Another was 1978 New York State Intersectional schoolgirl discus champ Elena Gervino of Scarsdale. The Rhode Island freshman won her event with a throw of 147 feet, 11½ inches compared to her still-standing state high school mark of 143-1½.

In one of the most closely contested events, Villanova edged defending meet champion Penn State in the 4-by-800-meter relay at the tape. Penn State goes into today's finals with 9 points.

Elena Gervino of the University of Rhode Island won the discus with a toss of 45.1 meters.

Evalene Hatcher of the University of Delaware leaped 6.08 meters to capture the long jump.
