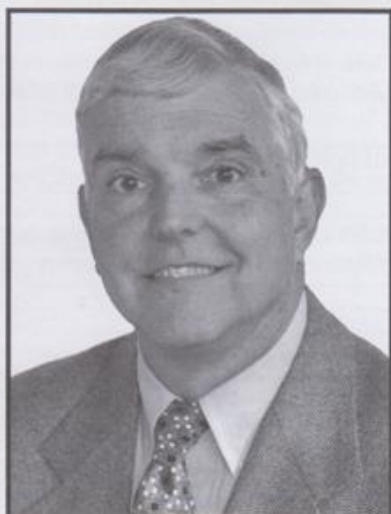

Competition

The ECAC administers nearly 100 regular season and postseason championships and/or events for 37 men's and women's sports. The ECAC also serves as the primary league for Division III men's hockey (3), Division III women's hockey (2), and Division I men's lacrosse. In addition, the ECAC provides leadership assistance for numerous affiliate organizations including the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes in America (IC4A), Intercollegiate Fencing Association (IFA), Eastern Intercollegiate Gymnastics League (EIGL), Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association (EIWA), Eastern Association of Rowing Colleges (EARC), Eastern Association of Women's Rowing Colleges (EAWRC), and Intercollegiate Rowing Association (IRA).

Officiating

The ECAC assigns over 5,200 officials in 12 sports across Divisions I, II, and III, including baseball, men's and women's basketball, fencing, field hockey, football, gymnastics, ice hockey, men's and women's soccer, softball, and wrestling. The bureaus assign for both conference and NCAA championships and totaled over 46,000 assignments last year.

Awards

The ECAC publicizes the achievements of over 2,100 student-athletes annually through the Player of the Week program, and over 1,100 student-athletes through the postseason all-stars. There are 25 sports for which the ECAC selects Players of the Week throughout the regular season, and nine sports where all-star teams are honored. During the fall convention each year, the recognition awards program honors institutions, administrators, student-athletes, and officials for yearly and career achievements.

The Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) is the nation's largest athletic conference and only multi-divisional conference, with 320 member institutions and over 122,000 student-athletes ranging across 15 states from Maine to North Carolina and westerly to Illinois. Established in 1938 with 58 charter members, the ECAC has since emerged as the nationwide leader in service. The Asa S. Bushnell Center, named after inaugural commissioner Asa S. Bushnell, serves as the main office for the ECAC. It is located in Centerville, Massachusetts on Cape Cod.

After Asa S. Bushnell molded the organization from its formation to his retirement in 1970, George Schiebler took over as commissioner from 1970-1972. Robert M. "Scotty" Whitelaw (1972-1989) guided the ECAC through one of the most significant events in its history, as the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate

Athletics for Women (EAIW) was consolidated into the ECAC in 1983. With the addition of women's sports, the ECAC doubled its number of championships and greatly increased its membership. Clayton Chapman (1989-1998), Phil Buttafuoco (1998-2006), and Steve Bamford (2006-2007) have also carried the title of commissioner through the last 19 years. Current commissioner Rudy Keeling assumed chief administrator duties on May 1, 2007.

The ECAC maintains two primary websites – one dealing with administrative issues, while the other serves as a fan-friendly site for news and results from all athletic events. Through the ECAC.tv web casting, the conference has the ability to showcase the excitement of college athletics within the 15-state footprint to a national and international audience. The ECAC also coordinates with institutions, television vendors and broadcast partners to televise quality sports programming on regional networks including Comcast (CN8 Sports), College Sports Television (CSTV), Entertainment and Sports Programming Network - University (ESPN), and the New England Sports Network (NESN).

The prestigious Asa S. Bushnell internship program, named after the first commissioner of the ECAC and established in 1976, offers college graduates from ECAC member institutions hands-on experience in all the areas of the only multi-divisional conference in the country. Former interns proudly represent the ECAC in all fields of the sports industry as directors of athletics, commissioners, broadcasting executives, professional franchise front-office executives, sports information directors and coaches.

All Good Things Must Come To An End



After a 23-year stint as the head coach of VMI Track and Field, it was announced in early March that Mike Bozeman will retire at the conclusion of the 2008 outdoor season.

"I am indebted to VMI for the opportunities they have given me during my tenure here," said Bozeman. "During my time here, the greatest satisfaction for me has come from working with the young men and women in the track and field program, as well as in the Corps of Cadets. It has been an honor and a privilege to follow in the footsteps of esteemed previous VMI coaches, and I feel I have given

my best efforts to continue the great tradition of VMI Track and Field and Cross Country."

