PENN STATE AND NINE RETURNING CHAMPIONS ATTEMPT TO DEFEND TITLES IN 112th IC4A OUTDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

On the weekend of May 21-22, Yale University will play host to 61 colleges and universities competing in the annual outdoor IC4A Track and Field Championships, for the first time in history. The Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America (IC4A) outdoor track and field championships are now into the 112th year and it seems appropriate that the Eli track program, which is rich in tradition with 15 IC4A team titles and one of the founding fathers of the organization, serve as the host for this spring's championships.

Penn State University will be attempting to defend its team title for the third year in a row, but will have tough competition from George Mason University and the University of Maryland. The meet should prove to be extremely exciting and competitive, as 978 competitors will vie for the nineteen individual and two relay titles.

The track events will feature only three defending champions from last year's outdoor IC4A meet held at Villanova University. Junior Bruce Phillip of Manhattan College will be the favorite to defend his 400 meter title, while sophomore Bob Packowski of the U.S. Naval Academy and two-time IC4A champion Eric Carter of Penn State University will try to fight off contenders in the 3,000 meter steeplechase and 10,000 meters.

With two-time defending 100 meter champion Lee McRae of the University of Pittsburgh red-shirting the outdoor season, brothers Lee and Willie McNeill of East Carolina will be the favorites in the sprint events. Both McNeills completed successful indoor seasons, capturing championships in the indoor IC4A meet held at Princeton University. For the second straight year Lee was able to capture the 55 meter title, while Willie won the inaugural indoor 200 meter race.

Lee, in his senior season, will be the favorite in the 100 meter dash, after finishing second to McRae in last year's IC4A event. The strongest competition will come from senior Benny Cureton of West Virginia University and brother Willie. Cureton finished second to McNeill in the indoor 55 meter dash, and will be considered a top contender, even though his strongest event will be the 200 meters.

The 200 meters will be a close contest between Willie McNeill and Cureton. Although Cureton finished second in the outdoor 200 meters last year and is considered stronger over the "half-lap", McNeill edged him out in the indoor 200 meters at Jadwin Gym. If Michael Timpson of Penn State can stay injury free he will be considered a leading contender for a medal, along with Thorb Towles of Boston University.

All eight finalists in last year's 400 meters will be returning to Yale to make this event one of the most competitive. Led by defending champion Phillip of Manhattan, the field will consist of 1986 champion Edwin Modibedi of Villanova, Michael Greene of Navy, and Terrence Sheppard of James Madison, competing for medals.

Phillip, who captured the indoor 500 meters, will find his strongest competition from Modibedi, who finished second in the outdoor 400 meter last year.

Due to graduation, last year's champion in the 800 meter run, Ray Levitre of Penn State will not be returning, leaving this year's outdoor race somewhat of an "open" event. The Nittany Lions still may claim the title with a strong performance from Steve Balkey, who finished third in the outdoor 1,500 meters last year, and won this year's indoor 1,000 meter event. Other top contenders in the race will be Keefe Clemons of Princeton University, and David Moore of Pittsburgh; John Evans of Providence College; Darren Outler of Georgetown University and John Cook of George Mason University. Clemons captured the 800 meter event in the indoor IC4A, with Cook finishing third.

With two-time (1985-1986) IC4A champion Abdi Bile of George Mason no longer competing on the collegiate level, the favorite will be senior Michael Stahr of Georgetown. Stahr won the mile in the indoor meet at Princeton and set an IC4A record of 4:00.06. Other strong contenders in the event will be sophomore Frank Conway of Providence and junior Greg Whiteley of Brown University. Conway ran under the 4:00 minute mark in the recent indoor season, while Whiteley finished fourth in the indoor NCAA mile with a time of 4:01.87. Seniors Garrett Barry of Iona College and Brad Schlapak of Northeastern University finished third and fourth in the in-

door IC4A and will be strong contenders for medals.

The 3,000 meter steeplechase is one of the three running events with a returning champion from last year's outdoor IC4A, but sophomore Packowski will have a tough time defending his crown. Sophomore Jim Gibson of host Yale University burst onto the National scene with a time of 8:40.12 and a third place finish at the Penn Relays. Packowski finished fourth in the Penn race, despite falling in an attempt to take the lead. Mark Coogan of the University of Maryland and Tyno Carter of the U.S. Military Academy are capable of posting 8:45 times.

