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Rich Memories Relived As Harvard Hosts IC4A

There are certain sounds with which one associates a place, event or person. You still remember the popular song of the time when you first fell in love, right? Anyone who has been to this event before surely remembers the resonant voice of "Legs" O'Reilly, reminding that "this isn't just any track meet. This is the IC4A."

This is Harvard's IC4A for the first time, at least in the sense that it is the university's first indoor hosting opportunity. But that doesn't make Harvard new to the world of running, jumping and throwing. In fact, when the record books are pulled out, dusted off and leafed through, one finds that Harvard track has a venerable history.

Since Harvard -- and its other Ivy confreres -- do not offer athletic scholarships, chances are that IC4A or NCAA team titles in track and field are a thing of the past. Those schools that can hoist trophies for such achievements should take a moment to thank schools such as Harvard for the opportunity.

At the turn of the century, Harvard was synonymous with college track. When the Olympic Games were with the Athens Olympiad in 1896, perhaps the most prominent members of the United States team were "college boys," or more specifically, Harvard men. Ellery Clark '96, William Hoyt '98 and James Connolly '99 participated in the games, Clark achieving an impressive double win no one has since (or likely will) duplicate.

Clark won the running long jump and the high jump, earning his place in Olympic history, but only after receiving reluctant permission to compete from Dean LaBaron Briggs. Such favor was not granted to Connolly, who paid his own way to the games. He finished second in the high jump, clearing a then-estimable 5'5", earned a bronze in the long jump and won the triple jump. Hoyt made gold his own by going over 10'10" in the pole vault.

Though the university administration wasn't quite sure it wanted its name associated with extracurricular accomplishments, Harvard was inextricably tied to track and field.

The early IC4A championships, then only conducted outdoors, were basically owned by Harvard. A couple of world wars crimped Crimson fortunes on the oval, but in the late 1930s, Harvard began carving a special niche for itself in the world of athletics. In 1936, Jaakko Mikkola was named head coach of the men's team, bringing glistening credentials to Cambridge. Mikkola was known around the

world as the coach of Finland's Olympic team in 1920 and 1924, and coached the great Finnish miler Paavo Nurmi. Nurmi's 1925 exhibition race, just 50 yards away from this year's IC4A venue, packed Harvard Stadium. One of Mikkola's H men made his way into the Olympics, as Sam Felton '48, finished fourth in the hammer in '48's games in London.

During the next decade, Harvard athletics, track included, had a slight change in focus. By the mid-1950s, the Ivy League had formalized, and competition among the member schools became the main emphasis. That didn't prevent some special individuals from surfacing and becoming prominent on the national track and field scene. Ted Bailey was the NCAA hammer champion in 1962, two-miler Walt Hewlett finished 16th in the 1964 Boston Marathon, while Chris Pardee high jumped 6'9" to win the '64 ICs. Royce Shaw made a name for himself by running a 4:03 mile as a freshman, at that time the fastest ever by an Ivy Leaguer. In 1969, Shaw outdueled another pretty fair Ivy man, Yale's Frank Shorter, winning the outdoor Heptagonal mile.

In the estimation of some, including Harvard's coach, Bill McCurdy, Jim Baker may have been one of the finest collegiate milers of the late '60s. He won the outdoor IC4A championship, setting Harvard and New England records with his time of 4:00.2. That mark held up for 18 years, until Clifford Sheehan broke the four-minute barrier in 1985.

Though winning the Heptagonal Games (competition among the Ivy League schools, Army and Navy) was of utmost importance, more athletes went on to even greater success. Harvard weight men won NCAA championships in the 35-lb. weight in both 1969 and '70. Charles Ajootjian and Ed Nosal were the national champs, but Nosal used the meet as a forum for more than a display of his physical strength.

At the NCAA indoor meet in Detroit in 1970, Nosal became somewhat of a household name. During August of 1969, a basketball player at Yale named Jack Langer competed in the Maccabiah Games in Israel, and was subsequently declared ineligible, Yale also going on probation. Upset at the NCAA, AAU and ECAC, Nosal took it upon himself to register a personal protest. After an appeal for a group effort fell on deaf ears, Nosal and teammate Keith Colburn made Harvard's and Yale's presence felt. After winning the weight and 1,000 respectively, Nosal and Colburn took the winners' stand in Yale jerseys. Skip Hare, third in the long jump, followed suit.

The mid-70s was the era of, among others, high jumper Mel Embree and pole vaulter Geoff Stiles. You've never heard of Mel Embree? You've heard of Dwight Stones, right? Well, Embree was the guy Stones was chasing a dozen years ago. Embree's stats are impressive.

The Ann Arbor, Mich. native won 42 of his 44 meet competitions, five Heps titles, two IC4A titles (indoor and outdoor in 1976) and set Harvard, Heps and IC4A records. Embree shed regional limelight for national spotlight when he defeated Stones in the 1975 Millrose Games in New York. A year later, he earned a spot on the U.S. Olympic team.

