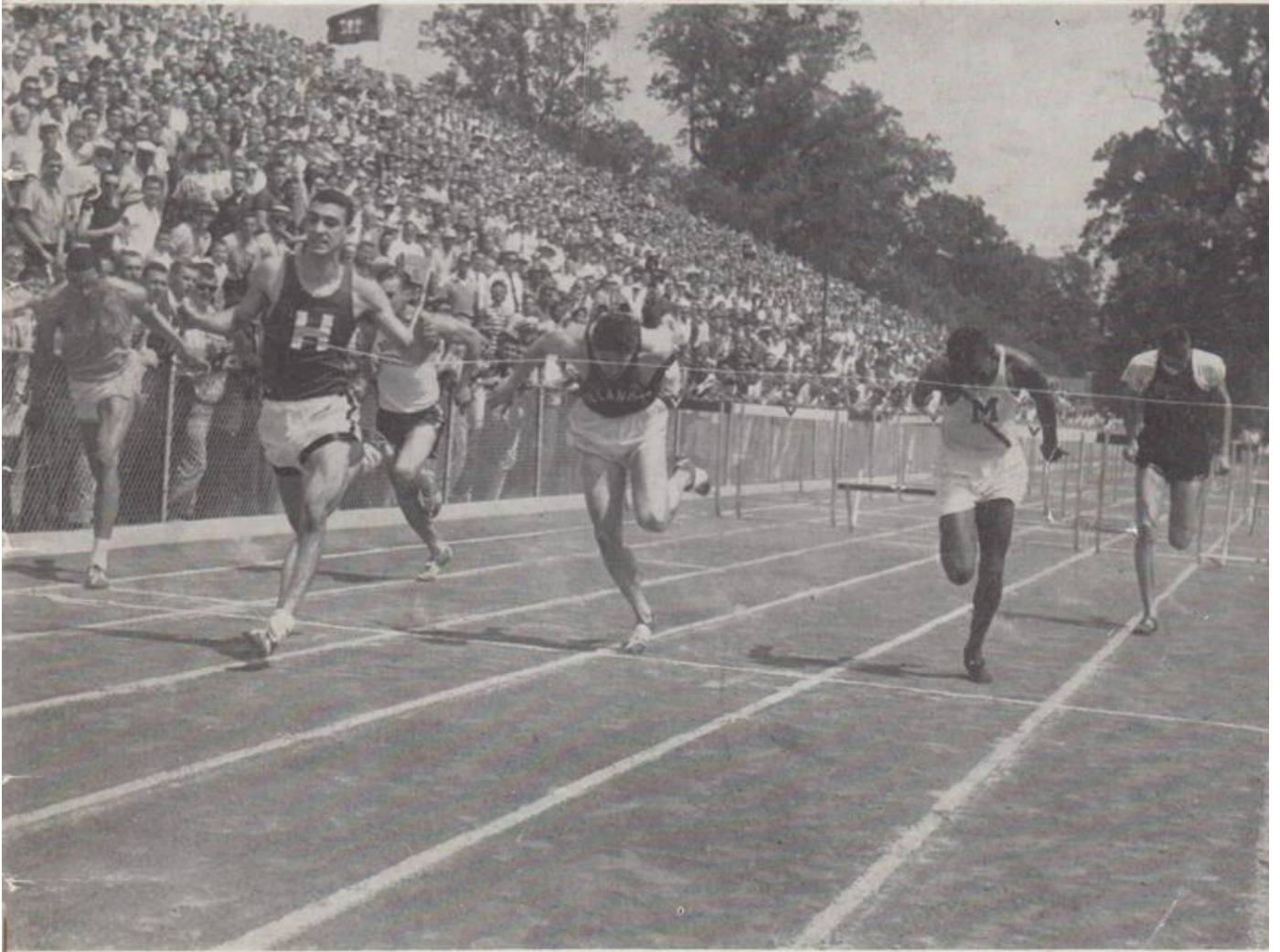

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General Information

Track measures four laps to mile.

All events are scratch, i.e., none is handicap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty for first false start, but competitor is disqualified for second false start.

