

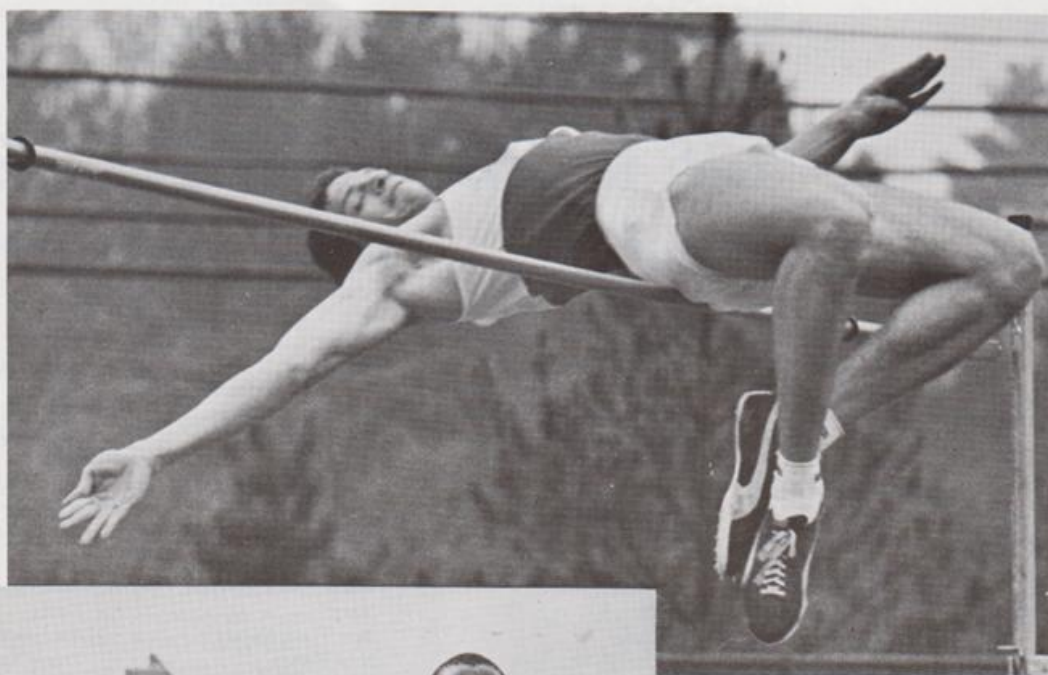

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

When Villanova senior Charles (Chip) Jenkins, Jr. was growing up, there wasn't a shred of evidence in the Jenkins' household that would in any way sway the son of a former Olympian toward a career in track. Charles Jenkins, Sr., Villanova's track coach of five years, left no trace of his gold medals from the 1956 Melbourne Olympics lying around the house. Instead, they were tucked away in a drawer along with the Penn Relays watches and other memorabilia from his sparkling running career at Villanova.

While running under the legendary James "Jumbo" Elliott between 1955-57, Charlie Jenkins enjoyed an illustrious running career at Villanova. With his running career behind him, Jenkins the father knew that Jenkins the son would have to make his own decision about running without any interference -- well, almost.

It is said that actions speak louder than words and Charlie Jenkins probably knew that when he subtly introduced the sport of track to his son Chip. Jenkins put his mementoes away because, he said, "if a kid grows up in that environment it's like growing up in the Hall of Fame. So when Chip grew up, he never got the 'Are you going to run like your dad ran?'"

But unable to break away from track completely, what the elder Jenkins did do was take his son to the University of Maryland where he could watch his father officiate both indoor and outdoor track meets.

"People would come up to me and tell me what a good runner my father was, but it went in one ear

and out the other," said the younger Jenkins. "I think the thing that really excited me about track was that when I was a little kid my father would officiate the indoor and outdoor meets at the University of Maryland and I'd love to watch the people run. I guess that sparked some sort of interest in me to run."

Chip Jenkins' interest in track, much to his father's delight, developed into a passion and by his senior year at Georgetown (MD) Prep School he was being recruited by Georgetown, Seton Hall, Manhattan, C.W. Post, and of course Villanova where his father had just been named head coach of the men's and women's track programs after the death of Jumbo Elliott in 1981. After selecting Villanova, Chip soon found that running for his father would mean that he had to prove himself to his teammates and colleagues, something that worked to his advantage in the long run.

"The only thing that was lacking when I came to Villanova was my prowess in the quarter," Chip stated. "It was just average. When I was a freshman there was a lot of peer pressure from the other runners that helped me to progress in my performances. I didn't feel like I was in the same class as they were and I felt that if I trained hard enough that I would become as good as them if not better."

So far, Chip's rigorous training has paid off. Between his sophomore and junior years his times lowered considerably and in this his senior year, Chip has finally come into his own, much to his delight as well as that of his father and coach.

"I think Chip's weight training and his training

on the track has given him a lot of strength," observed the Villanova mentor. "I used to keep saying to him, 'Chip you've got to be patient.'"

