Michigan St. Wins IC4A

Randalls Island, N.Y., May 28--Michigan State's sweep of the year's IC4A titles shared attention with a host of fine individual performances in the 73rd running of the outdoor games.

Scoring heavily in the hurdles and broad jump, the Spartans totalled 43 points to add the outdoor crown to their indoor and cross country titles as Horace Smith, one of the meet's two double winners, and Fred Johnson grabbed 21 points between them. Smith came from behind to take both hurdles in times of 14.3 and 22.9. Johnson, the 1947 low jumper was a close second this time, won the broad jump for the third straight year, and was fourth in the 100.

Winner of the century was the other double victor, Seton Hall's Andy Stanfield. The 21-year-old sophomore took the 100 in 9.8 after a bad start and then out a tenth off Barney Swall's 220 record with a 20.6 clocking.

Another record fell to Jim Fuchs with a 56-0 3/8 shot put in the trials Friday. The Yale junior thus became the sixth man in history to better 56 feet.

Running away from the field after the first two laps was Horace Ashenfelder who won the two-mile in 9:09.2. He shaved 2.6 seconds off the mark set two years ago by Penn State teammate Curt Stone.

The fourth record to fall was the high jump in which Brown's Dick Phillips and NYU's Irv Mondschein soared 6-7 7/8 to add an inch to Mondschein's height of a year ago. The latter had a big day, hitting his peak in the high jump, taking second in the broad jump with his first ever leap over 24 feet, and winding up his varsity career with 48 points in six IC4As.

Surprises were recorded in the mile and 880. Favored George Wade of Yale was badly pocketed in the 26 man mile field and finished 10th as the victory went to Neil

Pratt of Syracuse in 4:16.4. The latter kicked through the last lap in 59.8 to win by 8 yards from another outsider, Tom Kirwan of Penn, with Bob Weaver, Syracuse sophomore, a surprise third.

Defending champion Jack Dianetti just failed to live up to his favoritism in the half when he closed with a rush to pick up 15 yards but barely missed catching big Jim Groscholz of Haverford who won in 1:53.3. Unplaced was the 19-47 titlist, Reggie Pearman, who suffered a spike wound Friday. He dropped out at the halfway point in the 880, and finished last in the 440 but ran a 48.4 anchor lap to hold an NYU victory in the mile relay. Fighting hard, Pearman staved off a 48.8 leg by Cornell's Bob Wealey (third flip to "Michigan", p.8)

Jim Fuchs Hits 56-11 1-2,

Third Best Shot Put Ever

Pelham Manor, N.Y., June 4--Putting all his spectacular tension-building head waxing tremendous speed and great strength into his first mighty heave, Jim Fuchs took his place as the third best shot putter ever at the New York A.C. Games.

The shot sailed 56-11 1/2, a mark bettered only by Chuck Foxville's world record 58-0 3/8 and Jack Torrance's former world mark of 57-1. It bettered Al Blois' meet mark of 55-3 7/8 as did two later tosses of 55-7 3/8 and 55-8 1/2.

Over 56 feet for the first time last week at the IC4A, Fuchs said before the meet: "I don't have it today. I was up all night studying and I feel weak." After the throw he said "I didn't follow through" (flip to "Jim Fuchs", p.8)

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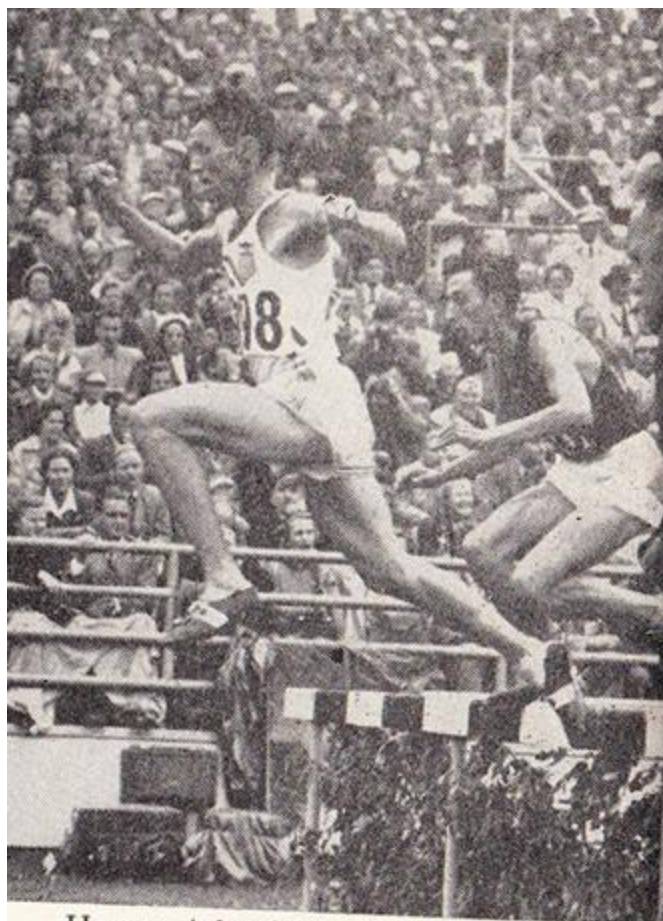
