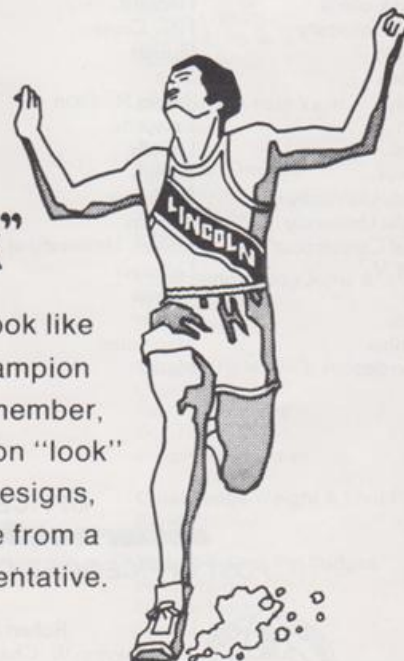

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A Career That's Growing By Leaps and Bounds:

FDU's High-jumping Sensation Franklin Jacobs By Jay Horwitz

It's a story that belongs in Walt Disney's World of Fantasy. Even most fairy tales have more believable plots.

The saga of Franklin Jacobs really has taken place, however, and the setting is Fairleigh Dickinson University and not the Land of Oz.

Just two short years ago, the Paterson, N.J. native decided to try high jumping as a senior at Eastside High School. Last January, the 5-8 sophomore leaped 7'-7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " to set a world indoor record in his specialty before 19,000 fans at the Millrose Games in Madison Square Garden. Perhaps no other athlete in any sport has had a more dramatic and rapid rise to stardom.

This weekend Jacobs is at Jadwin Gymnasium seeking to defend the IC4A indoor title he won a year ago. The confident 20-year-old still feels his best jumps are yet to come.

"I still can go higher," said Franklin, who also captured titles at the New Jersey Championship, Olympic Invitational and Princeton Relays this year. "I feel 7-8 or even 7-9 are not out of the question.

"To me there isn't that much difference between 7-6, 7-7 or 7-8," added the business major at FDU's Rutherford campus. "It's all in your head. I won't be completely satisfied until I get the outdoor record of 7-7 $\frac{3}{4}$. That's what I will be shooting for this spring."

Jacobs won seven major collegiate titles as a freshman, including the IC4A outdoor and Metropolitan crowns, but perhaps one of his most eye-opening achievements is the phenomenal 23 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches he has catapulted over his head.

"People are always asking me how a little guy can jump so high," says Franklin, who is also FDU's first IC4A individual gold medal winner. "There really aren't any secrets. I guess I have just been blessed with plenty of natural ability. My legs have been great to me ever since I was a kid."

Bill Monaghan, FDU's assistant track coach and high jump specialist, has this to add on the subject:

"I don't care how tall or short Franklin Jacobs is," the coach declares. "What makes him a champion is his competitive desire. I have never seen

an athlete with more dedication. Last spring he injured his knee and was in a cast for three weeks. A lot of people thought he was finished, that his career was in jeopardy.

"But Franklin didn't give up, and he worked himself back into shape. He was competing again in April. Just look at his record. Franklin has come up with a personal best in every big meet he has jumped. He just thrives under the pressure."

Even though he is the world indoor record-holder, Jacobs still hasn't fulfilled his long-range goal of making the United States Olympic team in 1980.

"Everything I do is pointed toward Moscow," adds Franklin. "I'm not taking anything for granted either. People have come up to me and said, 'Don't worry, you're a shoe-in to make the team.' I just laugh because high-jumping is such an unpredictable sport that anything can happen. There are so many young high school kids doing seven feet now. I came out of nowhere and someone could come out of nowhere to beat me. All I can say is that I'm striving for the Olympics, and if I make the team, I will come back with the gold medal."

If Jacobs does make it to Moscow, it's a good bet his mother, Mrs. Jannie Jacobs, will be there, too.

"My mother is my number one fan," laughs Franklin. "She is so happy for me, and seeing her smile all the time makes me happy. She has given so much to me through the years and I'm just glad I can do something nice for her."