Running high 48.0s and low 49.0s for the 400 meters his freshman year, Chip has shaved his 400 meter times down to low 46.0s and high 45.0s in his senior year. Ranked ninth collegiately on the U.S. 400 meter indoor list (Track & Field News/April, 1986), even more noticeable is his improvement in the 500 meters. Erasing three seconds from his junior year times, Chip lowered his 500 meter personal best to an impressive 1:01.08, which earned him a third place finish in NCAA indoor championships, as well as a ranking of fourth on the 1986 U.S. 500-meter indoor list.

His increased quickness has also paid off for the Villanova team in the relays where during the 1986 seasons he has recorded the fastest split on all but two of the 'Cats' 1600 meter relays. He further highlighted his senior season when he anchored Villanova's 1600 meter relay to a first place finish at the Penn Relays and thus earned his first Penn Relays watch. Since his freshman year, Villanova has won four IC4A team titles, three indoor and one outdoor, has captured the Big East Conference outdoor team title four consecutive years while winning the Big East indoor crown three of four years, and finished runner-up at the NCAA indoor championships twice. In 1985, Chip was invited to compete for the East in the National Sports Festival in Baton Rouge, LA where he ran a personal best 400 meter relay split of 44.9.

An accomplished high school sprinter from Cambridge, Massachusetts, when Charlie Jenkins was recruited by Villanova coach Jumbo Elliott in the 50's, he had less to prove than his son did.

"There was no one in my family that was an athlete to be compared to," recalled Dr. Jenkins. "I didn't have all the pressures placed on me that Chip had on him, and I didn't work as hard as Chip works either."

Recognized most often for his Olympic accomplishments, Charlie became Villanova's first in a long line of Olympic Gold medal winners by capturing the gold in the 400 meters at the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne, Australia. Capturing the 400 meter and adding another gold medal after running the third leg of the U.S. first place finishing 1600 meter relay, to this day, Charlie remains Villanova's lone double gold medal winner in the Olympics. In his three seasons of varsity track at Villanova, (freshmen weren't eligible to run varsity then) Charlie won five IC4A individual titles and established an indoor world record for 500 meters in 1956. The eight Penn Relays watches that clutter a drawer in his home were captured in just three years, as he and his teammates started Villanova's

domination at the Penn Relays by winning the Wildcats first title in 1956.

Charlie Jenkins is one of the few people in life that set high goals for himself and had the satisfaction of accomplishing those goals, and 30 years later, he has had the opportunity to watch his son do the same.

"I guess Chip and I are similar in the sense that once we get our sights set on something we get absorbed in it. The Olympics were probably the single most important thing in my life at the time. But life doesn't stand still and so it becomes necessary to bask in that glory for a relatively short time -- put those gold medals in the drawer where they belong and move on," remarked Jenkins. "But I think that Chip will improve even more and have a great future in running if he maintains the same kind of enthusiasm and diligence he has in the past."

Little will change for the Jenkins' after Chip's graduation from Villanova earlier this month, 30 years after his father graduated. Chip Jenkins will continue his running career while attending Law School at Villanova and Charlie Jenkins will continue to play a key role in his son's development on the track as his mentor. Charlie and Chip share a unique relationship. The part that both have personally played in the development of Villanova's track tradition has made them more than father-son, more than coach and athlete. It has strengthened their bond of friendship.

NOTRE DAME AND THE IC4A's

Notre Dame.

Those two words connote athletic tradition to many American sports fans. They think of footballs on a crisp, clear fall afternoon. Or, basketballs pounding the hardwood during the snowy winter months.

Yet tradition may not be found anywhere as strongly as in the Fighting Irish track program.

Little more than Indian villages and fur trading posts dotted the Indiana prairie in 1842 when the young Reverend Edward F. Sorin, C.S.C., traveled from France to found the University of Notre Dame. What started with a single log building in bad repair has grown into a 1,250-acre campus with twin lakes, wooded areas, and 107 buildings.

The track program also has grown. From former Olympian and longtime Irish coach Alex Wilson and most notably during the past decade under head coach Joe Piane.

Now in his 11th season at the controls of both the track and cross country teams, Piane's skills have given the Irish runners a widely-respected reputation throughout the country. Season records, individual performances and level of competition have been strengthened in both sports since his arrival in 1975.

Under Piane's direction came Notre Dame's first subfour-minute miler, 1981 graduate Chuck Aragon, a track All-American.

"I definitely feel our cross country and track reputations have risen in recent years," says the 37-year-old Piane. "And a lot of that is due to the recognition people like Chuck Aragon have gotten. We've got a ways to go yet, but our program is really growing."

Just recently senior Tim Tyler became Notre Dame's, and Piane's, second sub-four-minute miler. The Norwood, N.Y. native turned in a 3:42.16 clocking for the 1500-meters which converts to just under four minutes for the mile.

More tradition? Perhaps. But there are already many established customs for the Irish thinclads.

Notre Dame annually competes in the Indiana Intercollegiate meet and for 60 years has been part of the Central Collegiate Conference -- created by the legendary, and also track coach, Knute Rockne.