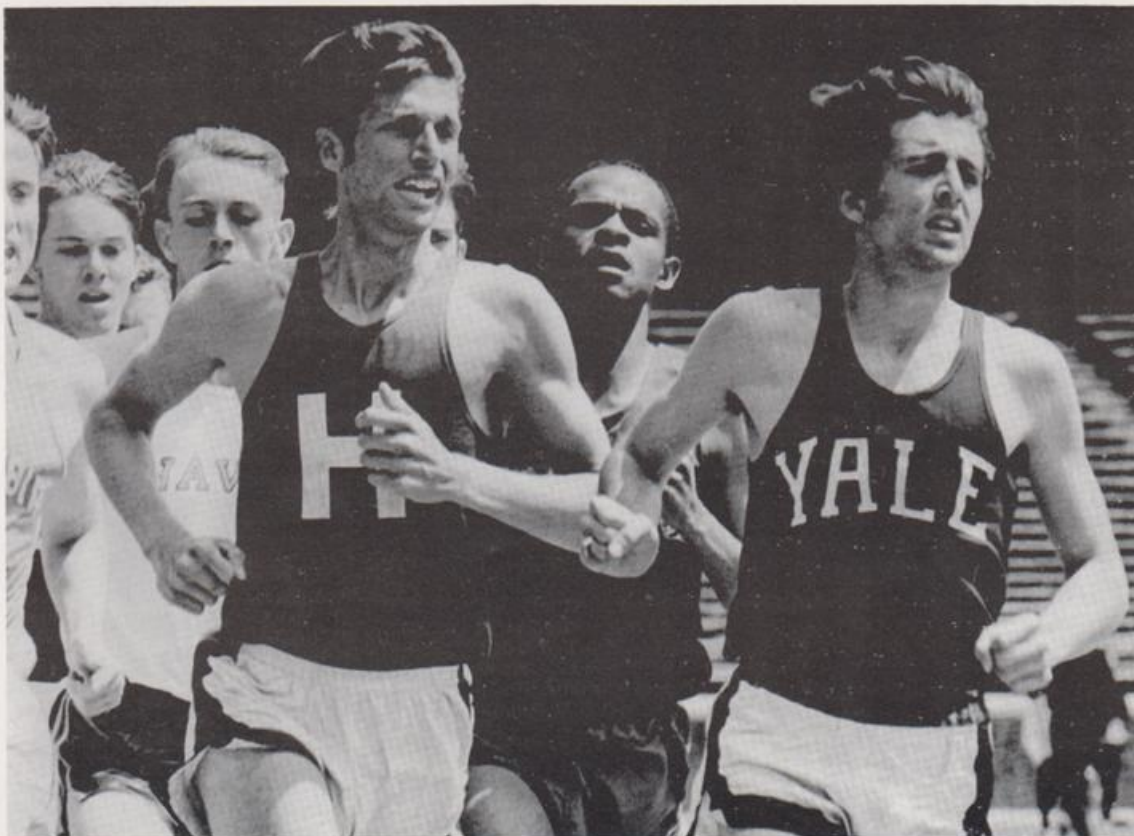
Even with his vast talent, Embree's track focus never blurred. McCurdy was quoted as saying, "In an Olympic year, some guys would have left the team to concentrate on their specialty. Mel wouldn't do that. Instead, risking a possible injury, he would practice a number of events, just in case we might need points from him to win a dual meet."

Initially, Stiles didn't make a splash on the Harvard track scene, never vaulting over 14 feet as a freshman. By the time he was a junior, however, he was clearing 16 feet on a regular basis, winning the IC4A title, and topping 17'3" to win the 1979 NCAA indoor pole vault title. Just for reference, winners of the event in the preceding four years included Earl Bell and Mike Tully.

Other national class trackmen wore the crimson singlet during the 1980s. Adam Dixon's 1,000 meter time of 2:19.8, registered in 1981, was then an American record. An All-American miler and Penn Relays winner at the distance, Dixon's marks of 3:43.89 in the 1,500 and 4:01.3 in the mile are eye-opening in a collegiate context. Cliff Sheehan eventually broke Dixon's mile standard by finishing fourth in the Jumbo Elliott Mile at the Penn Relays in 3:59.2, marking the first time a New England collegian had cracked the 4:00 barrier.

And now, in the days of specialty runners and shoe contracts and club affiliations, Harvard men are still turning heads. In December of 1983, Paul Gompers, now a senior for the Crimson, was running in the Humana-Rocket City Marathon in Huntsville, Ala. Coming from virtually nowhere, Gompers pulled up along side the leader, stuck out his hand, introduced himself and proceeded to set the world junior record, running 2:15.28. The record books list Gompers' affiliation as "USA" but, as has been the case for 91 years, the college boy is still a Harvard man.