In hurdle race competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In all relay races baton must be carried in runner's hand and must be passed to next succeeding teammate within clearly marked 20-yard zone, extending 10 yards in both directions from leg finish line.

Governing rules provide that, in races around turns, no runner shall cross in front of another unless and until he is 2 yards in front of his nearest competitor. Interference resulting from breach of this rule subjects offender to disqualification.

Each college is limited in actual competitors to one team in One-Mile Relay, two representatives in One-Mile and Two-Mile Runs, and five representatives in all other events.

A nominee or qualifier who fails to compete in any running or hurdling event for which he has been nominated or has qualified will be ineligible for any further participation in the meet.

Competitors must be on time for their events. They will be permitted on field ten minutes before their events are scheduled, but will be asked to leave immediately after their competition is finished.

In each event 15 points are scored: 5 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth, 1 for fifth.

WELCOME, SOPHOMORES!

AMONG the items the I.C.A.A.A. doesn't keep track of are the relative merits of succeeding sophomore classes.

We'll just have to take a chance—and wait for a documented rebuttal—in claiming that the Class of 1961 whose delegates we welcome for the first time at the Outdoor Championships is, in individual glitter and overall depth and balance, somewhat better than its predecessors.

First-time starters in the Outdoor Championships are potential scorers in all 15 solo events.

Three of them are already IC4A champions. They won their spurs in the Indoor Meet at Madison Square Garden last March. Jim Stack, of Yale, who came pretty much out of nowhere last winter, capped his swift climb by taking the 600 in 1:12 after running 1:10.2, fastest time of the winter season, though he made that time on the eight-lap Yale track. Angelo Sinisi, of Brown, won the 60-yard high hurdles in 7.3 after tying the meet record of 7.2 in the semifinals. Bjorn Anderson, Maryland's Danish import, cleared 14 feet in the pole vault in a tie for first.

Stack, an authentic powerhouse, had taken up track for the first time at The Hill School (his twin is a tennis player) and had run only three races before he came to Yale. He was a fairly solid freshman quarter-miler, Bob Giegengack admits, but he wasn't prepared for his varsity debut as leadoff man on the mile relay when Stack ripped off a 49.7. One has to rack one's memory to think of others who beat 50 seconds indoors on the leadoff leg.

Stack didn't worry about giving away ten yards at the start of his races, for he closed with power to hand over a lead in every relay race he ran, whether Giegengack assigned him to the mile or two-mile relays. Continuing his progress, the Eli sophomore set a Yale record with a 48-flat quarter in Miami during spring vacation, then was sidelined a month with a virus. Nevertheless he ran 48 flat again on his return to track, and won the Heptagonal 440 in 48 flat again in his second start, beating Princeton's Dick Edmunds, also a sophomore, also holder of his college record, at 47.4 (set as a freshman) and author of a 47.7 this spring.

Since Edmunds beat Stack a step in the Y-P freshman meet, they'll have their rubber meeting in the IC4A 440, if both get to the final. Even though such swifties as Pitt's Mel Barnwell, Tufts' Basil Ince (1958 runnerup), Penn State's Dick Hambright (third last year) are among the top contenders, the sophomores figure to be in the battle, along with another '61 man, Manhattan's Art Evans.

Dropping down to the sprints, the sophomores offer Penn State's Bobby Brown, beaten a narrow foot by Villanova's Ed Collymore for the 60-yard title last March, Maryland's Jonas Spiegel, who went out of the indoor 60 with a pull, and Villanova's Joe Manion. Spiegel was first noticed two years ago when, as a 17-year-old freshman, he ran close to Ira Murchison in the Washington "Star" sprint series. He dropped out of college with an illness and has now re-appeared as the sprinter one expected him to be. He won the Atlantic Coast Conference 100 in 9.6 recently and no one in the IC4A set has come up with faster clocking. Brown is also in the 9.6 grouping, while Manion has been overshadowed only because he is a teammate of Ed Collymore, IC4A 100 and 220 winner in 1957, 220 winner in 1958.

