Kathy Mills won the 5,000 meters yesterday to help push Penn State into the first-day team lead at the Eastern AIAW track and field championships on the Penn State track.

Mills pulled away from teammate Peggy Cleary and Maryland's Deb Pavik with four laps to go and steadily increased her lead for the win in 16:11.14.

Lady Lion Cleary finished second in 16:20.72, her best this year, and Pavik finished third in 16:44.04.

Only three finals were contested yesterday, and Penn State grabbed a 35-17 lead over second-place Maryland. Morgan State was third in the 27team field with 10.

The meet concludes today.

"We're in pretty good shape, but there are a whole lot of finals still to come," said State coach Gary Schwartz.

Schwartz's Lady Lions are hoping for an Eastern triple crown, a clean sweep of the cross-country, indoor and outdoor track titles in the same year.

The Lady Lions also got secondplace points from Vivian Riddick in the long jump and freshman Elaine Sobansky in the discus.

Riddick led until the last jump when she was passed by Morgan State's Evealene Hatcher, 19-1012 to 19-2.

"Vivian's been having a hard time beating Hatcher, but she had her beat today until that last jump," Schwartz

Sobansky finished behind Maryland's Marita Walton, 162-0 to 140-10. Lady Lion Cheryl Kent took sixth with a spin of 132-3.

"I was disappointed that Marilyn Senz didn't finish up there in the points will be pivotal in the team scoring," Schwartz said.

yesterday, Mills, Cleary and Pavik led from the start with Mills and Cleary running about 77 to 79 seconds per quarter in the middle of the race.

Mary Rawe won the 1,500 meters in 4:20.60, Tammie Hart captured the 400 meters in 53.80 and Marilyn Senz took the javelin with a throw of 46.01 meters for Penn State. The University of Connecticut finished 18th among the 25 teams with 8 points. Shelia McCabe captured fifth place in the 100 meters; Maria Perillo took fifth in the javelin; and Deanna Michaels also took a fifth in the high jump for the Huskies.
