The Bushnell Years

The Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America, starting with seven colleges, in its inaugural championships of 1876, was the country's oldest track and field organization when it was invited to join 13 assorted Eastern college leagues in a conglomerate called the Central Office for Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics in 1938.

All those separate groups weren't admittedly, an efficient way for the Eastern establishment to run its intercollegiate sports programs in football, basketball, baseball, track, swimming, fencing, wrestling, et. al. It was a crisis that triggered a change. Walter R. Okeson, chairman of the Football Rules Committee, and commissioner of the Eastern Intercollegiate Football Association, whose chief function was the assignment of officials, decided that his duties were too burdensome for a treasurer of Lehigh University.

So, a cluster of athletic directors decided it was time for a centralized office which would not only take over the vital assignment of officials but operate the various leagues as well. The committee assigned to the project was headed by James Lynah, the Cornell A.D., and included Asa S. Bushnell, Princeton Class of '21, the Tiger's graduate manager of athletics.

When Bushnell was tapped for the job of executive director of the COEIA, the football officials did not cheer the idea of getting a "boss" who had not been a football player, coach or official.

Similarly, a prestigious organization like the IC4A, which had been running its championships for 62 years, did not relish the idea of giving up its sovereignty.

In fact, the IC4A joined the new conglomerate for a one-year trial only on assurance, written into the COEIA constitution, that its identity would not be lost in the sports complex, that the Central Office would have no influence in the policies or affairs of the IC4A and that the cost of administration to the IC4A would not be increased over what it was in the year before the birth of the COEIA.

As one who was present at the creation, I had my

own doubts about letting the athletic directors take over the IC4A, which, it seemed to me, was flourishing under the stewardship of Old Grads and undergraduates who served as officers and handled the details of meet management.

Progress, however, would not be denied. Luckily, the new COEIA had Bushnell to do an uncharted task.

Bushnell won over those football officials, and, as the new secretary-treasurer and permanent Meet Director of the IC4A, launched a new era for the country's oldest track organization.

Did I say permanent? Well, 33 years. Bushnell's regime as Director of the IC4A championships comes to an end with these 94th Annual Outdoor Intercollegiate. He retires July 1 as commissioner of the Eastern College Athletic Conference (which is what the COEIA became in 1947), and will become Commissioner Consultant when George L. Shiebler succeeds him.

Unlike the football people who looked askance at a fellow who hadn't been a player, coach or official, the track people had no reservations about Bushnell running the IC4A. True, he had not been a trackman or coach, but, by gosh, no one could direct a track meet better than ASB. He had launched the Princeton Invitation meet in 1934 as an attraction for Alumni Day and crowds up to 50,000 had packed Palmer Stadium. His six-event program, assembling the best available talent, was a model of its kind.

Jack Lovelock made Bushnell a track fan. As Princeton athletic director, Bushnell put on the Oxford-Cambridge vs Princeton-Cornell dual meet in 1933. Of course, you remember that one. Lovelock, a slender trim blond Oxonian out of New Zealand, ran the first world-record mile (4:07.6) on U.S. soil since 1915, and the Tiger's own Bill Bonthron, seven yards back in 4:08.7, also bettered the world record. The thrill of that mile gave birth to the Princeton Invitation the next year when Glenn Cunningham lowered the world record to 4:06.7, beating Bonthron, and Ben Eastman within the hour broke the world 880 record. Jumbo Jim Elliott will not forgive me if I fail to mention that he was a participant in the 440 that day.

As a track director Bushnell once sent coach Matty Geis on a turn-around round trip by ship to England just to get the signed entry of Lovelock for the 1935 Princeton meet in which he beat Cunn-

ham again as a step toward psyching Glenn out of the 1936 Olympic 1500-meter title a year later.

No, the IC4A had no doubts about Bushnell's qualifications to run the IC4A championships in big-league style.

