No Surprise As Men's Team Wins IC4As

BETHLEHEM, Pa. — The Dartmouth men's cross country team, a surprise winner of the IC4A championship one year ago, lost the element of surprise this year. It didn't matter, however, as the Big Green repeated its victory showing Saturday to qualify as a team for the NCAA national championships Nov. 23, at Virginia.

Senior Bob Kempainen finished second and junior Tom Paskus was third to pace Dartmouth's win. The Big Green finished with 39

points, Penn State was second with 78 while Brown was third with 117.

Kempainen, the team captain, stuck with the eventual winner, Penn State's Eric Carter, until less than a mile was left in the race. Carter pulled away to win the 10,000-meter race in a time of 30:34. Kempainen finished second at 30:41. Paskus was third at 30:48.

Other Dartmouth scorers were junior Mike Donaghu, who finished seventh at 31:04, and junior Brian Lenihan and sophomore Ron Faith, who finished together — 13th and 14th — at 31:31.

Led by Eric Carter, who won with a time of 30:34, Penn State placed first in the NCAA Region I championships at Lehigh with 38 points to 68 by runner-up Georgetown. Pitt placed fifth in the 32-team field with 206 points, its first finisher **Paul Friedrich**, who was 41st.

The Dartmouth men's cross country team won the IC4A championship and the District I NCAA qualifier and Yale won the women's ECAC championship and the NCAA District I qualifier Saturday at Lehigh University in Bethlehem, Pa.

In the IC4A competition, Dartmouth finished with 39 points, followed by Penn State (78), Brown (117), Georgetown (125) and Bucknell (204). Connecticut finished 17th with 472 points.

The top five individual finishers were Eric Carter of Penn State, Robert Kempaninen of Dartmouth, Tom Paskus of Dartmouth, Chris Schille of Brown and Rick Granquist of Rutgers. The times were not available.

Gary Giffen was the first UConn runner to finish, placing 50th. Runningmates Andrew Ball placed 66th and Sal Ulto was 96th.

Robert Kempainen finished second and Thomas Paskus third behind Penn State's Eric Carter to pace Dartmouth to its second straight IC4A cross-country championship yesterday in Bethlehem, Pa.

The Big Green totaled 39 points to easily outdistance runner-up Penn State's 78.

Brown, with Chris Schille finishing fourth, wound up third with 117 points. Providence finished sixth with 210 and New England champion University of Massachusetts was seventh at 254.

Dartmouth, Brown and Providence qualified for next week's NCAA championships out of Region 1, as did Penn State, Georgetown and Bucknell from Region 2.

Carter covered the 10-kilometer course in 30:34, besting Kempainen by seven seconds. Paskus ran 30:48 and Schille 30:50.

Hens fail to qualify

BETHLEHEM, Pa. — The University of Delaware finished 23rd Saturday, failing to qualify for the national meet, in the men's Region II NCAA Cross-Country Meet at Lehigh University.

The top three teams in the 10-kilometer event, who qualify for the national tournament, were Penn State first with 38 points, Georgetown second with 68 and Bucknell third with 119. The nationals will be held Nov. 23 at the University of Virginia.

The Hens netted 626 points for the 23rd-place finish.

The top five finishers for the Blue Hens were Jim Chenowith, 83rd in 33:31; Pat Castagno, 124th in 34:31; John Gray, 130th in 34:35; freshman Mike Wallace, 137th in 34:46, and freshman Ken Zebley, 152nd in 35:09.

BETHLEHEM — For the second straight year and seventh in the last 10, Bucknell will send a team to the NCAA cross-country championships.

The Bison qualified for next week's national meet by finishing third in the District 2 meet Saturday at Lehigh. BU also finished fifth in the IC4As.

Steve West led the way for the Bison with a 20th place finish in the IC4A meet, running the 5,000-meter course in 31 minutes, 36 seconds. Eric Carter of District 2 champion Penn State won the race in 30:34.

The NCAA championship meet will be held next Monday at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville.

In the district meet, leader Penn State had 38 points, runner-up Georgetown scored 68 and Bucknell had 119. Navy was fourth with 192 and Pitt was fifth with 206.

In the IC4A, Dartmouth led with 38 points followed by Penn State, 78; Brown, 117; Georgetown, 125; Bucknell, 204; and Providence, 210.

Bucknell's other IC4A finishers were John Floyd, 42nd, 32:11; Mike Krafczyk, 44th, 32:16; Rich Starks, 50th, 32:31; and Jeff Morganti, 59th (time unavailable).
