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"You Do The Running... I'll Do The Thinking"

—Jumbo Elliott

He's a cross between a John Wooden and a Fred Shero or maybe they're just part of him. Because James Francis Elliott has been doing his thing at Villanova for 45 years and, though he doesn't bounce a basketball or slide a puck, he has rightfully earned his place among the world's greatest track and field coaches.

Nobody will write books about "Jumbo" for his techniques because they're all stuffed inside

his head like a filing cabinet. Rather, they remember Jumbo as a motivator, a man who could have been the best salesman ever or the best corporate executive ever. He just happens to be the best track coach.

There is no better example of his bottomless pocketful of the achievement of his miracles than 1600-meter relay in the last race of the day to clinch the team championship in last year's IC4As.

The Wildcats had a simple task: win the race. And they had to do it against seemingly long odds. The race was run in heats: Villanova was run in the slow section. They were running first, so their mark was the one which stood to be broken. They were running with an exhausted team which barely advanced through the trials and were comprised of four individuals who had run a combined 14 races up to that point.

Yet, they still won, and in a 3:04.5 time which was 7.7 seconds faster than the day before. With no one to spur him on, Glenn Bogue ran his final IC4A race as a senior in 45.1 as the anchorman.

Villanova won their 12th outdoor title by the slimmest of margins--one point! Case, in point.

Jumbo Elliott is a dictator, of sorts; there is no diplomacy in his decision-making. But though he hides his motives as well as the kindest of monarchs, his victories are counted in the people he produces, not the records.

"As far as goals are concerned," confirms Villanova's track authority, "each person is his own man. I expect full cooperation from him for 365 days a year. If he has some other opinion, that's bad."

This respect for authority has had its funny moments. As recently as the Penn Relays, Don Paige, the defending 1500-meter winner here, was being interviewed after his team's victory in the 6,000-meter relay. As the inquiries lengthened, he discovered his teammate Sydney Mareo dressing as if to leave Franklin Field. Paige interrupted him, "Sydney, where are you going? You've got another race (the 3,200-meter relay) to run."

Mareo quickly corrected him, stating that he had a plane to catch if he was to run the next week in his native country, South Africa. Amos Korir replaced Mareo, and Villanova won easily.

"His big philosophy is: 'You let me do the thinking, you do the running,'" explained Paige. "You don't question him, but he wants you to think out there because what separates the great runners from the good ones is the ability to think a race."

At first thought, that seems to be contrary logic. However, it doesn't require a philosophy major to figure out that Jumbo's theories were employed very successfully by the ancient Greek, Aristotle. "During a workout," says Paige, "you have to go to him. He'll say, 'Do a few of these.' or 'Do what's comfortable.' He's very indecisive. But he does that purposely. He does that to make you think."

"I've always said that he's more of an advisor than a coach... but he's still a coach."

"There are no curfews, no nothing. He's not that type of coach. You know what sleep you need, what food to eat. Ron Delany broke a world record in Madison Square Garden after eating two hot dogs a half an hour before the race. If I did that, I'd die. It's one of Mr. Elliott's favorite stories."

Mister Elliott is the apt title for a teacher. He prefers it to "Coach".

"On the track, he's made me a better and stronger athlete," said Paige, whose attempted double in the 800- and 1500-meter races fell short last year. "I've matured more, but almost all athletes do that."

"Off the track, he makes you more of a gentleman. He teaches you more manners. You dress up, and he won't let you have long hair."

Jumbo believes that if you have confidence in your appearance, you'll have confidence in your endeavors. His views permeate his views on life.

"You don't want to take it (track) too seriously," he tells you. "They're the best four years of your whole life. You don't realize how easy it is now, and how hard it is when you go out into the world. Run to your ability and work hard and not be mentally concerned. Go from day to day."

These are the commandments of a man who has numbered 285 IC4A champions, a man, you might say, who would be a shrewd judge of an outcome of any championship.

