Lady Lions Take EIAAW Crown

Vivian Riddick won just about everything in sight this weekend to help lead the Penn State women's track and field team to the Eastern AIAW team championship in a meet held at St. John's.

Penn State finished with 177 $\frac{1}{4}$ points to easily outdistance second-place Princeton with 64. Rutgers was third with 55 and St. John's was fourth with 50. Powers Maryland and Morgan State skipped the meet.

"Vivian had a stellar meet," said Lady Lion Coach Gary Schwartz. "She won the long jump (19-6 $\frac{3}{4}$) Saturday, and then won the 100, 200 and ran on the winning 4x100 relay team today."

Riddick, who missed workouts most of the week to attend the funeral of her fiance's father, won the 100 meters in a school record and NCAA-qualifying time of 11.85. She took the 200 in a personal record 24.33, and then joined Sue Lindner, Tammie Hart and Stephanie Weeks to take the 400 relay in a school record 46.71.

Terry Pioli blasted Princeton's Monica Eguono to win the 800, 2:09.30 to 2:11.2.

In the 1500 Patty Murnane outkicked Har-

vard's Mary Hearlihy, 4:19.91 to 4:23.20.

"In the three years I've been working with Patty that's one of her most impressive races," Schwartz said. "The 1500 was probably the strongest race depth-wise in the meet."

Elaine Sobansky won the shot put at 52-2, and she set a personal record by winning the discus with a spin of 154-3. Marilyn Senz was second in the discus with a 152-8. Senz also repeated as Eastern javelin champ with a toss of 153-10.

Hart pulled an impressive double with just 55 minutes of rest. She finished second to Lori McCaulley of Rutgers in the flat 400, 53.63 to 54.71, and then came back to finish second in a school record 59.56 in the 400 intermediate hurdles. Patricia Melton of Yale won in 59.05.

Margaret Wynne of Yale won the 3,000 in 9:31.70, outkicking Paula Renzi, 9:32.74.

West Virginia's Kathy Warlow won the 10,000 in 37:20, while Natalie Updergrove was second in 37:52.

Yesterday's win marked the second year in a row that Penn State has captured both indoor and outdoor Eastern AIAW titles.

Harvard All-America runner Mary Herlihy had quite a successful weekend for herself at the EIAAW Championships. The senior from Worcester finished second in the 1500 meters with a personal best of 4:22 and paced the 2-mile relay team, which won in the record time of 8:53.

Rutgers' McCauley Excels

The outstanding performance of the Eastern AIAW championships may have been the 5,471-point heptathlon by Boston University junior Julie White of Great Britain, but the most compelling performance was the personal heptathlon staged by Rutgers junior Lori McCauley. The National AIAW indoor quarter-mile champion ran seven races in the two-day meet at St. John's, including an easy 53.63 victory in the 400 meters and a 53.7 anchor leg that gave Rutgers' 4 x 400-meter relay team a come-from-behind victory.

Without Maryland, Penn State easily defended its team title, led by sprinter Vivian Riddick's three victories.
