



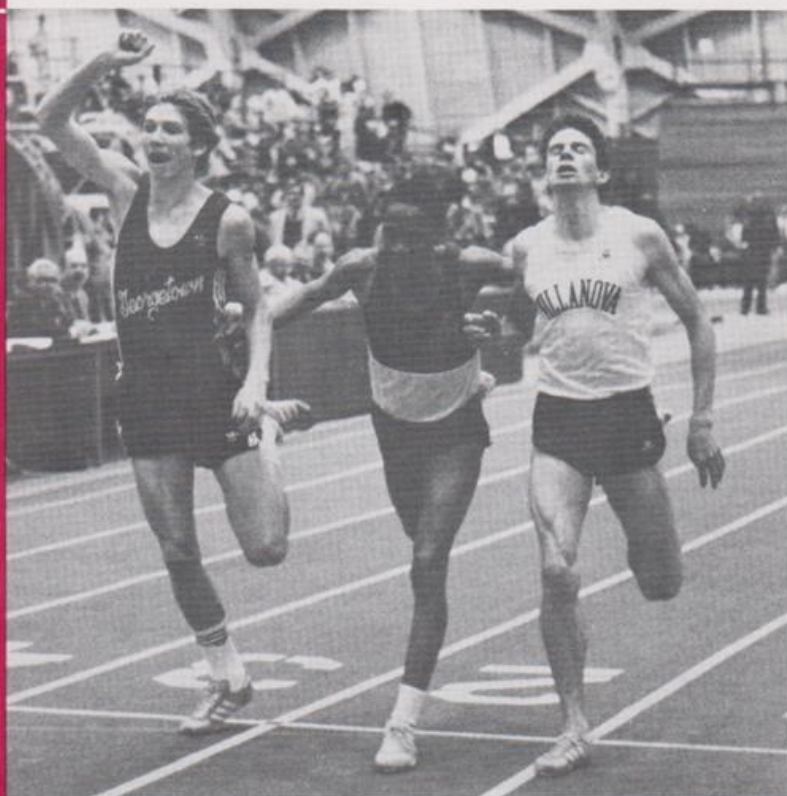

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"Georgetown and the IC4A: A Time-Tested Relationship"

Since 1896, when B.J. Wefers, a Georgetown University student, established two world records at the IC4A Outdoor Championships, the names Georgetown and IC4A have become synonymous with track and field excellence.

Founded in 1876 by athletes to help promote the sport of track and field, the IC4A is the oldest English-speaking athletic association in the New World. The quality of competition in the IC4A Championships has, through the years, made its championship the nation's most prestigious track competition other than the NCAA's. In short, IC4A means track. Over this period, a myriad of Georgetown student-athletes, coaches and administrators have played a major role in the success and longevity of the IC4A.

THE STUDENT-ATHLETES

Wefers was the world's top sprinter in the late 1800's--also holding the world record at 300 yards--and his 220 and 100-yard records were the standards by which all IC4A sprinters were to be judged for the next 25-30 years. Wefer's time of 21.2 in the 220 stood as an IC4A standard for 30 years, until Cornell's Henry Russell lowered the mark to 21.0 in 1926. His 9.8 clocking in the 100 was an IC4A record until 1922.

W.J. Holland, a two-time IC4A Outdoor 440 champ, was the silver medalist in that event at the 1900 Paris Olympics. Robert LeGendre, the 1922 IC4A Outdoor long jump champion, was a two-time Olympian and became a medalist in the pentathlon at the 1924 Paris Olympics. Another versatile Hoya who gained IC4A and Olympic fame in that era was Emerson Norton. The 1925 and 1926 IC4A Indoor high jump champion, Norton won the silver medal in the decathlon at the 1924 Paris Games.

Two of Georgetown's best known IC4A champions were among the world's best weightmen in the 1930's and 1940's. Leo Sexton set an Olympic record in the 1932 Los Angeles Games by heaving the shot a gold medal-winning 52-6¾. In the early '40's, Georgetown was the home of one of the world's top athletes. Alfred C. Blozis won nine individual IC4A titles in the shotput and discus while representing the Hoyas. He captured three individual NCAA outdoor shotput titles, held the world shotput record and was a first-team All-American football player, leading the Hoyas to a berth in the 1941 Orange Bowl. Blozis had a short, but storied career in the NFL with the New York Giants, before dying heroically in Europe while leading a rescue mission during World War II.

In the early '50's a Georgetown middle distance runner, Charlie Capozzoli, dominated the IC4A and the nation on the long distance level. He won consecutive IC4A Outdoor two-mile titles, the 1952 NCAA cross country championship and was a member of the US Olympic team at 5000 meters in the 1952 Helsinki Games.