After placing first and second in the Penn Relays 5,000 meters, Whiteley of Brown and teammate Peter Loomis will be the favorites in that event at Yale. Other strong competitors in the race will be senior Dan Garrett of Notre Dame; Carter of Army; and two-time Big East Indoor 5,000 meter champion, John Trautmann of Georgetown.

The top IC4A contenders in the 10,000 meters will be senior Chris Schille of Brown and junior Tom Paskus of Dartmouth College, who finished third and fourth in the Penn Relays 10km race. In that race Schille recorded an impressive time of 29:00.92, while Paskus finished with a time of 29:02.37. Paskus' teammate Bob Kempainen finished seventh in the Penn race and will be a strong contender in the outdoor IC4A event, along with two-time defending champion Eric Carter.

In the 110 meter hurdles, Pittsburgh should dominate after Eric Cannon, Calvin Holmes, Elbert Ellis and George Ifill finished first, third, fourth and fifth in the indoor IC4A 55 meter hurdles. The second place finisher in that indoor race, Michael Forbes of New York Tech, will not be in the outdoor field, but Charles Lackey of Rider College will be a strong candidate to prevent a Pittsburgh sweep of the event.

Senior Pat Mann of Georgetown will have his last shot at the gold in the 400 meter hurdles, after finishing second in the event the past three outdoor seasons. Tony Valentine of Villanova, the 1986 IC4A champion, will also be back for his final outdoor season to rival Mann for first place. Juniors David Jones of Seton Hall University and Michael Timpson of Penn State will also be strong in the event.

In the field events six defending champions return from last years meet. Sophomore John Kovatch of LaSalle University will try to defend his title in the high jump; while senior D.D. Manns of James Madison, who recently set the IC4A Collegiate mark at 26-11.75 in the long jump, will return. Maryland teammates John Finney and Duane Carlisle will hope to defend titles in the pole vault and triple jump. In the weight events, sophomore C.J. Hunter of Penn State and senior Gary Halpin of Manhattan will return in the shot put and hammer throw.

Although Kovatch is the returning champion, the favorite in the high jump will senior Ken Moody of Boston College. Moody won the indoor IC4A event, clearing 7-2.25. Senior Zon Thompson of St. John's University will also be a strong contender for a medal.

Terrapin John Finney is the favorite in the pole vault after winning the indoor IC4A event two years in a row. Finney vaulted 17-3 indoors this year and will try to reach

the NCAA qualifying height of 17-5.75. Senior Brent Vanderpool of Delaware State and Rutgers University teammates Dan Bertolomi, Steve Hess, and Steve Keating should vye for the silver and bronze medals.

Georgetown's Ray Humphrey edged out Manns in the indoor long jump at Princeton and the Penn Relays, but the battle rages on. Manns holds the IC4A Collegiate record of 26-11.75. Other top performers to watch for are Boston University senior Fred Salle, Ray Hawkins of Boston College and Al Dyer of Princeton.

The favorite in the triple jump is George Mason's Trevor Black, who won the event at the indoor IC4A and Penn Relays. Carlisle of Maryland, Donovan Fraser of St. John's, and junior Tom Mowatt finished first, second, and third at last year's outdoor IC4A, and should provide strong competition for Black.

C.J. Hunter is the reigning IC4A shot put champion, capturing last year's outdoor and this year's indoor titles. The Nittany Lion was edged out at the Penn Relays by Navy freshman Robert Sehnert, setting the stage for a competitive event. Discus will be an event that is basically "open", with defending champion and meet record holder Tony Washington of Syracuse University red-shirting the outdoor season. Top contenders will be Dartmouth freshman Marty Perkins, who won the Penn Relay Championship; Hunter of Penn State and Nick Sweeney of Harvard University.

Manhattan's Halpin is the heavy favorite in the hammer throw, with Tony Kenneally of Boston University, Jim Russell of Harvard and Steve Dering of Syracuse battling for the silver and bronze medals. With an IC4A Collegiate record of 245-0, Yale's Chris Athanasia is the favorite to win the javelin throw. Bill Parisi of Iona and John Hanley of Penn State are the other medal contenders.

