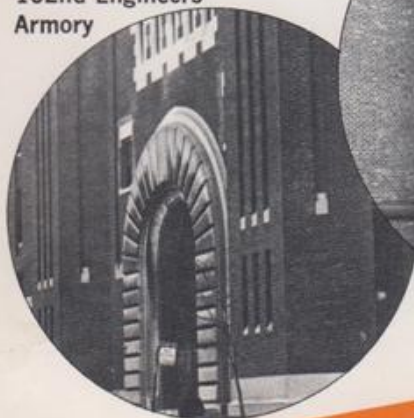

From N. Y. to Jadwin — 50 Miles, 50 Years

In the 93rd year of its existence as the country's oldest track organization, the intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America moved its outdoor championships from cinder tracks onto a synthetic surface, namely Tartan.

This was at Franklin Field in 1968, recently enough for every one in the house to recall that every I.C.A.A.A.A. running record—except the 200—was shattered by margins up to 21.2 seconds, the mile by 8.1 seconds as five men led by Dave Patrick (3:56.8) eclipsed the magic number in the first 4-minute mile in I.C.A.A.A.A. history. The only other 4-minute mile in the I.C.A.A.A.A. was run last May, at Franklin Field when Marty Liquori ran 3:58.5.

To what extent the track itself—a magic carpet—was responsible for this unreasonable and wholesale revision of records deponent can not say for sure. You have to give more than a little credit to the athletes themselves—a remarkable crew that included Patrick, Erv Hall, Larry James, Dave Hemery, Steve Stageberg, et.al. Some credit surely goes to the weather, 75 degrees, mostly sunny and calm. And to the motivation of an Olympic year.

This recent track history is recalled because the I.C.A.A.A.A. has made an historic move. After 49 years in big, dimly-lit armories not built for spectators and in Madison Square Gardens built for spectators but not geared to the needs of the athletes, the I.C.A.A.A.A. varsity track jamboree has moved from the city, into the country and onto a campus site.

Whereas the outdoor title meet has always moved about on campus venues (Harvard, Pennsylvania, Berkeley, Villanova and Rutgers), the indoor championships never found an academic setting until Old Nassau's plush new \$7 million Jadwin Gymnasium became available.

There are several reasons for this move, reluctant as management was to leave the capital of indoor track. With some 60 colleges of the 84 members of the I.C.A.A.A.A. represented in the Indoor Intercollegiate, the 12-foot-wide 11-lap Garden track inhibited the colleges in the kind of championship meet they wanted. Until Jadwin there was no ac-

ceptable alternative. Jadwin's 8-lap 18-foot-wide track actually is wider than that in terms of running room and has 12 lanes—count 'em, 12—in the stretch straightaway.

A track this size eliminates all manner of gimmicks the I.C.A.A.A.A. had to adopt in its years in the Garden. No more run-off hurdle heats to determine the finalists (which means there won't be another Happy Furth of NYU to win a run-off and then win dramatically in the final). No more gut-wrenching time trials, through endless heats because heats qualifying men on places were not feasible on a 12-foot track.

The I.C.A.A.A.A. could have eliminated these gimmicks if it could have run a two-day meet, but the Garden could not allot two days to the I.C.A.A.A.A. Princeton can, and for the first time the I.C.A.A.A.A. finals will be decided in an afternoon session.

Princedon and Jadwin also offer other attractions—ample locker rooms, warm-up areas, parking space. And the two-day format enabled the colleges to expand from 13 to 17 events and include a 440, an 880, a triple jump and a distance medley to conform to the N.C.A.A. program and permit our Eastern athletes to qualify for the N.C.A.A. in Detroit next week.

Lastly, the Jadwin track surface is Tartan, which brings us the long way around to what happened the first time the outdoor meet was held on Tartan.

But let's not jump to conclusions. Every indoor I.C.A.A.A.A. record is not automatically marked for oblivion because of the shift onto Tartan. The size of the track and sweeping turns, not the surfacing, will surely produce better times, but the I.C.A.A.A.A. records will stand up in many cases—like the 6 flat for 60 yards by Frank Budd, the 1:09.2 for 600 by Larry James, the 2:07.1 by Frank Murphy, the 4:02.1 mile by Marty Liquori (probably the best bet to go this year), and the 8:42.2 for two miles by Dick Buerkle.

