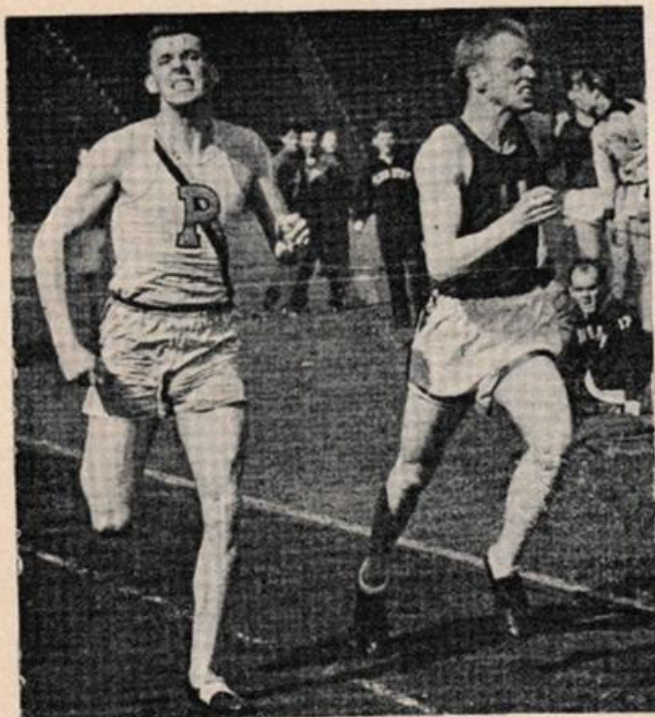

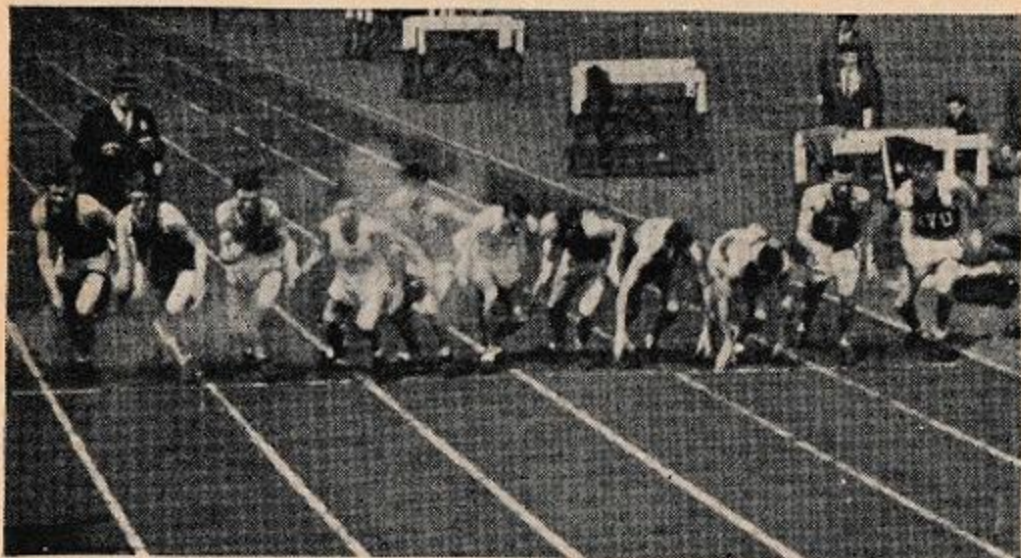

START AND FINISH OF 1940 ONE-MILE RUN

