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WATCH HARVARD IS JUMBO'S ADVICE

IN THE LAST TRACK MEET held in old Madison Square Garden on February 9, four runners in Harvard Crimson raced a two-mile relay in 7 minutes 28.1 seconds, an average of 1:52 halves.

The time itself was arresting enough for anyone except Villanova. More intriguing was the 20-yard beating Harvard handed Villanova. True, Dave Patrick did not run on the Wildcat foursome, but Craig Nation, Charley Messenger, Frank Murphy and Ian Hamilton did and this is a team capable of defeating any in the East.

But not the Harvard combination of Trey Burns, Royce Shaw, Jim Baker and Dave McKelvey, who unreeled 880s in 1:54, 1:50.8, 1:51.6 and 1:51.7. If Villanova lacked Patrick, Harvard ran without Keith Colburn, who ran a Harvard all-time record 1:48 as a freshman in the British AAA 880 championship.

Anyway, Jumbo Jim Elliott was moved to doff his hat to Bill McCurdy.

"What a job Bill has done up there," Elliott said of the Harvard coach. "I admire his coaching, and his recruiting too."

What kind of job—coaching and recruiting—did Bill McCurdy do? He has the fastest half-miler (Colburn, 1:48 outdoors); the two fastest milers (Shaw, 4:02.8; Baker, 4:05.9, both indoors this winter), and the two fastest two-milers (Doug Hardin, 8:44.2, and Baker, 8:48.4, both indoors this winter) in Harvard's long track history—and no one has a longer history.

"They were good to start with," said McCurdy, "and they have made fine progress. I don't think it was ever in my mind, though, that they could run a 4:02 mile, an 8:44 two-mile. Obviously they had the ability."

"About my recruiting them, well—the first I heard of Shaw was a letter from Hal Connolly (Olympic hammer throw champion and former world recordholder, with a Boston background) recommending Shaw as a Harvard-type. I took it as a compliment. But he didn't mention Shaw's athletic credentials, only his scholastic achievements as valedictorian of his high school. I then discovered he was a 4:15.8 miler, though he ran seventh in his State meet, and ran three miles in 14:34 in the summer before coming to Harvard.

"I wasn't too excited at the time. We've had 9-flat sprinters from Texas who never turned out for track. But Shaw was something. He broke the university record with 4:03.4 against Oxford-Cambridge in London last summer. He'll run the I.C.4-A. mile, but I don't know his best distance

yet. He's a good half-miler, a surprisingly fast quarter-miler (he was on our freshman mile relay). He has good speed and is very strong legged, with powerful thighs. He is not a particularly pretty runner. He tends to muscle his way. He slides his legs like a skater.

"With plenty of native endurance, he may become a better two-miler. Right now, he has a sprinter's emotional temperament, the shorter the distance the better the race. He likes to bang into it and get it over. He likes to go out and get free of traffic, but he can hang onto a pace and kick."

Shaw makes his sophomore debut in the I.C.4-A. mile, challenging two-year champion Dave Patrick, whose 4:01 this season is the only time faster than Shaw's in the I.C.4-A. set. No Harvard man has won the I.C.4-A. indoor mile since Norwood Penrose Hallowell set a 4:12.4 meet record on the 6-lap Kingsbridge Armory track in 1932. Shaw is a 19-year-old, 6-1 and 160 pounds, including a mod mop of hair.

As for Jim Baker, a senior from Northfleet, England, McCurdy heard from someone on the campus that an Englishman was coming to Harvard.

"I heard of him as a 4:20 miler, not as a two-miler, and I had no correspondence with him before I saw him at Harvard," said McCurdy. "But Baker has spent a career of being injured. That's been his drawback until this year, though he placed third in the I.C.4-A. 2-mile as a sophomore in 9:05.5 and was fifth last year in 9:03.4."

"First he sprained his ankle badly, then he fell down a flight of stairs during a summer camp job on the Cape."

"Before that he picked up a back injury during a trip home. Now that these injuries have cleared up he is able for the first time to capitalize on his natural ability."

Which explains Baker's seemingly sudden emergence into a 4:05.9 miler and 8:48.4 two-miler. He first broke the Harvard two-mile record with 8:56.6, placing third in the Heps last spring. He is 23, 6-1 and 153 pounds.

No Harvard man has won the I.C.4-A. two-mile since Willard Tibbets was first in 1925-26.

McCurdy has two shots at the two-mile title. He has Doug Hardin, a compact little (5-7, 120 pounds) junior from Short Hills, N. J., who in one year dropped from 9:05.5 to 8:44.2, the astonishing time he posted in the dual meet on Brown's 11-lap composition track on Feb. 23. In

SKIPPING OVER THE HURDLES

IS MANHATTAN going to make it eighteen straight gold medal years in this the 47th I.C.A.A.A. indoor track and field championships?