Bushnell has also directed 33 indoor IC4A meets. Parenthetically, it can be noted that Bushnell's last indoor IC4A meet ended a 37-year run in Madison Square Garden, old and new. For it is being announced today that the 1971-72-73 IC4A indoor meets will be held as a two-day event in Princeton's Jadwin Gymnasium, where the track is larger (8-laps) and wider (6 lanes) and roomy enough for a meet that attracts 65 or more colleges.

Bushnell as commissioner and as IC4A executive has been an administrator and mediator, never a dictator. He has been true to his pledge of 1938 to maintain the identity of each group affiliated with the ECAC. He is proudest of ECAC achievements in standardizing eligibility; of producing an atmosphere of mutual trust and faith, by and large, among his constituents; of modernizing the whole laborious business of schedule-making (through schedule-making conventions); of providing consistent professional management of the multiple championship tournaments and meets, and of assuring that officiating is non-partisan to a degree undreamed-of when he took over.

From 53 colleges in 1947, the ECAC has grown to 199 colleges (a 200th applicant waits admission), with 23 affiliated sports groups, the biggest of them insofar as competitive sports is concerned being the IC4A with 85 colleges. There is nothing like the

ECAC in the United States, and no regional track group like the IC4A.

One eminent critic in 1938 was sure such a super organization, though so much smaller then than now, would collapse under its own weight. The ECAC conducts not only the IC4A championships but also the Heptagonals and Metropolitan Intercollegiates in track, the National Invitation, Holiday Festival and Quaker City Festival in basketball, Holiday hockey tournaments, Intercollegiate Rowing Association and EARC regattas in rowing, championships in fencing, wrestling, golf, swimming and gymnastics, but also arranges some 11,500 individual officiating assignments a year in some 4,000 contests in various sports. Among its officials the ECAC conducts written examinations on rules and procedures, screens them and establishes their qualifications, instructs them in clinics and rates their performances.

"His has been the glistening work of an organizational artist who achieves things quietly and well," is a tribute from Robert J. Kane, Cornell athletic director, who ran a 440 in a Bushnell-directed Princeton meet and succeeded him as U.S. Olympic Committee secretary.

In his periodic bulletins during football seasons, Bushnell has pithily advised the officials: "Serve with maximum efficiency but always unobtrusively."

That has been the Bushnell credo. Working tirelessly and coatlessly (showing his colorful suspenders), Bushnell has managed to collect a monumental pile of papers, letters, documents which rise in stacks on his desk and all around him. His wit is unobtrusive, too. Getting ready to depart the ECAC scene that he created, he wryly notes, "The old orderly disorder (of my office) has given way to disorderly disorder."

Well, as a lifetime Princeton resident, Asa now won't have far to go to see the Indoor IC4A championships •

Only in the IC4A

There are many big track meets in the East each year, meets with bigger names and faster times and larger crowds than the IC4A. No matter. The IC4A championships, indoors and outdoors, are special.

Only in a meet such as this would a Ron Delany drive himself to the point of exhaustion by doubling in the 1000 and the two mile, passing up his best race—the mile—to help his school win the team title.

Only in a meet such as this can an athlete be a hero by placing third or fourth or even fifth.

Only in a meet such as this does track and field, a very personal, very individual sport, become a one-for-all, all-for-one team affair.

The fight for the team title—and, indeed, the fight to merely score an IC4A point—has produced marvelous drama over the years.

Only in these championships can a dispute over whether a man finished third or fourth in a hurdles race steal the headlines from the men who finished first. It happened in the 1959 indoor IC4A meet, when Penn State and Manhattan finished a fraction of a point apart.

Only here can a coach charge—probably with merit—that an incorrect announcement over the public address system cost his team the championship. It happened at Villanova Stadium in 1960 when the two points for a fourth-place finish in the hurdles by Penn's Rick Cuthbert were added to the Penn State total.

The correct score was Penn State 34½, Villanova 33, but the announced score was 36½-to-33 as the runners lined up for the climactic mile relay.

"Penn State needs fourth place to clinch the team title," the announcer said, and Penn State got third. A recheck showed the Nittany Lions really needed second, and they lost by half a point.

