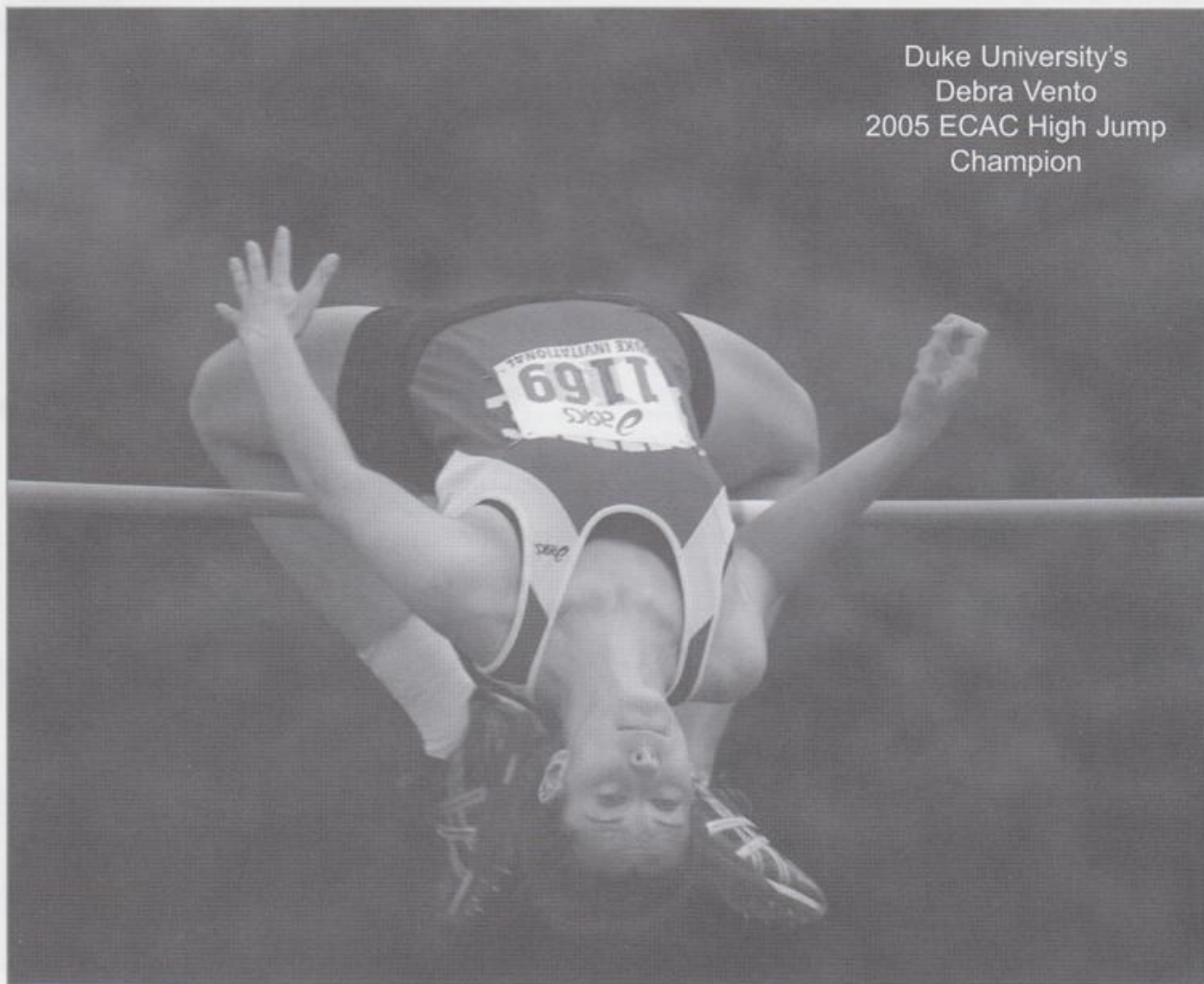

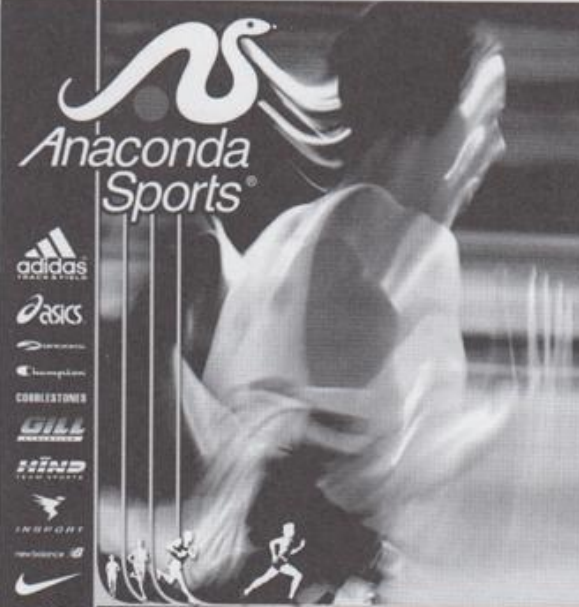

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Championships

The ECAC administers 110 preseason and postseason events for 35 men's and women's sports, 10 affiliate organizations and seven playing leagues.

Officiating

The ECAC assigns officials in 14 sports in Divisions I, II and III, including baseball, men's and women's basketball, fencing, field hockey, football, men's gymnastics, men's and women's ice hockey, men's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball and wrestling. In addition, the ECAC officiating bureaus provide clinics and workshops, improving the level of officiating and attracting the most qualified collegiate officials.

Communications

The ECAC publicizes the achievements of its member institution's student-athletes through weekly and postseason awards. Annually, the publicity bureau recognizes more than 4,000 student-athletes in 20 different sports from Division I, II and III member institutions.

Marketing and Sponsorships

