This IC4A held to form as a close battle, even if it had looked like a runaway for most of the meet. George Mason, with 32 points, was knotted in what appeared to be a close battle for 2nd with several schools as the meet drew to a close on Sunday.

On the other hand, Penn State had piled up 26 points on the first day, added another 16 with the shot results early Sunday, and their total of 62 points provided a large lead with just the three relays, the high jump and triple jump still undecided.

But George Mason's final rush, anticipated by Patriot coach John Cook and others who had charted the meet beforehand, was enough to give the school its first indoor IC4A title. While Penn State could only garner a 6th in the 2-mile relay and a 5th in the triple jump, George Mason scored wins in the 2-mile relay and high jump, a 3rd in the mile relay, and a total of 14 points in the triple jump.

George Mason did have some nervous moments, though, such as favored Tim Hesse pulling a stomach muscle shortly before the 400 final, then dropping out after taking only four strides in the race. Their second runner on the mile relay took a hard fall, but was able to continue running, with the team ending up in 3rd place. In addition, they lost another probable ten points when their freshman pole vaulter, Istvan Bagyula, returned to his native Budapest to compete in the World Championships, where he would finish 6th.

Other highlights of the meet included Michael Timpson's win in the 200, his final indoor IC4A race. Eugene McNeill, last year's winner, was disqualified in his heat for running out of his lane.

Elton Lewis (2:25.62) held off two challenges by Paul Vandegrift (4th-2:26.31) on the last lap before pulling away to a win in the 1000 over Mason's John Cook (2:25.93) and Paul Gabbrah (2:25.94).

Manhattan senior Bruce Phillip won the 500 in an impressive 1:01.49, but his 46.2 anchor in the mile relay wasn't enough to make up for an earlier mishap, as Seton Hall beat Manhattan, 3:14.91-3:15.04.

A new generation of sprinters emerged as freshmen Raghib Ismail (6.34) and Salaam Gariba (6.35) took 1-2 in the 55-meter dash.

Cats' Gariba gets fast start at IC4A

PRINCETON — An athlete who may be Villanova's first sprint star since Frank Budd and Paul Drayton turned in a doubly impressive performance yesterday in the 68th IC4A indoor track and field championships at Princeton's Jadwin Gym.

Salaam Gariba, a 20-year-old freshman from Ghana, won his qualifying heats in the 55- and 200-meter sprints — in what was only the fourth time he had ever run indoors.

Gariba, who enrolled at Villanova in January, turned in the day's second-fastest qualifying time in the 55-meter trials, winning the second heat in 6.39 seconds despite a so-so start.

About 3½ hours later, with his arms pumping aggressively and his legs working like pistons, Gariba tore around the unbanked, eighth-of-a-mile track to win the last of a dozen 200-meter heats in 22.03 seconds, the fifth-fastest time of the day.

The newest Wildcat thus assured himself of running both races again today, when the IC4A determines 16 individual titlists and the team championship.

Toward the latter, Penn State got off to a better start than any other contender in the 40-team field. Scoring 26 points through the first four final events, the Lions hold an eight-point lead over surprising second-place Princeton and have a 20-point advantage over George Mason, perhaps the Lions' biggest rival.

Adding to the 14 points produced by Barry Walsh and Eric Steenstra, who finished 2-3 in Friday's pentathlon, the Nittany Lions got 10 points in the pole vault from Mark Algeri (third) and Tom Kleban (fourth), and two more when Michael Timpson placed fifth in the long jump.

The pole vault was won by Maryland's John Finney, who cleared 17 feet, 4¼ inches for the only meet record of the day.

The Lions qualified for just about every final slot counted on by coach Harry Groves. "We did pretty well," Groves said. "But George Mason will come back strong tomorrow."

Patriots coach John Cook agreed. "We did about as well as we could do," he said. "But Penn State is having a better meet than I thought they would. It's going to be a dogfight."

That is common, of course, for the

IC4A, but the meet also continued the crash course that Gariba has taken up since he reached the United States.

"This was my fourth time indoors and my second at 200 meters," Gariba said after warming down from his 200 heat, "but it was very good. I was running relaxed, trying to reserve energy for the finals, to see if I can do here what I did in the Big East."

In that competition, Gariba won the 200 in 21.52. To do as well or better in today's IC4A final, Gariba will have to do it virtually alone. Thanks to the seeding of the two-section final, Gariba will run in the slower heat and hope to win the event without the push of such competitors as Timpson, the outdoor IC4A champ, who led all qualifiers at 21.72.

Another sprinter Gariba won't face is Eugene McNeill of East Carolina, the meet's defending champion at 200 meters. Through an error that plagued several other wayward lads, McNeill was disqualified for running out of his lane, shortly after he won his heat in 21.63.

Whatever his immediate achievement, Gariba is a welcome addition at Villanova, whose legendary track history has been built primarily from the exploits of middle-distance runners.

"He's got strength and his techniques are good," Nova coach Charlie Jenkins said. "He's got good acceleration off the blocks. We have to work with him, but it's basically good. His problem is that he's never run indoors before now, so he has a problem with the tighter turns."

In other results:

- Raghieb Ismail, the Notre Dame freshman better known for his football exploits, won the day's fastest 55-meter heat, at 6.35, one place ahead of Timpson. But the Irish kick-return specialist missed out in the 200 meters, falling short of making the final by .02 seconds.

- In the day's most dramatic final, Princeton savaged the long jump for 18 points when Vincent Smith and Alfred Dyer finished 1-2, in that order. Smith leaped 24-9¼ to beat his teammate by an inch and a half. Each Tiger managed his best mark on his last jump of the competition.

- In the only other final, Simon Linscheid of Iona won the 35-pound weight throw at 64 feet, 10¼ inches.

ROWBOTHAM WINS IC4A 800m; 'CATS FINISH 7th

Villanova University senior Paul Rowbotham (Orpington, Kent, England) captured a victory in the 800m at the IC4A Indoor Track and Field Championships, conducted this past weekend at Princeton University's Jadwin Gymnasium. Rowbotham's win helped Villanova's men's track team finish in a tie for seventh place overall.

Rowbotham won the race handily, reaching the tape in 1:50.08, with Pittsburgh's David Moore finishing second in 1:50.98. Wildcat junior Howard Jackson (Markham, Ontario) was fifth in the 800m, in 1:52.89.

The Wildcats finished with 32 team points, tied with Georgetown for seventh in the overall team standings. George Mason University won the IC4A title with 72 points, while Penn State was second with 65 and Princeton third with 40.

In the 55m, freshman Salaam Gariba (Tamale, Ghana) finished second in 6.35, and managed to finish third in the 200m with a time of 21.85. Junior Quentin Howe (Glens Falls, NY) was fifth in the 1000m, with a time of 2:27.28, and junior Jan Friedli (Copenhagen, Denmark) was fourth in the mile, in 4:12.77.

"I was pleased with the performances of Paul Rowbotham and Salaam Gariba," commented Dr. Charles Jenkins, Villanova's head track coach. "Paul ran an excellent race, and looks to be in good shape for the NCAA meet. Salaam turned in two outstanding performances. The thing to remember about Salaam's time in the 200m, is that up until a few weeks ago, he had never run on an indoor track.

"We look forward to competitive performances from our runners at the NCAA Championships," Jenkins continued. "I haven't decided whether Paul Rowbotham will run in the 800m or the two mile relay, but he's qualified in both, and Jan Friedli has qualified in the mile."

The Wildcats travel to Indianapolis, IN this week for the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships, at the Hoosierdome.