But the date that Piane and his athletes point to with pride is the annual IC4A indoor and outdoor championships.

Notre Dame is the only non-Eastern school to regularly compete in the nation's oldest conference.

"For years the meet was the mythical national championship," notes Piane. "Before the NCAAs this was the meet that brought together the best of the nation's track and field competitors. It always has had the best competition but now its limited to the Eastern schools, and us."

During the early '50s, the growing importance of the Pacific Coast track championships, and travel expenses, ended West Coast school participation along with most of the rest of the country. Ironically, in 1958 Wilson took the first Fighting Irish team to the prestigious event.

"There weren't any qualifying standards then, it's my recollection that they just went," says Wilson's assistant from 1958, Robert Smith. "Alex would take the boys when he felt he had a team worth taking. I guess at least one person would go each year."

Smith, a four-year track monogram winner and captain of Wilson's first squad in 1950, also noted that most of the team's scholarship athletes came from the East Coast and that the trips served as a valuable recruiting tool.

The tradition lives on.

"We recruit heavily in the East and the IC4As give our program exposure and lets our kids return home to race," says Piane. "Our kids get something that most Midwestern teams don't have -- an opportunity to run against Eastern schools like Villanova, George Mason, and the Ivy League. As a coach I really enjoy it and I'm sure the kids do too."

"I enjoy the IC4As because I'm from the East," says junior Jeff Van Wie from Suffern, N.Y. "We get a lot of people supporting us because so many of our team members are from the East. It's also fun because the meet assembles the finest teams in the Eastern Region and I like that kind of competition."

"It takes good qualifying times to get into the IC4As and once you're there you're facing the cream of the crop," adds Salinas, Calif., native Gary LeKander. "For most of our team it's the highlight of the season."

"But according to Piane there is more to the IC4A

championships than just highlights...they are important training goals as well.

"Our kids are more in tune with IC4A standards than the NCAAs," comments Pianne. "For most of our kids that's a terminal meet and for a vast majority of our people that's a realistic objective as opposed to the NCAAs.

"That's not to say we don't have some NCAA caliber competitors but for many it's an attainable goal. You've got to be able to maintain IC4A levels on a regular basis before going to nationals. It's a sort of stepping stone for our kids." LeKander agrees, "Not everyone can get to the NCAAs so the IC4As are a goal that adds something to the season for everyone."

Traditionally Notre Dame has been very strong in the middle distance events and this year is no exception. The Irish two-mile relay unit headlines the list of Pianne's participants in the IC4As.

The foursome consists of Van Wie and Tyler along with senior co-captain John McNelis, (East Northport, N.Y.), and junior Robert Nobles, (Baton Rouge, La.). As a group they have left their mark on the Notre Dame record books by winning the Terrier Classic at Boston and the prestigious Drake Relays. The team also garnered All-American status indoors by placing third at the NCAAs with a school record of 7:21.01 on the metric oval.

Despite all of the on-the-track success of the Irish, and especially this relay team, Pianne takes his greatest pride in the other side of Notre Dame tradition -- academics.

"The accomplishments of our relay team are

phenomenal but what can make you really proud is their performance in the classroom as well," states Pianne. "McNelis and Tyler are in engineering, which is probably one of the toughest majors anywhere, and Van Wie has recently made the dean's list in the College of Business. Nobles also does a fine job in business, that's what makes this a great place."

Admission is highly competitive at Notre Dame with about five applicants for each freshman class position. About 75 percent of those accepted were in the top 10 percent of their high school classes.

"Students come here to be students first, athletes second," says Pianne. "We don't force them into a major that's more convenient for track, they follow a program to prepare them for later life. What I feel is impressive is that something like 99.9 percent of our student-athletes who stay for four years leave with a degree."

Pianne beams with pride as he speaks of the academic accomplishments of his present team and names of the past like Aragon and Steve Dziabis (class of 1983). They each achieved All-America status and have gone on to medical school.

Spectators and competitors at the 1986 IC4A outdoor championships will have a unique opportunity when McNelis, Nobles, Van Wie, and Tyler take to the track along with the rest of the Irish squad. They can view that unique blend of athletics and academics which is so much a part of that tradition, a part of those two words -- Notre Dame.

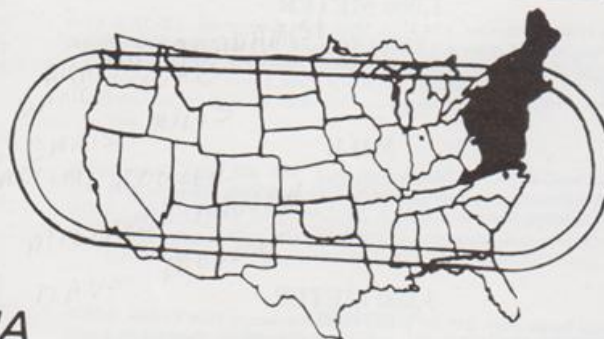
