Young Doctor on the Run

When Carlton Young won the 440-yard dash at the NCAA Indoor Championships in Detroit this past winter, he dedicated the race to the late Jumbo Elliott, his former coach at Villanova.

Elliott, after all, was the inspiration behind Young's transformation from a sprinter to a quarter-miler.

Young made national waves when he attended Central High, running a 9.3 100-yard dash as a senior. He also won the Junior National AAU 100 meters that summer.

"When I first got here, Jumbo said I was going to be a quarter-miler," the Wildcats' senior recalled. "I told him, 'No.' He said, 'Yes.' I said, 'No.' So, we battled all during my first year.

"I kept prompting him to let me run in the 60-yard dash during indoor season. He gave in to that, but he was always trying to make me run the 600.

"Then, finally, he let me run the 100 meters outdoors at the IC4A Championships. The problem with that was that I was hurt the week before. I had strained my hamstring. I made it to the finals of the 4 x 100-meter relay. But, in the 100-meter dash, it was just too much and I pulled.

"Ever since then, I decided, 'Well, maybe the quarter is the only thing left.' And I kept hold on to the 100 and 200, but I couldn't keep up. Everybody was ahead of me and I was still having pain in my leg. I finally succumbed to his prodding, and here I am."

Young is the best 400-meter man to run for Villanova since the legendary Larry James. He already has run a personal-record 45.32 in the trials for the NCAA outdoor meet last sprint.

After the season, he will have to make a major decision about whether a major decision about whether to keep in training for the 1984 Games in Los Angeles or completely immerse himself in a medical career.

Young, a brilliant student in biology with a 3.89 grade-point average, is a Rhodes scholarship regional finalist who has been accepted to Johns Hopkins University's prestigious medical school. He will start classes there this fall.

"That has been a problem of late, deciding whether I am going to continue running," Young said. "At one point, 'No.' At another point, 'Yes.' Right now, I'm thinking that I'm going to try.

"I won't run indoors, but I'll just extend my season, because I'll only be able to practice two or three times a week. I'm planning on doing my distance work in September through December. There are a number of tracks I can go to in Baltimore. I think there's a warm-up track I can go to.

"Then, hopefully, when I get out of school sometime in May, I'll have enough time to compete. Maybe I can run meets on weekends in May and possibly qualify for (The Athletic Congress meet) that way."

Young, who is engaged to Valicia M. Hill, knows the rigorous schedule will not be easy. But he has had two dreams ever since he started growing up. One, of course, was to make the Olympic team. The other was to become a doctor.

"I guess I first had the desire to be a physician when I was 8 years old," he said. "My mother took me to the physician once and I was fascinated by the instruments and the white coat and everything else. I started asking her questions about it and she encouraged me in that direction."

Young got a head start on his future when he began working under Dr. Harvey J. Learner at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania's chemotherapy labs as an 11th-grader.

"I'd worked there for five years," he said. "I'm in a program called AFNA, the American Foundation for Negro Affairs."

Young was a nationally recruited sprinter at Central. He chose Villanova over the Sun Belt schools for several reasons.

"My primary interest is education," he said. "Track was secondary. I used tracks as a means to gain my education. Villanova afforded me the opportunity to do both in an atmosphere that was favorable. The academics here were good and I was able to get into Johns Hopkins with the credentials of the school. The fact that Jumbo was here also played a part. And it was close to home. I didn't want to go that far."

Young is one of those rare student-athletes who has been able to achieve success on two levels.

"It takes discipline," he said. "A lot of times, you don't have any time, especially when you go away on weekends...leave Friday and not get back until Sunday with a test on Monday. But, as all the athletes on the team will attest, you just have to discipline yourself the same way you discipline yourself to come to practice everyday."

"It is difficult, but I had my desire to become a physician and that overruled any sleepiness or anything else."

Making a Name for Themselves at George Mason

Two former high school coaches affectionately known as "The Odd Couple" are hard at work building an Eastern collegiate track power at George Mason University in Fairfax, Va., which despite its historic name, has been a full-fledged University for less than 11 years.

John Cook, the head coach, works at the University part time. Ralph White, the assistant coach, works full time and is the men's track coordinator. Cook, who coaches the long-distance runners, drives a speedy Porsche and talks at sprinter's speed. White, who has the sprinters under his wing, drives a conventional-style Ford and measures his words carefully. Both were long-distance runners in college, Cook at Maryland and White at Penn State.

Cook and White get exceptional assistance from two other part-time assistants, Wade Privette and Ed Zuraw, both of whom have been on the staff for five years. Privette works with the long, triple and high jumpers. Zuraw concentrates on the pole vaulters.

George Mason made the track world stand up and take notice by winning four events and finishing second behind perennial power Villanova in the IC4A indoor championships at Princeton in early March. The names of George Mason University and individuals Reggie Henderson, John Parker, Rob Muzzio, Mike Scudieri, Jon Babcock and Skeeter Jackson are well known in collegiate track. And, don't forget Tommy Lovelace and Ron George, who run the first two legs of the Patriots' outstanding mile relay team which boasts Henderson and Parker as the knock-out punch.