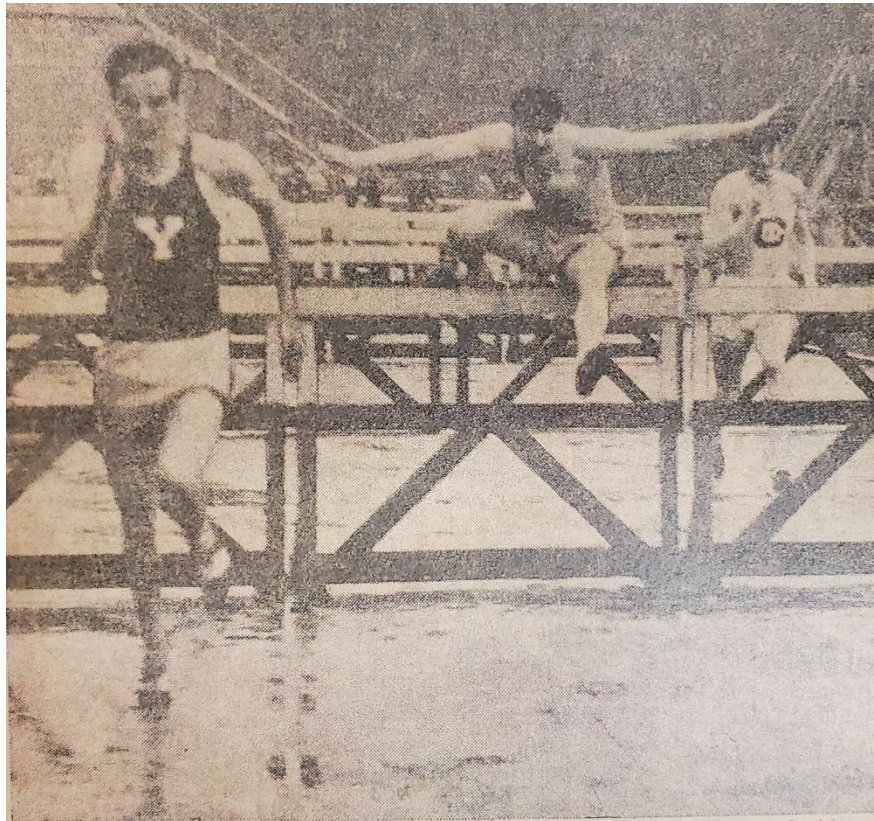

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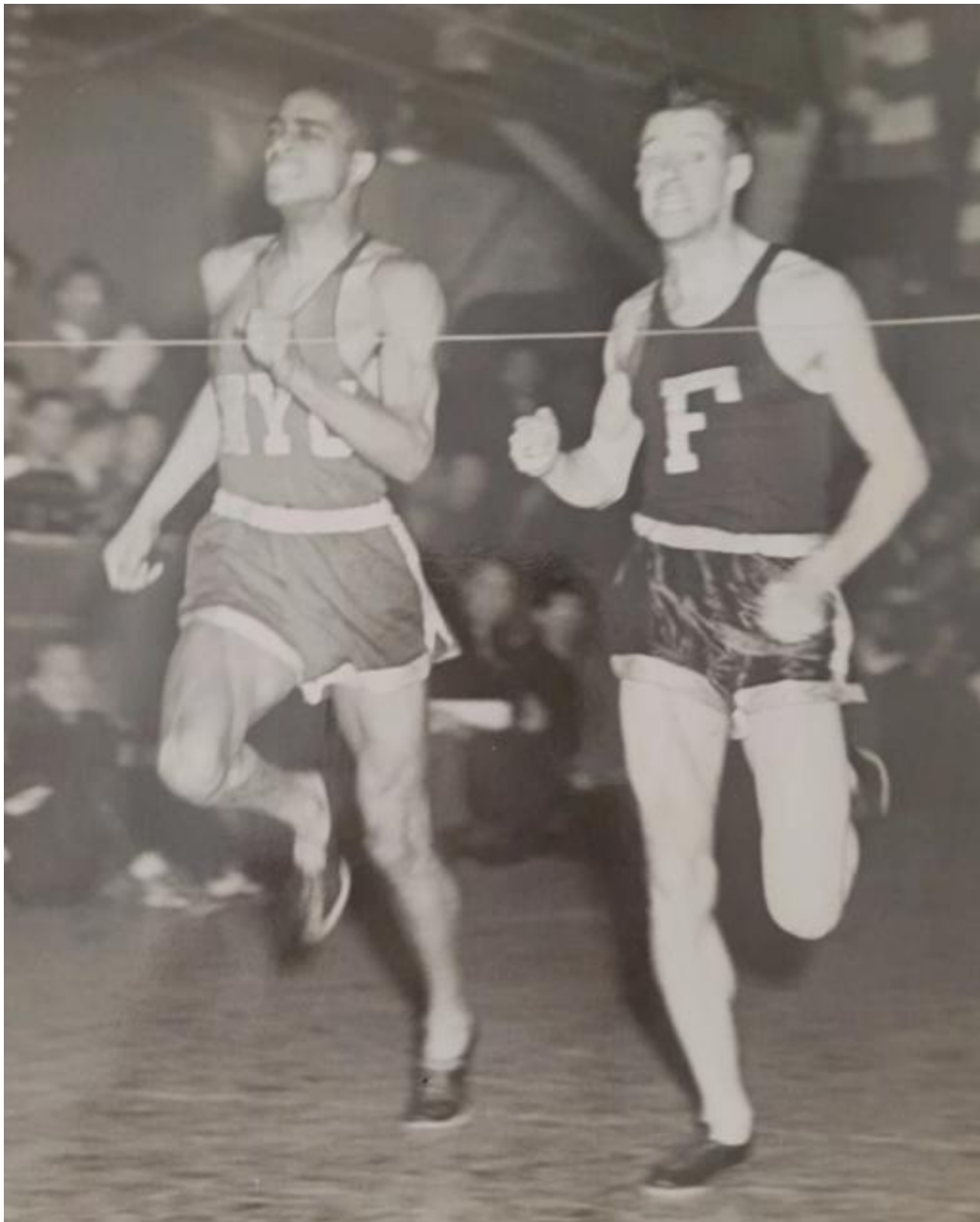

