The sum of \$500 was appropriated to the Intercollegiate Finance Committee primarily for the purpose of issuing their printed report. The Association had previously contributed \$2,000 to the Committee.

Discussion was had as to the advisability of adopting the new Olympic hurdle, that is, a hurdle having its top bar an easily breakable strip set in slots in the uprights which can be replaced when broken.

An extended discussion was had on the various methods of improving the technique of handling the outdoor meeting such as plastic clay in front of the take-off board in the broad jump to show fouls; improved indicator devices for informing spectators as to the height or distance in jumps and throws; methods of lap reporting; improvements in judges' and timers' stands: methods of marking and measuring throws of implements and improvements to scoreboards.

INTERCOLLEGIATE FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Intercollegiate Finance Committee organized to raise funds from colleges and college men for the Olympic Games has completed its work and will shortly publish its report. Mr. Gustavus T. Kirby, chairman of this committee, states that the report will be in the form of the final issue of the Intercollegiate Olympic Journal. FIFTY-SECOND ANNUAL TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIP MEETING

May 25th and 26th, 1928

The 52nd Annual Track and Field Championship Meeting was held at Soldiers Field, Cambridge, on May 25th and 26th, 1928. The meet which gave promise of the breaking of numerous records was greatly marred by the heavy and continuous downpour of rain of Saturday which was most discouraging to competitors, spectators and officials. After a week of rain, Friday proved a clear, warm and sunny day and the records which were broken were the result of the competition in the field events of Friday. The times made by the track men Saturday were most creditable considering the muddy and soft track covered with a sheet of water and the steady cold rain and wind.

The championship was won for the second time in succession by Stanford with a total of 43 points. Yale was second with 25 1-3 and Penn State third with 16. Syracuse was fourth with 15 points. Yale and Penn State just reversed their positions of last year.

Three field event records were broken on Friday. The meet had scarcely opened when Eric C. W. Krenz of Stanford broke the record in the shot put with a put of 50 feet 1 inch displacing the record made by Clarence L. Houser of 49 feet 11 3-4 inches made in 1926. Later in the afternoon Krenz added his second record with a discus throw of 154 feet, 11 inches displacing Houser's second record of 151 feet 3 3-8 inches also made in the 1926 meet. The third record which was broken was the broad jump mark of 24 feet 8 1-2 inches held by Alfred H. Bates and made last year. This year Bates improved his record to 24 feet 10 3-8 inches.

The weather on Saturday also precluded the taking of satisfactory pic-