In the 880 it's sophomore Tommy Carroll of Yale out of Fordham Prep, where he broke Don Bowden's national schoolboy record with a 1:50.6 clocking. Last winter Carroll spent virtually the whole season recovering from a hairline fracture in his leg, which may explain why he failed to place in the IC4A 1000. This spring he is unbeaten in the half, he set the Yale record at 1:50, has two other clockings of 1:52, including one for the Heptagonal title, and is showing the consistency and strength foreshadowed by his school performances. He and Manhattan's Kye Courtney (1:52.3) give the Class of '61 a couple of live ones against seniors Ed Moran, of Penn State, Peter Close, of St. John's, and junior Charles King, of Penn State, who tops the list with a 1:49.8, only seven-tenths behind Arnie Sowell's IC4A record.

In the distance races, Maryland's Francis Colavita (4:13) and Harvard's Jared Fitzgerald (4:16) need more maturity to cope with Moran (4:01.7 in 1958, 4:02.1 in 1959), Close 4:07.6 indoors, 4:09.2 this spring) and others in the mile. The same is true of Duke's Jared Nourse, sophomore 2-mile winner of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

A notable sophomore threat in the hurdles (high), along with Sinisi, is Maryland's Bill Johnson, who set a Terp record of 14.2 as a freshman, has matched that time this spring, won the ACC title and was runnerup to Sinisi in the indoor IC4A.

Outstanding in the field events are two sophomore javelin throwers—Connecticut's Reid Crawshaw, who startled the natives on his debut at Randalls Island when he tossed the spear 240 feet 6½ inches in the Queens-Iona Relays, and Maryland's Nick Kovalakides, with a toss of 239 feet 2½ inches in a dual meet with North Caro-

THROW AWAY THE WATCH!

THE recent hullabaloo over whether an 18-year-old New Jersey schoolboy did or did not actually cover 100 yards in 9.3 seconds brings up a point dear to this observer's heart.

Why don't we throw away the stopwatch as a criterion in races of less than 440 yards? Or, at least, why don't we expunge from the official record lists all under-a-quarter marks?

To a watch-conscious set, this proposal doubtlessly will be initially horrifying. But, if you think it out, we believe you will agree that the idea contains something of value.

If nothing else, it would spare fine boys like Johnny Mostyn of Bergen Catholic High School and the officials who in good faith attest the authenticity of his world record-equalling performance the embarrassing ordeal of publicly-expressed skepticism.

We hold there are just too darned many variables for sprint records to have real significance. We'll spell out a few of them.

Assuming in the first place that the record-setting sprinter covered the advertised distance, here are some of the things that can happen to shave important tenths of a second from his time.

Without having technically beaten the starting gun, the sprinter may have anticipated it so precisely that he is off and running with its crack. This happens even against the best starters. We won't stress that there are starters who unwittingly "throw" legal but flying starts to alert sprinters by giving cadenced commands. As for starters who don't have the moral fibre to admit they "blew one" and fire a recall shot when a sprinter is already in motion at the gun, they're unmentionable. A sprinter can shade his time from one to five-tenths of a second by making one of these advantageous getaways.

Then there's the matter of the wind. Say even that a wind-gauge is in use and shows the four-miles-plus per hour aiding limit has not been exceeded. A legal four m.p.h. push, as against a retarding breeze of the same strength constitutes an eight m.p.h. swing in favor of the downwind sprinter.

We'd guess this would give him a two or three-tenth edge over his maybe faster, but non record-setting colleague.

Also, we don't completely trust wind gauge readings as giving the whole picture. For one thing, most anemometers record only velocity, not direction. For another, normally only one gauge is in use and it can vouch only for wind velocity at its position. In the air currents that swirl about a stadium track, the wind often varies widely—in speed and direction—at different points of a sprint course. Finally, when is the gauge checked? How often are readings taken during the actual running of a race?

To wind up this harangue, consider the other big factor in a sprint record—the stopwatch and its operator. The watches used in big meets like this IC4A classic are factory-checked, precision instruments. But the hand that tells the time doesn't flow smoothly around the calibrated dial. It travels in clicking twentieth-second steps. The sprinter who arrives infinitesimally instantaneously in advance at the finish of a click can benefit by a tenth-second, the way watches are read.

