

42<sup>nd</sup> IC4A Indoor Championships  
Madison Square Garden, New York, NY  
March 9, 1963

New York City, March 9 -- Villanova's front-line strength picked up four firsts, a second and third for 27 points and the Wildcats second straight IC4A indoor title.

The top man for Villanova was Rolando Cruz, who set a personal best of 16'1" in the pole vault. Noel Carroll picked up another victory with a 2:11.1 in the 1000, Don Webster ran a 47.5 anchor leg in the mile relay to give Villanova another win and Pat Traynor accounted for the other first with a 9:02.1 in the two miles. Tom Sullivan was second in a tactical mile and Vic Zwolak completed the Villanova scoring with a third in the two miles.

In the pole vault, Army's Dick Plymale went ahead when he cleared 15'9" on his second attempt while Cruz needed three tries. But Plymale lost a contact lens at 15'9" and it could not be found in the sawdust pit. At 16'1" the Army junior couldn't make it but Cruz went over on his first try. Cruz had the bar raised to 16'4" but failed.

Harvard sophomore Aggrey Awori tried for a triple but saw his hopes dashed in the afternoon session when he failed to qualify for the final of the broad jump. However, he did better in the 60 high hurdles, winning in 7.3. He got a poor start in the 60 and took second to Manhattan's Bob Mattis. Another foreign athlete, Wendell Mottley, a Yale junior from Trinidad, hoped for an indoor record in the 600 and looked sharp in his heat with a 1:10.1. At night he failed to come close to the indoor record but did lower his meet record to 1:09.9. Fordham's Frank Tomeo ran a 1:10.3 in his heat but was disqualified. NYU's Gary Gubner won his 20th straight indoor victory in the shot with a 61'5" effort while Holy Cross sophomore Kevin O'Brien surprised with a 6'8" leap in the high jump.

NEW YORK, March 9 (UPI) Slender Rolando Cruz of Villanova soared over the listed world indoor record for the pole vault with a leap of 16 feet 1 inch tonight to pace a spree of record-breaking in the IC4A Track championships.

Cruz's victory helped Villanova's attempt to retain the team crown in this Madison Square Garden meet, where usually team competition is rated more important than individual performances.

In an afternoon heat, Wendell Mottley of Yale set a meet mark of 1:10.1 in the 600-yard run. The meet record of 7.3 seconds was equalled in the 60-yard hurdles by John Bethea of Morgan State, in a heat, and winner Aggrey Awori of Harvard in the final.

Cruz, who hopes to do his vaulting for Puerto Rico in the 1964 Olympics eclipsed the listed world vault record of 16-0 $\frac{3}{4}$ , held by John Uelses.

Finland's Pentti Nikula has a pending vault of 16-8 $\frac{3}{4}$ .
