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The Soaring Ram: An Eastern Legend

"I don't think there's any doubt that he's of national caliber, and I think the potential is there someday soon to be world class."

That's Bill Falk talking, and he's referring to an exceptional athlete named Mark Strawderman of the University of Rhode Island.

Falk, of course, is an expert in his own right, one of the nation's foremost authorities in the pole-vault and the very successful head coach of track and cross-country at URI.

His latest vaulting star, one in a long line he's produced over the last 20 or so years as an assistant and now head man at Kingston, is the best yet, and has the credentials to be the best ever.

At 6-feet and 160 pounds, Strawderman is not as spindly as his frame suggests, and is a superior athlete. He holds every vaulting record in the eastern part of the United States, is a two-time All-America and has a personal best of 17' 9 3/4", the highest an eastern athlete has jumped in history.

He first was named an All-American for coming in third at the 1981 indoor NCAA championships hosted by the University of Detroit. He came back this spring and made eastern and Ram track history. At the 1982 NCAA indoor championships held at the Silverdome in Pontiac, MI the URI superstar cleared the same height as national titlist Doug Lytle of Kansas State, but technically finished second in the nation because he had more misses at the height.

Thus Strawderman became the first URI track performer to accomplish the feat in the 17 years that NCAA indoor meets have been held.

A mild-mannered young man who hails from Ashaway, RI, a small village located only a few miles west of the URI campus, Strawderman is an all-around athlete. For example, he's long-jumped 21'9", high-jumped 6'8" and has sprinter's speed.

He's just on the edge of making the "magic" 18-foot vaulting mark, saying he's ready for it, and that "I've been coming real close lately." That's been his goal for quite some time now, even before he came within a quarter-inch in the NCAAAs; in fact even before he soared 17'6".

And to show you just the kind of person he is, when teammates were not available to participate in events other than his specialty, he volunteered to take their place. And he works hard at his sport, as

diligently as any athlete at Kingston. If he isn't lifting weights or doing wind-sprints or running the long miles, he's hard into his first-love... vaulting.

It's interesting to note that Mark really didn't come onto his specialty by design. When he was in the sixth grade, he noticed an older youngster who lived down the street practicing at a backyard vaulting pit. He stopped by to watch one day.

The upshot of it is that when he tried it, he liked it. Two fence posts and a bamboo piece for a bar later, Mark made it over nicely, thank you, and a new star was born. "I think I got up to around eight feet," he smiled, "and I liked the challenge of it."

The irony to the story of his start in the sport is embodied in the person who let him use his pole and pit that day. His name is Wayne Findeisen, and he is the former University of Rhode Island star vaulter whose records have been eclipsed by Strawderman. To add to the irony, they both attended nearby Chariho High School and each was a schoolboy All-Stater in track.

He has won every major pole-vaulting title available in the eastern part of the United States. He took the IC4A indoor championship in three of the four years he competed in the event.

"I think everybody likes to be in the limelight," he said. "But if you like what you're doing, that should be enough. The track people know. They know my name." And so do a lot of other people.

He's won the vaulting crown in the Penn Relays, the Princeton Relays, and the BC Relays, and is a four-time New England titlist in both indoor and outdoor competition. In fact, incredibly, he has reached a goal that no other athlete in eastern track history has achieved, that of holding nearly every meet and facility record in the east, an accomplishment for which the University and its track program is justifiably proud.

Strawderman's naturally been one of the major factors in URI's rise again to track prominence over the last four years.

Strawderman was perhaps the deciding factor, both in point-scoring and as a psychological focus for his teammates, to Rhode Island's 11th place finish -- the best ever for a Ram track team -- in last winter's NCAA indoor meet. That finish was the second highest of any eastern school, with only vaulted Villanova ahead of the Rams.

Mark is the first URI trackster to be named an All-American since Bob Narcessian, now a coach at Brown University, placed first in the hammer throw for the Rams at the 1967 NAAs. Falk said of his superstar... "He also has something else beyond athletic ability. He has no fear. That's important. You can have all the athletic ingredients, but if you're afraid of falling from 17 or 18 feet in the air, you can't make it."

"You think about it sometimes; you know all the things that can happen," Strawderman said of this aspect to his sport, "but you have to remain aggressive. Anything less and you WILL get hurt. Confidence will overcome fear."

He has been hurt upon occasion, but he's come back stronger than ever. In 1980, when he cleared a 16-foot vault, he missed the pit and landed hard on the tip of his spine. Last year he made 17'1½" at Princeton, but crashed between the

mats on his back. And last summer at the NCAA outdoor meet, he landed on the crossbar, knocking out a pair of his front teeth.

He pulled a muscle earlier this spring, which has hampered his work over the past few weeks, but is determined to make a go of the rest of his senior season. "You have to work at anything to be good at it," the likeable Ram said. "But it doesn't seem like work if you're enjoying it. I love it."

