Lions Take 12th at IC4A Championships

Penn State placed three runners in the top 60 and had to settle for 12th place in the annual IC4A Cross Country Championships at Lehigh yesterday.

The Lions scored 267 points as N Dwight Stephens placed 16th. His time for the 10,000-meter race was 31:00 flat.

Villanova won teams honors at both the IC4A and Region 2 levels. The Wildcats scored 142 points to capture the IC4A title and a spot in the NCAA meet scheduled for the same Saucon Valley course in Bethlehem a week from tomorrow.

Ray O'Flynn of Providence won the event in 30:05.

Other Lion scorers were Paul Mackley (28th in 31:14), Gary Black (58th in 31:36), Bob Hudson (83rd in 32:08) and Clark Haley (87th in 32:10).

"We ran pretty much the same as we have all season," Coach Harry Groves of the Lions said.

Bill Reifsnyder of Bucknell fin-

ished 15th and qualified for the national meet. His time was 30:57, two spots ahead of teammate Brian Harshman (31:02).

Forty-three teams participated and 340 runners competed.

Steve Shisler of Penn State won the JV race with a time of 32:06.

The Lions finished ninth in the Region 2 meet, scoring 184 points. Villanova won top honors with 97. Dartmouth won Region 1 honors with 51.

BETHLEHEM, Pa. - Villanova scored an upset in the men's division and Penn State took the women's title in the IC4A cross-country championships. Villanova's men finished with 142 points, to 149 for runner-up Dartmouth. Favored Fairleigh Dickinson was sixth with 188. Richard O'Flynn of Providence won the men's individual title in 30 minutes. 5 seconds for the 10,000-meter course on which the NCAA championships will be held a week from tomorrow. Villanova's scorers were Gerard O'Reilly, second in 30:28; Marcus O'Sullivan, sixth in 30:39; Brian O'Keefe, 24th in 31:09, Anthony O'Reilly, 51st in 31:30, and Sean

O'Neill, 62d in 31:40.