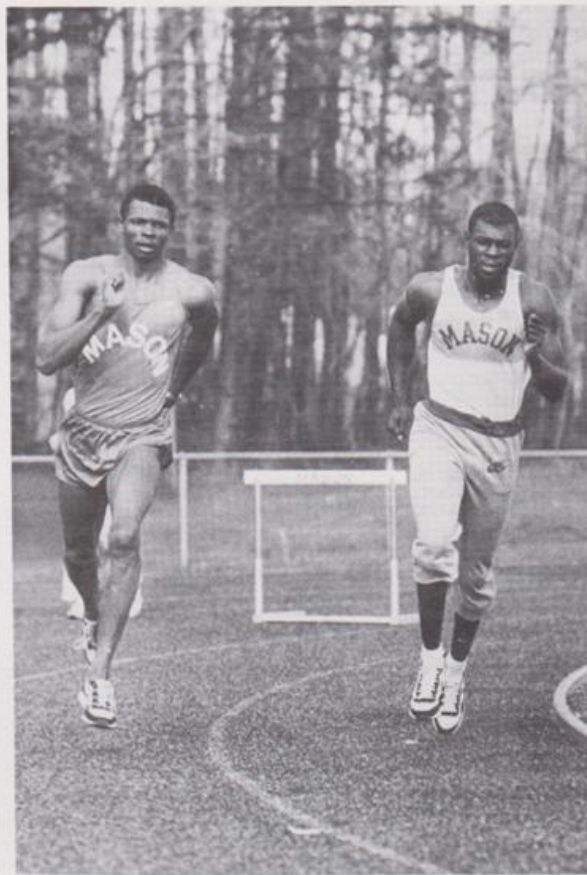
There is an effective chemistry between Cook, who developed numerous outstanding distance runners at Edison High School in Fairfax County, Va., and White, who joined Mason's staff from Eleanor Roosevelt High School in Greenbelt, Md. Ralph developed 18 individual state champions at Roosevelt.

"We didn't really get going at George Mason until Ralph joined the staff and developed our outstanding sprint program," Cook said. "He deserves the credit for that. I'm a distance man," the head coach added.

For his part, White is extremely comfortable working with Cook. At the recent Virginia State Division I outdoor championships, George Mason was clearly ahead in the team championship with the Patriots best event, the mile relay, coming up.

"I didn't want to run our guys in the mile relay because they were tired and we didn't need the points," White said. "I went to John and he readily agreed. Not many coaches would turn down points in a State championship event. John's not like that," White said. "I respect him for that."

At the IC4A indoor meet, Muzzio won the pentathlon with 3,950 points and Henderson ran a record 1:01.91 in winning the 500 meters to account for two of the Patriots' victories. Reggie also ran the anchor leg on the Patriots' winning mile relay team, which was clocked in 3:14.19 to second-place Princeton's 3:17.18 and third-place Villanova's 3:17.40. Lovelace, George, Parker and Henderson ran in that order for the victory.

The other victory came when Scudieri captured the triple jump by a scant quarter inch over Mark Tobias of Mount St. Mary's. Mike leaped 51 feet, 2½ inches to Tobias' 51 feet, 2¼ inches in what must have been an officials' nightmare.

Babcock was second to John Keyworth of Villanova in the 3,000 while Lovelace finished sixth in the 400 meters and Mark Spenik sixth in the pole vault to account for the rest of George Mason's points. Rutgers tied Mason for second, but the Patriots took home the second-place trophy on the basis of more first-place finishes.

Henderson went on to finish third in the 440 at the NCAA indoor championships at Pontiac, Mich., despite running on a banked-track for one of the few times in his career. Reggie also ran a leg on the Patriots' mile relay team, which finished sixth in the NCAA event. Henderson, Parker, Lovelace and George earned All-American honors for their efforts at the NCAAs.

A year ago, George Mason was quietly building its program. Then, the transfer of Henderson from the University of the District of Columbia and the decisions by Muzzio and Parker to attend the Fairfax, Va., school put the timetable in high gear.

Henderson is well known in track circles. He has run a 1:01.41, the second fastest in the World 500 meters. The bonus is that Reggie is team-oriented and has been a valuable and steady influence for the entire team. His presence has elevated all of the relay teams to the position of being a threat each time they step on the track. And Reggie doesn't shirk the opportunity to run. He's always there when the team needs points.

Parker, from Prince Frederick, Md., decided to continue his education at George Mason and suddenly the Patriots had an explosive group of sprinters only waiting to be moulded into an outstanding unit. Already on hand were Lovelace, George, Frank Raines, Robert Brown and Godfrey Eason. The competition in practice proved demanding and the times kept going down each week. John was a high school All-American who won a junior national AAU title last summer.

Muzzio was a star football player at Robinson, gaining All-Washington, D.C. Metropolitan recognition as a

linebacker. He was an All-American in track and decided to pursue a career in track across the street from his high school at George Mason. Rob already has coaches from the U.S. Olympic teams drooling about his prospects for the 1988 Games. At the Penn Relays, he finished third with 7,668 points, an American junior record for athletes 19 and under. Rob recently turned 19.

Another plus this season has been the return of Skeeter Jackson, who missed the indoor campaign because of a leg injury. Skeeter won the long jump at last year's Penn Relays, underwent surgery in March and returned to action to win at the Virginia State outdoor championships four weeks later.

Parker scored a double at the Virginia State meet, winning the 100 and 200-meter events, setting a record of 21.10 in the latter. Henderson won the 400 in meet record time of 46.62. Other victories came from Scudieri in the triple jump and Mark Spenik in the pole vault. The Patriots also won the 400-meter relay in the meet-record time of 40.61.

Cook, White, Privette and Zuraw have their athletes pointing for this outdoor version of the IC4A and the upcoming NCAA championships. The team has been troubled by a rash of minor injuries this spring which has set back the development schedule. And, the Patriots are coming off a gruelling week of final exams.

But there is little doubt that George Mason is making a name for itself in Eastern track.

"Other coaches couldn't remember my name, or that of the school, and often I was called 'John Mason,'" Cook laughed. "That's changing now."