"I'll never forget that day," said Penn's Jim

Tuppeny, who was a Villanova assistant then. "I thought we'd lost. I was sitting on a water can in the infield, almost in tears . . . From that day I always kept score myself."

Only in the IC4A championships can a coach of a team that has no chance to win enjoy the thrill of leading the pack for several hours. There was the 1962 indoor meet when Penn, which wasn't expected to score a point, went to dinner leading Villanova, which was expected to score a lot of points, 3-0.

"Do you think you can hold the lead?" a man asked Penn coach Boo Morcom after a long jumper named Ron Hines had contributed the three afternoon points.

"We'll give it all we have," Morcom replied with a straight face as he checked the time schedule. "I know one thing. They can't catch us for at least four hours . . ."

A few track meets do the emotions run as high as they do at the IC4As, where winning coaches are frequently carried off the track on their athletes' shoulders and losing coaches occasionally get as upset as Jumbo Elliott did in 1961, the year Villanova lost the indoor title on a disqualification in the mile relay.

"I'm a hard loser," Elliott stormed after the galling, one-point defeat to Yale. "This stuff about being a good loser is for the birds . . . Still, I figured I went out of my way to be a good loser," he added, "in the sense I didn't punch anybody in the nose."

Such commendable restraint has undoubtedly been exercised by others. Certainly Maryland's Jim Kehoe was angry the night Tuppeny congratulated him on a victory his team didn't achieve.

"I thought I saw Maryland kids finish second and third in the 60," Tuppeny recalled. "It wasn't Maryland, though. Just the same color jerseys. We (Villanova) won the title. He was upset."

Larry James: Golden Boy

Delaware Valley track fans have been spoiled by Larry James.

The lanky Villanova team captain wins so often and makes it look so easy his fantastic performances for the Wildcats usually are not appreciated.

Since arriving at the Main Line campus from White Plains, N. Y., James has developed into one of the world's top quartermilers and helped Villanova win four IC4A track titles.

Larry could help the Wildcats make it five this weekend and become the all-time IC4A gold medal winner in the process.

His first indoor medal was earned as a shaky sophomore in 1968 and since then the Mighty Burner has picked up 11 pieces of gold in IC4A competition. Barney Ewell, who ran for Penn State in 1940, 1941 and 1942, is the leading gold miner, with 12. Leslie MacMitchell, the N.Y.U. star, who won his medals from the 440 (relay) to cross country, also gained 11 in 1940-42.

It hasn't been as easy as it appears for James. People think he should be breaking a record every time he steps on a track. A brilliant sophomore year made it impossible to please the fans as a junior and senior.

"No matter where you go," James says, "people expect more than you feel you can produce. It's hard to please, you can't get records all the time."

James, who was recruited by Jim Tuppeny, the present Penn coach, set his first records as part of the 440 and 880 relay teams at White Plains.

"He wasn't even the best in his school," recalls Tuppeny. "Otis Hill was the best. We liked Larry as a hurdler and a triple jumper and felt he might work in as part of a relay team."

The skinny youngster, who was only No. 2 in high school, worked in quite well. He put on the blue and white Villanova uniform and began working harder. It wasn't long until he became No. 1.

He helped the Wildcats set the Penn Relay frosh mile record in his rookie campaign, then blossomed into world class competition as a sophomore.

Larry won IC4A and NCAA indoor titles that second season but made his first real impression on Philadelphia fans with a brilliant 43.9 anchor leg in the Penn Relays.

That performance enabled Villanova to beat favored Rice in the mile relay and win five major carnival championships, a feat the Wildcats duplicated in '69 and '70 with help from James.

Before his sophomore year was over, James picked up three more gold medals in the IC4A outdoor meet and earned a berth on the Olympic team.

He came home from Mexico City with a silver medal and an idea how tough this world can be on young celebrities.

"It's the mental part that's tough," Larry said

You Can't Win by a Nose

Although the Bulova Accutron Phototimer (it was originally called the Bulova Phototimer) has been in use since 1948, the complicated \$200,000 equipment needs some explaining.

