THE TERRAPINS TRY AGAIN

THE I.C.A.A.A. scene shifts from Madison Square Garden's 11-lap boards to Rutgers' 440 En Tout Cas cinderpath, from winter to spring, from a 13-event program to 18, but the battle lines, within the framework of a 57-college entry, remain the same.

It's Villanova defending, Maryland challenging the Wildcats, and Harvard hopeful of making it a three-way fight. Villanova is seeking a sixth straight triumph, achieved by no one since the Crimson, in the infancy of the country's oldest track organization, won seven in a row in the 1880s.

In the indoor I.C.4-A., it was Villanova, 24 points; Maryland, 21½, and Harvard, 14. The enlarged outdoor program brings new personnel into the picture, discus and javelin throwers, for instance, steeplechasers and triple jumpers. Current form and figures indicate all three top-rated powers will pick up additional points.

Who will benefit most from the switch to outdoors? The guess here is Maryland, which has dominated its Atlantic Coast Conference for a full decade and is most ambitious to extend its domain to all the East.

Villanova has scored 45 points and upward in each of the last four years. Harvard was a distant runner-up with 29½ last year; Maryland buried in the pack with 10. The champions, with an almost all-senior array, come back with talent which accounted for 28 of their 45 points last year on their own campus. Harvard retains 20 of its 26½. Maryland has 8 of its 10 points but is reinforced by the strongest sophomore group.

Brother Friel, on another page of this program, pre-views Villanova's chances. Here we'll survey Maryland's. Jim Kehoe, who, in his 19th year as Terrapin coach, admits he needs all the help he can get. His closest approach to the I.C.4-A. team title was a distant second to Penn State in 1959, the one year in the last eight when Villanova didn't win.

"We're going to make a stab at it," said Kehoe. "We're taking 25 to 30 men to the meet and we won't have anyone who doesn't merit performing in it. We rate Villanova head and shoulders above all as the team to beat, but we're in position to challenge the rest of the field."

If this were a test of dual-meet strength and skills, Kehoe would take on anyone in the I.C.4-A., including Harvard, with confidence.

"This isn't meant to criticize any other operation, but we have a strong dual-meet philosophy

at Maryland," Kehoe said. "Dual-meet-wise, we're real tough. We were red hot against Navy and did things we never did before or since. We were very good in our conference meet. We know it takes a different approach to win the ICAAAA."

That approach is spearheaded by Maryland's class performers — Frank Costello and Mike Cole, the I.C.4-A. and NCAA indoor champions in the high and long jumps, respectively. Costello, gifted sophomore from Union, N. J., became the second 7-footer in I.C.4-A. history last March. He then became the first NCAA indoor champion by beating Olympic medalist John Rambo in a tense jumpoff requiring nine extra leaps. Remarkably consistent, he has cleared 6-11¾ this spring.

Cole, a senior, comes to defend his title with 24-11¾ credentials (25-1 indoors). He has taken on secondary chores in this meet as a sprinter who won his conference 220 in 21.5 and is counted on for points in the 100 and 220.

Maryland's other Atlantic Coast Conference champions, besides Costello and Cole, are sophomore Russ White, from Livingston, N. J., who has thrown 250-0½ in the javelin; Steve Lamb, 47.5 quarter-miler, who ran third in the I.C.4-A. last year, and Ramsey Thomas, 1:52.1 half-miler. White respects Lennart Hedmark, the Penn State Swedish import who set an NCAA frosh record a year ago and beat him last month in the Penn Relays. Lamb and Thomas, not suited to the 600 on the Garden boards, are potential scorers, though Thomas is in faster company.

In the mile Kehoe has another sophomore in George Henry who ran 4:08.4 (third) behind a winning 4:06.1 in his conference. Only Herb Germann's 4:07.2 has been faster in the I.C.4-A. set this spring. Dick Sheer was Maryland's only track scorer in the Indoors when he ran second in the hurdles. He has a 14.2 clocking this spring.

"Everyone knows we have to do something running to stay close to Villanova," said Kehoe.

