## Vermont's Goddette Wins Eastern Javelin

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Shelly Goddette won the javelin, Katrina Geurkink took a third and a fourth, and Chris Boehmer captured a fifth place Sunday to highlight Vermont's performances in the Eastern Intercollegiate Association for Women's track and field championships at Georgetown University.

Goddette, a Rice Memorial graduate, set a UVM record of 47.72 meters (156 feet, 6 inches) to top the field. It was Goddette's personal best by more than five feet and put her

comfortably ahead of Tina Arcaro of Temple, who finished second at 46.10.

Geurkink placed third in the shot put with a heave of 13.84 meters (45-5 feet) and fourth in the discus with a toss of 44.26 meters (145-12½ feet). Elaine Sobansky of Penn State won both of those events and Penn State also captured the team title.

Boehmer took her fifth place in the long jump. She had a leap of 5.61 meters (18-5 feet) to trail winner Vivian Riddick of Penn State (19-9¾ feet).

# Lady Lions Win Easily

Elaine Sobansky scored 20 points, Vivian Riddick accounted for 18 and Marilyn Senz picked up 16 as Penn State's track and field team buried the rest of the competition in the annual Eastern Championships at Washington, D.C., yesterday.

The Lady Lions of Coach Gary Schwartz scored 125½ points and beat runner-up Boston University by 70½ points. Villanova was third with 43 and Pitt was fourth with 42. Thirty-eight schools competed.

"Maryland and Harvard didn't show up," Schwartz said last night. "But the one-day format helped us. We could keep throwing fresh people into the events. Team depth and team spirit were the keys."

For State, it was title No. 6 in the last eight years.

"We're going to go to a two-day meet next season," Schwartz said.

Sobansky won the shot (53 feet) and discus (156-10), Riddick won the long jump (19-9¾) and placed fourth in the 100 and 200.

"Had I known beforehand," Schwartz said, "I could have pulled Vivian out of the 100 or the 200 and

let her concentrate on one sprint. She was the workhorse. It was hot and humid here."

Paula Renzi of State gained NCAA qualifying in the 5,000, winning the event in 16:31.1.

Senz placed in three field events, her best effort being a second in the discus, five feet and five inches behind Sobansky.

Natalie Updegrave of State won the 10,000 in 35:08 and Doreen Startare won the metric mile in 4:23.3. She also ran the anchor leg on the winning 3,200 relay team in 2:10.7.

"Doreen had to run the 1,500 twice and then the 800 leg on the relay," Schwartz said.

Heidi Gerken (2:12.5), Judy Cassel (2:16.7) and Beth Stever (2:13.7) also ran on the 4 x 800 team.

State's Hanna Humphreys placed fourth in the long jump with a leap of 18-7¾, a personal best.

The Lady Lion Open will be staged at Nittany Lion Track Sunday. It will be the team's final meet before the NCAAs at Austin, Texas next month.

the winner ... Junior **Julie White** won the high jump competition to help lead the BU women's track team to a second place finish at this weekend's EIAAW championships at Georgetown University. White jumped 5-9¾ to lead the Terriers to the runnerup spot behind Penn State. Penn State had 125 points, BU had 55 and Villanova was third with 43.

**Local Lines:** Gail Counts and Renee Henderson led Pitt to a fourth-place finish among 37 teams in the EIAW Outdoor Track Championships at Georgetown. Counts won the 100-meter dash in 12.30 with Henderson second at 12.45. Pitt took the 400-meter relay in 47.36 with Sue Torre, Counts, Marsha Hawkins and Henderson. In the 200 meters, Henderson was second in 24.7 and Counts third in 24.9.

## Tigers' Shriver holds second in heps

Towson State's Tina Shriver held on to second place going into today's final three events in the heptathlon with 2,994 points in the Eastern AIAW Division I track and field championships at Georgetown University.

Shriver took first in one of the four events yesterday, tossing the shot 38 feet 5½ inches. Sharon Pfister of West Virginia University leads the competition with 3,035 points, while Lafayette's Sharon Lukenday is in third with 2,850 points.

## Shriver takes heptathlon

Towson State University sophomore Tina Shriver won the Eastern AIAW heptathlon at Georgetown University with 5,041 points yesterday, edging West Virginia's Sharon Pfister, who had 5,040 points.

Shriver placed first in the shot put with a toss of 38.5 feet, and was second in the high jump, long jump, and the javelin. She finished fourth in the high hurdles, along with a fifth-place finish in the 200 meters and 10th in the 800 meters.