Strawderman was named the 1982 recipient of the Albert LeBoeuf Award, symbolic of overall athletic achievement during a person's career at the University of Rhode Island. This coveted award has been given in his memory since 1947 by the family of LeBoeuf, Ram class of 1917, and is considered as the premier male athletic honor at URI.

Rogers & FDU— Thinclad Prophecy

If the Fairleigh Dickinson University track team is able to complete the "IC4A Double" it will be a tribute to the miracles of modern medicine.

"We could do it, but everybody has to be healthy," Coach Russ Rogers said, "and right now it doesn't look very promising. (Ephraim) Serrette and (Randy) Smith are both hurt and that's a lot of points right there. Without them it will be almost impossible."

The Knights won their first IC4A championship in March at Princeton's Jadwin Gymnasium, collecting 56 points. Villanova was runnerup with 47, while Maryland had 43½.

Serrette was the only FDU winner at the indoor meet, winning the 55-meter dash in 6.32. He is also the defending champion outdoors, winning the 100 last year at Villanova in 10.41. Serrette will also run on the 4x100 meter relay team and possibly the 4x400.

Smith finished fifth in the IC4A pentathlon, despite getting injured during the competition. The injury is still healing and Rogers is just hoping to have him ready for the IC4As. Smith, perhaps the best all-around athlete on the team, is capable of scoring points in the hurdles, the long jump and on both relay teams.

"If he's not 100 percent, he won't run," Rogers said, concerning Smith, "no championship is worth ruining a kid. I would probably red shirt him for the season and give him an extra year."

FDU finished runnerup indoors and outdoors 1981, so Rogers would like nothing better than to be No. 1 in both this time around. Last year at this meet, the Knights ended up with 81 points, second to Maryland's 102.

"I don't think it's going to take 102 points to win this year," Rogers said. "Maryland will be in there because of strength in the field events and so will Villanova and Seton Hall. Richmond is also going to get its share, so I think the points will be more spread out."

"I've always gone with quality, more than quantity, because quality is all that matters in the big meets. That's how we won the indoors. We concentrated on the individual events and took a first, four seconds and a third and won it all."

Richard Ouma, the indoor IC4A record holder in the 800 (1:49.18) and the current outdoor champion, will be out to repeat in 1982 against an all-star field which should include teammate Jama Aden, winner of the 800 in the Martin Luther King Games. Julian Spooner of Richmond and John Marshall of Villanova also figure to be in the race, making it one of the most competitive of the meet.

Solomon Chebor, a senior from Kenya, is the defending IC4A and NCAA champion in the steeplechase. He won last year at Villanova in 8:34.2, three seconds ahead of John Gregorek of Georgetown, who figures to provide the bulk of the opposition once again. Clyde Edwards, a junior from Barbados, has developed into one of the top quarter-milers in the country, having won the King Games 400 in 45.60, which was the best time in the country this year, at that time.

"Clyde and Jama are going to be tough to beat the rest of the year," Rogers predicts. "They may lose, but the guy who beats them will know they were in a race. Both are training very hard and they're hungry and that's always a good combination."

Though the Knights also won the mile relay last year in 3:06.19, half of that team, Jack Armour and Mark Taitt, is academically ineligible in 1982.

"We'll have a team in there, but I don't know who the other two runners will be (along with Ouma and Edwards)," Rogers said. "We're also hurt because Oliver Alves (a big factor indoors) has

used up his eligibility. He could have run on the mile relay. But I'm not going to cry, we still have a lot of quality athletes and we're going to be in the hunt."

Rogers is also expecting help from long-jumper Brian Williams, a surprise third place finisher last year at 24'7", sophomore Paul Wright in the 800; sophomore James Igohe in the 1500 and freshman Dwight Oliviere in the triple jump.

When Rogers took over as head coach three years ago, he predicted an IC4A championship within three years. Having made good on that promise Rogers is now hoping to "double my pleasure."

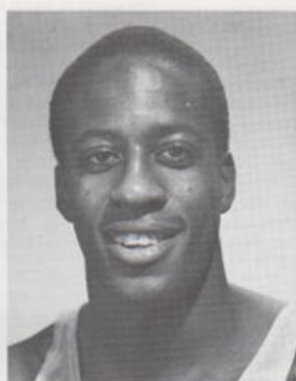

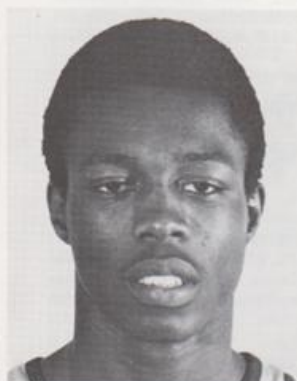