In two respects the I.C.A.A.A.A. is not making an unprecedented move. The indoor meet has been

Watch Out, Villanova!

The IC4A "Stop Villanova" mission, carried on almost singlehandedly by Maryland the past several years, could be getting some help in the very near future.

Manhattan and Pennsylvania may not be ready to grab the team trophy yet, but keep an eye on both.

Perhaps it's only a coincidence, but the two teams beginning to show signs of challenging the supremacy of Jumbo Elliott's Wildcats have strong ties with Villanova.

Fred Dwyer, who won three indoor IC4A miles running for Elliott, then started Marty Liquori's career while coaching at Essex Catholic, is putting championship pieces together at Manhattan.

Some thrilling IC4A clashes between pupil and teacher appear inevitable.

Back in Philadelphia, a guy named Jim Tuppeny is slowly but surely constructing a powerhouse at Penn. Tuppeny learned his trade well, as Elliott's Villanova assistant for a dozen years.

Tuppeny, an unbeaten hurdler and pole vaulter as captain at LaSalle, took over the rebuilding job at Penn in 1966 with some very modest goals.

"Our goal," says Tup honestly, "was to score in the ICs . . . and improve the program."

Since the Quakers were 0-7 in dual meets the year before Tuppeny arrived, finished last in the Heptagonal Championships and failed to enter a single athlete in the ICs, the goal was realistic.

Participation (or the lack of it) was the key, Tuppeny decided.

"At Penn, dual meets are important," the former president of the IC4A coaches explained. "At Villanova we were more interested in quality. I knew we had to build quantity here and worry about the quality later."

Tuppeny, along with assistants Irv Mondschein and Jim Gibbons, went to work on a two-pronged recruiting program. The aim was to rekindle interest from within while at the same time "selling" Penn to schoolboy athletes.

"The enthusiasm of the coaches is important," explains Tup. "We had to expound the virtues of track and our school."

Neither was difficult for Tuppeny, who loves track and feels the University of Pennsylvania, with its

many fine graduate schools, is far ahead of the competition.

Backing his strategy with deeds, Tuppeny was careful to nurture the competitive spirit of his new participants by keeping them as active as possible.

For the first time in years, Penn entered every major event in the Penn Relays and Tup followed up by entering his athletes in as many major meets as possible.

The upswing in interest is shown dramatically in the year books. In 1964, the best of four pre-Tuppeny years, Penn awarded 18 varsity letters in track. Last year, 34 athletes picked up a Red and Blue "P."

The increased interest enabled Penn to start back up the ladder. Tuppeny's first team finished its dual schedule 4-3 to end a string of losing seasons and the frosh club went 5-1.

The '68 frosh team was 6-1 and the '69 yearlings went unbeaten to set the stage for a super all-around campaign last year in dual meets. The cross-country team went 10-0, the outdoor track team rewrote the record books while going undefeated and the frosh team was perfect a second straight season.

Fabulous Temple of Sweat

The L. Stockwell Jadwin Gymnasium at Princeton University, answering the longtime need for a building which could accommodate at one time the entire University "family," housed its first athletic event on January 25, 1969, when Pennsylvania and Princeton met in varsity basketball. Its official dedication took place on March 1, 1969 on the occasion of the annual Harvard-Princeton-Yale indoor track meet.

Probably the most striking feature of the Jadwin Gymnasium is its flexibility. Designed as a multi-purpose structure, it emphasizes elements of mobility and adaptability which allow it to stage basketball games, track meets, squash matches, tennis matches, fencing meets, wrestling meets, practice sessions, in such normally outdoor sports as baseball, lacrosse and football, as well as concerts, dinners, convocations and lectures. Estimates are that the intercollegiate contests and practices, plus an intramural program which involves some three-fourths of the student body, produce a daily usage of Jadwin Gymnasium by about 1,000 persons.

Prior to the completion of the Jadwin Gymnasium, the University relied on such as Dillon Gymnasium (capacity 3,250), the University Chapel (capacity 2,000) and McCarter Theatre (capacity 1,080). Their inadequacy, when related to Princeton's undergraduate enrollment of 3,225,

graduate enrollment of 1,525, faculty of 880 and research staff of 660, is readily apparent. No indoor facility was available in previous years for spring sports practices nor did the winter track team have a "home" of its own.