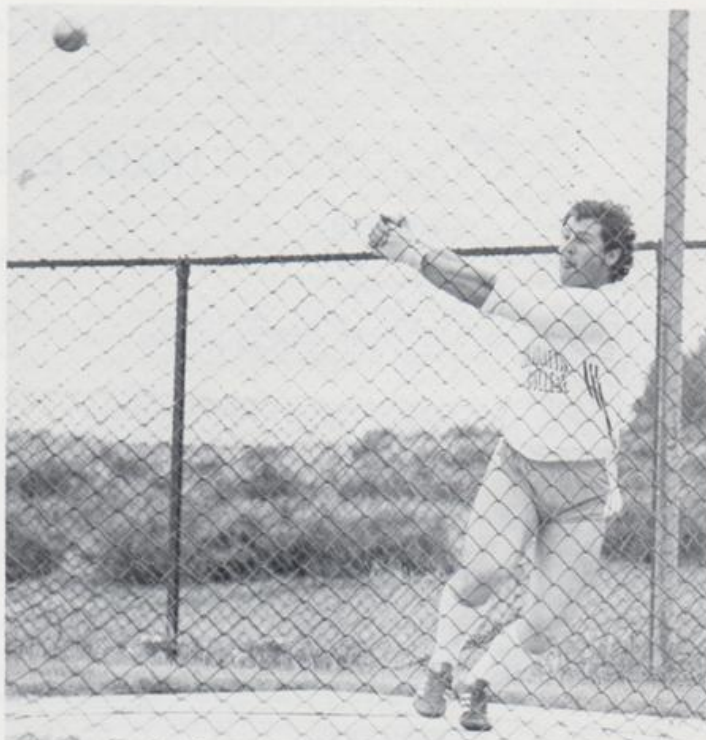

Yale and its 112 Years of Rich IC4A Track & Field Tradition

For the first time in its storied track and field history, Yale University hosts the ICAAAA Outdoor Championships. With 15 total IC4A team titles and 139 individual champions, Yale appropriately welcomes the Outdoor Championships back to New England for the first time since 1940.

Yale's first organized track program was actually an intramural competition for athletes organized by the students themselves. Walter Camp ('80) — the virtual father of modern football — relates an anecdote that gives a flavor of the early teams. While at baseball practice one day, he was asked by one of the students organizing an upcoming meet to participate. Camp, always ready for a challenge, accepted. To decide which event to enter, he examined the various prizes offered for each event. Deciding that the one offered for the hurdles "was by far the most valuable," he entered the event, and with almost no training, won a silver cup.

From these inauspicious beginnings, track organized itself throughout the decade of the 1870s into a more cohesive schedule of intercollegiate competition. The impetus actually came from another sport. Every July, the Yale crew met a number of other eastern colleges in an annual regatta in Saratoga Springs, New York. Early in the decade informal "foot races" were held between athletes of the schools competing in the regatta. Interest reached such a point that in 1876 the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America was formed with Yale acting as one of its founding fathers. Created to supervise an annual athletic competition between eastern schools, the ICAAAA — known as the IC4A — was the first English-speaking athletic association in the New World.

