THIRTY-FIFTH INTER-COLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIP

HE thirty-fifth annual track and field meeting of the Inter-Collegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America was held on Franklin Field, Philadelphia,

May 27 and 28, 1910. The meeting was conducted under the auspices of the University of Pennsylvania. As usual, preliminary heats were held on May 27th for the 100 yards dash, 220 yards dash, 440 yards dash, half-mile run, 120 yards hurdle, 220 yards hurdle, and elimination trials for the broad jump, high jump, hammer throw, shot put and pole vault. The finals in all these events were held on the following day.

The meet, which was won by the University of Pennsylvania, was favored with unusually fine weather on both days, though a variable wind interfered to some extent with the runners in the distance events. Pennsylvania's total was $271/_2$ points, Yale being second with $251/_2$ points. It was the first time in the history of the Association that the championship was won with a smaller score than 30 points, and this fact constitutes a fair index to the closeness of the competition.

Notwithstanding the favorable weather conditions, only one inter-collegiate record was broken. This was in the pole vault, in which F. T. Nelson, of Yale, cleared the bar at 12 feet $43/_8$ inches, displacing the record previously held by C. S. Campbell, of Yale, which was 12 feet $31/_2$ inches. In the 220 yards dash the inter-collegiate record of $211/_5$ seconds, which was also the world's record, made by B. J. Wefers, of Georgetown, in 1896, was equalled by R. C. Craig, of the University of Michigan.

There was a good attendance on both days, about 9,000 persons witnessing the final performances on May 28th.