Constructed at a cost of approximately \$6.5 million, the gymnasium was financed by a number of donations, the major one being the legacy of some \$3.5 million from the family of L. Stockwell Jadwin '28. Captain of Princeton University's track team in 1928 and an outstanding hurdler during his collegiate career, Jadwin lost his life in an automobile accident only a few months after his graduation. Following the 1964 death of his mother, Mrs. Stanley P. Jadwin, the bequest which formed the financial base of the new building was received by the University. Generous gifts from others endowed additional features included in the new gymnasium and construction got underway in the late summer of 1965.

Basically a two-story structure, Jadwin Gymnasium also contains two additional sub-levels. Its area of 250,000 square feet and volume of nearly 10 million cubic feet allow for versatility far greater than an ordinary basketball auditorium, or sports arena.

Its main floor consists chiefly of the boarded

The IC4A and BULOVA

There are many reasons why the Bulova Watch Company and the IC4A championships are intertwined, and they go beyond the fact that Harry B. Henshel, the president, is an Ivy Leaguer who attended Brown University.

Henshel is responsible for there being a Bulova Accutron Phototimer, that electronic system of judging finishes and timing races which has been so invaluable to track and field for the past 23 years.

His curiosity about the Photofinish camera used at the racetrack led to the development of the Phototimer, which is the same system, but with time added to it.

From that beginning has come a relationship with track and field which has been so close that there were some Yale men who believed that Art Olsen, the Bulova Phototimer crew chief until he retired a few years ago, was as deserving of an Eli track letter for the 1954 season as Mike Stanley, whose second place in the 1,000-yard run was the difference between Yale winning the team title and failing.

It was the picture from the Bulova Phototimer which made the difference after a preliminary decision had listed Penn's Paul Radenbausch as the man who was second.

There are so many examples of the value of the Bulova Accutron Phototimer pictures over the years that a listing of the races decided after studying the photos could fill many pages of this program.

That Bulova should be involved in this public service is an interesting phenomena. Other companies become involved in sports because their business depends on it. For others, it feeds the vanity of executives to become associated with famous athletes.

For Bulova, there is some business in supplying Sports Timers for the sports world, but this is a fractional part of the company's activities. Very few of the Bulova executives have become associated with the athletes they see, mostly in track and field.

As president, and as a veteran timing official of track meets, Harry Henshel is so busy doing his

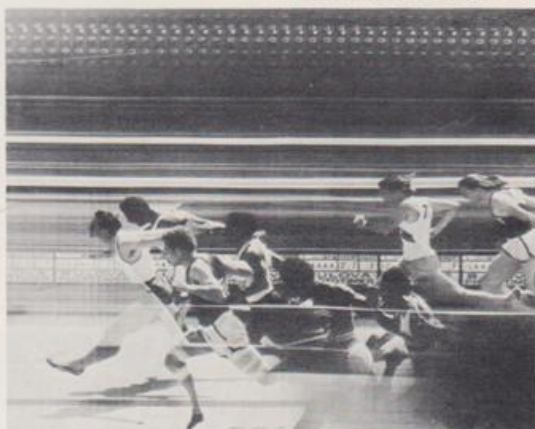
job at each meet that he rarely sees anything of the athlete except his torso when he reaches the finish line.

The interest of Bulova in servicing sports, with the Bulova Accutron Phototimer and the thousands of Bulova Sports Timers which are loaned to officials for use at hundreds of meets, stems from the sports interest of the men who helped build the company.

Col. Harry D. Henshel was a great sports enthusiast when he was on the sports scene. He was prominent in Amateur Athletic Union activities until almost the day he died. He was a founder of the Maccabiah Games which are held regularly in Israel as an Olympics for Jewish athletes from all parts of the world.

