New York City, March 10 -- Villanova's Frank Budd turned in the greatest sprint exhibition ever seen indoors by running 6.0 twice and 6.1 on two other occasions at the IC4A Indoor Championships

Budd started off the day by posting a 6.1 in his heat. Then in the quarter finals he left his opposition far behind to post his first 6.0 and tie the indoor record jointly held by Herb Carper, Roscoe Cook, Dave Styron and Ralph Alspaugh. Two watches had him in 6.0 and the other had a 6.1. He again ran 6.1 in his semifinal heat and then four hours after his first 6.0 repeated that feat to win the final. The watches this time read 5.9, 6.0 and 6.0. A surprising second in the final was Gerald Ashworth of Dartmouth, who was only a foot behind. Ashworth ran 6.1 in both the quarter and semifinals. Robert Mattis of Manhattan was third in the final followed by Paul Drayton, also of Villanova, fourth, and Sherman Lewis of Michigan State fifth.
