# I.C. 4-A Run Is Captured By Trujillo

Dennis Trujillo of Army, a 20-year-old junior from Pueblo, Colo., ran an unorthodox race yesterday that proved to be the winning formula in the I.C. 4-A cross-country championships at Van Cortlandt Park.

Trujillo gained a long lead early in the five-mile race and lengthened the margin in the hills en route to an 80-yard victory over Randy Thomas of Massachusetts, the runner-up.

The College Division race was won by George Moller of the University of Rochester in 24:27. John Bredryzcki of C. W. Post was second in 24:39. Lehigh won the team honors with 58 points.

Thomas paced Massachusetts to the team title, its first, in the 66th annual meet conducted for the members of the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America. It was a stunning upset for the Minutemen, whose coach, Ken O'Brien, was in tears after receiving the official results.

"We've thought I.C. 4-A all year," said O'Brien, whose team lost to favored Providence last week by 23 points in the New England championships.

Yesterday, on a warm and windless afternoon, Massachusetts had three runners among the first 11 and scored 106 points for the triumph. Providence was second with 125 followed by

Navy (130), the Heptagonal winner, previously unbeaten Georgetown (156), Northeastern (161) and Fordham (200). Manhattan, last year's winner and Rutgers, the Metropolitan champion, were 11th and 12th, respectively.

The first eight teams plus Dartmouth (as an additional New England representative) and Penn State (which drew an at-large bid) qualified for the National Collegiate championships to be run next Monday in Bloomington, Ind.

Trujillo, now unbeaten in 10 races, was timed in 24 minutes 20.8 seconds. He wasted no time establishing his credentials. The Cadet ran the "flats" unusually fast and had a 30-yard lead after the first half mile. The 5-foot-8-inch, 135-pounder then led the field, with Tony Colon of Manhattan next, into the hills, a portion of the race for which competitors usually reserve their strength.

Eamon Coughlin of Villanova, place third in 24:37. Alex Kasick of West Virginia was fourth followed by Bill Gillin of Massachusetts and Ron Speirs of Rutgers. The first freshman to cross the line was James Peterson, of Georgetown, who was eighth.

The starting time for the I.C. 4-A cross-country run yesterday was incorrectly listed Sunday and Monday in The Times schedule of sports events as 1:45 P.M. instead of 1 o'clock. The Times regrets any inconvenience it may have caused.

# Speirs is sixth in IC4A run

NEW YORK — Ron Speirs ran the opposite of his usual race pattern for sixth place—the highest ever by a Rutgers runner—in the 66th annual IC4A University Division Cross Country Championships in Van Cortlandt Park yesterday.

Edison's Gary Cohen, complaining the course is too flat for him, finished right behind Speirs despite a bad stitch.

And while the two local entries had their finest showing ever in the race, Army's fleet-footed junior, Dennis Trujillo, won handily in 24:29.8, with Massachusetts a mild surprise in winning the team title with 106 points.

Providence followed Massachusetts in the team race with 125 points. Rounding out the top five and thereby qualifying for the NCAA Championships Monday at the University of Indiana, were Navy with 130, heavily favored Georgetown with 136 and Northeastern with 161 points.

Rutgers, despite the fine showing of Speirs and freshman Jay Vickery (27th in 25:16), finished 12th in the team race with 277 points. Princeton, behind Ron Bunnell's 12th place effort was 10th with 265.

Trujillo led the race almost

the entire way, pacing the field through a brisk 4:22 mile and winning by almost 14 seconds over Randy Thomas of Massachusetts.

The 5-8, 131-pound Cadet lost the lead briefly to Scott Eden of Duke in the back hills at about two-and-one-half miles, but quickly regained it.

"I wanted the lead," Trujillo said afterward. "When Eden took it I was worried. I thought

I was taking a fast pace and it scared me, but I stayed with him and he fell back."

Trujillo, unbeaten this year, felt this was the toughest competition he'd seen and will see since he is passing up the Nationals due to a dual meet with Navy Saturday. "It's disappointing not to go, but if we beat Navy it will be worth it. They're changing the schedule so I'll be able to run the Nationals next year."

Coming out of the hills and heading for the three-mile mark, Trujillo, followed by Villanova's Eamonn Coghlan, Alexander Kosick of West Virginia, Eden and Thomas made up the top five. Speirs was in 13th with Cohen 18th.

"At two-and-one-half miles I started to feel the pain of the first mile," Cohen, a former Middlesex County champion for John P. Stevens said. "I was really frightened."

Cohen had passed through the mile just off the leaders in 4:28.

After the flats and heading for the final mile including Cemetery Hill, Cohen had moved up to sixth, while Speirs remained 13th.

"I just knew I had to do it," Cohen, last year's 23rd place finisher, said. "I bombed out three years in a row and this was my last chance to do anything in the meet. I wanted to stay in the top group and let it all go at the hill, but as it turned out, they all ran away from me."

"This time I had the mental

"This time I had the mental attitude to keep going, even though the stitch really began to hurt going up the hill," Cohen continued. "This is a fast course, I'd rather have more hills."

In that case Cohen should find the NCAA six-mile course ideal.

Speirs, 30th in the race last year and 31 in the NCAA's timed 24:41, four seconds ahead of Cohen. The time also eclipsed his own Rutgers record for the course by two seconds.

"I wanted to go out and be in the top 10 at the mile, but it seemed fast to me," Speirs said. "I didn't start moving until the three-mile mark."

"I felt this was the first time I really ran the last two miles," Speirs continued. "I really surprised myself. This is the first time I've ever moved on Cemetery Hill. I went out relatively slow and picked it up. It was just the opposite of the way I usually run."

Rutgers coach Les Wallack remarked, "He ran superbly. He stayed back early and ran the last mile like crazy. We told him he had to finish in the top 10 and he did."

Vickery was the fourth freshman across the finish and qualified for the Nationals, while another freshman, Highland Park's Ray Meyers, was 41st for Syracuse in 25:36.

David R. Moller of Rochester won the college division race in 24:27.2, while Lehigh won the team title with 58 to 107 for defending champion Bucknell.