If you happened to bunk into Jasper coach Jim McHugh on the way into this beautiful new sports arena tonight and he was smiling, chances are Bruce Weberbauer won the 35-pound throw up at West Point this morning.

The husky from Cranford, N. J. (No, we haven't forgotten the Garden State even though the Newark News now has a New York edition), was McHugh's No. 1 hope to keep the Manhattan first place string going.

Bruce went off the beam a little in the Metropolitan Intercollegiate a few weeks. He had to settle for second place. McHugh and his field event mentor Irv Kintisch feel that Weberbauer is going to get out a 65-footer one of these days, and this is the day they wanted him to do it.

Del Benjamin, the multiple event dandy, is another gold medal hope in the long jump. He has had miseries this indoor season. A gold medal in this meet would make Del's year a success. And this will be his last year in the Kelly Green.

Ed Mulvihill—he hails from New Jersey, too—is still another first place hope. He is a high jumper-pole vaulter, but isn't dreaming of gold medal in the latter event with Villanova's Vince Bizzarro around. The fellow Mulvihill wants to beat tonight is Elijah Miller of Rutgers.

Since Miller once passed up an indoor meet because he had a date to take his girl to a concert, there have been rumors the Manhattan coach bought tickets for every concert in town tonight and mailed them to Miller. "They're false rumors" says McHugh.

Joe Healy (Sam to boys who travel with the indoor and outdoor track and field caravan) really busts out when he gets gabbing about his ace Byron Dyce. "He's a competitor," says Sam, "and I mean a competitor of competitors."

Going into tonight's meet, Byron had a 2:09.3 1,000 and a 4:06 mile to his credit. Everyone here in the Metropolitan area is rooting for Dyce to win an NCAA or some other topnotch track event for his silver thatched mentor.

Colby and Wesleyan have broken into the I.C.4-A. picture this year, thanks to the efforts of Sebsibe Mamo of Ethiopia and Ambrose Burfoot. The I.C.4-A. two-mile record going into this meet is 8:52.7, by Bill Clark of Notre Dame three years ago. Mamo hit 8:43.6 this winter and Burfoot stopped the watches in 8:45.8.

Colby has won only one gold I.C.4-A. medal and that wasn't in a running event. Back in 1925, Ken Wentworth won the weight throw. Wesleyan, a charter I.C.A.A.A. member back in 1875 and in and out of the organization since, had to wait for Frank Paranya to win the 1961 indoor mile with 4:15.6.

That Paranya win was a sweet one to me though I didn't witness it due to being in Miami to cover a Floyd Patterson-Ingemar Johansson world heavyweight title fight. But I picked an I.C.4-A. form chart to hold the franchise before heading South. Paranya was a Newark News special. His uncle is a state editor for our paper. His mother is a graduate of a Newark High School—Barringer. See how easy it is to pick winners in this meet.

In a recent story I suggested that Wes Wallack, a Colgate grad, should talk the Rutgers' athletic authorities in forming a boxing team and switch from coaching track and field to the fisticuff sport. Wes is a real scrapper for his athletes and, fulfilling that chore, has become one of the star performers at the weekly luncheons of the Track Writers' Association, held every Monday at Leone's during the indoor and outdoor season. Wes is getting so many write-ups lately, there has been talk along the banks of the Raritan that his trackmen are dating better looking coeds than the Scarlet football stars are.

And we can't forget Jumbo Jim Elliott. Villanova's very successful coach was complaining of being tired at a recent meet.

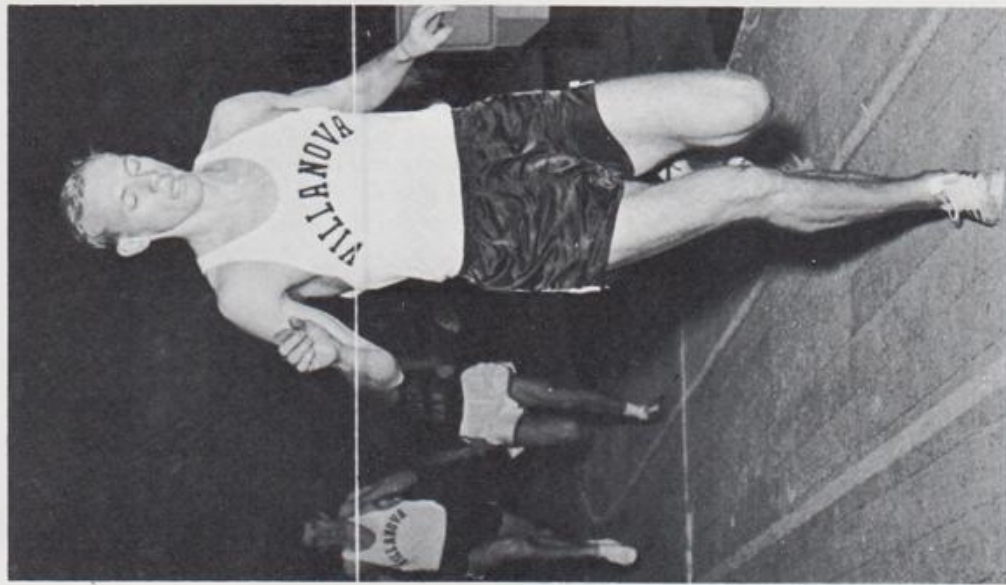
When the Wildcat coach moved on, a friend of his confided: "Jim's not kidding. He's doing most of his own recruiting these days."

