Two IUP Gals Gain AIAW Berths

WORCESTER, Mass. — IUP's Barb Stauffer and Deanna Macreno qualified for the Nov. 12-14 AIAW Division II National Meet Saturday, finishing 17th and 19th respectively in the EIAAW Division II Regional Meet at Holy Cross.

Stauffer's time was 19:00.9 over the 5,000-meter course, while Macreno clocked 19:07.5.

IUP's other finishers included Sally Johnson (22nd, 19:12), Peggy Ruffennach (39th, 19:40) and Mercedes O'Connor (41st, 19:44.8).

The Indiana gals finished sixth in a field of 13 teams with 133 points. Nancy Small of Boston College was the individual winner, traversing the course in 18:04, while Villanova was the top team with 64 points.

3 Blue Hen women qualify for nationals

WORCESTER, Mass. — Sandy Givney, Jody Campbell and Kim Mitchell of the University of Delaware finished in the top 10 of the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women regional cross country meet Saturday to qualify for the national championship meet.

Givney finished second to Nancy Small of Boston College in the 5,000-meter race with a time of 18 minutes 16 seconds. Small's winning time was 18:04.

Campbell finished fourth with a time of 18:44 and Mitchell, a Dickinson High graduate, finished sixth in 18:50.

Delaware finished fifth in the race for the team championship, which was won by Villanova.

The Delaware trio will compete in the national meet Nov. 21 in Pocatello, Idaho.

Harriers Prepare for Nationals

Everything went according to schedule for Villanova's women's cross country team. Earlier in the season first year Coach Bob [unclear] laid out his plan for the season, to peak for the championship meets in order to earn a berth to the AIAW Championships. Last Saturday at Worcester, Massachusetts the women came away with the meet honors, much to the surprise of local West Chester and other teams sure that Villanova would not be that competitive.

Mary Ellen McGowan (18:37.0) led the squad to their 64 point finish, 11 points ahead of second place Boston College. McGowan is a freshman who has proved infinitely valuable to the 1981 squad, scoring in all the meets and

posting more than one first place among Villanova finishers. She finished in the seventh position.

Also scoring for Villanova in order of their respective finishes were: Eva Maria Berardi (18:45.2), Carol Gilsinger (18:54.4), Sue Shea (18:58.0) and Bev Reilly (19:13.3). Amelia Cain ran in the sixth position, finishing well up in the pack with a time of 19:31.1. Another important event

of the day was Villanova's 23 point spread over fourth place West Chester. It was the first time this season that the Wildcats had

crossed the line before their local rivals.

The first place finish at the Easterns has Villanova running toward the AIAW Division II National Championships one week from now in Pocatello, Idaho. But the women plan to be ready to meet the challenge, not only of the tough national competition but of the difficulty of running in the high altitudes.

High altitudes cut the runner's supply of oxygen, making the change from the low altitudes very difficult. However, the Wildcats

have been preparing for that for three weeks now as they do some of their track and road work outs in PO² masks. These masks, which cover the girls faces, cut their oxygen intake by one-half. Lightweight tanks on their backs regulate the flow of oxygen.

The trip to Idaho is hard won yet well prepared for. The women had an impressive finish in the Eastern Regionals and have trained carefully for the high altitudes of the mid-west. They are looking to victory in the National Championships.

SUNY-BINGHAMTON freshman Becky Williams earned All-East AIAW honors for her ninth place in the Eastern AIAW Division III N.Y.-New England run at Worcester, Mass. Williams' 19:24 was 1:01 behind winner Jackie McNiff of Holy Cross. Williams, from Madison, Wisc., and SUNY soph Marilyn Milligan (17th) qualified for AIAW nationals Nov. 21 at Idaho State. The Colonials were fourth in a 13-team field led by Holy Cross.

Army runners place second

WORCESTER, Mass. — Army, led by Wendy Anderson's fifth-place showing, finished second Saturday in the Eastern AIAW Division III Women's Cross Country Championship.

Holy Cross won the race with 41 points, followed by Army's 61. By finishing in the top two, the Cadets qualified for the National AIAW Division III championship in Pocatello, Idaho in two weeks.

Anderson ran the 5,000-meter (3.1 miles) course in 19:09. Laura Meche of Army was 13th in 19:35, Joan Foulkrod was 14th in 19:37 and Harlene Nelson was 15th in 19:38.

Jackie McDuff of Holy Cross won the race in 18:23.

Kate Wiley of Harvard took the individual title and teammate Darlene Beckford finished third as Harvard won the EAIA Women's Cross Country Regional Championships Saturday at Holy Cross. Harvard won with 33 points. The University of Rhode Island was next with 86 and the University of Pennsylvania was third with 115. The three teams qualified for the nationals.

Cornell women 10th in meet

Cornell's women's cross country team closed out its season by placing 10th out of 15 teams at the EIAW championships Saturday at Worcester, Mass.

Harvard was team champion with 33 points and also had the top individual in Kate Wiley, who ran the five-kilometer course in 17:39.2. Following the Crimson were Rhode Island (86), Penn (115), Princeton (118) and Rutgers (150). Cornell had 207.

The Big Red's top runners were Margie Coffin, 28th in 19:04.6, and Kathy McPherson, 31st in 19:08.8.

Cornell finished 1-1 in duals and had a first in the Binghamton Invitational. Seven of its top eight runners will return next fall.