As an aid to the officials, both in judging the winners and timing, the Bulova Accutron Phototimer has been invaluable. Even the change in the definition of the torso, which determines the winner, hasn't made it easier for the officials in those close races which come so frequently.

The change in the definition was put into effect a year ago, on May 1. And two days after the new rule became legal, the Phototimer was needed to separate the winners in a race at the Quantico Marines Relays. It was a classic example of the difference between the old and the new definition of torso.

Previously, the torso included the chest and the neck, but not the head. Quite frequently, the officials had trouble deciding whether or not the part of a runner which was across the finish line was really the torso. The elimination of the neck as part of the torso was supposed to make it easier on the officials.

Actually, there is very little difference, but that resulted in Hampton Institute beating out Morgan State for the 440-yard relay title. Had the race been held April 30 instead of May 3, Morgan State would have been the winner because anchor man Ray Pollard's neck was extended beyond that of Charlie Allie, the No. 4 runner for Hampton. But with the new rule, Allie was the winner.

A number of officials think the difference in judging is so little that they believe track should adopt the horse-racing system of picking winners by the head. However, that was before the new style of Afro haircuts in which the hair can stand out several inches from the head.

In horse-racing there is no other choice because the structure of the animal is such that the nose must always be first across the finish line.

The Bulova people are constantly attuned to the nuances of judging races. Their pictures have been of invaluable help to the officials who study them before they pick the winners of close races.

Nobody, however, studies more pictures of finishes than do the members of the Bulova Accutron

Phototimer crew. They pore over the pictures for days after each meet, checking the results and comparing the times of each finisher. The times are computerized, those of the hand timers and the Bulova Phototimer.

One opinion of the Bulova people is that the difference in the outcome of the 440-yard relay at Quantico between the new rule and the old is such a rarity that fewer than .01 percent of the races' outcome would be changed by picking the winner with the inclusion of the neck as part of the torso, or by adding the head when making those decisions.

Bulova operators appear at the track many hours before even the officials. They need the time to check out the placement of the camera, to make sure that it is focused exactly on the finish line. Although you may see a picture which resembles one shot of many runners, each runner is photographed only at that moment when he crosses the finish line.

The prints are made from a moving roll of film which goes horizontally, right or left, according to the direction of the race. In addition to being photographed crossing the finish line, each runner's time is photographed with him, the time appearing at the top of the picture. Each picture also has the identifying information of the meet, the race and the position of each runner in relation to his rivals.

There are five parts to the Phototimer. In addition to the camera there are the starting unit, which is a Bulova-patented photo-electric transducer fastened to the starter's pistol barrel; the Time Base, which receives the coded signal of the firing of the gun; the spinner, which carries the identification of the meet, race and heat, and the portable darkroom, set up in the stadium, as close to the camera as is physically possible. The closer the darkroom is to the rest of the equipment, the quicker is the service given by the Bulova team.

Not counting messengers and those dealing with the officials, the operation requires a six-man crew headed by Bob Richards, the crew chief who is stationed at the camera. Two men are in the darkroom, one at the start and a fifth at the finish line. A sixth man, Bulova engineer Sam Sugarman, checks out the equipment. •