In her own way Mrs. Jacobs is just as remarkable as her famous son. Her husband deserted the family and she was forced to raise 11 children all alone. In addition, her sister died in 1965 and she had four more mouths to feed.

"When I was growing up, our house was always crowded," says Franklin with a smile. "Now most everybody has moved out. We still have six people at home, but there is a little more room."

Despite all the fame and notoriety Franklin has attracted this winter, his personality hasn't changed one bit, according to his high school track coach Bill Shipp.

"Franklin hasn't forgotten his roots," says Shipp. "He still comes back to school whenever he can, and I always see him spending time with the young kids around his house. I can't tell you how proud of him we are."

REMEMBERING GEORGE BARKER

In its fifty-seven years of existence, the IC4A Indoor Championships have undergone a number of changes: the steady growth of the number of member schools and entrants, the move from New York to Princeton's Jadwin Gymnasium, the modernization of track technology with the introduction of such techniques as automatic timing. This year, however, there is a more personal and deeply-felt change. A man who for many years was a part of these championships, as both a competitor and as an official, is gone.

Forty-six years ago, George Barker was a member of the New York University team that won the IC4A Indoor crown. The previous fall, he was the IC4A Cross-country champion. Under the tutelage of Emil Von Elling, an almost legendary figure in American track and field, Barker developed as both an athlete and as a person at NYU. A Dover, New Jersey native who was a state track star at Dover High School, he ran on many Penn Relays teams, and was a leader by example on the NYU track teams that were consistently among the best in the east.

His enthusiasm for college athletics, especially track and field, continued after his graduation from NYU in 1933. Despite the demands of time, travel and personal expense, Barker regularly made the trips to serve as an official at the IC4A meets, the U.S. Olympic Invitationals, and at many other eastern college meets as well. Even after he and his wife, Virginia, moved to Michigan, where he managed the Three Rivers plant for Continental Can Company, he continued to return to the east for these special events.

Barker served for years on the IC4A games committee, as chief clerk at various meets, and frequently officiated at the national championships and the Millrose Games. He was an able and competent official, a very orderly person, a man who liked things done in the proper manner. This was reflected in his precision, in his care in organizing heats and events, in his attention to providing the judges and press with prompt and accurate information. He is remembered as a fair-minded man, and as a gentle man.

George Barker was extremely civic-minded, active in countless social service organizations. He was, to whatever he applied himself, devoted. His alliances stretched from his hometown in New Jersey to his last home in Three Rivers. Among the many groups to benefit from his service were the YMCA, the Boy Scouts, the Rotary, Kiwanis and Elks clubs, and the Presbyterian Church, of which he was an elder for forty years. As an elected official, he served the Three Rivers community as city commissioner, an office to which he won reelection. Yet despite the demands he placed upon himself as a participant in these many groups, he still came to the east to be a part of the IC4A meets.

John Trachy met George Barker in 1930 when both were students at NYU. Their friendship, started on a cinder track, continued for almost fifty years, until Barker's sudden and unexpected death early this year. On occasions too numerous to mention, they officiated together at intercollegiate track and field meets, and despite the geographic breach that developed with the Barker's move to Michigan, their friendship continued. Only the frequency of their visits diminished.

As those who worked alongside George Barker would concur, he was a man of very high character, a man devoted to his family, a man who thrived on hard work. These are qualities that infect those who come in contact with them in a very positive way, and are qualities which, to some degree, are found in most successful competitors.

At the time of his death, Barker had been planning to come to New York for the Millrose Games, and to visit the Trachy's. He died before he could return east to participate in one of the highlights of the indoor track season.

The games to which he added so much by his enthusiasm, his dedication, his attention to detail, will go on without him. But as John Trachy predicts, the void will be felt for sometime. "You don't come across a fellow like George Barker every day."

It is forty-nine years since George Barker was first captivated by the smell of sweat and balm, the spirit of camaraderie and competition, that is such an integral part of the IC4A experience. Scores of others, participants and observers, have been similarly attracted by the uniqueness of the championships. And among the many who came to know him through his association with these meets for so many years, he will be missed.

