72ndOutdoor IC4A Championships May 29, 1948 Randall's Island, NY

NEW YORK, May 29 — Paul Cowie, Princeton's football star and war hero, powered his way to a double IC4A sprint victory in Triborough Stadium as Yale upest favored New York University for the team title, 37 to 34.

Cowie, blond 24-year-old father of two childern, came from behind in the 100 to tie the meet record of 9.6 held by Frank Wykoff and Barney Ewell. In the 220, Cowie, who did not run indoors because of "football legs" and who was beaten in the Penn Relays 100 last month, trounced defending champion Joe Cianciabella by three yards in 20.8, only one-tenth of a second off Barney Ewell's meet record.

Irving (Moon) Mondschein of N.Y.U. cracked the only meet record with a high jump of 6 feet 6% inches, his best leap of the year. Mondschein also made the best broad jump of his career, 23-8%, to finish second behind defending champion Fred. Johnson of Michigan State.

Reggie Pearman of N.Y.U. barely beat Frank Fox of Seton Hall in a 47.6 440. Pearman, considered an Olympic hope in the 800 meters, was unable to complete his double, finishing a badly beaten sixth in the 880. Jack

Dianetti of Michigan State, who was second in both IC4A and NCAA half miles last year, won in the ordinary time of 1:53.2.

Other successful title defenders were Jerry Karver of Penn State who took an easy 4:17.5 mile victory, and Yale's Vic Frank, who threw the discus 165 feet 8% inches.

Horace Ashenfelter continued Penn State's domination of the distance runs with a 9:13.2 victory in the 2-mile run. Sam Felton of Harvard defeated most of the United States best hammer throwers with a toss of 175 feet 4½ inches, and placed second to Frank in the discus.