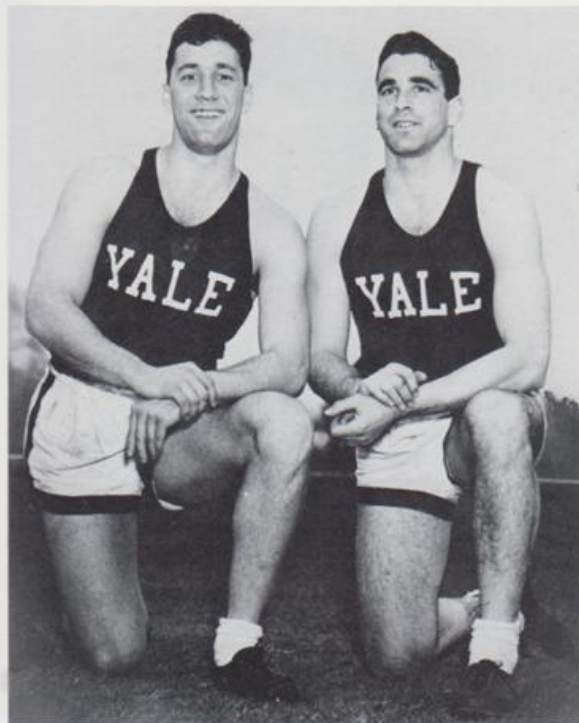
During the initial year of IC4A competition, Yale's W.J. Wakeman won the 120 yard high hurdles with a time of 18.25 seconds to give the Elis their first individual champion. In 1887 Yale won its first IC4A championship behind the efforts of two of the most able athletes in Yale's history, A.B. Coxe and Charles Sherrill. Coxe — whose brother later donated the funds to build the indoor track facility at Yale that now bears the family's name — became a two-time double winner in the shot put and hammer throw, breaking intercollegiate records in both events. As Coxe was completing a four-year reign in the shot put, Sherrill was beginning one in the 100 yard dash. Sherrill, who later became active in the Olympic movement and served as the U.S. Ambassador to France, was also responsible for one of the most basic innovations in all of sports. Early sprinters began their races in the standing position, arms cocked like a boxer. Sherrill introduced the modern four-point crouch, which allowed the sprinter a far more powerful start.

Yale captured a second IC4A crown in 1889, with Sherrill finishing first in both the 100 and 220. It was after Sherrill had graduated, however, that Yale enjoyed its greatest string of success, winning four consecutive titles from 1893 through 1896. That final victory brought to a close seventeen years of dominance by Yale and Harvard, but their unmatched success in IC4A competition made it only natural for the two track powers to initiate dual meets. Thus, in 1891, Yale and Harvard met in a raging downpour before three thousand spectators to inaugurate another phase of one of the country's most distinguished rivalries.

The 1980s saw Yale play an important role in the international track scene. In 1894 the team travelled to England to meet Oxford in track and field. The following year Oxford and Cambridge journeyed to New York to meet a com-

bined Yale-Harvard team which was virtually dominated by Eli trackmen. The Yale-Harvard versus Oxford-Cambridge competition has continued biennially, encompassing 28 meets to date, the most recent one being held in England in 1987.

The early decades of the 1900s saw Yale emerge as one of the nation's powers in track and field. The new century found Yale capturing the IC4A championship three straight years, from 1902 to 1904. What crystallized Yale's position during these years was the Elis' domination in the pole vault. From 1896 until 1912, Yale won the IC4A pole vault event thirteen times. Arthur C. Gilbert ('08), who shared the 1908 IC4A title in that event with three other Eli trackmen, soon became recognized as the father of modern pole vaulting. The man who was later to delight generations of boys with his Lionel train sets had developed an early basic vaulting technique.

Yale vaulters consistently established world records in that event; they were the first to clear the 12 foot, 13 foot, and 14 foot barriers. In 1912, John Gardmer set the world mark at 13'9". Nine years later, Truman Gardner won the first NCAA championship in the event. In 1927, Sabin Carr, a three-time IC4A champion and perhaps Yale's greatest vaulter, cleared the 14 foot mark: a feat made more remarkable by the fact that waiting at the bottom of the vaulter's descent was only a sawdust pit. In the late 1940s, the Yale athletics staff, looking to improve the pit area, gathered remnants from an automobile cushion factory in nearby Ansonia, transported them to New Haven, and wrapped the cushions together in bundles to create the world's first non-sawdust pit. Besides its role as innovator, Yale maintained its prominence in the event through the 1930s; from 1924 to 1941, Eli vaulters won twelve indoor and nine outdoor IC4A championships.

Pole vaulters were not the only champions for Yale. The school formed its first cross-country teams in 1907, and in 1915 Johnny Overton became Yale's first IC4A individual champion. In the 1930s, what began as outdoor quadrangular track meets between Yale, Harvard, Dartmouth, and Cornell grew into the Heptagonal championships, which included Columbia, Penn, and Princeton. Following the war years, Army, Navy, and Brown joined the field of competitors that continue to participate in the yearly meet. Although name changes have been considered, the members have chosen to retain the traditional title, and so it is that every spring, the outdoor Heptagonals have determined the best of ten teams and the Ivy League champion.