Most timers are competent watch-handlers. But they're human and prone to human mistakes. There's a natural reaction lag between flash of gun and punch of watch. Sometimes the gun doesn't flash. Punching on the sound, which travels at 1000 feet per second, can make a three-tenth difference in favor of the sprinter in a 100-yard race. Having served as an official timer, I think there's a natural inclination to anticipate the finish, influenced by fear of being late and out of subconscious sympathetic desire to see the athletes do well.

Some day some sprinter will hit all these variables just right and run the 100 in 8.5 seconds. I won't get any more excited about it than any of the 9.3 clockings, listed or otherwise.

I have my own infallible yardstick for measuring the ability of a sprinter. It's the answer to "whom did he beat and by how much in a race that meant something?"

Delany Scores An Impressive Double In I.C.A.A.A. Farewell



One year ago a new record of 4:07.8 and a ten-yard triumph over Penn State's Ed Moran was Villanova's Ron Delany's mile performance before a cheering campus crowd of 12,500 in the Villanova Stadium.



Seventy minutes later Ireland's Olympic champion successfully defended his half mile I.C.A.A.A. championship, winning by eight yards. This marked his Eastern collegiate track farewell and earned him his tenth I.C.A.A.A. varsity title, indoors and outdoors.

IRON MIKE HERMAN

IF ALMOST EVERYTIME you look up today you see Mike Herman's number (No. 323), don't be surprised. It will be the real McCoy. Or, if you please, the real "Iron Mike," New York University's heralded one-man track team.

There's only one regret. This is the end of the ICAAAA trail for the Versatile Violet. He has already won three indoor titles in the broad jump and one outdoor championship and a second place in the same event.

Mike has also bagged a third place in the indoor hurdles and a tie for fifth in the high jump.

Count them all together and it's a total of 27½ points for his IC4A contribution as an NYU varsity athlete.

This week-end, Mike is entered in four events—the broad jump, pole vault, high jump and 220-yard low hurdles.

Could he win all four? It isn't likely, but it isn't impossible either.

The headlines recently screamed "Herman Wins 7 Events." That was in a triangular meet and as one wag put it, "The only surprise was that he didn't take 8 events."

Not in a decade has NYU, or any other Metropolitan school for that matter, had anyone to rival "Iron Mike." In 1949, Irving "Moon" Mondschein wound up a brilliant career with a total bag of close to 50 points.

Herman is easily the greatest all-around wiz-bang since, putting him in a class not only with Mondschein but such versatile immortals as Penn State's Barney Ewell and New Hampshire's Boo Morcom.

Only hard luck has kept the 160-pound, 5-foot-11 ball of fire from racking up even more IC4A points than the figures show.

In each of the five previous meets he has competed (indoors and outdoors, that is) a pulled muscle has cut short his ambitions.

"I've always entered numerous events," he reports, "but after the broad jump, I'd generally have a leg injury and have to pull out."

Possibly the most exciting and at the same time most anxious moments of his athletic career came in such a spot.

"As a sophomore, I had finished my three qualifying tries in the broad jump," Herman recalls. "I was two inches in front of the field,

with La Salle's Ira Davis second. Now it came the finals and I was hurt. I couldn't compete.

"I can't tell you what agony it was to sit there and watch Davis, one of the great athletes of this generation, take three pot shots at my lead.

Luckily for Herman, Davis couldn't match Mike's distance and the NYUer won the title.

There have been times, though, when his legs have held up and he has been able to go on. Such an occasion was last winter's indoor IC4A meet. Herman, after taking the broad jump, competed in the hurdles, finishing third, with Manhattan's Henry White fourth.

You remember what an uproar that created. Before the meet was over, the officials had reversed the order and that switch gave Manhattan College a close team victory over Penn State.

Before the week was over, however, the order was again changed, going back to its original position. That put Herman third, White fourth and brought the team title to Penn State.

But that's been shape of things for Mike in his years in the IC4A. Winning or third, he's in the spotlight, right in dead center.