Renaldo Nehemiah

TERRAPIN'S FROSH HURDLER OFF TO RECORD START

Renaldo Nehemiah and Albert King arrived at the University of Maryland at the same time and both ranked as the top high school performers in their respective sports.

Although the Indoor Track season did not start until Basketball was well underway, Nehemiah has become the most sought after of the Maryland athletes by the news media.

The Scotch Plains, New Jersey, native immediately established himself as a collegiate hurdler with a Maryland record in his first appearance in a Terrapin track uniform.

He made his first appearance in a National Invitational Meet in Maryland's Cole Field House, and then followed that a week later with a sensational 7.13 electronically-timed 60-yard hurdles win in Philadelphia.

"Skeets", as he is known by his friends, then came up with a shocker for Coach Frank Costello just a week later in Madison Square Garden in a race about which Costello later reflected, "I really wasn't ready for anything like that." "It was outrageous the way he shattered the world record with his 7.07," said Costello. "In a short race like that it's amazing to drop it that much."

Costello is ready to talk about Nehemiah, and another Scotch Plains native, junior Bob Calhoun, to anyone that will take a moment to listen. "I'm telling you right now, both these boys are going to be in the 1980 Olympics in Moscow," says Costello.

"Nehemiah's biggest asset is his outright speed and great natural quickness. He also has great balance and is a natural hurdler," says Costello.

Few athletes are more dedicated than Nehemiah. He runs with a purpose, and winning is just a part of it. He is a strong proponent of eastern track. His choice of Maryland left Southern California as the runnerup in the recruiting war. "In Los Angeles, all they talk about is the weather and how all the best track people go out there. That kind of attitude really turned me off," says Nehemiah. "Maryland had a good hurdler in Greg Robertson, a fine track program, and I knew I would get good coaching and excellent competition there. We have good track here in the East."

He came to Maryland after being acclaimed "High School Athlete of the Year" by Track and Field News. His high school marks included a record 12.9 seconds for the 120-yard hurdles, the second-best 100-yard dash in the nation with a 9.4, the second-best 220 time (20.9), a 24-11½ long jump that ranked third, and a fifth-best 330-yard intermediate hurdles time of 37.0.

In his first attempt at the collegiate hurdles in the US-USSR Junior meet in Richmond, Virginia, he turned in a 13.5 second performance, breaking the 13.7 mark established by Rod Milburn.

Costello has been watching Nehemiah run since his junior year in high school. With over 100 colleges recruiting him, Costello had competition, but few coaches know more about the area. He's from Union, N.J., just 15 minutes from Scotch Plains, and his brother David coaches track at nearby Elizabeth High.

While in the ninth grade, Nehemiah aspired to be a sprinter, but switched to the hurdles partly because "no one else wanted to try it because they were afraid of getting hurt" and also because he wasn't as fast as some of the older sprinters on the team.

Speed, however, is one of his greatest assets, and he also ranks as one of the top sprinters in the east, along with his teammate Bob Calhoun.

With Calhoun and Robertson pushing him in practice, Nehemiah never has the opportunity to relax. Calhoun also grew up in Scotch Plains, only ten houses away and has joined him in breaking records. His 26' 1" long jump recently topped a meet mark established by Ralph Boston.

The freshman has adjusted well to the collegiate life, and is adept at fielding the questions of the media with the poise of a veteran. "Renaldo's composure is incredible," says Costello. "He has nerves of steel. It doesn't bother him that he is running against guys 25 years old or more."

With a half dozen Invitational appearances and the Atlantic Coast Conference Championships behind him, "Skeets" will have lost his freshman status when he enters his first IC4A Indoor Championships. But he is looking forward to the chance to further reinforce his already considerable reputation - perhaps as an IC4A champion.

Dash includes: 60y, 70y, 50m and 60m; high hurdles includes: 60y, 70y, and 50m; 600 includes both 600y and 600m; one mile run includes 1500m; two-mile run includes 3000m; mile relay includes 1600m relay; two mile relay includes 3200m relay.