The years following World War II initiated Yale's greatest triumphs in track and field. In 1946, Bob Giegengack was hired as the Eli head coach. During his 29-year tenure, "Gieg's" teams notched eleven Outdoor and four Indoor Heptagonal championships, and four IC4A crowns, two each indoor and outdoor. Most of Yale's 27 track and field Olympians competed during the Giegengack era, including Jim Fuchs, Victor Frank, Wendell Mottley, Jay Luck, Frank Shorter, Rich MacDonald, and Kwaku Ohene-Frempong. Giegengack himself was the assistant coach for the 1956 Olympic team, and in 1964 he was the head coach of what is considered America's strongest Olympic track and field team, winning twelve out of a possible 24 gold medals in Tokyo.

Yale's greatest track teams came in the period from 1948 to 1950. Led by the "Iron Twins" — world-record shot putter "Jungle Jim" Fuchs and Olympic discus thrower Vic Frank — Yale won the IC4A Outdoor Championships twice, in 1948 and 1950, and the Heptagonals three times, twice outdoors in '48 and '50 and indoors in 1950. The teams also began a five year string of consecutive dual meet victories; from the indoor meet at Cornell in 1947 to the same meet five years later, Yale never lost a meet. When that loss finally came in Ithaca, it was by a single point.

The 1950s saw Yale continue to maintain a pre-eminence in track and field. In 1954, Yale won both the Outdoor and Indoor Heptagonals. Most remarkable, however, was the IC4A Indoor title that the Elis clinched when captain Mike Stanley lunged at the finish line of the 1000 yard run to take second place away from Penn's Paul Raudenbush. Judges had awarded Raudenbush second place until photographs showed that Stanley had indeed edged out his rival. The year 1959 saw Yale's two mile relay team of James Stack, Ned Roache, Ed Slowick, and Tom Carroll dominate competition on the national level. That same year the Elis won the first of what would prove to be five consecutive Outdoor Heptagonal crowns.

If the late 1940s and 1950s were marked by accomplishments in field events, the 1960s witnessed great accomplishments on the track. In 1964, Wendell Mottley captured the world record in the indoor 660 yard run with a time of 1:09.2. He also set or tried five Yale indoor and outdoor records and won a silver medal in the 400 meters while competing for his home country of Trinidad. Mottley was beaten in that event by Mike Larrabee of the United States, whose coach was none other than Bob Giegengack.

The spring of 1968 saw Yale relay teams set ten records in five different events. What proved most astounding was that each record was set by a different quarter. One such example occurred in the spring Heptagonals, in which Yale came back from twelve points down to overcome favored Army and Harvard to capture the title. The final events in this meet were the 220, the 400 relay, and the mile relay. Rich Robin-

son took the 220 with a meet record of 21.5, closely followed by Yale's current women's track coach Mark Young, who had previously won the 440. Next, Robinson anchored Yale's 440 relay as the Eli established yet another new mark in winning. In the finale, the mile relay team of Young, Chuck Hobbs, Larry Kreider, and Steve Bittner broke a third meet record to give Yale its team victory.