Herman hasn't confined his conquests to the college ranks, nor even to these American shores. In 1957, the Violet senior, now 21, competed in the world Maccabean Games at Tel Aviv, Israel, and bagged two championships—the pole vault and the decathlon.

In the decathlon he didn't bother running in the 1,500-meter race. "What was the use?" he reasons. "I didn't need it. What's more, what fun is there in running that far?"

That decathlon triumph put a bee in his bonnet. Now coach Joe Healey's all-America boy won't be happy until he wins the AAU decathlon championship. He'll be trying for that one in Kingsbury, California, later this summer.

"Then maybe I'll make the Olympic team," he grins. "That's what I would like."

And that's what his legions of admirers and well-wishers among sports fandom would like. It couldn't happen to a nicer guy.

The only pity is that "Iron Mike" won't be in any more of these IC4A skirmishes. This gallant competitor in the Violet jersey will be missed.

lina. But they may have to better those efforts to stop Manhattan's Don McGorty from taking his third straight ICAAAA title.

McGorty broke a wrist playing basketball last winter and has taken quite a time getting back to his 230-foot form of last year.

Manhattan's Frank Carroll is the sophomore in the high jump with the best credentials. He cleared 6-6 in placing second to Villanova's Charley Stead indoors. In the hammer Harvard's Stan Doten has flung himself out of obscurity this spring with a throw of 180 feet 5½ inches, which was of title-winning caliber up to three years ago.

Besides Anderson in the pole vault, other sophomores who are soaring are John Murray, first Cornellian to clear 14 feet (14-0½), Penn State's Ron Beard, with a mark of 13-7½, and Harvard's versatile Tom Blodgett, with 13-6. Tufts' Earle Beasley, who got a piece of the indoor shotput with a 54-7 toss, is the sophomore threat in that event, while Yale's Mike Pyle and Dartmouth's George Ramming, the Heptagonal surprise winner, are just over and under the 160-foot mark.

Win, lose or dead-heat, these sophomores deserve an extra glance today. They'll be around in IC4A competition for two more years.

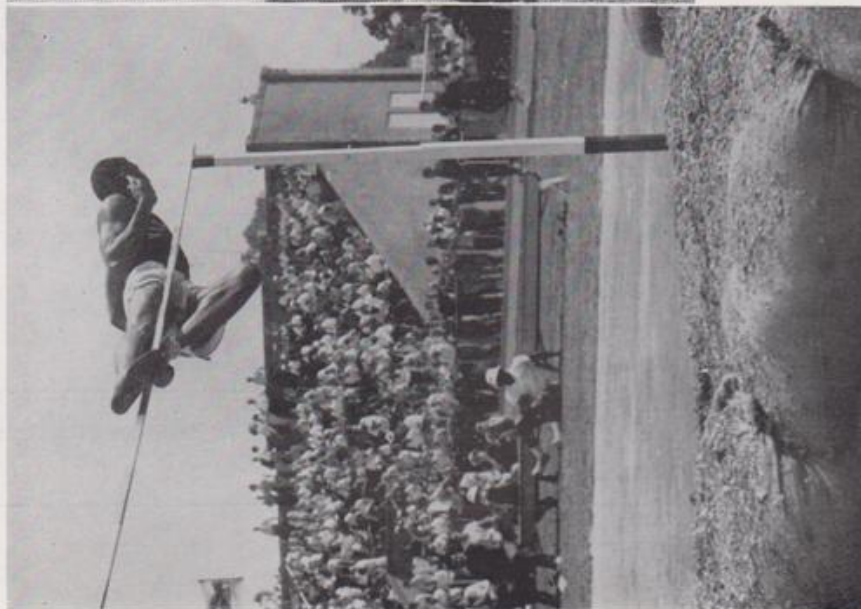

CINDERPATH NOTES

A near-record total of 49 colleges nominated 601 athletes when Meet Director Asa Bushnell closed the book last week on entries for the 83rd annual I.C.A.A.A. championships, oldest track meet in the country.