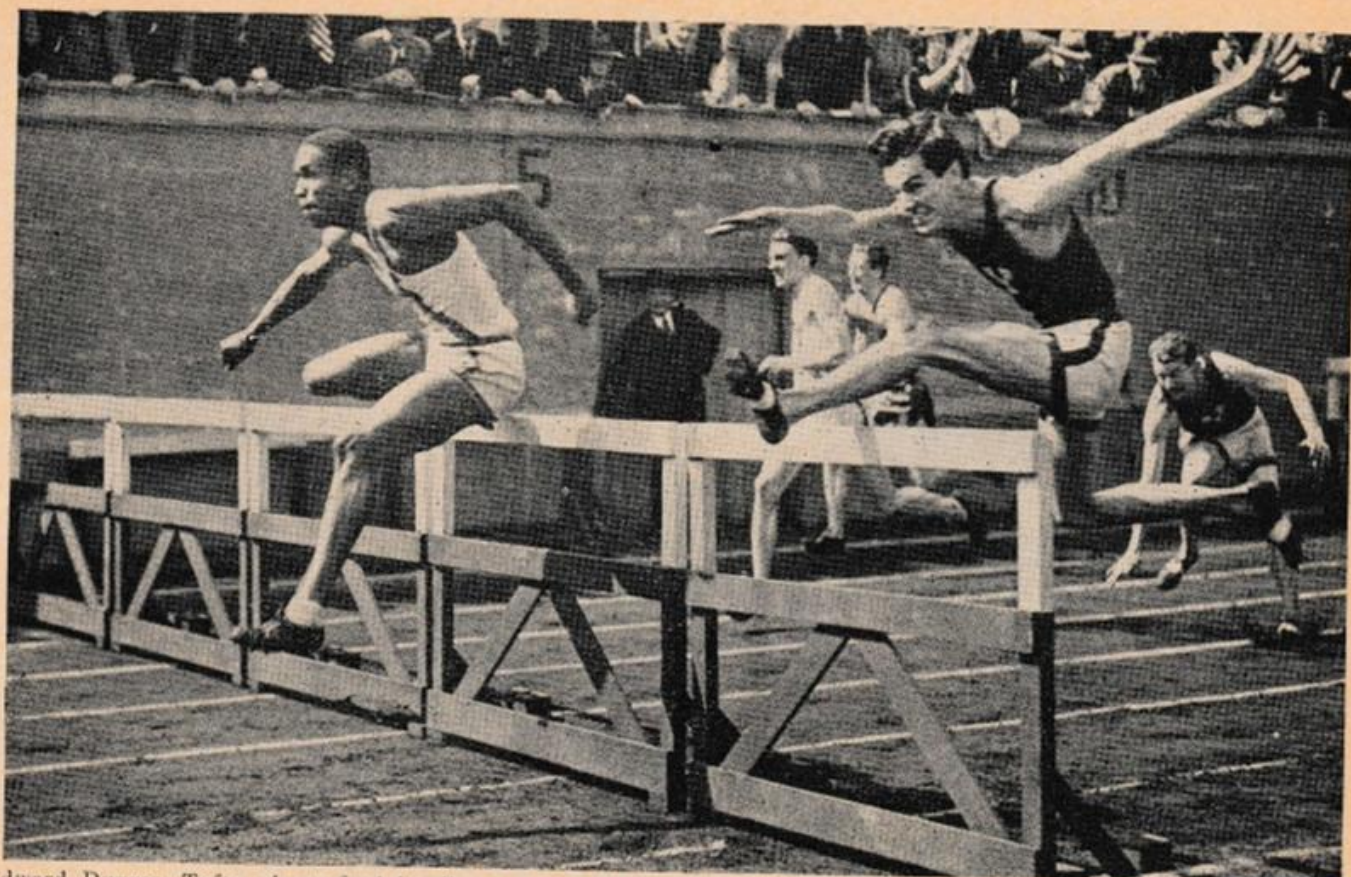