THE BEAST FROM YALE

IT IS NOT QUITE TRUE that I.C.A.A.A. rules require a Yale man to win the 600-yard championship. It works out that way.

The Elis have taken the 600 title with Jim Stack in 1959, 1960 and 1961; Jay Luck in 1962, Wendell Mottley in 1963 and 1964 and Mark Young in 1967. That works out to seven titles in nine years, interrupted only by the 1965 and 1966 victories of Olympian Tom Farrell of St. John's.

The favorite this year—you should excuse the surprise—is a Yale man, the same Mark Young who won last year. Before graduation in June, he may establish himself as an all-time Eli hero on the same level with Mottley, Luck and Stack.

Mark Young is 6 feet 2 inches tall and weighs 175 pounds. He runs with such power that he has been called The Beast.

"He's a nice young boy," says Bob Giegengack, the Yale coach. "But he's a tough, vicious runner. He has no sprint speed, but a world of strength and a world of desire. He might be best at the half-mile."

"I might," says Young. "The quarter-mile is becoming a sprint, and I don't have sprinter's speed."

He isn't exactly a slowpoke, either. He has run the 220 in 21.4 seconds, the 440 in 46.6 (45.3 in a relay) and the 600 in 1:09.5 on dirt, 1:11.1 on boards. He is the I.C.A.A.A. and Heptagonal champion at 600 yards indoors and 440 yards outdoors. But he's not yet in the class of Mottley, who broke world records at three distances indoors and won a silver medal in the 1964 Olympic 400-meter final.

"I ran against Mottley once," says Young. "I was a freshman and he ran for Oxford-Cambridge. I was out of shape and ran 51.3 for the quarter. He ran 46.3. I was coming around the

final turn when he was finishing. I got a real good view of him."

Young has been running since he was a youngster in Newton, Mass. A 10-year-old friend owned a stop watch, and he and Young took turns running around a big block while the other acted as timer. Young became so fast that eventually two friends ran a relay against him. He still won.

He started formal running in seventh grade, and between races he high jumped 5 feet. He ran 50 and 75 yards, "but not very well," he says. In ninth grade, he tried the half-mile, did 2:25 the first time out and got down to 2:18 by year's end.

In 10th grade, he ran the half in 2:00. In 11th grade, he won the Massachusetts high school championship with a 4:25 mile. In 12th grade, he won the New England championship with a 49.3 quarter. Between track seasons, he made the all-state football team as an end.

Young earned football letters at Yale as a sophomore and junior, playing on the kicking teams. He quit after one game last fall to concentrate on track.

"I saw I wouldn't play much," he says. "I thought I could put the practice time to better use in track and I knew I wouldn't be letting the football team down."

If the extra time for track results in a big year, it will be high time. Young missed the outdoor season as a sophomore because of mononucleosis. He missed the national championship meets last summer because he was running in England. Now he is looking forward in this Olympic year to climactic races against such as Lee Evans, Vince Matthews and others in their class.

"If only," said Mark Young, The Beast, "I had their speed."

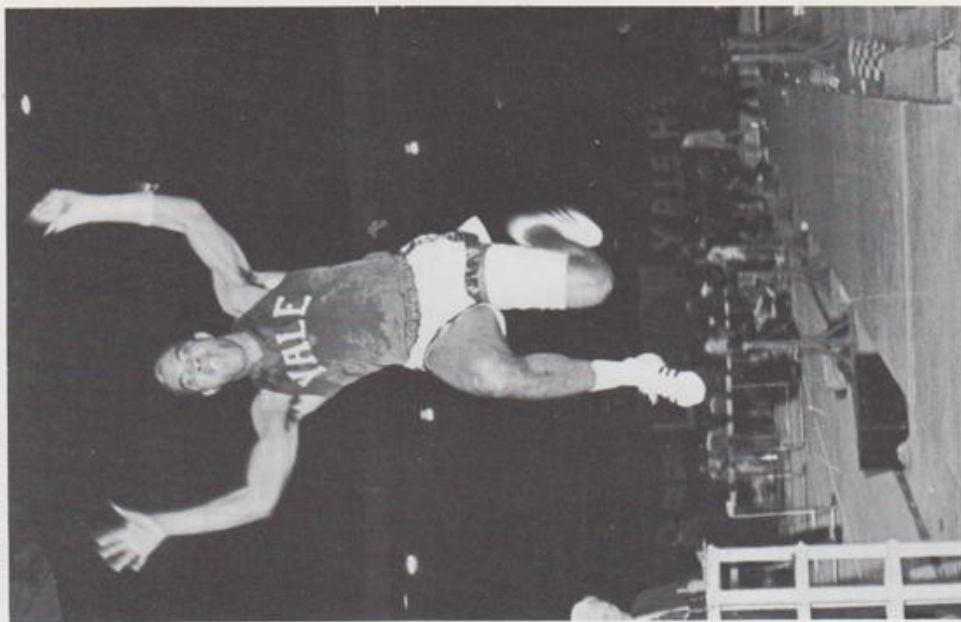
SENSATIONAL PERFORMANCES MARKED 1967 MEET

