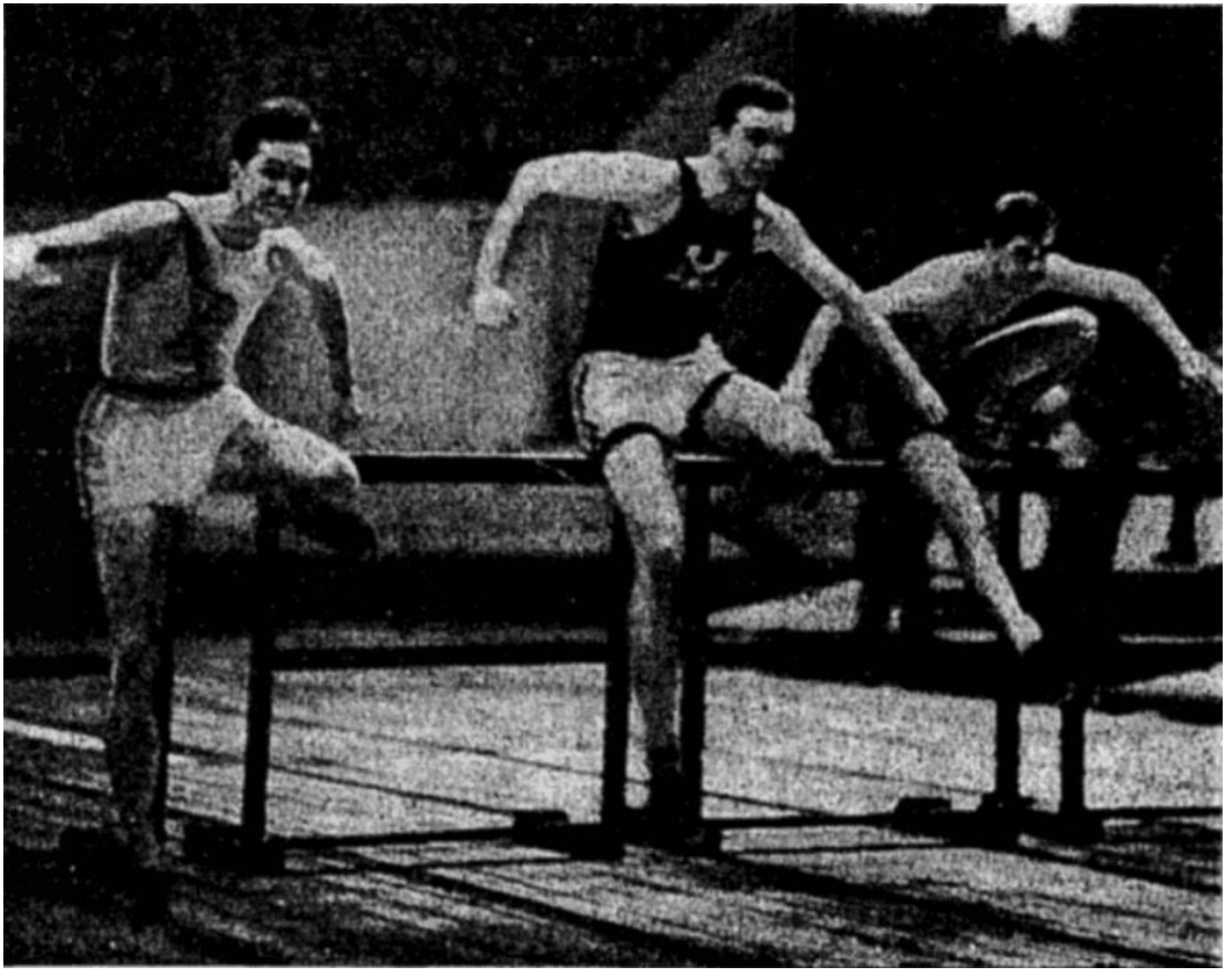




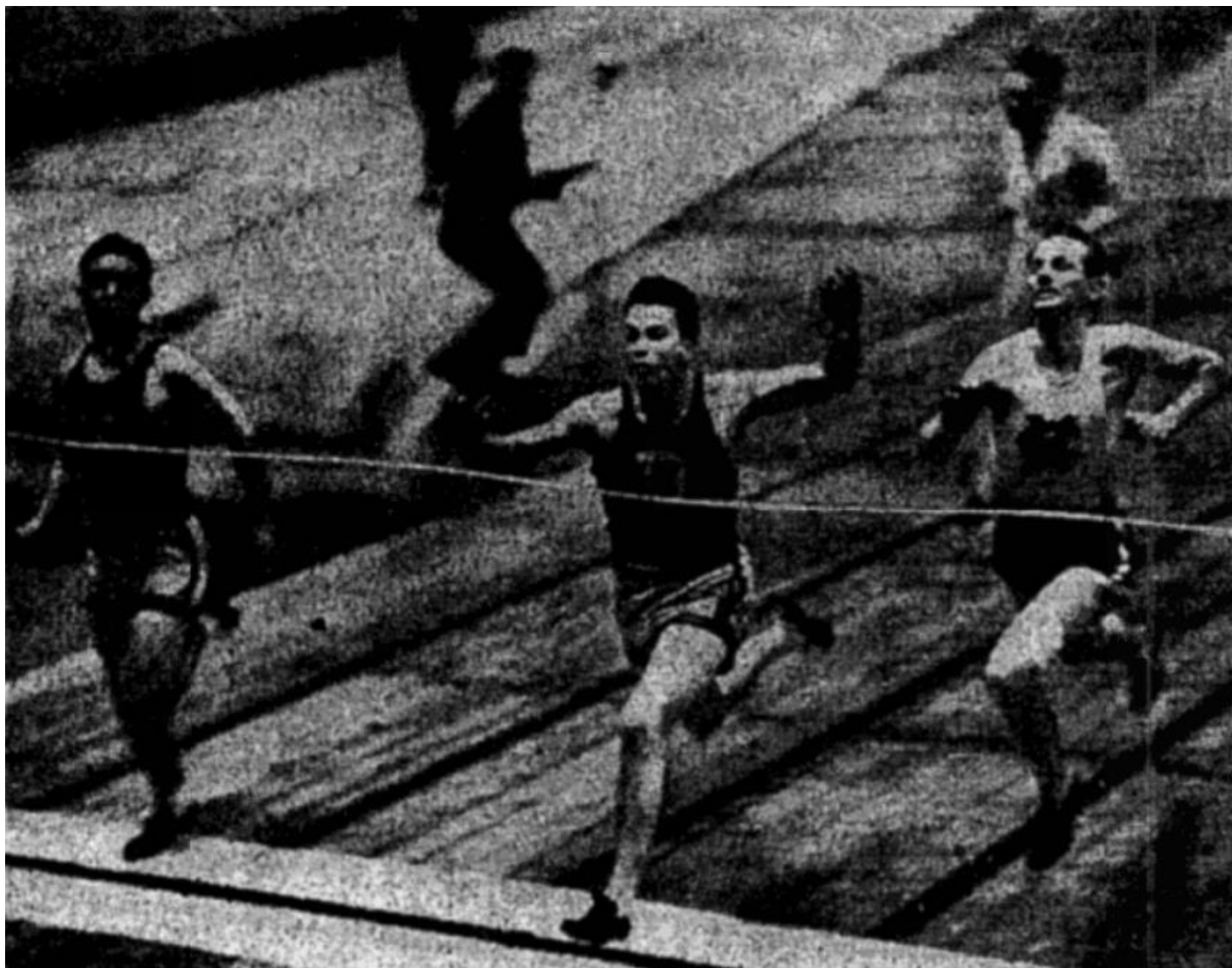
**Lou Burns, Manhattan ace, who retained his L. C. A. A. A. A. one-mile championship last night.**
