# Northeastern pulls surprise, wins IC4A cross-country title

Northeastern Crosscoach country Irwin Cohen passed up the IC4A Championships at Van Cortland Park, N.Y., yesterday to fill a commitment as referee at the NCAA Division 3 meet at Franklin Park. In doing so he missed seeing his team pull off a major upset by winning the IC4A title with 57 points, over (85), Provi-Princeton dence College (113), Georgetown (178) and Penn (181).

It was the first IC4A title of any kind for Northeastern which was also making amends for a three-point loss to Providence in the New England Championships a week ago.

Dave Merrick, a 22year-old senior from the University of Pennsylvania, led the five-mile race from start to finish and established a record of 23:51 while beating runnerup Curt Alitz of Army by 45 yards.

Northeastern, under the guidance of assistant coach Everett Baker, placed three runners in the top 10 to become only the second New England team to win the 67-year-old race.

The Huskies were led by sophomore Jon Flora who wound up fourth in 24:28. Flora got a lot of support from freshman teammate Bruce Bickford who fin-

ished 7th and twin brother Bob Flora who was 8th. Seniors Mike Buckley (13th) and Ken Flanders (27th) rounded out the Northeastern attack.

Cohen was informed of the victory while officiating the NCAA meet at Franklin Park. "I'm sorry I had to miss being there," he said, "but hearing that good news without expecting it made up for it."

New England champion Mike O'Shea of Providence faded to fifth after battling Merrick for the lead in the early stages.

Other New England schools among the leaders included Dartmouth, 6th; Harvard, 14th; Yale, 18th; UMass, 19th; UConn, 20th and Holy Cross, 21st.

# Penn's Merrick cracks record

NEW YORK (AP) — Dave Merrick of Penn set a meet record 23:51 in capturing the individual title Saturday in the 67th annual IC4A University Division cross country championships.

The 22-year-old senior led from start to finish and broke the tape for the five-mile course at Van Cortlandt Park 45 yards ahead of Curt Alitz of Army, who was timed in 24:00.

Merrick, undefeated this season, bettered the old mark of 24 minutes flat established in 1974 by John Hartnett of Villanova

That same year Merrick was second in 24:07.6, his best performance before Saturday. Last season he did not compete because of foot injuries.

Larry Tractenberg of Princeton trailed Alitz by an additional 45 yards in taking third place in 24:27.

John Flora of Northeastern was next in 24:28, and his effort led the Huskies to the team title for the first time ever with 57 points.

Princeton was second with 85, while Providence, the favorite, settled for third with 113. Georgetown was next with 178 and Penn completed the top five with 181.

Bruce Bickford (7th), Bob Flora (8th), Mike Buckley (13th) and Ken Flanders (27th) completed the Northeastern squad.

Bucknell University regained the team title in the 14th annual College Divison championships with 27 points. Lehigh, winner five of the last six years, was runner-up with 52. West Chester State was third with 108.

Bob Braile and Daniel Davis led the Bisons to their triumph with a one-two

finish. Braile, clocked in 25:21.8, was 22 vards ahead of Davis.

Lafayette put on one of its best showings ever in the College Division championships — a 10th place finish with 348 points.

The Leopards' top finisher was Jay Kohler (27th in 26:28). Tim Reardon was 34th in 26:37; Brian Gallagher 69th in 27:17; Marty Orzio 111th in 27:54 and Bob Miekle 119th. Kohler's effort was the eighth best for a Lafayette runner on the New York course while Reardon's time was the 12th best.

East Stroudsburg State, with Pete Heesen competing on the West Coast, placed 12th among the 30 schools. Mark Weber placed 14th at 26:03 while Bruce Gramling, Joe Worden and Bob Handock were 78th, 109th and 137th in that order.

# Record Run By Merrick Takes IC4A

NEW YORK, Nov. 15—Dave Merrick of Penn chopped nine seconds off the meet record in winning the individual title in the 67th IC4A university division cross-country championships at Van Cortlandt Park today.

Merrick was timed in 23:51 for the five-mile course. Army's Curt Alitz, who was timed nine seconds slower, finished second. Princeton's Larry Tractenberg was third in 24:27, followed by Northeastern's John Flora, 24:28.

Flora's effort, along with 7-8-13-27 finishes by his teammates, enabled Northeastern to grab the team title with 57 points, 28 better than runner-up Princeton.

Favored Providence was third with 113, trailed by Georgetown with 178.

Claude Barron of Navy took 22d place and teammate Steve Giorgis was 28th to help pace the Mids to a seventh-place finish.

Eighth-place Maryland's highest finisher was Jeff Smtith, who came in 23d.