Bozeman has directed VMI's Track and Field program since 1985, a run that included 12 Southern Conference championships and 13 Conference Coach of the Year honors, including the 2005 Big South co-Coach of the Year award. He also coached numerous all-conference honorees, including the Big South Conference 800-meter record holder, current team member Felix Kitur, as well as two NCAA All-Americans. In addition, he has held various responsibilities related to Cross Country during his time at VMI.

"Mike Bozeman has had a terrific run as VMI's Head Track and Field Coach. The program has enjoyed great success during his time here," VMI Athletic Director Donny White offered. "VMI is indebted to Coach Bozeman for that, as well as for his outstanding leadership."

During his time at VMI, Bozeman's diverse skills and expertise were called upon by the Institute in many ways. He was Commandant of the Corps of Cadets from June 1994 to July, 1996, and he was VMI's interim athletic director from January through May 1998.

"During those times, Coach forced us, as a staff, into positions that required us to learn and develop our skills as leaders and coaches. He had responsibilities over and above the track and field program," offered long-time Bozeman assistant, VMI Associate Head Coach Darrin Webb.

One of Bozeman's assignments was to help build a viable women's athletic program at VMI. The first women's sport was cross country which started in 1997. A year later, indoor track was added, and in 1999 outdoor track began competition. In 2002, Mildred Cooper became the first female Conference Champion at VMI, winning the shot put at the Southern Conference outdoor championships. Cooper was recently named to the SoCon's 25th Anniversary Women's Indoor Track and Field team.

Bozeman's efforts were also instrumental in VMI gaining membership into the prestigious Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America (IC4A) Conference, where the team has had outstanding success since joining. In both 2004 and 2005, two Keydets, including Garrett Brickner in the high jump, captured IC4A titles. Bozeman also helped initiate the VMI women's team's acceptance into the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC).

Before his arrival at VMI, Bozeman spent the previous six seasons as the field events coach for the University of Florida. Sixteen Gator athletes were named All-SEC during Bozeman's tenure and 15 participated in the NCAA Championships with four attaining All-American status. A 1967 graduate of The Citadel, he opened his 37-year coaching career at South Carolina, where he was an assistant coach from 1970-73 while earning his Master's degree. In addition, he coached at Spring Valley High School in Columbia, S.C., where he was named Coach of the Year on three occasions. Four of his athletes were named All-American including Ernest Marvin, who in 1978 was the number four high school triple jumper of all time. Associate Coach Webb offered a comment about why, precisely, Bozeman may have enjoyed this success.

"I know he has taught me the importance of how to develop young people, into men and women, that strive to reach their absolute potential on and off the track.

He showed me that if you develop people that want to be good at what they do, the sky is the limit as to what they are able to accomplish."

And develop them Bozeman has, in part with his having been heavily involved in numerous activities promoting the development of amateur track and field on all levels. He helped start the South Carolina High School Track Coaches Association and edited the track and field honor roll for many years. He was a charter lead instructor in the Athletic Congress Certification Program for coaches and conducted many clinics throughout the country. He has been a leader in decathlon development in the U.S. and has led U.S. squads to international competitions in Cuba, Japan, and Germany. One of his former athletes, Jim Wooding, was a member of the 1984 Olympic team. A retired Brigadier General in the U.S. Army Reserve, his awards and decorations include the Silver Star, Bronze Star, Legion of Merit, Air Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, the Combat Infantryman's Badge, and the Ranger Tab. He is also a 1992 graduate of the U.S. Army War College. After commissioning in 1967, he spent three years on active duty including a year in Vietnam, where he served with distinction as a platoon leader and commanded a Long Range Reconnaissance Patrol Unit. He is married to the former Carol Kennon, and they have two children (Gioia and Robert. Bozeman and his wife also have four grandchildren (Luke, Wade, Caroline and Reilly).

In closing, the words of the three other VMI Track and Field coaches convey the spirit and attitude of the man behind this biographical information, as well as the type of respect that Coach Bozeman has drawn during his illustrious career.

Assistant Coach Zack Scott stated, "The type of dedication, respect, and loyalty Coach Bozeman has given to his student-athletes for the past 23 years has earned him the same in return. That is not just reflected in the records and awards he has won, but in developing a track and field team that has met VMI's high standards of excellence, and has helped the student-athlete succeed, before and after graduation."