There's no doubt of Maryland's power afield. Besides Costello, Cole and White, the Terps count on Bob Schnetzka, indoor runnerup in the long jump at 23-10¼; three 15-footers in Pete Kowzun, Bob Williams and Stu Markley (the first two scored indoors); Dick Dull, a 224-foot javelin man, and Ernie Hearon, 55-8 shotputter who was sub-par from illness indoors. There are others who could break into the scoring, and

THE BASHFUL OLYMPIAN

ONE YEAR AND one week ago, in the Crock of Cheese track meet among St. John's, Fordham and New York University, Tom Farrell of St. John's ran his first outdoor half-mile of the year. He won it in 1 minute 51.1 seconds, and his coach, Steve Bartold, said:

"This is the start."

It sure was. A week later, Farrell, almost unheard of outside the east, won the I.C.A.A.A. title in 1:49.5 in an upset. Three weeks later, he won the National Collegiate 800-meter title in 1:48.5 in an upset. Two weeks later, he ran fourth in the New York Olympic trials in 1:47.5 and qualified for the final trials. Ten weeks later, he ran second in the final Olympic trials in 1:48.0 and made the United States team. Five weeks later, he ran fifth in the Olympic final in 1:46.6. Tom Farrell had come a long way from the sidewalks of New York.

This year, Farrell seems headed for more glory. In February, he set a world indoor record of 1:49.3 for the 880 and in the process beat the supposedly unbeatable Bill Crothers of Canada. Outdoors, he won the Metropolitan Intercollegiate 440 for the second straight year, one week after running a 440 in 46.9 against Navy. Today, he is seeking more I.C.A.A.A.A. glory.

This giant of a runner is no giant of a man. Tom Farrell is a little fellow of 5 feet 7 inches and 142 pounds. He is 21 years old. He lives in Forest Hills, Queens, with his family, and he is quick to tell you that the best runner in his family—is or will be—his brother Pete, a freshman at Notre Dame.

Tom is a St. John's senior and marketing major. He is a Big Man on Campus without really trying. He is a smart, tough, hardened athlete who doesn't scare when the going gets sticky. Yet he is a shy young man who prefers to make his public utterances one sentence at a time.

When he returned from the Olympics as America's No. 1 half-miler, he was honored by St. John's at an assembly. There were 1,000 fellow students waiting when a nervous Tom Farrell arose to make the first speech of his career. He had a fine speech memorized. He got up, looked at the crowd and forgot everything he was going to say. Instead, he spoke off the cuff and proved a tremendous hit.

He's easy to work with," says Bartold. "He always does what I tell him, but first we talk it over. If he wants to change a workout, we discuss it and compromise. He's sensible. If it comes to doing more or less work than he normally would, nine times out of ten he will want to do more. Sometimes he scares me. I think he tends to work too hard.

"All he wants to be is another guy on the team, and that's how the others regard him. He never asks for anything special. He'll sit in the back of the bus when we travel. He doesn't like to have a fuss made over him.

"He has been a big help with our younger kids. They look up to him. He doesn't go over to them and coach them—that isn't the way he does things—but they use the same locker room, the same shower, the same track. They talk, and they learn from him."

Farrell can teach them plenty. He is a smart enough to follow a well-conceived race plan and then alter it when circumstances dictate. He does what he has to do, and he does it so well that he has succeeded far beyond what the greatest optimists had predicted.

Take, for example, the N.C.A.A. 800-meter final at Eugene, Ore., last June. Farrell was boxed on the pole around the last turn. He might have tried to swing around the pack, but that would have been fatal. Instead, he stayed cool and waited for something to happen. Something did. The leader drifted out, Farrell barreled through and won.

Tough? Farrell showed his toughness in the final Olympic trials at Los Angeles. Coming out of the final turn, he was just ready to make his move when everyone else did. Within 20 yards, Farrell was last. This time, waiting would have been fatal. Farrell didn't wait. He swung wide, ran down everyone except Morgan Groth and made the Olympic team.