His son Harry has always been interested in sports, especially amateur sports like track and

Villanova Took Five Titles

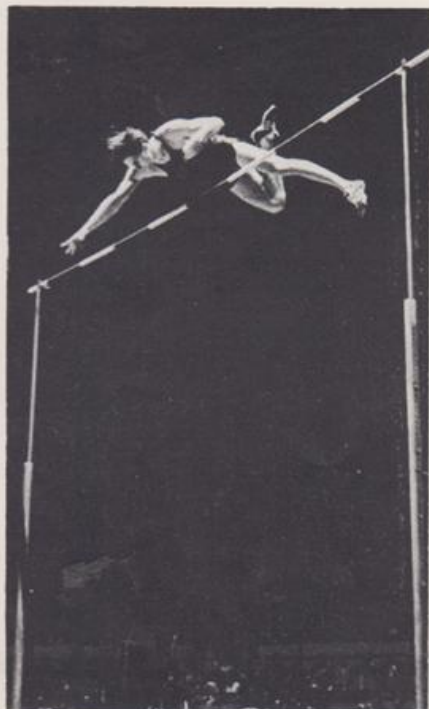

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General Information

N.C.A.A. RULES OF COMPETITION WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED BY REFEREE AND OTHER OFFICIALS.

Track measures eight laps to mile, and 220 yards to lap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty under rules for first false start, but competitor is disqualified by second false start.

In hurdle race competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In all relay races baton must be carried in runner's hand and must be passed to next succeeding teammate within clearly marked zone.

Governing rules provide that, in races around turns, any competitor willfully jostling, running across or obstructing another competitor so as to impede his progress, shall be disqualified. If in any race a competitor is disqualified for any of these reasons, the Referee shall have power to order the race to be re-run excluding the disqualified competitor or, in the case of a heat, to permit any competitors affected by the act resulting in disqualification, other than the disqualified competitor, to compete in a subsequent round of the race.

Any competitor may be disqualified if, in the opinion of the Referee, he has in any way been aided by a coach, teammate, or anyone connected directly or indirectly with the team concerned, such as running along-side of a teammate, being stationed at various points near the track, or located near by any of the field events for the purpose of aiding or coaching a competitor after the race or field event has officially been started.

Each member college is limited to following numbers of actual participants in various events in Indoor Championships:

Two-mile run—two (plus two more upon approval of Executive Committee)

Relay races—one team

All other events—four

No contestant may be entered in two-mile run in Indoor Championships if he can cover distance no faster than 9 minutes 29.6 seconds.

In the weight throw, shot put, and the long and triple jump each contestant shall be allowed three preliminary tries. The first six men in the standing at the completion of the trials will qualify for the final. Each finalist will then receive three additional tries. All marks made, in both the trials and the finals, will count in determining the results. Each competitor shall be credited with best of all his efforts.

A nominee or qualifier who fails to compete in any running or hurdling event for which he has been nominated or has qualified will be ineligible for any further participation in the meet.

Competitors must be on time, all contestants entering enclosure 15 minutes before scheduled start of their event. As soon as their event is over, competitors will kindly leave track and infield at once.

In each event 16 points are scored: 6 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth and 1 for fifth.

run on synthetic surfacing—Elastraturf—in its three years in the Garden on Penn Plaza. As for the 8-lap track, the I.C.A.A.A. started the indoor championships on a furlong oval when it built a portable banked track for the 1922 inaugural in the 102nd Engineers Armory on West 168th Street in New York.

The I.C.A.A.A. meet was staged on that track for 10 years, and no one faulted the track. It was the finest of its kind on the indoor circuit. The varsity set authored world-best performances on it, particularly in the mile relay, where Pennsylvania, anchored by Olympic-champion-to-be Bill Carr, posted a 3:17.8 in 1931, and in the 2-mile relay, where Georgetown, led off by the same Edward Swinburne who is now a finish judge, posted a 7:41.6 in 1925. That mark endured 31 years in the I.C.A.A.A. book.

I was not present at the creation of the Indoor Intercollegiates in 1922 but made them my beat four years later. On that 8-lap banked track, I saw Lloyd Hahn, in a special race, run the fastest 880 in the world, indoors or out, in 1928 when he clocked 1:51.4. The late James A. Taylor, executive secretary of the I.C.A.A.A., closed his eyes and

said he could tell it was a record race by listening to the beat of Hahn's spikes on the boards. Jim Taylor had been a Columbia half-miler. I believed him. In 1929 my form chart in the Herald Tribune predicted that N.Y.U. would win with 25 points (they scored 25 points) and Emil Von Elling's Violets, the first New York college to win the team title, started a trend that was followed by Manhattan, Columbia and Fordham.

