Maryland nips Morgan for EAIAW track title

Cambridge, Mass. (Special)—Maria Parsons was the individual star, and the Morgan State University mile relay team charged back into the national spotlight, but the Univesity of Maryland used depth to squeeze past coach Leonard Braxton's Bears, 68 to 64, in the chase for the team title in the annual indoor track and field championships of the Eastern Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women which concluded a weekend stand at Harvard University yesterday.

Morgan's mile relay foursome of Parsons, Valerie Robinson, Cynthia Colquitt and Roberta Belle knocked out a winning 3 minutes 45 79 seconds—second fastest intercollegate time in the nation this win-

Maryland and two winners, high jumper Paula Girven, 5 feet 11 inches, and Juanita Alston in the pentathlon, 3,635 points, but used places in 12 events to edge the numerically small but talent-rich Morgan team, which won three events and placed in four others.

Parsons set two individual meet and school records, zipping 60 yards in 6.86 seconds in the semifinal, and winning the 220 in 24.45. The tired sprint star, who also ran on two relays, held on for second

in the dash final, 6.90.

Evalene Hatcher set meet and school standards in the long jump, 19 feet 9¼ inches; Colquitt set a school record of 2:09 in placing second in the 880-yard run, and the 880-yard relay team of Parsons, Rhonda Yancey, Roberta Belle and Hatcher set a school mark in getting second, 1:38.62.

Maryland state entries dominated the high jump, as Mount St. Mary's freshman Thea Akerman was second, 5-10, and Maryland's Jalene Chase, from Columbia, was fourth, 5-8.

DelState shows power in track

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. — Lori Dowers, Janise Dale and Marjorie Walker turned in outstanding individual performances yesterday to highlight a strong overall showing by Delaware State in the EAIAW Eastern Regional Women's Track Championships at Harvard University.

Dowers won three 60-yard dash heat races run and turned in the second fastest time — :06.9. Dowers, from Lawrenceville, N.J., qualified for today's semifinal.

Dale reached the final of the 440yard dash with a time of :56.5, the second fastest time her semifinal heat.

Walker holds second in the pentathlon with 2.137 points after the 60-yard hurdles, the shot-put and the high jump. She will compete in the long jump and 880-yard run today.

The Hornets 880-yard realy team — Dale, Linda Means, Louise Campbell and Josephine Hobbs — qualified for the semifinals by finishing second. The 1:40.1 clocking was also good enough to qualify it for the AIAW National Championships, which will be held Friday and Saturday at the University of Missouri.

The Hornets mile relay team failed to reach the final — it came in third at 3:51 — but qualified for the nationals. Hobbs also ran a personal best of :25.1 in the 220, but finished third and did not make the final.

Also, DelState qualified Arlene McMillian in the high jump and Sherice Smaw in the shot-put.

DelState's Dowers winner at regional

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. — Delaware State's Lori Dowers won the 60-yard dash for the regional championship in yesterday's EAIAW Regional Track Meet at Harvard.

Margerie Walker, also of Del-State, placed second in the pentathlon with 3487 points. The DelState mile relay, which finished fourth, and the 880 relay team, which placed seventh, both qualified for next month's national qualifying meet in St. Louis.

UVM's St. Hilaire Sets 2-Mile Mark

Vermont's Judi St. Hilaire set a new UVM record and copped a second place finish Sunday in the two-mile run during the EAIAW women's championship track meet at Harvard University.

St. Hilaire ran the two miles in 10:05.4 for the Vermont record, which was good enough for a second-place finish.

Janet Terp placed fifth in two events, leaping 18 feet two inches in the long jump and five feet-eight inches in the high jump.

Vermont posted the second-best team total of the New England schools entered and finished 13th overall with 12 points. Maryland won the meet with 68 points, while Morgan State was second at 64 and Penn State third at 53.

Bates Track Marks Fall

Placing 11th in the pentathlon in the EAIAW meet at Boston University Sunday was freshman Jennifer Kettle of New Gloucester, who tallied 3,155 points. Right behind in 12th place was classmate Karen Holler of Auburn, who racked up 3,147 points. Holler flew 16 feet, 61/4 inches in the long jump to move up several notches in the scoring.

Also at the EAIAW meet, senior Renata Cosby ran the 440-yard run Saturday in a Bates record time of 57.2 seconds, breaking her own standard of 58.35 seconds. The time qualified her for the semifinals, where a slower time eliminated her from further competition.

Perham's 7.4-second clocking in the 60-yard dash trials and Suzanne Alley's 5-2 leap in the high jump were not good enough to enable them to move into contention for points.

Winning the EAIAW meet was Maryland, followed by Morgan State and Penn State. The University of Maryland piled up 68 points to outrun 64 other schools and win the Eastern Women's Championships at Harvard in a meet highlighted by the performance of Harvard freshman Darlene Beckford of Cambridge, who set a national collegiate record in winning the mile. Beckford nipped Villanova's Brigid Leddy in 4:32.30.

Villanova broke the national collegiate record in wining the two-mile relay in 8:49.84. Harvard, which was also under the old mark, finished second in 8:59.48.

WOMEN'S TRACK

The Penn State women's track team had a successful weekend at the EAIAW Indoor Championships at Cambridge, Mass. The Lady Lions finished third in the team standings behind defending champion Maryland and Morgan State.

Individually, Penn State captured seven thirds, as four Lady Lions recorded personal bests in their events.

Mary Rawe turned in a 4:44.9 mile, her best ever, in finishing third. Heather Carmichael ran to a personal best in the two mile, 10:09.41, good for third. Carolyn Ihrig took fifth in 10:33.16.

Peg Cleary placed third in the three mile in a personal bet 15:57.3, while Debbie Lewis sprinted to third in the 220 with a 24.84.

"Debbie ran a-super semifinal race to get into the finals," said Penn State coach Gary Schwartz. "For a freshman to run with that crowd is a real good job."

Karen Krawiec high jumped 5-8, good for third, while Vivian Riddick long jumped 19-212, also good for third. Ms. Riddick placed sixth in the 60-yard dash in 7.19.

In the 880, Penny Fales took fourth with a personal best 2:10.06.

The pentathaletes turned in good performances, with Sue Van Horn finishing third with 3,385 points and Ann McKillop taking fourth with 3,351.

"We had a super meet," said Schwartz. "Most of the girls bettered or were close to their best performances.

"In the two-mile relay, we were running second on the anchor leg, but Penny (Fales) had a calf problem and had to drop out. The relay wouldn't have changed our placing in the meet, but it would have added to our point total."

Former Lady Lion Patti Knighton placed second in the long jump with a leap of 19-61/2.

WOMEN'S TRACK AND FIELD: Two Rochester area women are sixth and seventh, respectively, after the first day of the AIAW Eastern Pentathlon at

Harvard in Cambridge, Mass.

Jackie Blackett of University of Rochester was sixth with 1,905 points after competing in the 60-yard high hurdles, shot put and high jump events. Debby Cubbon of Alfred University was seventh, including a second place in the hurdles with an 8.7-second time, with 1,902 points. St. John's Theresa Jaeger is first with 2,214 points.
