PRINCETON, N.J. (UPI) — Seton Hall captured the 440 and 600-yard sprint events and set a one mile relay record to win its first ICAA indoor track and field championship Sunday.

The Pirates, led by sprinters ~~Charlie Joseph and Howard Brock~~, who won the 440 and 600-yard events respectively, edged Maryland 37-34 for the team title. Defending champion Villanova placed fourth.

Brock, a senior from Washington, D.C., also anchored Seton Hall's one mile relay, which set an ICAA indoor record of 3:12.9 minutes.

Maryland, which had gone into the second day of the meet with 14 points gained in Saturday's long jump event, and William & Mary — which captured the 60-yard high hurdles, two-mile run, 800-yard run and distance medley — threatened Seton Hall throughout the day but the Pirates' depth in the sprint and relay events was the difference.

Joseph — whose 47.7-second finish tied an ICAA record — was followed at the tape in the 440-yard event by teammates Al DAley, who finished second, and Jim Lewis, who finished fifth.

Seton Hall also took a second in the 800-yard event on Orlando Green's performance, a fourth with Ira Presley's finish in the 600-yard and fourth in the two-mile relay.

PRINCETON, N.J. — John Leonard with a second place in the one mile walk, was the lone Plattsburgh State entry to place in the ICAA Indoor Track & Field Championships held here over the weekend.

However, Plattsburgh State qualified seven men for the NCAA College Division Championships, the most of any college division team competing in the ICAA Meet.

Leonard had a time of 7:35 minutes just behind Stewart of Kings Point who clocked a 7:18 time.

The one mile relay team was nosed out of a chance to go to the semifinals by Georgetown. Plattsburgh State still bettered its own school record with a 3:22.5 time. Harold Horton ran a 51.7 split, Gary Gillis, 50.2, Ron Cameron, 49.6 and Tony Haslam, 50.7.

Brian Dodge finished eighth in his two mile heat with a 9:08 time and Cameron placed third in his 600 heat with a 1:13.7 time.

Tom Pillsworth lowered his own indoor mark in the one mile run with a 4:22.1 clocking and a fourth place finish.