That, in itself, was a stunning surprise. Farrell's performance in Tokyo was even a greater surprise. Upset after upset had moved him that far, and there were more upsets ahead. He ran second in his heat in 1:48.6 and reached the semi-finals. He ran second in his semi-final in 1:47.8 and reached the final. He ran fifth in the

SHED A TEAR WITH JUMBO

JUMBO ELLIOTT's track and field forces from Villanova have won five straight and seven of the last eight outdoor and four straight and seven of last nine indoor ICAAAA championships. Prior to the majority of those title meets, the Wildcat mentor has shed jumbo tears that one or more colleges were sure to win.

This time the dapper Villanova coach is rendering an encore of the tune he used for the Indoor Championships at Madison Square Garden last March sixth. The only change is that the tears are much bigger this time. This necessitated Wildcat assistant Jim Tuppeny following his boss around the last few weeks with a bigger mop.

"We'll never do it again this time," Elliott opines. "Maryland will be twice as tough outdoors and look what that Harvard team has been doing. Then this would have to be a year that both Army and Navy are sending their full teams to the IC4As instead of competing against each other in a dual meet. The only consolation is that the championships aren't being held on our campus this year."

It is true that Maryland should be stronger outdoors and that the Terrapins might have won indoors if pole vaulter Stu Markley and shot putter Ernie Hearon had stayed healthy. But it is Jesse Abramson's job to plead the Maryland case on other pages in this program.

First let's get down the Wildcats even Jumbo admits are probable scorers in the first ICAAAA championships held in New Jersey. They are Earle Horner (the 220 defender) and Marshall Uzzle in both sprints, Larry Livers in both hurdles, Noel Carroll and either Al Adams or Jim Orr in the 880, Tom Sullivan in the mile, Dave Hyland and Marty Ferko in the steeplechase, Augie Zilincar in the shot put, either Charley Preas or Joe O'Neill in the triple jump and a mile relay team picked from among Carroll, Kozlowski, Uzzle, Adams, Orr and Bill Heidelberg.

Jumbo doesn't claim all of those boys will score. His lone definite comment on scoring possibilities is "we have to get a lot of points in the 100." He insists there will be no unknown Wildcats pulling surprises and that Zilincar won't score in his new event—the hammer. The only probable doubles outside of the sprints and

hurdles that he will admit are in the relay and the 440 or 880.

Surprise points are old hat to Elliott and counting out a few this time might be foolhardy. How can we forget fellows like little John Kopil in the distance events, broad jumper Johnny Buckley and shot putter Bill Joe, a scoring gift from the football team.

Then how about a few individual event doubles. The 440 and 880 heats are separated by a half hour on the time schedule and the finals are one hour apart after a night's rest. The mile (to be run in time sections if necessary) and the 880 final are 70 minutes apart, the mile and the 3,000-meter steeplechase are 75 minutes apart, and the three-mile and the steeplechase only 45 minutes apart.

The advice here is to remember that Elliott is a gambler.

If Carroll hasn't been walking the floor much these nights with his infant daughter, it could be that Jumbo might talk the Irishman into trying his luck in the quarter and half. Don't for a minute forget the edge in running experience that Noel has over most of his rivals in this meet. And the probability of any Wildcat four-some getting better than third in the mile relay is slim.

Then the mile is before the half to bring up the possibility of Sullivan trying that double. A half-mile heat on Friday certainly wouldn't hurt his mile chances and the only gamble might be Tom shutting out Adams or Orr in the 880 heats. The three-mile-steeplechase double is much too rough for any of the present Wildcats.

Whether it will be hurdler Ken Coniglio or any other unsung Wildcat you care to name, you just can't discount the Villanova habit of coming up with surprise points. Who figured Horner was going to win the 220 last year? How many would risk a bet on his chances of winning both sprints this time?

Elliott, with Tuppeny's help, has proven many, many times in the past that he can get the limit out of his squad. It's a matter of record.

The advice from this corner is—Don't count Villanova out even if Jumbo's tears match Niagara Falls before Maryland or any other team has the team trophy wrapped up for the journey home.

N.C.A.A. RULES OF COMPETITION WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED BY REFEREE AND OTHER OFFICIALS.