The ECAC Corporate Partner Program is dedicated to developing relationships with commercial entities that are committed to the mission of the ECAC, support the ideals of intercollegiate athletics and value the pursuit of excellence on and off the field of play. The ECAC® is the nation's largest athletic conference with 317 Divisions I, II, and III colleges and universities from Maine to North Carolina. Since its foundation 68 years ago, the ECAC has emerged as the nationwide leader in service. The headquarters, the Asa S. Bushnell Center, is located in Centerville, Massachusetts on Cape Cod. A non-profit service organization since 1938, the ECAC was founded as the Central Office for Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics with 58 charter members. In 1983, one of the most significant events in ECAC history occurred as the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (EAIW) was consolidated into the ECAC. Through the years the ECAC has been

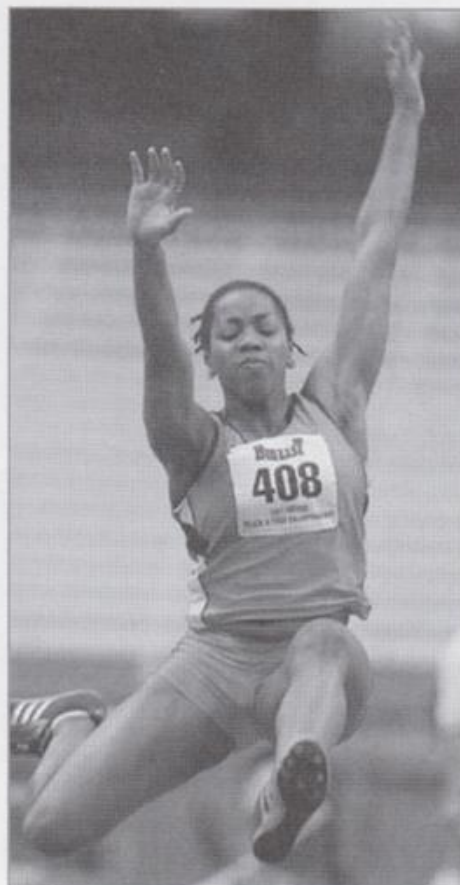

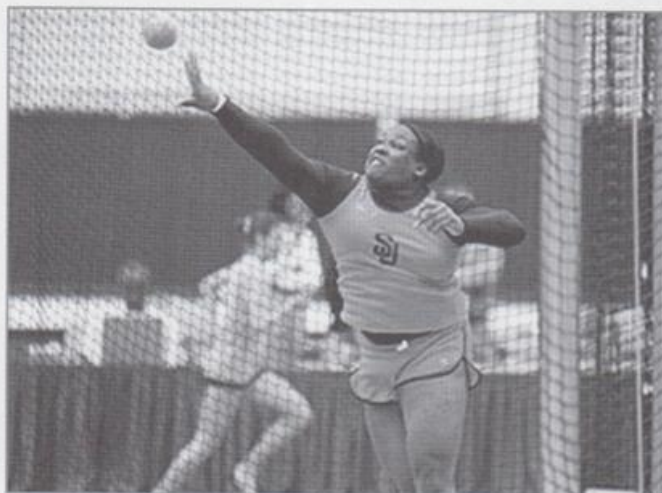