When the I.C.A.A.A. made its first move it went to a bigger armory and built a bigger track, the 6-lap banked beauty in the cavernous field-artillery drillshed on Kingsbridge Road in The Bronx. There wasn't a track to compare with it, but Kingsbridge Road was remote from Grand Central and Times Square and the armory had other disadvantages. The I.C.A.A.A. made the inevitable shift in 1934 to the Garden, where it was a March fixture for 37 years.

So, in one respect, the I.C.A.A.A. is going back 50 years. It is staging its indoor meet, for the first time, on a flat track, which it couldn't abide in 1922 when it built a portable banked track. But an 8-lap flat track covered by Tartan obviously is something else again.

Now, if the spiked-shoe and stopwatch fraternity will adjust to a change in time and tool down the Jersey Turnpike in sufficient numbers, the Indoor Intercollegiates can be happy in their new home.

There has been no letup this year. The cross-country teams went unbeaten on both the varsity and freshman levels, giving Penn a 44-8 varsity cross-country log under Tuppeny.

More important, the frosh harriers won the Big 5 and Columbia Invitational and placed second to Manhattan (remember Fred Dwyer) in the IC4A meet.

Indoors this winter, the Red and Blue is undefeated to date with a 34-33 victory over Villanova in the Middle Atlantic AAU in January one of its achievements.

With the improvement in dual meet competition, of course, the quality began to show.

Last year it was a bashful sophomore named Tom Blair. Tom accounted for all six Penn points in the indoor IC4A meet by winning the pole vault and then repeated outdoors.

A broken ankle, suffered last summer while sky diving in South Jersey, has hampered Blair this indoor season but Tuppeny has a dozen potential IC4A point getters in the stable now.

It's significant that only one, hurdler Ed Wheeler, is a senior. Ed was second in the outdoor ICs last year but now is running second to freshman Bruce Collins, one of a handful of super frosh at Penn.

Juniors Julio Piazza, who ran a 2:10 thousand before breaking a leg last year; Karl Thornton, a 4:06 miler, and Eltio Rogers, a 9-minute two-miler, are the leading distance runners on the varsity.

Elton (Dennis) Fikes, the Eastern States champion from New York City, may be the best of the lot but he's a member of the frosh club.

Junior Ed Markowski has been out performing all-Ivy senior Frank Craven this season, giving Tuppeny a pair of 55-foot shot men, while junior Jeff Fried has cleared 6-8 and sophomore Fred Samara has leaped 24-6 in the jumping pits.

Both the mile and two-mile relay teams have lowered school standards this season. Sophomores Peter Toohey and Bob Childs combine with Piazza and Thornton in the two-mile while captain Bob Race, soph Bob Burns, Arnie Rapowitz and Roy Supulski handle the baton over the mile.

Pole vaulter Mark Mondschein, the coach's son, and high jumper Mike Sperger were Delaware Valley area champions last year and add quality to the frosh team.

Last month's IC4A ruling making freshmen eligible starting with this spring's outdoor championship certainly will propel the Penn cause.)

It's beginning to look as if Tuppeny's strategy is about to pay dividends. The dual meet foundation is sound, the team is holding its own in the Heptagonals.

Next step up the ladder is the IC4As.

Look out Villanova, an old friend is flexing his muscles.

field. Thus, it was natural that he serve annually on the AAU Timing Committee, of which he was chairman for some years.

Providing the services of the Bulova Accutron Phototimer and Bulova Sports Timers is an expensive one with no financial reward. Bulova owns two Phototimer units which have, by this time, cost upwards of \$200,000 to build and to improve.

Many inquiries have been made about buying it, but the equipment has never been built for public sale. Each unit is virtually hand made. It would require expensive research and experimentation to develop a unit cheap enough and, above all, simple enough, for anyone to handle.

At present, servicing a meet requires the presence of at least six technicians who are experts at electronics and photography, or both. It is a complicated operation consisting of five parts—the camera, the electronic starting unit, the time base, spinner and portable darkroom.