The honorable Ricardo Urbina, an associate judge on the Superior Court of the District of Columbia, was a three-time IC4A champion in the 880 and 1000 while a Georgetown undergraduate in the mid-1960's. During that time, two Hoya distance runners, Steve Stageberg and Eamon O'Reilly were dominating IC4A and national long distance running.

Two-time Olympian (in the 1980 and 1984 steeplechase) John Gregorek is the IC4A record-holder indoor at 1500 meters. In addition to the Indoor 1500 and 3000 meter wins, he also won Outdoor 1500 and 5000 meter titles. The Hoyas' top threat this year to join the illustrious group is senior Kevin King. The defending meet champion at 3000 meters, King also has two other IC4A titles as a relay performer.

THE COACHES AND ADMINISTRATORS

J.D. O'Reilly, who led Georgetown for 17 years between 1914 and 1933, coached 23 IC4A champions and also brought the Hoyas their only indoor team title in 1925. Frank Sevigne was the Georgetown coach from 1949-1955, before moving on to the University of Nebraska. While at Georgetown, Sevigne coached 10 IC4A champions.

Francis X. Rienzo, Georgetown's Athletic Director, and Joseph Lang, the University's Assistant Athletic Director, are both former Hoya coaches who have had a major impact on the IC4A as both coaches and administrators. During Rienzo's tenure from 1969-74, he coached IC4A, Penn Relay, and NCAA champion Joe Lucas, but it was for his role as President of the IC4A that Rienzo will be best remembered. "Primarily it was Frank that saved the IC4A from possible disbandment," recalls ECAC and IC4A Track Administrator Art Farnham. "He did as much as possible to help the reunification of the IC4A."

In the late 1970's, when the entire structure of the IC4A was in danger, Rienzo directed the groups athletic directors toward a compromise which preserved the quality of the IC4A. Now in his second term as IC4A President, Rienzo continues to work vigorously to maintain the IC4A's lofty position in the track and field world. Lang was Georgetown's head coach at the time of the IC4A-ECAC rift. It was Lang who proposed to the coaches the same compromise which Rienzo was putting forth to the athletic directors. "Joe and Frank were instrumental in conveying to the athletic directors that the coaches were adamant in their support of the participation of those IC4A members who had withdrawn from the ECAC," says Farnham. Rienzo and Lang proved to be a formidable team, indeed. As the Hoyas' coach from 1974-83, Lang coached ten IC4A champions, including two-time champion Gregorek, and three Championship of American relay teams, as well as an NCAA championship relay squad.

The Hoyas are currently coached by Frank Gagliano, who led Georgetown to a third-place finish in the 1984 Indoor meet. Gagliano came to Georgetown from Rutgers University where he coached several IC4A champions, most notably Eliot Quow, -- the silver medalist at 200 meters in the 1983 World Championships -- and Mike Roche -- a 1976 Olympian in the steeplechase.

Frank Sevigne, a legendary former coach at Georgetown University and the University of Nebraska, died on January 29, 1985 following a lengthy battle with cancer. He was 62.

Sevigne, regarded as one of the nation's top middle distance coaches, coached 10 IC4A champions, an Olympian (Charlie Capozzoli), a world record two-mile relay team and three Championship of America relay squads while at Georgetown.

In 1956, Sevigne left Georgetown and became head coach at the University of Nebraska. At the Big Eight school he compiled a 141-40-3 record in dual and triangular meets and won four Big Eight indoor titles. He produced 11 NCAA champions, nine Olympians, 42 All-Americans and 104 conference champions in his 28 years at Nebraska. Sevigne resigned last March because of illness, but kept the title of associate track coach.

Where There's a Track Meet, There's Helio Rico

He is overshadowed by the many outstanding athletes surrounding him. He is not recognized as record after record around him is broken. But he is respected, and you can bet Villanova's relay teams on that.

His name is Heliodoro "Bud" Rico, and his game is track and field. Rico started his track and field career where most end it -- after competing as a sprinter at New York University. His interest in track and field has grown to broad-based proportions including over 35 years of officiating, editing rules, and directing major meets throughout the East. For the past six years Rico has served on the Board of Directors of The Athletics Congress (TAC), the governing body for track and field in the U.S. His other accomplishments and contributions are almost too numerous to mention: Chair of TAC Rules Committee; editor of TAC rule book; director of TAC U.S. Indoor Track & Field Championships held each year in Madison Square Garden; and chief umpire at the 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Games.

