Relayers give UMO women 24th in meet

HANOVER, N.H. — Cathy Boucher and Deb Eby of East Stroudsburg State College turned in their best times of the season in the 440-yard dash but failed to place in the EAAIW Indoor Track and Field Championships Saturday at Dartmouth.

Boucher was timed in 1:03.9 while Eby was clocked in 1:05.1. ESSC had one other competitor, Jodi Jarrett, who had a distance of 31-11 in the shot put.

The Warriors will play host to the EAAIW Outdoor Track and Field Championships at the ESSC Stadium May 6-7.

HANOVER, N.H. — The University of Maine - Orono's women's track team, completing its first season of indoor inter-collegiate competition, finished 24th among 39 clubs in the Eastern Inter-collegiate Athletic Association for Women's title meet at Dartmouth College here Saturday.

The mile relay team of Lauren Noether, Lisa Stevens, Patty Holcomb and Nancy Duval placed fourth with a UMO record time of 4:00.2 to account for the team's four points.

Morgan State won the relay in 3:49.6, three seconds off the women's American record. The University of Maryland won the championship with 66 points.

HANOVER, N.H. — Pitt placed 11th among 36 schools in the first Eastern indoor women's track championships at Dartmouth yesterday.

The Pantherettes highest finish was third in the 880-yard relay (Pam Shaw, Sue Lewis, Janice Irwin, Karen Krichko) in 1:47.5.

Marie Ribik placed fifth and Karen Krichko sixth in the high jump, both at 5-4. Pam Shaw was fifth in the long jump at 16-6 3/4.

Maryland won the meet with 66 points. Penn State was second with 64.

Thomson, Herrman 1-2 in 60-yard hurdles

HANOVER, N.H. — Carol Thomson and Kim Herrman of the University of Delaware Women's Track Club finished 1-2 in the 60-yard hurdles yesterday at the EAAIW Championships at Dartmouth College.

Miss Thomson set a meet record with her time of 8:07. Miss Herrman was clocked at 8:35.

HANOVER, N.H.— The University of Maryland took team honors and the University of Vermont's Janet Terp finished second in the pentathlon competition at the first Eastern AIAW indoor track and field championship Saturday at Dartmouth's Leverone Field House.

Terp posted victories in the pentathlon long jump and the pentathlon high jump with marks of 5.16 meters and 1.52 meters respectively and wound up with an overall score of 3,152, placing her just behind Temple's Cindi Troxell, who finished with 3,169.

The Terpin women collected 66 points, while Penn State was second with 64 in the competition that involved teams from more than 30 schools in the Northeast.

Maryland's victory was led by

high jumper Paulala Paula Girven and two sprinting sisters Marilyn and Carolyn McCoy. Given took her event with a height of 5-10, while Marilyn McCoy won the 60 60-yard dash and combined with her sister for a share in the 880-relay win.

Penn State's Liz Berry was the outstanding distance runner, winning the three-mile race in 17:06.6 and finishing second to Amherst's Marina Buckley in the two-mile.

Among the others standouts were Patti Knighton of Penn State, a winner in the long jump, Delaware's Carol Thompson, who won the 60-yard hurdles; Lorna Forde of Long Island University, who took the 440-yard run and Cathy Whitcomb of Tufts, who won the mile in 4:55.92. Branwen Smith of Springfield College took the title in shot put.

HANOVER — The University of Maryland had a pair of individual champions plus a winning team in the 880-yard relay and second place in the mile relay to edge past Penn State and win the first Eastern AIAW indoor track and field

championship today at Dartmouth's Leverone Field House.

The Terrapin women collected 66 points while Penn State was second with 64. Delaware State College was third with 27 in the competition that involved teams from more

than 30 college in the Northeast.

Maryland's victory was led by high jumper Paula Girven and two sprinting sisters, Marilyn and Carolyn McCoy.

Girven took her event with a height of 5 feet 10 inches. Marilyn McCoy won the 60-yard dash (Carolyn was fourth) and both had a share in the 880 relay win.

The Terrapins clinched the meet by taking second place to Morgan State in the mile relay while Penn State finished fifth.

Penn State had an outstanding performer in distance runner Liz Berry who won the three-mile race in 17:06.6 and finished second to Marina Buckley of Amherst in the two-mile. Berry was three seconds behind Buckley's winning time of 10:58.46.

Patti Knighton of Penn State won the long jump while other outstanding performances came from Delaware's Carol Thomson who won the 60-yard hurdles, Lorna Forde of Long Island University who edged Andrea Andrews of New York University in the 440-yard run, and Cathy Whitcomb of Tufts who won the mile in 4:55.92.

Kathy Mills of Penn State was second to Whitcomb as the Nittany Lion women finished 2-3-4 in that event.

Cindi Troxell of Temple collected 3,169 points to edge past Janet Terp of Vermont in the five-event special pentathlon by 17 points.

Branwen Smith of Springfield College was the other individual winner, taking the title in the shot put.

Maryland women capture Eastern track crown

Hanover, N.H. (Special)—The University of Maryland won the team championship in the first Eastern Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women indoor track and field championships at Dartmouth College yesterday, beating runner-up Penn State University by 2 points.

Maryland won three events and totaled 66 points to 64 for Penn State. Delaware State College was third, 27, and the University of Massachusetts fourth, 25, among 39 competing schools.

Morgan State University won the mile relay in 3 minutes 49.06 seconds, with Paulette Clagon, Tanya Bryant, Paula Clagon, and Yvette Coleman. The same four went unplaced in the 880-yard relay.

For Maryland, the mile relay team clinched the team title when it finished second behind Morgan State in 3:56.7. Penn State was fifth in the race, the final event on the program.

Terrapin freshman Paula Girven won the high jump at 5 feet 10 inches, Marilyn McRoy took the 60-yard dash in 7.0 seconds, and the 880-yard relay team of Carolyn McRoy, Susan White, Marilyn McRoy, and Linda Miller placed first in 1:46.5

Other Maryland points were recorded by Miss Girven, third in the hurdles, 8.4; Martha Fuhayda, third in the shot put, 42-7½; Carolyn McRoy, fourth in the 220 in 26.1, and fourth in the 60 (no time); Linda Miller, fourth in the 440, 59.2; Janet Hubert and Susan White, fifth and sixth in the hurdles (no times), and Marilyn McRoy, sixth in the long jump, 16-foot-6.
