# SEVENTH ANNUAL INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIP ATHLETIC MEETING

The 1928 Indoor Meeting held on March 3rd at the 102nd Engineers Armory, New York City, was the most successful indoor meet ever held by the Association. From the standpoint of tense and sustained interest, unusually close competition, the breaking of records, size and enthusiasm of the audience and smoothness of running it has had no equal. For the first time in the memory of the oldest attendant at big indoor meets the competitors for the first heat of the first race were on their marks as the clock struck eight. The last event, the special 880-yard race, was finished at 10:32. In 1927 the meet finished at 11:05 and the year previous at 11:35. The speed of operation and the absence of difficulties were a tribute to the officials and the management.

Four Intercollegiate records were broken: Sabin W. Carr, Yale, '28, won the pole vault at 13 feet 334 inches, breaking the previous record of 13 feet held by himself, Nelson B. Sherrill of Pennsylvania and Stephen R. Bradley of Princeton; Norwood G. Wright, Cornell, '28, threw the 35-lb. weight 53 feet 111/8 inches to break the record of Frederick D. Tootell of Bowdoin of 52 feet 91/4 inches; David Adelman, Georgetown, '29, won the shot put at 48 feet 8 inches, breaking the record of Ralph G. Hills of Princeton which was 47 feet 534 inches; Syracuse won the one-mile relay in 3 minutes 21.2 seconds or 2/10ths of a second better than its own record of last year. The winning of this race by Syracuse over Georgetown who was the favorite lost the meet for the latter.

The finish of the one-mile run was one of the most thrilling finishes of a long distance race seen in recent years. Ralph G. Luttman of Harvard with a tremendous drive at the end failed by less than a foot to catch the winner, William J. Cox of Penn State, in the good time of 4 minutes and 20 seconds.

The finish of the 70-yard dash was extremely close and puzzling, all six en-

trants finishing within two feet of each other.

From time to time the Association has extended the courtesies of its track to outstanding performers for the reason that it is believed to be the fastest indoor track in the world. This year Lloyd Hahn, formerly of Brown, now of the B. A. A., had given promise of his ability to break the 880 indoor world's record. A special event at the end of the program was therefore arranged. Mr. Hahn had as competitors Samuel Martin, Dartmouth, '26, and Pincus Sober, C. C. N. Y., '26.

Hahn started at a tremendous pace for the distance, finished the first lap of the four in 26 1/5 seconds, the first quarter in 54 1/5 and his last quarter in 57 1/5. It was obvious to the experienced ones that he was steadily mowing down the record and the excitement of the audience was something rarely seen. When the time was announced—1 minute 51 2/5 seconds—a new world's record had been placed on the books not only for indoors but actually better than the outdoor record. Dr. Peltzer, former holder of the record, was present to see the performance.

A number of novelties were introduced which were well received by the audience. The announcing was done with a mechanical loud speaker suspended over the center of the floor with excellent results. A score-board 17 by 24 feet kept the audience informed on the progress of the point scoring. The Columbia University band in uniform furnished music that was more appropriate and more spirited than in former years with a regimental band. The track had been widened at the start 3 feet to facilitate the passing of batons and the starting of the long races. All the competitors in field events were furnished with chairs which helped greatly to preserve order. The area around the finish lines was roped off and only the necessary officials permitted therein, giving the spectators a better opportunity to view the finals.