Track measures four laps to mile.

All events are scratch, i.e., none is handicap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty for first false start, but competitor is disqualified for second false start. However, starter's recall no longer nullifies false start by any competitor.

In hurdle races competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In all relay races baton must be carried in runner's hand and must be passed to next succeeding teammate within clearly marked 20-yard zone, extending 10 yards in both directions from leg finish line.

Governing rules provide that, in races around turns, any competitor willfully jostling, running across or obstructing another competitor so as to impede his progress, shall be disqualified. If in any race competitor is disqualified for any of these reasons, Referee shall have power to order race to be rerun with disqualified competitor excluded or, in case of heat, to permit any competitors affected by act resulting in disqualification, other than disqualified competitor, to compete in subsequent round of event.

Any competitor may be disqualified if, in opinion of Referee, he has in any way been aided by coach, teammate, or anyone connected directly or indirectly with team concerned, such as, running along-side of teammate, being stationed at various points near track, or located nearby any of field events for purpose of aiding or coaching competitor after race or field event has officially been started.

Each member college is limited to following numbers of actual participants in various events in the Outdoor Championships:

One Mile Run	2*
Three Mile Run	2*
One Mile Relay	One Team
All other events	5

Nominee or qualifier who fails to compete in any running or hurdling event for which he has been nominated or has qualified will be ineligible for any further participation in meet.

In four weight events (shot, discus, javelin, and hammer), broad jump, and triple jump, each contestant shall be allowed three preliminary trials. One more man than there are places to be scored shall qualify for final of three trials each. To qualify for final, competitor must make at least one legal effort in preliminaries.

All performances made in field event trials in one-, two-, or three-day meets shall be counted with performances in final in determining final place winners. Each competitor shall be credited with best of all his efforts.

Competitors must be on time, field contestants entering enclosure five minutes before scheduled start of their event, and track contestants entering enclosure upon completion of race next preceding theirs. As soon as their event is over, competitors will kindly leave track and infield without delay.

In each event 15 points are scored: 5 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth, and 1 for fifth.

* (Plus 1) one more upon approval of Games Committee, provided all three representatives of affected college are of championship calibre).

Villanova has nine men who have scored in ICAAAA championships; Maryland has eight. Harvard has six.

How they and others will score in this meet provides juicy speculations. Let's sit back and enjoy it.

final, the best showing by any American in the event.

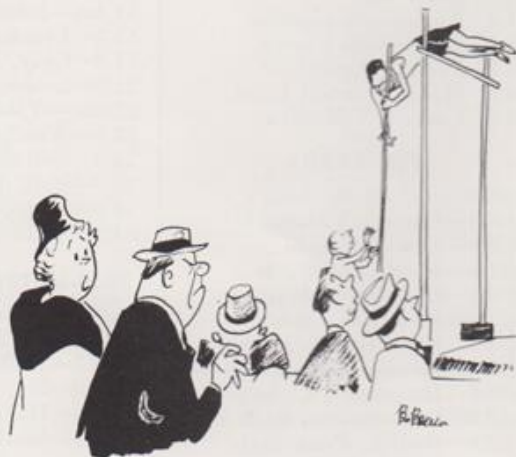
Farrell had every reason to be proud, and he was proud. But he couldn't hide his disappointment. He thought he should have been third.

The stop watch shows that Farrell is one of history's fastest metric half-milers. The record shows that he deserves to stand with such I.C.A.A.A.A. half-mile champions as John Paul Jones, Ted Meredith, Phil Edwards, Ben East-

man, Bill Bonthron, John Woodruff, Reggie Pearman, Arnie Sowell and Ron Delany.

But how good is he? The question was put to Bartold, at the age of 29 a highly successful figure in his own right.

"How good is he?" Bartold said. "I don't know. If he loses at a half-mile, maybe we'll know. Maybe he's as good as 1:46.6, because that's what he ran in the Olympics and he lost there. But forget time. He is a tremendous person and a tremendous athlete. I feel fortunate just to be associated with him."