GENERAL INFORMATION

N.C.A.A. RULES OF COMPETITION WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED BY REFEREE AND OTHER OFFICIALS.

Track measures eleven laps to mile, and 160 yards to lap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty under rules for first false start, but competitor is disqualified by second false start.

In hurdle race competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In all relay races baton must be carried in runner's hand and must be passed to next succeeding teammate within clearly marked 20-yard zone, extending 10 yards in both directions from leg finish line.

Governing rules provide that, in races around turns, any competitor willfully jostling, running across or obstructing another competitor so as to impede his progress, shall be disqualified. If in any race a competitor is disqualified for any of these reasons, the Referee shall have power to order the race to be re-run excluding the disqualified competitor or, in the case of a heat, to permit any competitors affected by the act resulting in disqualification, other than the disqualified competitor, to compete in a subsequent round of the race.

Any competitor may be disqualified if, in the opinion of the Referee, he has in any way been aided by a coach, teammate, or anyone connected directly or indirectly with the team concerned, such as running along-side of a teammate, being stationed at various points near the track, or located near by any of the field events for the purpose of aiding or coaching a compe-

titutor after the race or field event has officially been started.

Each member college is limited to following numbers of actual participants in various events in Indoor Championships:

Two-mile run—two (plus one more upon approval of Executive Committee)

Relay races—one team

All other events—four

No contestant may be entered in two-mile run in Indoor Championships if he can cover distance no faster than 9 minutes 55 seconds.

In the weight throw, shot put, and the broad jump each contestant shall be allowed three preliminary tries. The first six men in the standing at the completion of the trials will qualify for the final. Each finalist will then receive three additional tries. All marks made, in both the trials and the finals, will count in determining the results. Each competitor shall be credited with best of all his efforts.

A nominee or qualifier who fails to compete in any running or hurdling event for which he has been nominated or has qualified will be ineligible for any further participation in the meet.

Competitors must be on time, field contestants entering enclosure five minutes before scheduled start of their event, and track contestants entering enclosure upon completion of race next preceding theirs. As soon as their event is over, competitors will kindly leave track and infield at once.

In each event 16 points are scored: 6 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth and 1 for fifth.

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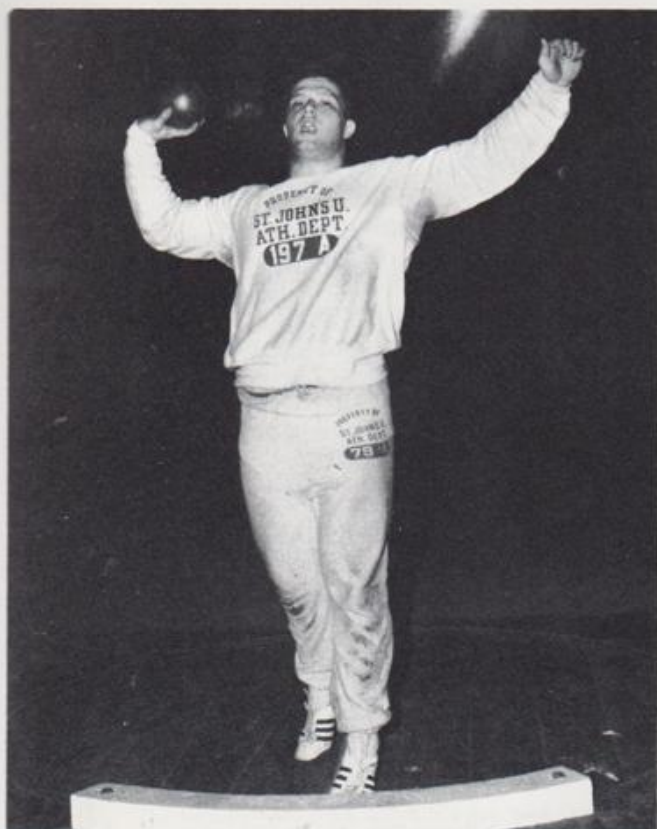