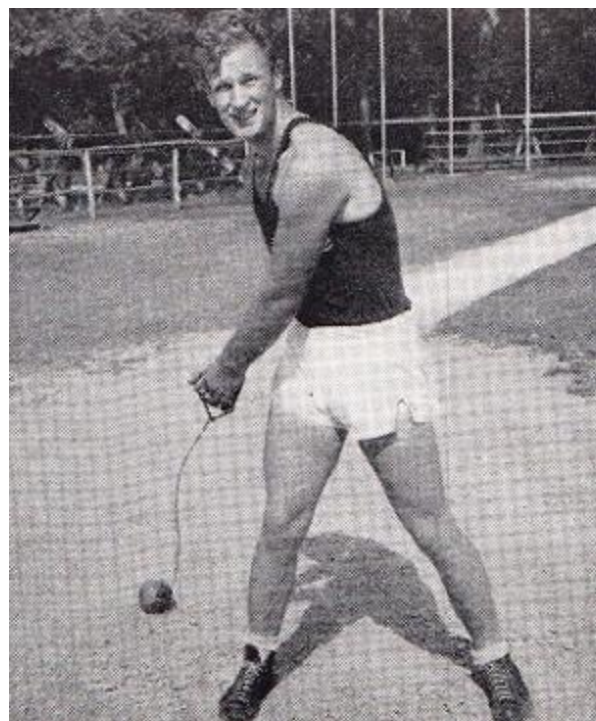

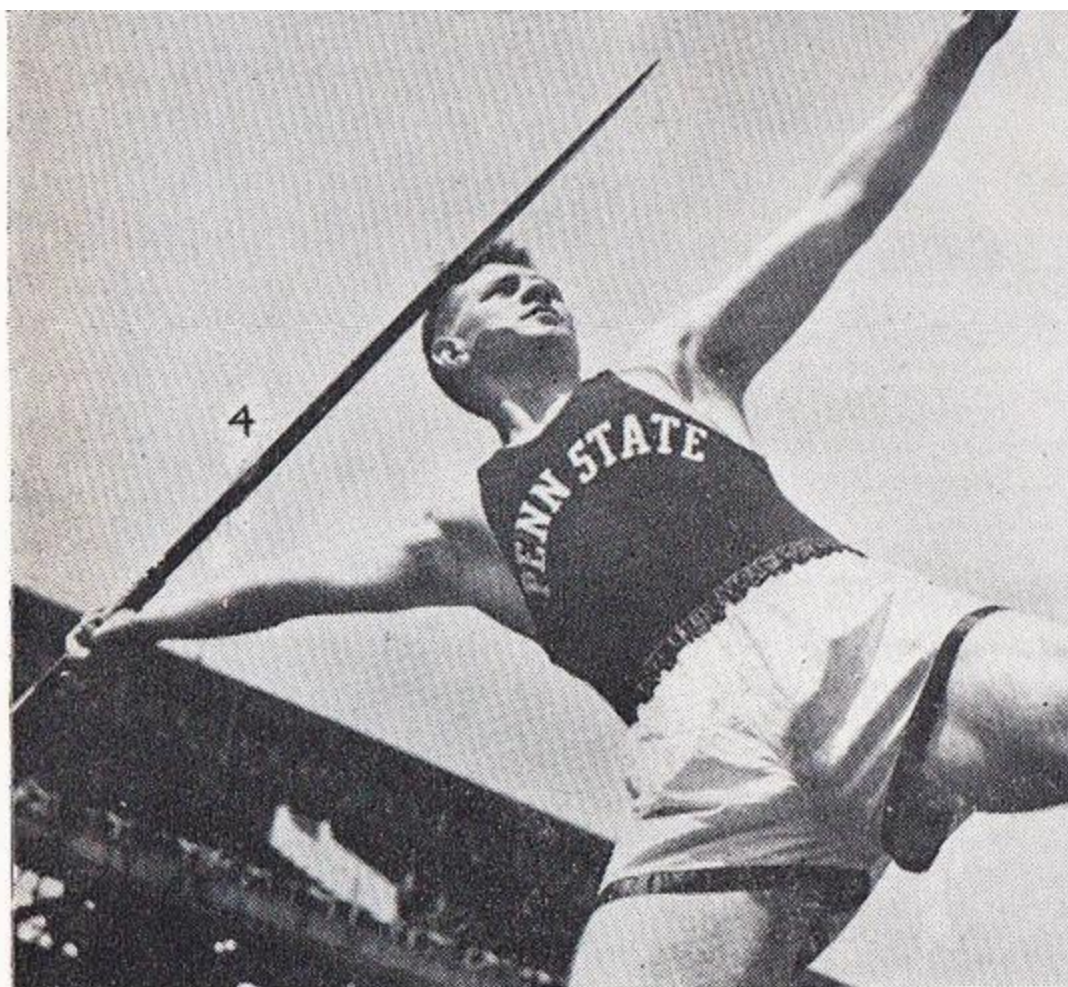