He was U.S. National Track team manager in 1963, 1968, 1973, and 1977, a job that entails arranging everything from who makes the team to where the team will eat. In international competition, the team manager is considered the team leader, and is involved in decisions as well as in organization. It was during one of these trips, at a meet in Hanover, Germany in 1963, that Rico recalls the best-run event he has seen. "The third leg of a relay, our runner hadn't taken off his sweat. He started removing them as he received the baton, and fell 5-10 yards behind. He handed the baton over to Bob Hayes, who had no form, and any form he did have was lost in the wind. Anyway, Hayes overtook this big German runner to win the event and help us win the meet."

Last summer, as chief umpire at the Olympics, Rico organized the 200 track and field officials involved in the Games. Positioned at center field, Helio watched every event, and was involved in all the protests and controversies, including the historic Zola Budd-Mary Decker incident.

Presently Rico is employed as Chair of the Registration Committee of the Metro Athletics Congress, a position that entails registering all track athletes in the metropolitan New York area, sanctioning all track and field, long distance, and race walking events sponsored by TAC, and conducting disciplinary hearings.

Rico's involvement with the IC4A dates back to his running days at NYU when he competed in indoor and outdoor IC4A championships during the mid-1940's. Soon Rico found himself back on the familiar grounds of IC4A competitions, but as a referee. He patterned himself after Asa Bushnell, Director of the IC4A championships and Commissioner of the Eastern College Athletic Conference (1938-70). "Asa Bushnell was low-keyed," stressed Rico. "He never said no before considering every problem and every question. He treated everyone nicely, without looking at who you were."

A lawyer in his "spare time" away from track, one question that doesn't need to be asked is if Helio Rico is a busy man. For six years Rico has been Meet Director for the USA Men's and Women's Indoor Track and Field Championships in Madison Square Garden. Here his duties differ from those of a referee. Preparation for a meet of this magnitude can start as much as seven months before the meet date and includes collecting entries, assigning officials, and the usual paper work. A tough job indeed, but Rico assures it isn't all bad: "Everything is taken care of so I have nothing to do at the meet!"

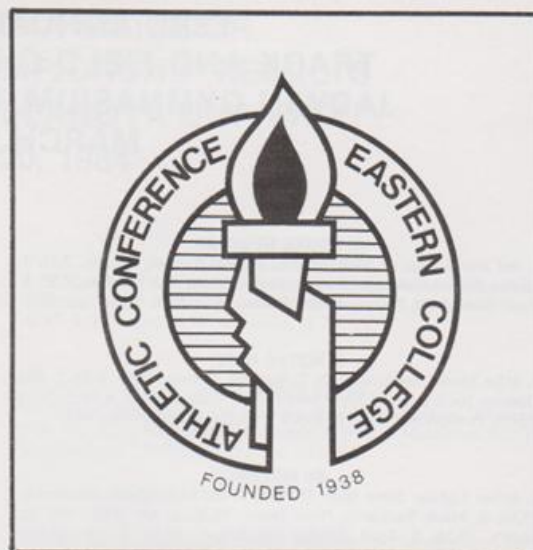
One might wonder if a man who is so busy and so interested in track and field could possibly be married, and better yet, actually see his wife more than once a month. Rico's wife, Patricia, has made things a little easier on both of them. After competing at the 1960 Olympic Trials, Patricia became a referee herself. Now she officiates at noteworthy events such as the Millrose Games, and was a manager for last summer's U.S. Women's Olympic team, as well as a former chair of AAU and U.S. Olympic women's track and field committees.

Why does Helio Rico keep doing all this? Why does he spend virtually every minute of his time away from his "real job" thinking and breathing track and field? "I enjoy all of it," says Rico. "I like the sport, the young people, and many of us from NYU are still in the sport. It's become a kind of fraternity. I figure I could be doing worse things." Well, we're all glad you aren't, Helio.

You can't be around track and field for almost 40 years without noticing changes over the years. For Rico, one of the main differences is a result of athletes competing in open and professional meets. "Athletes are not under the control of their college coaches anymore. I still think the college experience is an excellent one -- if an athlete leaves that, they lose a lot."

As a head referee at a meet such as the IC4A, Rico is primarily concerned with instructing and overseeing other officials, although he admits this is made easy by the strong core of IC4A officials. Rico is also often the "final word" on protests -- "I've been fairly lucky over the years. Most of my decisions have not gone on to the jury of appeals. For some reason the coaches respect my decisions."

However, if a coach isn't quite satisfied with Rico's decision and does take it one step further to the jury of appeals, "It doesn't bother me," says Rico. "Coaches have the right to appeal. Everyone has a job to do." And everyone knows Helio Rico does his job -- and he does it right. Just like he has for 37 years.