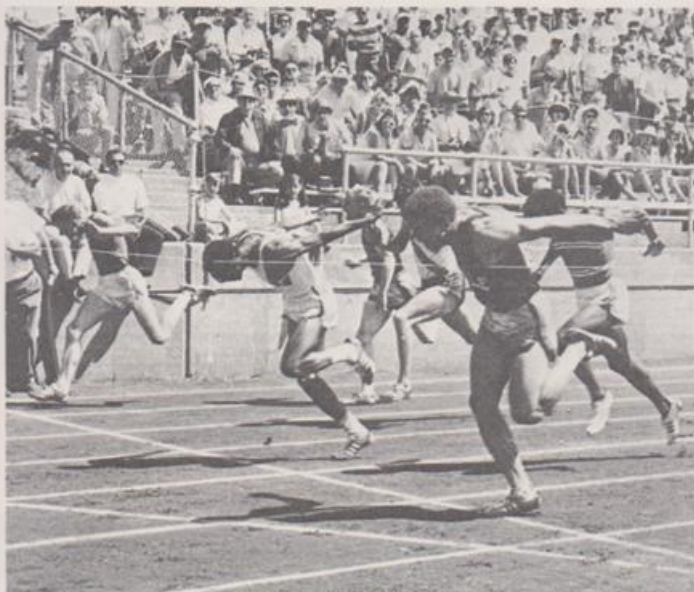

The University of Maryland just edged Villanova University, 53 points to 52, in 1969 although each team took five individual titles. Maryland last had won the crown in 1966 and the Terps' 1969 victory prevented the Wildcats from taking possession of the seventh Championship cup. The Wildcats now hold four legs on that trophy and need one more title to retire it. Previous victories came in 1963, '64, '67 and '68. No. 6 was retired by Villanova in 1962, after it had led the field in 1957, 1958, 1960 and 1961.

That cup had been in competition since 1933. Of five former cups, two were won by Harvard and one each by Yale, Cornell and Southern California.

Each of the Association's Trophies is held by the championship team for the year following its victory and becomes the permanent possession of the college that wins it five times, exclusive of ties.

General Information

N.C.A.A. RULES OF COMPETITION WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED BY REFEREE AND OTHER OFFICIALS.

Track measures four laps to mile.

All events are scratch, i.e., none is handicap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty for first false start, but competitor is disqualified for second false start. However, starter's recall no longer nullifies false start by any competitor.

In hurdle races competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In all relay races baton must be carried in runner's hand and must be passed to next succeeding teammate within clearly marked 20 meters zone, extending 10 meters in both directions from leg finish line.

Governing rules provide that, in races around turns, any competitor willfully jostling, running across or obstructing another competitor so as to impede his progress, shall be disqualified. If in any race competitor is disqualified for any of these reasons, Referee shall have power to order race to be rerun with disqualified competitor excluded or, in case of heat, to permit any competitors affected by act resulting in disqualification, other than disqualified competitor, to compete in subsequent round of event.

Any competitor may be disqualified if, in opinion of Referee, he has in any way been aided by coach, teammate, or anyone connected directly or indirectly with team concerned, such as, running along-side of teammate, being stationed at various points near track, or located nearby any of field events for purpose of aiding or coaching competitor after race or field event has officially been started.

Each member college is limited to following numbers of actual participants in various events in the Outdoor Championships:

3 Mile Run	2*
Relays	One Team
All other events	5

Nominee or qualifier who fails to compete in any running or hurdling event for which he has been nominated or has qualified will be ineligible for any further participation in meet.

In four weight events (shot, discus, javelin, and hammer), broad jump, and triple jump, each contestant shall be allowed three preliminary trials. The first six men in the standing at the completion of the trials will qualify for the final. Each finalist will then receive three additional tries.

All performances made in field event trials shall be counted with performances in final in determining final place winners. Each competitor shall be credited with best of all his efforts.

Competitors must be on time, field contestants entering enclosure five minutes before scheduled start of their event, and track contestants entering enclosure upon completion of race next preceding theirs. As soon as their event is over, competitors will kindly leave track and infield without delay.

Spikes longer than $\frac{3}{8}$ inch not permitted.

In each event 16 points are scored: 6 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth, and 1 for fifth.

*(Plus 1) one more upon approval of Executive Committee, provided all three representatives of affected college are of championship calibre.)

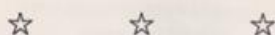

Some of the greatest IC4A drama has occurred before the fans arrived. In the 1960 indoor meet, Villanova—without Ron Delany for the first time in four years—needed points from John Buckley, an in-and-out long jumper, to have a chance. Buckley hadn't jumped 23 feet indoors since his freshman year, and two weeks before the IC4A meet he had fouled three straight times in the trials and strained a muscle. On this afternoon, with Elliott sweating and pleading and praying, the 21-year-old senior fouled on his first two jumps. There would be a 50-minute wait before he could jump again.

