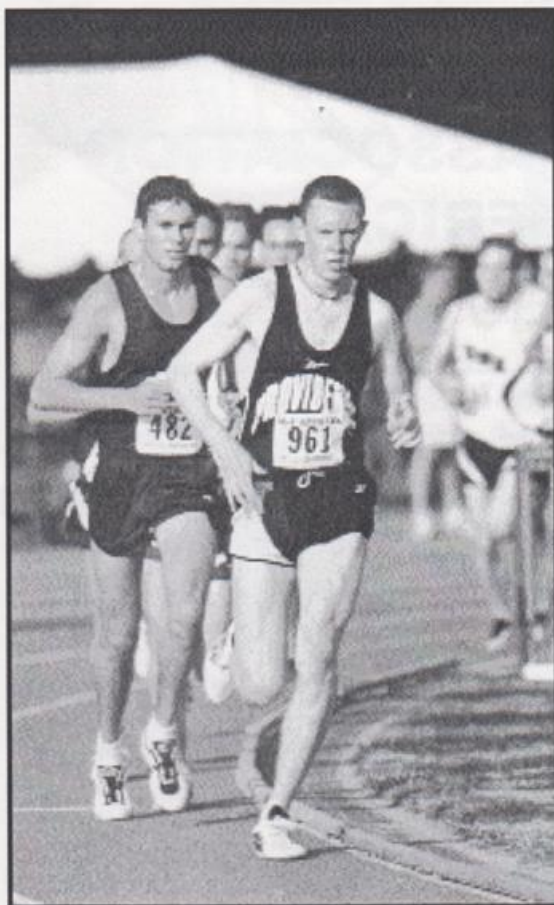


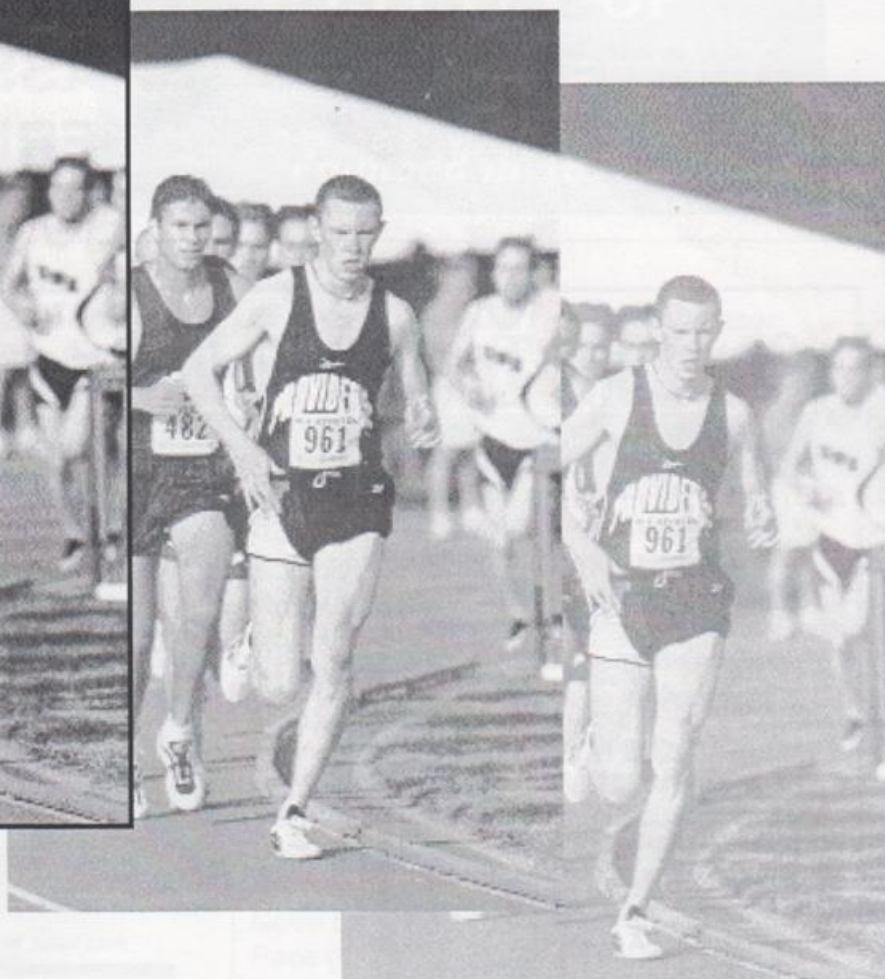

Kelly Writes His Own Chapter in Providence's Record Books

When you meet Keith Kelly for the first time, the words "NCAA Champion" do not come to mind. A tall, thin guy from a small Irish town named Drogheda about 30 miles out of North Dublin, Kelly may be one of the nicest and down-to-earth athletes you may meet Providence College. Yet within the thick accent of Kelly's voice is a champion - a NCAA Champion - and one of the greatest runners in the history of the Providence College Track Program.

Like many kids growing up in Europe, Kelly did not imagine himself as a star runner when he was younger - he wanted to play soccer. But to stay out of trouble, Kelly joined a local running club in Drogheda and started running seriously in high school as a result of a physical education teacher with a passion for running.

"He got me training very hard and focusing on running rather than on soccer," explains Kelly, "and I really just took off from there. I started competing in national competitions and winning races, training hard, watching what I ate, gym work and did all of those things right. And to top it off, I got to come to America."