Part of the mystery of this man is his refusal to predict anything. His own athletes may not know when they are running, where they are running or what they are running; only the results become predictable.

He delights in scrambling his relays and in entering athletes away from their specialties--but always with a purpose. It's a success formula that has not been bottled, patented or copyrighted.

About this upcoming meet. Jumbo will only comment that he has more quality runners on this team than on any other.

A pretty general remark, you say? True. It's as conservative as his three-piece suit.

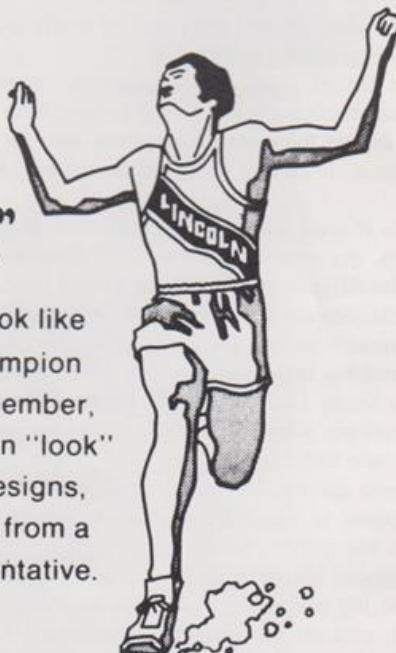
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Villanova Set To Defend IC4A Title

Villanova enters this year's IC4A championships with one of their best teams, but the talent may not be enough to win. The meet to be held at the University of Pennsylvania's Franklin Field on the third weekend in May will be another of several hotly contested Villanova-Maryland matchups.

Villanova is riding a wave this year which includes IC4A championships in cross country and indoor track, the NCAA indoor championship, and another fine showing at the Penn Relays. Lost from last year's team which beat Maryland by one point for the outdoor crown are Mark Belger, Glenn Bogue and Jim Flynn, who accounted for 22 points in individual events. Likely first time point scorers include Amos Korir and Joe Mitrovich who, coupled with a year's maturity for the rest of the squad, should give the Wildcats their deepest squad ever.

Korir is an Allegheny County College (J.C.) transfer from Kenya where he was a 13-0 high school pole vaulter. His older brother, John Kipkurgat, was Commonwealth Games 800 meter champ in 1974, but Amos was not good enough to run on the high school team. Since then however, he has won the national junior college championship and set a JC record in the steeplechase at 8:38.8 and ran 8:40.0 in early April at the Dogwood Relays, supplanting Vic Zwolak's school record of 8:42.0.

Joe Mitrovich, a sophomore walk-on from Rancocas Valley Regional in South Jersey, shocked everyone with a throw of 252-1 in the javelin at the Penn Relays. Mitrovich broke Jim Shillow's school record of 241-6 from 1968 and was the second best collegiate thrower at the Relays behind Army's Steve Kreider. If he can maintain this form he should score well at the IC4A and give Villanova their first points in the weight events since Shillow won the javelin in 1968.

A year's seasoning for the suburban Philadelphia school will be the big difference between this year and last, however. Don Paige has been healthy for an entire year for the first time since his high school days, and this should aid him in completing the 1500-800 double he attempted last year. Sydney Maree has been healthy for the entire year also, unlike a year ago when the IC4A meet was only his second since recovering from leg problems which kept him out of action more than three months. Maree won the IC4A indoor 3-mile in March with a meet record and has already run 13:31.2 for 5000 meters.

Paige led Dean Childs, Maree and John Burns to sweep of the 1500 last year. Such a sweep

seems unlikely this year. Childs, Maree and Burns all have developed the strength to run longer distances exceptionally well and may be able to score better if placed elsewhere.

Paige and Anthony Tufariello should continue to roll along as two of the best middle distance runners ever produced at Villanova. Paige has won the past two NCAA indoor 1000 yard run titles, while Tufariello won this year's NCAA 600 title.