Last year when the 16-title championship event left New York for a campus celebration at Villanova, the host Wildcats won the team title for the second straight year. Villanova tallied 33⅝ points and Penn State was second with 27⅓. Without Ron Delany, winner of five outdoor I.C.A.A.A. titles in his varsity career, Jumbo Elliott's Villanovans are not expected to retain the title in the face of powerful challenges by Penn State, the favorite, and Yale, the second choice.



All the Eastern track powers are entered except Navy, which has a conflicting dual meet with Army at West Point. But Army entered its four hammer throwers headed by Ed Bagdonas, who set a Heptagonal record of 203 feet a few weeks ago at New Haven.

Penn State needed a reversal of a reversal and had to wait 11 days to get official confirmation that it won the I.C.A.A.A. indoor title in Madison Square Garden last February. But the Nittany Lions have demonstrated such crushing power in dual meets this spring that they are the solid favorites to win the I.C.A.A.A. outdoor team title for the first time since 1954.

Outstanding for the Nittany Lions, coached by Chick Werner, are Ed Moran, Dick Engelbrink, Charles King, Bobby Brown, Dick Hambricht, John Tullar, among many. Moran, runner-up to Ron Delany in both the mile and 880 last year, set an indoor I.C.A.A.A.A. 1000-yard record of 2:09.6 last winter, recently ran a 4:02.1 mile—his best winning mile and far faster than the I.C.A.A.A.A. championship record. He also tops the 880 list with a 1:49.6—his best half.

☆ ☆ ☆

Engelbrink, indoor I.C.A.A.A.A. 2-mile champion, ran 8:58.9 to better the I.C.A.A.A.A. collegiate record in the 2-mile, and King unfurled a 1:49.8 half, up to then the fastest 880 in the country.

Brown is another Penn State sprinter in the tradition of Barney Ewell or Art Pollard. Hambricht placed third in the I.C.A.A.A.A. quarter last year. Tullar won the I.C.A.A.A.A. discus two years ago beating Manhattan's Ken Bantum. He was out of college last year. Werner has a 1:50.7 half-miler in Bill Schwab, two vaulters, Dick Gross and Ron Beard who have cleared 13-7 $\frac{3}{4}$, three javelin throwers in Jonathan Musser, Jim Schwab and Andy Nyce who have thrown the spear 218-7 $\frac{1}{2}$, 223-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 208-8 this spring, taking turns in winning.

Yale, which might have beaten Penn State to the indoor team title of the I.C.A.A.A.A. if Tommy Carroll hadn't suffered a hairline fracture which kept him out of two months of training before the I.C.A.A.A.A., figures to make the strongest showing against the favorite.

☆ ☆ ☆

From out of the Eastern or E.C.A.C. territory there is entered a 14-man team from Michigan State, only Big Ten member of the Association, a 20-man team from Maryland, the Atlantic Coast Conference champions, 5 men from Duke, a one-man entry (Bob Verbick, vaulter) from Marquette.

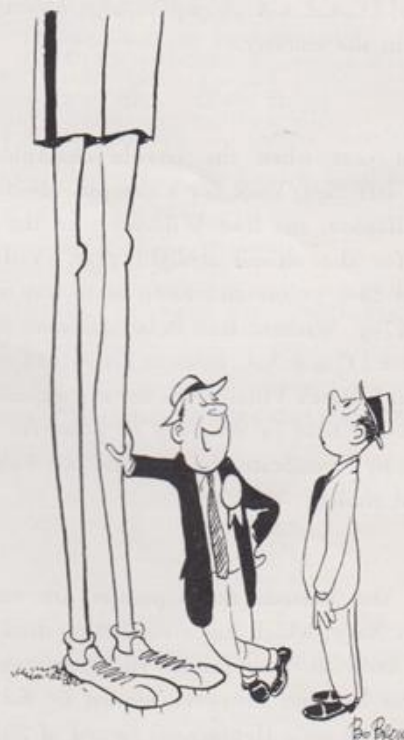
Notre Dame, which has competed in the last two I.C.A.A.A.A. indoor meets, has a conflicting commitment in the Central Collegiate Conference championships.