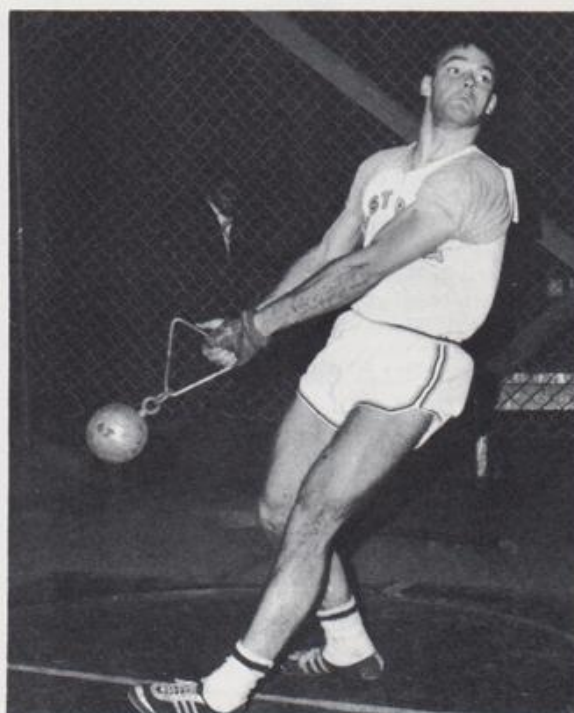

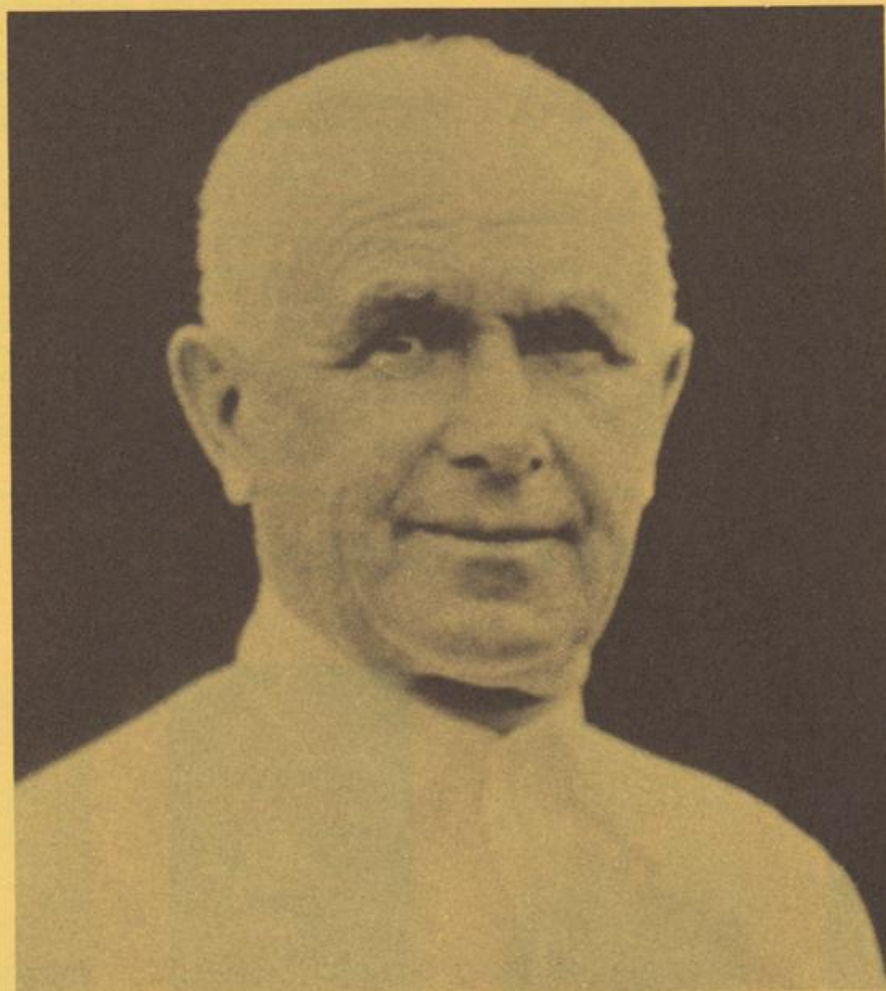

A GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY

On May 31 and June 1, 1918, the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America—The I.C.4-A—held its 42d annual outdoor championships at Pennsylvania's Franklin Field in Philadelphia.

The I.C.4-A. was, and is, the country's oldest track and field organization. Its championship meet was being resumed in 1918. The year before, with the U.S. at war, the meet had not been held. It is the only time the I.C.4-A. ever cancelled its title events.

