In the ECAC women's championship held in conjunction with the IC4A race, Emily Germano of Cornell won in 17:40 for the 3.1-mile event.

Ariana Kelly's second-place finish in 17:46 helped Yale to its fourth team title — its first since winning three straight from 1986 to 1988 — with 64 points.

Princeton was second with 89 points and Cornell third with 98.

The Monmouth women finished 17th among the 24 teams in the university division, and Tammy Gazia (20:17) finished as the top Hawk in 75th place.

Rutgers finished seventh overall, led by junior Colleen Sunderland, who ran to sixth place. Toms River North graduate Christy Collins finished 43rd.

The women's ECAC Cross County Championships were run in the same place, and Princeton placed second behind Yale.

The Rutgers women placed seventh with 200 points. Junior Colleen Sunderland led the Lady Knights with a time of 18:13.6 to place sixth.

Seton Hall's women finished eighth in the ECAC, with junior Michelle Henry placing 13th with a time of 19:13.4. Joycelyn Harris of Franklin finished the race in 20:02.3.