"I'm sick," Elliott muttered. "I think I'll go home."

Instead Jumbo dashed to the lobby. "Give me a double," he told the man at the refreshment stand, and he gulped down his tall Coke.

His confidence somewhat restored, the Villanova coach survived the long wait and saw Buckley jump nearly 24 feet to finish first and help the Wildcats repeat.

Even foreign athletes, unaccustomed to America's old-college-try approach to athletics, have been caught up in the IC4A excitement.

One of Villanova's Irish stars, Noel Carroll, considered track a purely individual sport when he came here. Yet before he left he found himself doing crazy things—struggling to score points in an indoor 1000 with a sore leg, for example. He finished second, and his four points enabled Villanova to win the team title by one point over Manhattan in 1964.

When his race was over Carroll staggered through an exit leading to a corridor and sprawled over a wooden barrier, too exhausted to move.

"I never tried so hard before," he said. "If we lose by a point, I'll get the next ship home. How does it look?"

It was a strange speech coming from a foreign athlete, but then the IC4A is a strange meet.

"It took me a while to get the old college spirit," Carroll said that night. "You continually listen to your teammates drive it home to you. They keep saying, 'The ICs are coming up. The ICs are coming up. That's the one that counts.' So you give it the old college try."

They all give it the old college try, the young men competing for the contenders and the young men who are simply trying to get their school on the scoreboard. That is what makes an IC4A meet so special. •

recently. "In track and in life, you're always doing what someone thinks you should be doing, not what you want to do."

James couldn't equal that Olympic year performance, of course, but he won the 600 indoors, the 440 outdoors and anchored both mile relay teams to victory in IC4A competition.

Yale nipped the Wildcats at the wire in the 440 relay and James and his mates settled for second place as Maryland won the team title by a single point.

It is typical of James' career that people remember his one IC4A failure.

"Larry did too much, too fast," says Jumbo Jim Elliott, the Villanova coach. "After that sophomore year, people expect him to win."

It's news when he loses."

Elliott, who has tutored more Olympic team members than any other American track coach, considers James one of his best.

"He's a great competitor," Jumbo says. "The tougher the competition the better he likes it. Whatever you ask him to do he does."

Jumbo has asked a lot from James this year.

He got a winning 600 and mile relay anchor leg from James as Villanova won the IC4A indoor title. He got a winning 440 and mile relay anchor leg as the Wildcats placed second in the NCAA meet in Detroit.

Tender arches made running painful during the Penn Relays but Elliott asked for, and received, four quarters in the 46-second range as James helped his team win the sprint medley and mile relay.

A commerce and finance major at Villanova, James is nearing the end of his career under Elliott. Before he enters law school at either Georgetown or Catholic University, he would like to help his team regain the IC4A crown from Maryland.

If he becomes the all-time gold medal winner along the way, fine. Winning the team title is the big thing for Larry James.

"I have more enthusiasm for the big meets," admits James, "but not for myself. I've been through all this . . . but it's a team thing. You just can't let the other guys down in the big meet."

That philosophy is the reason Villanova is going after its tenth outdoor IC4A title since 1957 and why Larry James is about to become No. 1 on the list of gold medal winners. •



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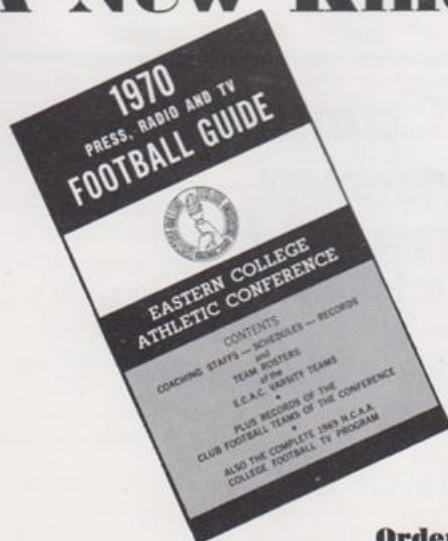