The I.C.4-A. championships were confined, then as now, to its member colleges—14 in 1876, 20 in 1918, 81 in 1968.

In 1918, the I.C.4-A. championships were the country's most prestigious and biggest college meet. It is not surprising that track coaches from member as well as non-member colleges assembled in Philadelphia for the two-day spiked-shoe gala. The top coaches went where the action was—which meant Philadelphia in 1918.

So, we have a lot of track coaches, the best known in the land, sitting around a hotel in Philadelphia and someone, his identity lost to history, suggested that they ought to organize an association for the good and welfare of their sport. Thus, the Association of College Track Coaches of America was born May 30, 1918—first coaches' association in any sport anywhere.

The coaches who were the charter members formed a notable roster. They were Keene Fitzpatrick, Princeton; Jack Moakley, Cornell; W. L. Donovan, Harvard; Johnny Mack, Yale; Alonzo A. Stagg, Chicago; Steve Farrell, Michigan; Harry Gill, Illinois; Lawson Robertson, Pennsylvania; Tom Keane, Syracuse; Frank Kanaly, M.I.T.; William Martin, Penn State; Harry Hillman, Dartmouth; Walter Christie, California, and Bernie Wefers, Fordham.

On their campuses they are remembered as the "Grand Old Men" of track, though Lon Stagg, for one, would more readily be identified with football. I doubt there was a Ph.D. in education among the lot of them. Some like Wefers, Hillman, Robertson had been outstanding amateur trackmen—Hillman and Robertson adept in the old-fashioned three-legged races. Others like Moakley, Keane and Donovan had been professional racers before the turn of the century, when professional races were in vogue. Others like Fitzpatrick and Mack were football trainers, too, for basically the coaches were trainers before they became coaches. Nowadays, these famed coaches might have difficulty, on the qualifications they held then, to get a coaching job, for masters' degrees, doctorates in education and the like are helpful if not necessary to obtain a coaching appointment.

The coaches elected the courtly, white-haired Fitzpatrick as their first president.

That association formed in 1918 is now the I.C.4-A. Track Coaches Association. There's also a national association, to which I.C.4-A. coaches also belong, but the I.C.4-A. coaches fought to preserve the existence of their own pioneer group and resisted merger 30 years ago. The I.C.4-A. was organized in 1875 "to foster and maintain track and field competition among its members on a high plane of true amateurism, sportsmanship and friendly relationship."

It was and is an independent organization governed by its own constitution, by-laws and athletic rules. It welcomed cooperation with other sports governing bodies for furtherance of amateur athletics, provided its "essential autonomy" was not impaired or endangered. The I.C.4-A. coaches association adopted the same principles. Its membership, therefore, is confined now to the 12 Eastern states and the District of Columbia, except for Notre Dame, Duke, Michigan State and Marquette—the last two rarely represented in the championships in recent years. These four are the only colleges outside the 12-state area to which the I.C.4-A., in 1957, confined future applicants for membership. With these geographical restrictions, the I.C.4-A. and its coaches association keeps growing.

In 1919, Knute Rockne became a member of the coaches group, though Notre Dame wasn't admitted to the I.C.4-A. until 1955, a quarter century after Rockne died in a plane crash. Joining the coaches association with Rockne was another famed football coach, Andy Kerr of Colgate, also Jack Rourke, of Colgate; Emil Von Elling, of NYU; Bart Sullivan, of Holy Cross; Johnny Magee, of Bowdoin; Mike Ryan, of Colby; Archie Hahn, of Virginia; John D. O'Reilly,

of Georgetown (the O'Reilly Mile is run annually in the Boston K. of C. indoor meet); Billy Queal, of Yale; J. V. Mulligan, of Navy; Eddie Farrell, of Harvard, and Pop Seeley, of Williams.

The names ring bells. They were the coaches in 1926 when I took over the track beat for the New York Herald Tribune, and they were eloquent teachers for anyone getting deeply involved in track lore and personalities. They "invented" interval training, called repeats now—the basis of modern methods which have improved records so much—long before more imaginative successors gave it widespread publicity through catchy names.

The coaches could suggest and recommend but could not establish policy or rules for the I.C.4-A. In 1920 they recommended medical examinations for all athletes before participation. But the coaches were not necessarily gifted with occult powers. They could not envision the 3:51 mile, 71-foot shotput, 17-foot vaults and 7-5 high jumps. So, in 1921, the coaches recommended that no schoolboy should be permitted to run more than one race in one day longer than and including the 440, nor more than two races below and including the 440.

The coaches requested the Penn Relays to include a hammer throw event, and later resisted attempts to abandon the hammer throw, which was a specialty of the Northeast segment of the country.

The coaches also gained stature in 1921 when they were invited by the I.C.4-A., then governed by undergraduates and an alumni advisory board, to help arrange trial heats by seeding the best runners. The coaches also requested the I.C.4-A. to build a portable banked board track, eight laps to the mile, for the

first I.C.4-A. indoor championships held in the 102d Engineers Armory on West 168th Street.