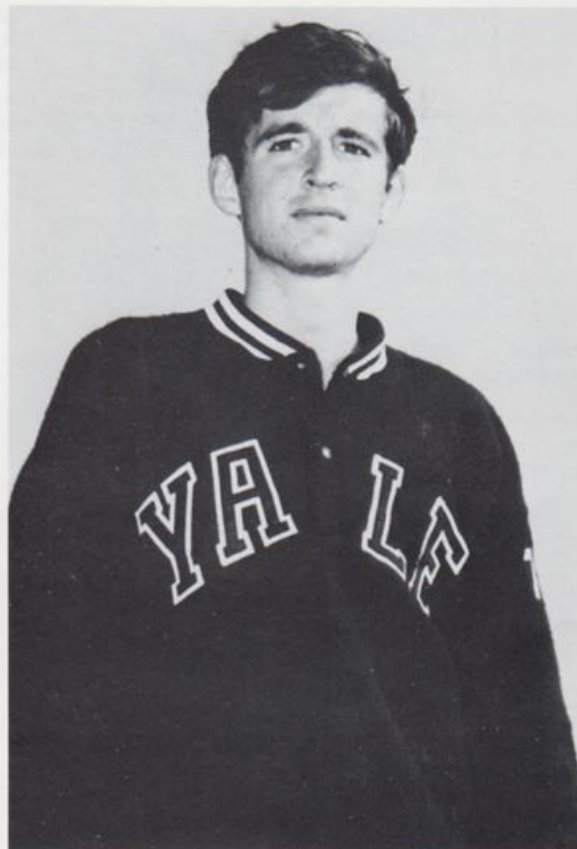
During the late 1960s and early 1970s, Yale track fans witnessed the accomplishments of such greats as long jumper, triple jumper, and future professional football star Calvin Hill, distance runner and Olympic Gold Medalist Frank Shorter, and Olympic hurdlers Jay Luck, Kwaku Ohene-Frempong, and Richard MacDonald, the latter two representing Ghana and Canada respectively.

The decade of the 1970s is generally seen as the nadir of Yale's track fortunes, yet this tells only half the story. In 1977 the university continued its commitment to leadership in the track world by fielding its first women's varsity teams in both indoor and outdoor track and in cross country. Mark Young, the 1968 men's captain, was hired in 1980 as full-time coach for the women's program, and in the eight years since, Young has lifted the Eli women to prominence.

Sparked by the arrival of head coach Steve Bartold, the men's program has entered a phase of rebuilding. In 1980, the men's cross country team responded with a 10-1 record and, led by Paul Erling, a 4th place finish in the Heptagonals, the team's highest since 1968. The 1981 squad duplicated the 10-1 mark but bettered their Heps showing with a third place finish that included record-setting performances by Andy Atkeson and Ben Wheeler, both of whom eclipsed Frank Shorter's Yale mark at Van Cortlandt Park (NY).

Throughout the present decade, Yale has maintained its dedication to a strong track and field program. Along with a \$2 million renovation of Coxe Cage, 1982 saw world-class miler Sebastian Coe visit the Yale campus as a Kiphuth Fellow. Yale's 1985 track teams were the first to use the renovated DeWitt Cuyler Complex, the site of this weekend's meet, and they responded with an outstanding year. At the outdoor Heptagonals, Steve Bartold's squad finished third, Yale's highest finish in the outdoor event since 1970. At the meet, Eugene Profit shattered Yale and New England records for the long jump with a leap of 26'2". Profit's performance qualified him for the NCAA championships, where he placed fifth and became the first All-American from Yale since Frank Shorter had accomplished the feat in 1969. Other outstanding Yale performers in recent years include 1984 Olympian Larry Miller, who finished third in the 400 meters at the IC4A's in 1985 and 1986, two-time NCAA All-American Jim Driscoll, who placed second in the hammer throw at last year's IC4As, and pole vaulter Nathan Way, whose third place showing in the 1987 IC4As recalls the glory years of Yale track.

As a founding member of the IC4A, and as a twelve-time winner of the outdoor title, Yale is proud to reaffirm its commitment to track and field by hosting this year's Outdoor Championships.

50 Years of Tradition, Diversity & Service

Proudly celebrating its 50th anniversary in 1988, the Eastern College Athletic Conference is a voluntary association of 250 colleges and universities throughout New England, the Middle Atlantic states, Virginia, the District of Columbia and North Carolina.

The ECAC, which is the nation's largest athletic conference, is unique in that institutions of Divisions I, II & III are members, from the largest state-supported universities to the small private or church affiliated colleges, lending the conference an unparalleled diversity in membership and philosophy.

A Conference of conferences, the ECAC umbrella covers dozens of playing conferences and other associations. Colleges and universities from the Big East and Ivy League to the Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, New York and New Jersey State Conferences, along with 14 other Division I, II and III conferences, hold active membership in the ECAC.