"I have learned a great deal from working with Coach Bozeman during my time at VMI," said Cross Country Coach Paul Spangler. "He has had a profound effect of instilling the hard work and discipline amongst this coaching staff, as well as helping give the athletes the characteristics needed for them to be successful on and off the track. His leadership is what has helped make the Track and Cross Country programs some of the most successful sports at VMI."

Finally, Coach Webb offered, "I have had the privilege of working for someone that can be defined in five words, loyalty, honesty, demanding, fair, and leadership. Coach Bozeman is a man that believes what is right is right regardless of the consequence. It has been a privilege to be part of the final 14 years of Coach Bozeman's 38-year coaching career, as he is a man that has had a lasting impact not only on our athletes, as well as the athletes everywhere he's coached, but also on track and field as a whole. As I move forward, I will know that my career has developed into what it is today in large part thanks to the skills and beliefs that he has bestowed upon me. Thank you, Coach."

Quiller to Step Down After 13 Seasons at Army



Director of Athletics Kevin Anderson announced earlier this season that Army track and field head coach Jerry Quiller will retire from coaching at the conclusion of the 2008 outdoor track and field season.

Quiller, now in his 13th year at the helm of the cross country, and track and field programs at the Academy, has become one of the most successful coaches in the history of West Point's intercollegiate athletic program.

"Jerry Quiller has been the face of Army's track and field program for more than a decade," stated Anderson. "I cannot thank

him enough for the leadership he has provided to our cross country, and track and field programs. Jerry has established a degree of excellence in our track and field program of which we are all proud. We will miss him greatly and wish him well in his future endeavors. 'Coach Q' will always be a big part of our track and field program."

The Fort Collins, Colo., native has carried the men's track and field team to the Patriot League outdoor championship in each of his seasons at the Academy, running the Army streak to 16 consecutive titles. During his first 12 years as the head coach of the Black Knights' men's and women's programs, Quiller has garnered 36 total Patriot League championships and 22 coach of the year awards between the sports of cross country, and track and field.

"This was something I always wanted to do," said Quiller. "I have always had the utmost amount of respect for West Point and what the Academy stands for. The young people that come here are truly special, and I'm thankful to have had the chance to work with them and be a part of this program. I can't thank the Academy enough for what it has done for me and my family since we moved here."

Quiller took over the program from Ron Bazil in 1995 and continued to build a tradition of excellence that has seen the Army men go undefeated at the Patriot League Outdoor Championships since joining the league in 1992. Quiller has also guided the women's program to seven championships. The men's team has won eight of the last 10 indoor conference titles and the women have finished in the top three in the league in each of the last 10 seasons.

Quiller has been honored with the Patriot League Men's Track and Field Coach of the Year award by his peers in nine of his 12 years at Army, including a run of eight consecutive awards. In 1998, he earned the honor on both the men's and the women's side during the outdoor track and field campaign.

Forty-eight student-athletes have earned All-America laurels during Quiller's highly-decorated, 38-year coaching tenure. Many of his athletes have qualified for the U.S. Olympic team, including Dan Browne, a 1997 West Point graduate who competed in the 10,000-meter run and the marathon at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece.

The success of his teams at the Academy has not gone unnoticed on the national or international stages. Quiller was named an assistant coach by the United States Track and Field Association for the U.S. Track and Field Team at the 2000 Olympic Games. Quiller spent seven weeks in Sydney, Australia, working with the distance runners, including four athletes who qualified for the finals in the 1,500-meter, 5,000-meter, and 10,000-meter races.

Quiller joined the staff at West Point in 1995 after finishing his second stint at the University of Colorado where the Buffaloes' men's and women's cross country teams finished second and fourth, respectively, in the nation in 1994. That fall, he was named the national coach of the year. In total, Quiller spent 14 years at Colorado, picking up three Big 12 championships and a total of 12 men's and women's team appearances in the NCAA Championships. He earned conference coach of the year honors five times and coached a total of 19 All-Americans.

A native of Fort Collins, Colo., Quiller began coaching at Colorado in 1970. Along his coaching path, he made stops at Wayne State (Mich.) University, Colorado State University and Idaho State University before returning to Colorado in 1985.

"I suppose one of the hardest things will be leaving the fellow workers I've run into in the 12 years I have been here," adds Quiller. "The coaching staff, the athletics department and especially the two officer representatives the team was assigned have been an immense help and really turned out to be my best friends here. I don't know how often you become best friends with the people you work with, but it happened here."

"Sometime down the road, I'm going to read the names of these kids in the paper as the future leaders of our country. It's going to be honor to be able to say I was their coach."