That fast 8-lap banked board track—there's none like it now except in Louisville—and the enthusiastic crowds that packed specially built portable stands in the armory helped boost the growing popularity of indoor track. The I.C.4-A. runners set many world indoor records on that 8-lap track and the bigger (6-lap) track in the Kingsbridge Armory in 1932 and 1933 before the I.C.4-A. moved its indoor meet into old Madison Square Garden.

In 1922, that first year of the Indoor Intercollegiates, the coaches recommended that freshmen be excluded from varsity competition. Note the date. Forty-six years later the NCAA voted to lift the ban against freshmen in varsity competition in all sports except football and basketball, the money sports which would invite the most abuses. But the I.C.4-A., tied to the Eastern College Athletic Conference in eligibility policies, maintains the ban on freshmen (except for colleges permitted to request waivers based on small enrollments).

The coaches moved in 1923 to eliminate the use of dangerous spikes for lane markings, substituting lane lines, and began the still continuing effort to make all track and field rules uniform. (Differences still exist between the international rules followed by the AAU and the NCAA rules which now govern I.C.4-A. meets).

In 1924 the coaches suggested a definition for a legal high jump. "A legitimate high jump is when a jumper's feet first go over the bar," recommended the coaches. One of their brethren, Stanford's Dink Templeton, lost his 1920 Olympic berth as a high jumper (fortunately make the team in the long jump) be-

cause his best jump was ruled a "dive." The rule has been modified some more, so that any jump off one foot is legal, even the novel back-flip technique introduced by Oregon State's Dick Fosbury, who, with Brigham Young's Ed Hanks, set the 7-foot record for New Madison Square Garden.

In 1925 the coaches still hadn't discovered how much a schoolboy could do without harm to himself. They were advising schoolboys to take it easy and refrain from two-mile races. The Jim Ryuns and Gerry Lindgrens, Martin Liquoris and Art Dulong were yet unborn.

In 1929 the coaches recommended the use of starting blocks to help speed up the conduct of a meet. At the time they were considered a gimmick that helped a sprinter. A world record made out of blocks was denied until the blocks were approved. The coaches, led by Harry Hillman, came up with ideas for lighter weight hurdles which still need eight pounds of force to tip them over.

Still hipped on the subject of schoolboy restrictions, the coaches in 1933 disapproved mile and 2-mile races for boys under 18. The diehards were finally convinced when Ryun, under 18, cracked 4 minutes in the mile, and Lindgren, under 18, ran two miles under 9 minutes.

The coaches, though, disapproved the metric system which (inspired by the Los Angeles Olympics) had been adopted by the I.C.4-A. for its championships. The noble experiment died after four years, insofar as the I.C.4-A. was concerned.

There is still some good and welfare for the I.C.4-A. Track Coaches Association to ponder in its next 50 years. But let's not discourage boys under 18 from running a 3:50 mile!

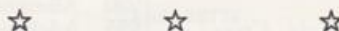

BULOVA Phototimer being used for I.C.A.A.A. Championships

The Bulova Phototimer provides a picture-and-time record of each runner at the instant he crosses the finish line. The finish-line photos produced by this automated electronic photo-recording system are for the finish judges to examine and interpret. Their decisions are final.

To make the finish photo, the Phototimer camera takes a continuous picture of the finish line on a film strip that moves at the same speed as the runners. The hooded and shutterless Zoomar lens, focused on the finish line through a slitted opening as small as 1/128th of an inch wide, fixes the image of each runner on the film strip as his head, torso and limbs move across the finish. Simultaneously, the system also photo-records elapsed time to one one-hundredth of a second.

Prints of the finish photo are available to judges within three minutes of the finish.

that race, with Shaw, then Baker pouring on the pace, Hardin came on to win. Hardin had signalled his advance into a topflight collegian with his 8:48.8 in London last summer. He is tough and tenacious, a guy who grinds it out.

This intrasquad rivalry—Shaw vs. Baker in the mile, Baker vs. Hardin in the two-mile—contributes to the Crimson success.

"Each feels he can beat the other," said McCurdy, "without losing team spirit. It doesn't bug them to race each other."

As for Keith Colburn, a sophomore from Beverly Hills, who was New England prep 880 and mile champion two years at Exeter, he established himself as Harvard's fastest-ever half-miler as a freshman.

"He's a natural, with his great speed, incredible resilience and intense competitive spirit," said McCurdy. "Unfortunately he stretched his Achilles tendon in cross-country, and it hung on. When it cleared up, he hurt his foot banging too hard on the indoor turns. Maybe I made a mistake letting him try to run his way back. He is just coming around and will help our two-mile relay on the I.C.4-A."