Over the years, the ECAC has developed a strong voice on not only the regional level, but also on the national scale with the National Collegiate Athletic Association. Since over 25 percent of the NCAA is made up of ECAC members, the Conference membership has the ability to play a leading role in the development of national athletic policy and action.

From the viewpoints of both philosophy and personnel, the ECAC's impact upon the NCAA is well documented. The ECAC and its member colleges have been prime movers in the development of divisional structure and autonomy which was also adopted by the NCAA. John Toner, University of Connecticut athletic director and Boston College's athletic director, Bill Flynn, have served both as NCAA and ECAC Presidents to head the list of prominent ECAC administrators who have served key leadership roles in the NCAA. Former Cornell athletic director Dick Schultz is now the executive director of the NCAA.

Founded in 1938 as the Central Office for Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics, the ECAC began with a charter membership of 53 colleges and has grown into its present membership of 250. From the start, under the leadership of its first Commissioner, Asa S. Bushnell, the conference addressed the concerns of its members in the same fashion as it does today. Bushnell and the Central Office were able to meet and resolve athletics scheduling issues, administer the assignment of officials and lend its management skills to various tournaments and championships.

In 1947, the Central Office officially became the Eastern College Athletic Conference and another assignment was taken on by the ECAC -- that being the maintenance of minimum standards of eligibility for student athletes and the establishment of basic principles for the ethical conduct of intercollegiate athletics, by member colleges. While recognizing the right of each individual college to set its own academic standards programs and operate under its own code of ethics, the membership of the ECAC legislated certain minimum standards of eligibility which now apply to all Conference members in such areas as amateurism, recruiting, academic standing, financial aid, years of participation and outside competition, all of which are now consistent with standards also adopted by the NCAA.

Bushnell molded and guided the organization from its inception until his retirement in 1970, at which time his long-time associate, George L. Shiebler, was appointed Commissioner. Robert M. (Scotty) Whitelaw, who joined the ECAC in 1960 as Assistant Commissioner, succeeded Commissioner Shiebler upon his retirement in 1972. Under Whitelaw's leadership the ECAC has continued to prosper as the largest and one of the most dynamic and diversified athletic conferences in the country.

Today the ECAC has evolved to the point where its member institutions not only enjoy the benefits such as the professional management and coordination of its numerous tournaments and championships, expertise on eligibility and rules interpretations and the assigning of officials, but also public relations department and service bureau to promote the membership's teams and student athletes, all in an atmosphere of mutual trust which was always commonplace among ECAC institutions from the start.

The ECAC now assigns officials for regular season and championship events in the sports of baseball, men's and women's basketball, fencing, football, gymnastics, ice hockey, men's and women's soccer and wrestling, as well as the ECAC affiliate championships in cross country, indoor and outdoor track, crew and swimming.

In addition, the ECAC professionally manages over 70 championship events for its member colleges -- including those for Division I men's basketball, ice hockey and baseball tournaments whose winners receive automatic berths into their respective NCAA Championships, and terminal ECAC championships for all three divisions in the sports of football, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's golf, men's and women's lacrosse, field hockey, men's and women's gymnastics, men's and women's ice hockey, swimming and diving, women's volleyball, cross country, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track, softball and Division II and III baseball.

The ECAC office also helps manage the championship tournaments of its affiliates in cross country and track (IC4A), wrestling (Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association), fencing (Intercollegiate Fencing Association), swimming (Eastern Intercollegiate Swimming League), crew (Eastern Association of Rowing Colleges & the Intercollegiate Rowing Association) and gymnastics (Eastern Intercollegiate Gymnastics League). The ECAC Holiday Basketball Festival, held every year at Madison Square Garden in New York City, is sponsored by the ECAC and is the premier Christmas tournament in the country.

With the help of its public relations and service bureau departments, the ECAC helps to promote its members' athletic programs and athletes through weekly and seasonal players and teams of the year awards, selection of all-star teams, compilation of statistics and publications, as well as publicizing its championships.

The ECAC current headquarters, the Asa S. Bushnell Center, is located in Centerville, Mass., and was dedicated to its first commissioner in 1974. The ECAC is currently staffed by 20 full-time employees with an additional part-time staff of 15 serving as supervisors of officials.
