## Blue Hen women 15th in NCAA cross country

BETHLEHEM, Pa. — The University of Delaware, with Barbara Woodruff its top runner, finished 15th in the NCAA Region II women's cross-country championships held Saturday at Lehigh University.

Delaware finished with 115 points in the 25-team field. Penn State finished first with 23 points followed by Villanova with 73 points.

Villanova's GTE Academic All-American Vicki Huber, a graduate of Concord High, won the overall race with a clocking of 16:33.

Woodruff, with a personal best time of 19:21, on the 3.2 mile Lehigh course, placed 77th in a field of 163 Region II runners, and was the top Blue Hen place finisher.

Other Delaware runners with their place and times were: Karin Skoglund, 81st, 19:25; Jenniffer Wiest, 90th, 19:39; Michele Socorso, 98th, 19:54; Cheryl Amin, 105th, 20:12; and Kristin Heras, 114th, 20:31. Yale captured the ECAC championship behind the two-three finish of Kelly Groteke and Sarah Smith.

Vicki Huber of Villanova won the 5,000-meter race in 16 minutes, 33 seconds. Liz Brendan of Georgetown

was fourth and Tina Maloney of Providence placed fifth. Groteke was clocked in 17:03; Smith in 17:04.

Following Yale (52 points) in the team standings were Providence (108), Penn State (144), Villanova (153) and Harvard (166). UConn, with 283 points, placed 10th.

Kim Hawkes led the UConn contingent, finishing 34th in 17:59. Lisa Wakem was 40th and Amy Freder-

icks placed 57th.

In women's competition, Bucknell sophomore Judy Perry, the East Coast Conference champion, finished 11th in the District 2 meet and 28th in the ECAC meet with a time of 17:49. BU was sixth in the district and 12th in the ECAC.

Vicki Huber of Villanova was the winner in 16:33. Penn State won the district title with 65 points, followed by Villanova, 75; Princeton, 81; Georgetown, 102; Cornell, 129; and Bucknell, 186. Yale won the ECAC with 52 points. Providence well back with 108. Penn State, 144; Villanova, 153; and Harvard, 166, completed the top five.