Can Harvard, whose last I.C.4-A. team triumph was scored in 1927, challenge Villanova, eight-time winner of the indoor team title in the last 11 years?

"We sure mean to try," said McCurdy.

Villanova and Harvard, by happenstance, are head-to-head in the mile (Patrick and Frank Murphy against Shaw) and two-mile (defender Charles Messenger and Tom Donnelly against Baker and Hardin). Villanova's other best bets are Erv Hall as defender in the hurdles (he'll run the sprint too), Vince Bizzarro, 16-7 $\frac{3}{4}$ vaulter, Larry James in the 600 and two solid relays, with James doubling in the mile relay and no one doubling in the two-mile relay.

If Shaw, Baker and Hardin can hold the Villanova distance men even, it will be up to Harvard's field event men to offset Hall, James, Bizzarro and the relays. Edgar Stowell, Harvard field coach is high on Ron Wilson and Charley Ajootian, both 59-0 $\frac{1}{2}$ in the weight throw, and Dick Benka in the shotput. Steve Schoonover, 15-6 vaulter, who was fourth last year, is another hope.

It's a long shot, but Harvard is making its best effort in years, triggered by the spectacular mile and two-mile efforts of Shaw, Baker and Hardin.

"Sure, I worry about Harvard," said Elliott. "They're getting stronger and stronger every week."

Now, Bob Giegengack, of Yale, has company. He has been worrying about Harvard for 22 years.

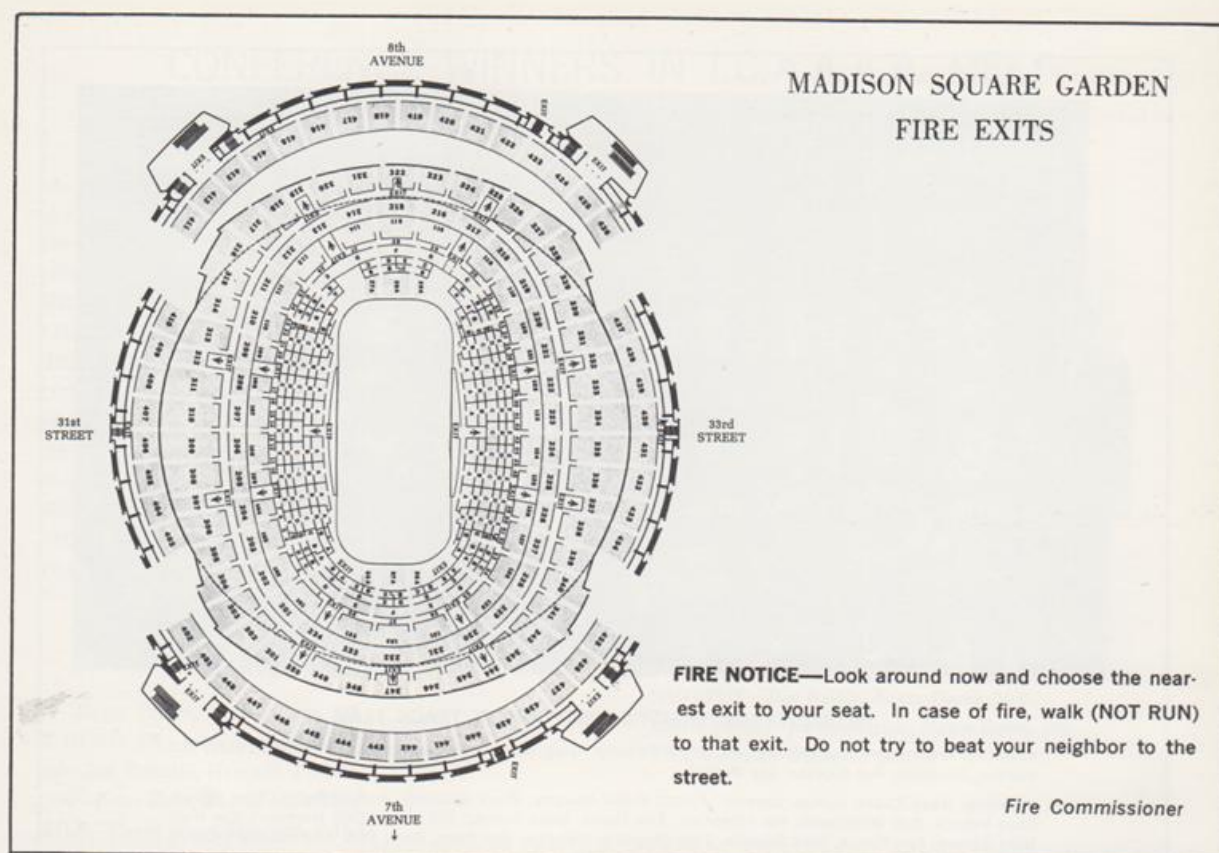
