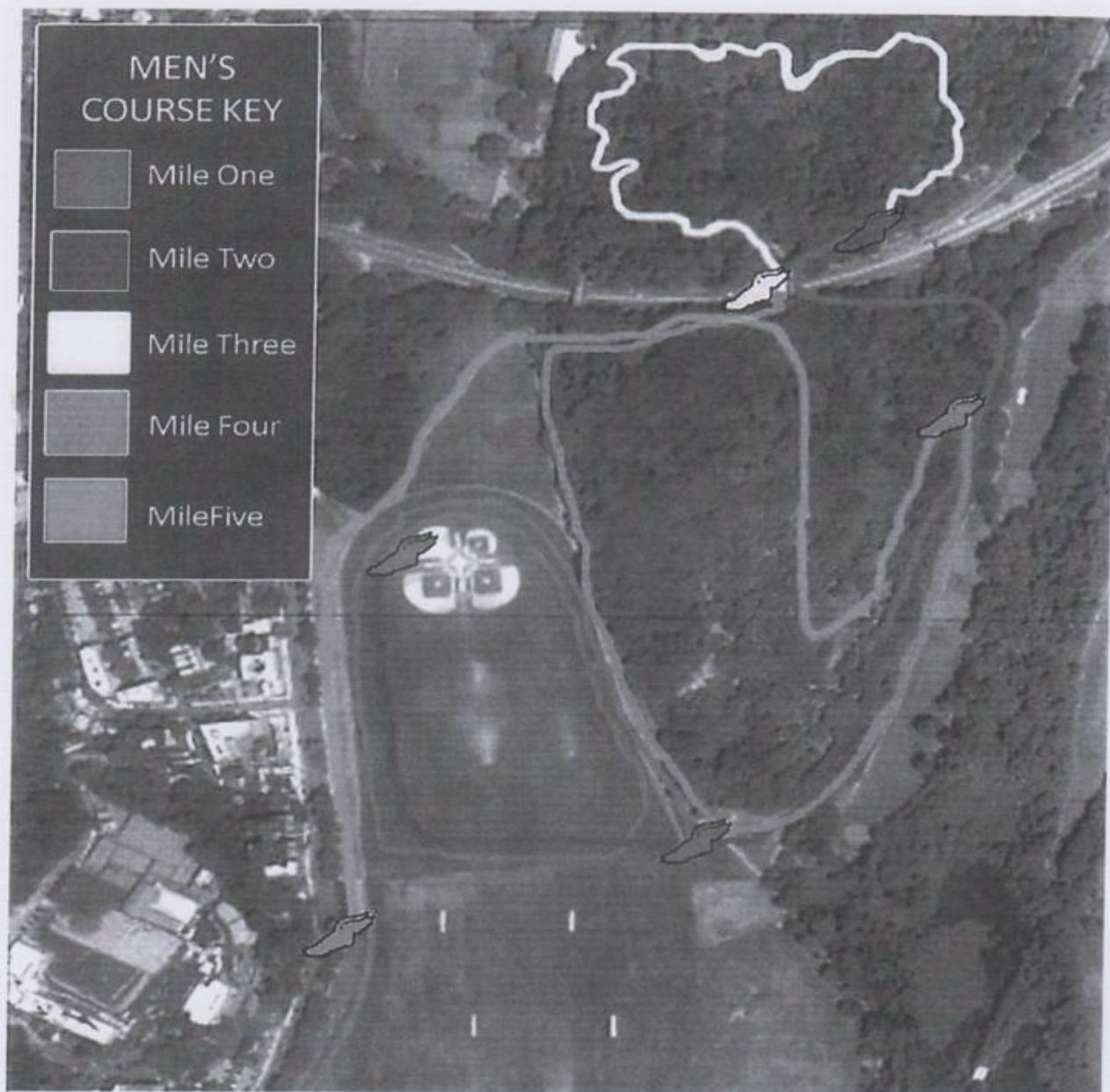
ECAC CROSS COUNTRY MAP

About the ECAC

The Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) is the nation's largest conference and only multi-divisional conference, with approximately 300 Division I, II, and III colleges and universities from Maine to South Carolina and westerly to Missouri. Established in 1938 under the leadership of inaugural Commissioner Asa S. Bushnell with 58 charter members, the ECAC has since emerged as the nationwide leader in service. The ECAC headquarters relocated from Centerville, Mass. to the Matrix Corporate Center in Danbury, Connecticut in July of 2014.

Competition

The ECAC administers nearly 100 championships for 32 men's and women's sports. The ECAC also serves as the primary league for Division III men's hockey (3), Division III women's hockey (2), Division II field hockey, and Division II men's lacrosse.

Officiating

The ECAC assigns over 3,000 officials in 10 sports across Divisions I, II, and III. The bureaus assign for regular season events, as well as, conference and NCAA championships

Awards

The ECAC publicizes the achievements of over 5,000 student-athletes annually through the Weekly Honors program and post-season all-stars. During the fall convention each year, the Honors Dinner awards program recognizes institutions, administrators, student-athletes, and officials for yearly and career achievements.
