# State Women in Running for EAIAW Track Championship

The Penn State women's track team is right where it wants to be after the first day of competition at the Eastern AIAW meet at Harvard University, in the thick of the battle for the team championship.

"It looks like Penn State and Maryland again," said Lady Lion coach Gary Schwartz last night. "Boston University is no longer in the picture. They had a few injuries today."

In the only final contested yesterday, Deb Pavik of Maryland won the three-mile run in 15:53.1. Peggy Cleary of Penn State was third in 16:18 flat and Natalie Updegrove took fourth in 16:37.8. Mary Walsh's sixth-place finish gave the Lady Terps 11 points to the Lady Lions' 10.

Madga Kubasiewicz placed seventh for Penn State in 16:52.5.

The Lady Lions came through the qualifying rounds better than Schwartz had thought they would, and he is optimistic about today's finals.

Both Stephanie Weeks (8.59) and Sue Lindner (8.43) advanced to the semifinals in the 60-yard hurdles, while Vivian Riddick advanced to the semifinals in the 60-yard dash (7.0) and to the finals in the 220, running 25.24 in the preliminaries and 24.9 in the semis.

Three Lady Lions moved into the finals in the mile, as Doreen Startare won her heat in a personal best 4:53.7, while Mary Rawe (4:58.7) finished second and Patty Murnane third (4:59.5) in the second heat.

Penny Fales took second in her heat of the 880 in 2:16.9 to advance to the finals.

Penn State placed two runners in the finals of the 440, as freshman Tammie Hart won her heats in the prelims (55.94) and the semis (55.6) while Terry Pioli took second (57.3) and third (57.1) in her heats.

Both relay teams will run in today's finals. The 4 x 440 team advanced without having to run, while the 4 x 880 team took second in its heat in 9:15.5.

"We'll have to get some points in the jumps and the shot put," said a happy Schwartz. "We could come out with some good points in the mile.

"Vivian (Riddick) was an unexpected treat, getting into the finals in the 220.

"The two mile is really stacked, but Kathy (Mills) should score some points there. We'll see if everything falls into place."

# Penn State Women Eastern Track Champs

Miler Mary Rawe and high jumper Karen Krawiec turned in firsts, but coach Gary Schwartz credited team balance and attitude with pulling the Penn State women to the Eastern AIAW indoor track championship Saturday at Harvard.

The Lady Lions, picking up their first Eastern indoor crown since 1978, easily outscored runner-up and defending

champ Maryland, 89-63.

"Overall balance and team attitude, team spirit, had a lot to do with the win," Schwartz said. "We only missed scoring in two events, and we didn't have people in them. We missed in the 4 x 220 relay because we thought we'd be spreading ourselves too thin, and we missed in the pentathlon where Ann McKillop was hurt.

"We took 18 people and all but three scored, and the scoring was evenly distributed among sprints, distances,

jumps and weights."

Rawe flashed to a Penn State indoor record in winning the mile in 4:43.1, and teammate Doreen Startare, who came into the meet with a personal best of 4:58, did 4:48.8 for fourth.

Krawiec tied her school record in winning the high jump at 5-10.

The Lady Lion two-mile relay squad of Startare (2:17.5), Peggy Cleary (2:17.4), Patti Murnane (2:15.5) and Rawe (2:11.0) finished a close second to Harvard, 9:01.00 to 9:01.81, a PSU record.

Georgetown was third in 9:01.82.

"Darlene Beckford (Harvard's anchor) ran a soft quarter, and Mary was boxed in," Schwartz said. "She wasn't able to take it out as hard as she wanted. It came down to the three of them going flat out at the finish and Mary held off Chris Mullins from Georgetown who's a 2:05 half-miler and who has great leg speed."

Schwartz was also pleased with freshman Tammie Hart's 55.62 for third in the 440, a school record and a

national qualifying time.

"Tammie Hart lived up to her potential," he said. "We're starting to see the times we know she's capable of and she competed very well. She ran four quality quarters in the 55s in two days."

'Hart is a former PIAA champ from

Williamsport.

"Vivian Riddick turned in a solid performance," he said. "She was fifth in the 60, fifth in the 220 and third in the long jump. That's the kind of attitude that helped us. And Mike Shine has done a great job with our sprinters. They're really coming along."

Judi St. Hillaire of Vermont set an EAIAW record of 9:52.53 in winning the two mile over Kathy Mills, 10:04.65.

Lady Lion freshman Elaine Sobansky finished second in the shot

put with aheave of 49-1134.

"Last year we didn't win anything in this meet, and this year we have two firsts and three seconds," Schwartz said. "We really dominated the meet."

Ten individuals and three relay teams have qualified for the National meet this weekend at Idaho State.

Judi St. Hilaire of the University of Vermont set an Eastern record in the two-mile Saturday at the Eastern Women's Indoor Track Championships at Harvard University in Cambridge, Mass.

St. Hilaire ran the two-mile in 9:52.53, smashing the old mark of 10:05.06. She ran the first mile in 4:57.3 and the second mile in 4:54.16.

St. Hilaire also anchored Vermont's two-mile relay team which placed seventh in 9:12.5, a new school record. Pam Moulton ran the first leg in 2:20.3, Laurie Mertzlufft the second leg in 2:19, Karen Bucke the third leg in 2:18.2, and St. Hilaire the fourth leg in 2:15.

Penn State won the meet with 89 points, followed by Maryland (63) and Morgan State (62). Vermont was 12th with 10 points.

## Morgan women set 880-yard relay mark

Boston (Special)—Roberta Belle keyed a U.S.-record team in the 880-yard relay for Morgan State in an unofficial time of 1 minute 36.8 seconds in the EAIAW Region I track finals yesterday.

The world record time of 1:36.9 was set

in 880 meters by Tennessee State.

However, Belle, from Baltimore's Douglass High School, was disqualified in the 440-yard dash for a lane violation and that cost Morgan a second-place finish in the meet. In women's track, Adelphi's Marva Fearon, Cheryl Innis, Marilyn Gilliard and June Griffith set a meet and school record in the mile relay at 3:44.7 in the EAIAW championships at Harvard University. Fearon finished second in the 60-yard dash in 7.0, and Innis was second in the quarter mile in 55.4.