Tim Dale, Keith Brown and Derrek Harbour should score in the sprints and relays. Dale won the 400 his first two years, but lost to Glen Cohen last year. Cohen has been hurt this season, and the odds seem to be against him repeating.

Villanova's last big point producer is Nate Cooper, school record holder in the triple jump. Cooper set a meet record last year, but will face another stiff challenge from Dennis Ivory of Maryland. This is one of the few events in which Villanova and Maryland pit their strengths against each other and has been an interesting sidelight to past meets.

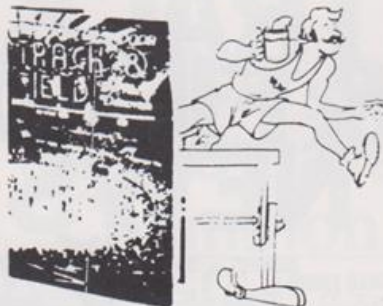

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Fairleigh Dickinson's Walt Marusyn To Retire

In a word, Walt Marusyn has brought respectability to Fairleigh Dickinson University's cross-country and track programs.

No one outside of Northern New Jersey knew of the Knights' teams when Marusyn began coaching both sports in 1958. However in 22 years, the North Arlington resident has transformed those two obscure squads into clubs that are nationally and even internationally known.

That, even more than his 266-147-72 lifetime record, will be the legacy Marusyn leaves when he retires from coaching after the NCAA Championships later this month.

"What Walt has done in a nutshell is give our cross-country and track teams credibility," said FDU acting athletic director, Bob Metz, a long-time friend. "Sometimes I thought he was working 26 hours a day.

"I can't believe there was ever a coach more dedicated to his kids than Walt Marusyn," Metz added. "I'm certainly sorry to see him leave coaching, but I'm just glad he will still be with us in an administrative capacity."

Marusyn, who is the president of the IC4A Coaches Association, will remain with FDU as the Knights' assistant director of athletics, chairperson of the physical education department at the University's Rutherford campus and physical education instructor.

"It wasn't an easy decision to leave coaching," said Walt, whose teams have captured 28 championships during his reign. "It just got to the point where there wasn't enough time to fulfill all my other responsibilities.

"Naturally I will miss the kids and the association I had with the other coaches and officials. The personal relationships were the best part of the business.

"I leave with a great deal of satisfaction knowing that we may have come a long way." He said, "In 1958 we used to travel to meets in a car. One of my biggest worries was not having enough people to compete. Thankfully those days are in the past."

Marusyn recruited high jumper Franklin Jacobs and the Paterson native proceeded to set a world indoor record of 7-7 $\frac{1}{4}$ as a sophomore. Another of his recruits, senior Gideon Terer, captured the AAU 1,000 yard run title in 1978. The Knights third super star sprinter Ephraim Serrette, won the 60 yard dash at the IC4A indoor.

In recent years, FDU's track teams have taken relay medals at Madison Square Garden and in 1977 the Knights earned gold watches in the mile relay at the Penn Relays.

Marusyn's cross-country squads have compiled a 34-4 record since 1976. They won their first IC4A University Division and Metropolitan Conference titles and defeated such teams as Rutgers, Princeton, Army, St. John's, Lehigh, Yale and Colgate. Last fall the Knights finished second to Villanova in IC4A Championship race. Away from coaching, Marusyn, along with John Gibson, FDU's assistant coach, established the New Jersey Collegiate Cross-Country and Track Conference.

While this year has been filled with success for Marusyn on the track, it was also the most heartbreaking time of his coaching career. Last September his wife, Faye, entered the hospital for an operation. She died the following month. Despite the personal anguish, Walt has carried on his duties and responsibilities as a coach.

"Not many people could have carried on under those circumstances," Metz added. "Walt loves his kids so much and he didn't want to let them down. He is a wonderful human being and a fine coach. It's certainly not going to be the same without him."