An interesting part of Kelly's growing up includes the fact that both of his parents deaf, thus allowing him and his brother to have become fluent in sign language. While Kelly didn't really know any other way, he explains that there were little differences growing up.

"There were a few differences, you know, like when you go to sporting events and your parents aren't really talking to anybody because they can't communicate," says Kelly. "So that was hard. But my parents have been great to me all my life, and have always supported my running, so I don't consider them different at all. They are amazing people."

As a collegiate Track athlete, Kelly has not one season each year, but three, and must stay constantly in-shape all year round. Therefore, when listing the number of successes Kelly has accomplished in his career at PC, he is truly a testament to what hard work and dedication can bring you when you set goals for yourself. Kelly attributes the majority of his success to the working relationship and friendship that he and Head Coach Ray Treacy have developed over his time here.

"It feels pretty good, especially when you set a target for yourself like I did," explains Kelly.

"When I came here, my first four years here went great, and then when I started really working closely with Ray, the long-term goal was, 'OK, you're a fifth-year senior, we're trying to win the NCAA Championships,' and I made that my long-term goal. So when that happened, it wasn't so much just being a champion - it's the fact that Ray and I set a goal and we achieved that." "No matter what that goal is," Kelly continued, "just to achieve something that you set out to do with your coach and to work so hard to get that goal, that's what does it - that's what so special about it."

In addition to the 2000 NCAA Cross Individual Championship, Kelly is a three-time All-American in Cross Country. He has won two NCAA Regional Championships in his career, two New England Championships, and this past year won the Big East Cross Country Championship after two previous years of finishing in second place.

Also of great pride for Kelly are the team awards that he has been a part of in his career here, most recently winning the Big East Cross Country Team Championship, and finishing in the top three at the NCAA Championships at Iowa State this past fall.

"We so much believed in ourselves," tells Kelly. "There

was a level that we would not allow each other to drop below. And we finished 3rd in the country. When we carried that trophy home it was almost better to carry the team trophy than carry the individual trophy."

Kelly has also mastered the 3,000 and 5,000 meters for the Friars in the Indoor Track season. This past winter, he claimed his fourth All-American honor by placing third in the 3,000 meters at the NCAA Indoor Track Championships at the University of Arkansas. Also on his list of accolades are a pair of Big East Championships in the 3,000 meters and the 5,000 meters and three IC4A Championships (5,000 meters and two in the 10,000 meters).

Kelly is currently training for the last championships of his college career for the Outdoor Track season. He is a two-time IC4A Champion in the 10,000 meters, a 10,000 meter and a 5,000 meter Big East champion, and a New England champion in the 5,000 meters. And with the way Kelly is running this spring, another All-American honor - and possibly a second NCAA Individual Championship - is not out of the question.

On May 6, Kelly ran in his final Big East Championship and captured the 5,000 meter title in an NCAA provisional qualifying time of 13:58.40. Running all alone for the entire race, Kelly ran the fifth fastest 5,000 time ever at the Big

East and the fastest since 1993. He earned his seventh Big East title, which tied him with former Friar Mark Carroll for the most Big East individual championships ever at Providence.

This weekend, he will be looking to capture a school record fourth IC4A title. Although he won the IC4A 10,000 meter championship in 1998 and 1999, this year he will try to capture his first IC4A 5,000 meter outdoor championship. In 2000, Kelly won the IC4A indoor 5,000 meter title. This will be his final collegiate 5,000 meter race as he will run the 10,000 meters at the NCAA Outdoor Championship in Eugene, Oregon.

Kelly's accomplishments have not gone unnoticed in his homeland, either. He was chosen by the Irish National team to run in the European and World Cross Country Championships. In fact, Kelly recently placed 24th in the World Cross Country Championships - the Olympics of Cross Country.

In his spare time, Kelly toys with deejaying techno and house music; in fact, he has turntables in his bedroom.

"Music - without music, I'd go mad. With running you have a pretty quiet lifestyle - you rest an awful lot. So I just go to the turntables and mix it up."

Kelly admits, however, that he will miss his teammates the most. "I haven't seen a team anywhere that has gelled the way we did. We're a unit. Runners are different people - someone that runs 100 miles a week and doesn't drink, watches what they eat, goes to bed early - it's a different mentality because it's such a hard sport. So that's why we're tight, because we love doing that. We love going out and torturing ourselves by running."

In fact, Kelly attributes his success to his friends, the most. "I would be nowhere without my teammates, my coach, my girlfriend and my family. I would be nowhere if during those training sessions I felt the pressure of the lads pushing me. That's the difference. On your own you can only do so much, but when you got a team behind you pushing you - it's amazing." With support from two countries' fans behind him, Keith Kelly could very well follow in the steps of former PC Olympian John Treacy, and write the next chapter of his successes on the world level.

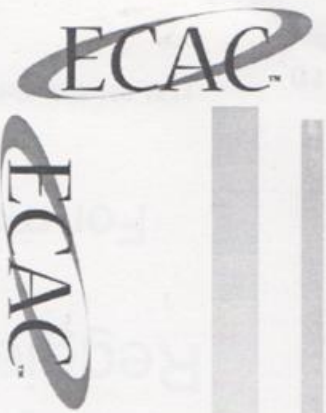