In addition, in an indoor arena like the new Madison Square Garden, and similarly in Jadwin Gym, a picture is ready within three minutes from the finish of a race, in spite of the vastly increased distances from camera to darkroom to officials on the floor. •

basketball area and the Tartan-covered track complex. The main basketball court, accommodating some 7,500 spectators, is a 94 x 50 playing surface. At either end is an additional 94 x 50 court flanking two 84 x 50 areas—five courts in all.

The track area features an 8-laps-to-the-mile track, complete with pole vault, long jump and high jump locations. There is a 310-foot straight-away. Its infield area can also be utilized for tennis, with four courts provided. Movable bleachers which service the basketball area may be used as well for track.

Permanent seating which includes 1,900 theater chairs and 1,700 bleacher benches is limited to the north wall. The remainder of the seating is temporary, thus contributing to the building's flexibility.

A fencing room is the central feature of the first sub-level, which also is the site of the spectator galleries for the 13 squash courts. The playing areas of the squash courts and a wrestling room make up the second sub-level.

Six tennis courts and a baseball infield convertible to lacrosse, football and soccer comprise the bottom floor—the second of Jadwin Gymnasium's two chief levels. In addition to serving as a practice area for outdoor sports during inclement weather, or the late winter in the case of spring sports, this area serves as the locale of the field events such as the shot put and 35-pound weight during indoor track meets.

Jadwin had its first multi-college exposure in March, 1969, when the 16-team Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association Championships were held over a two-day span. There was general agreement that all went well and that tournament was only the beginning.

Last winter, the new Princeton gym played host to the championships of the Intercollegiate Squash Association in early March. The three-day affair shared billing with a first-round NCAA basketball game between Ivy champion Pennsylvania and the Niagara Purple Eagles, led by the colorful Calvin Murphy. This attractive pairing brought out Jadwin's first cage sellout, a solid 7,500 fans revelling in the action.

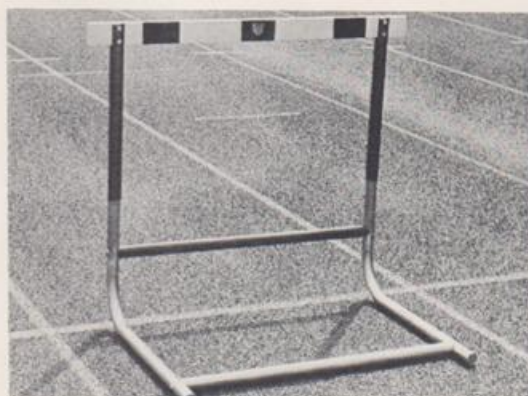
A plethora of interscholastic events dotted the late winter calendar as well, with the New Jersey AAU staging its track finals on the Jadwin Tartan and the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association booking two high school doubleheaders before enthusiastic crowds.

Beginning on December 11, when the Tiger track team hosted St. John's and Temple, the Princeton gymnasium was to be a veritable beehive of activity right through late March. Old Nassau's basketball team has ten home appearances, the wrestlers appear there six times in dual competition, the track team lists six regular meets plus the New Jersey College Championships. In addition, there are five varsity fencing meets and the squashmen entertain seven foes.

One week from today, a wrestling innovation makes use of Jadwin when the District II eliminations, from which will emerge entrants for the NCAA tournament, take over the main floor. Depending on the schedule, there is a possibility that another first-round NCAA basketball game could be fitted in that weekend as well.

Jadwin is considered, at least by the public at large, as a sports arena and from the foregoing, that would be hard to deny. Yet the building had its non-sporting moments last year as well, some of them rather chaotic. A speech on ecology by Interior Secretary Walter Hickel stirred campus sentiments and led to administrative action in the wake of some extra-curricular noisemaking. In May, following President Nixon's decision to eradicate VietCong sanctuaries in Cambodia, Jadwin was the scene of a massive emotion-charged assemblage, known as the Assembly of the University Community, from which evolved a number of unprecedented moves, such as the recent two-week pre-election Moratorium and the Strike of last spring which saw classrooms virtually empty for the final month of the academic year.

A number of Princetonians still find it hard to believe that the beautiful, functional edifice called Jadwin Gymnasium is a reality, so long was it needed and in the making. Yet none will deny its value to the overall Princeton picture. It will be a busy place for many years to come. •
