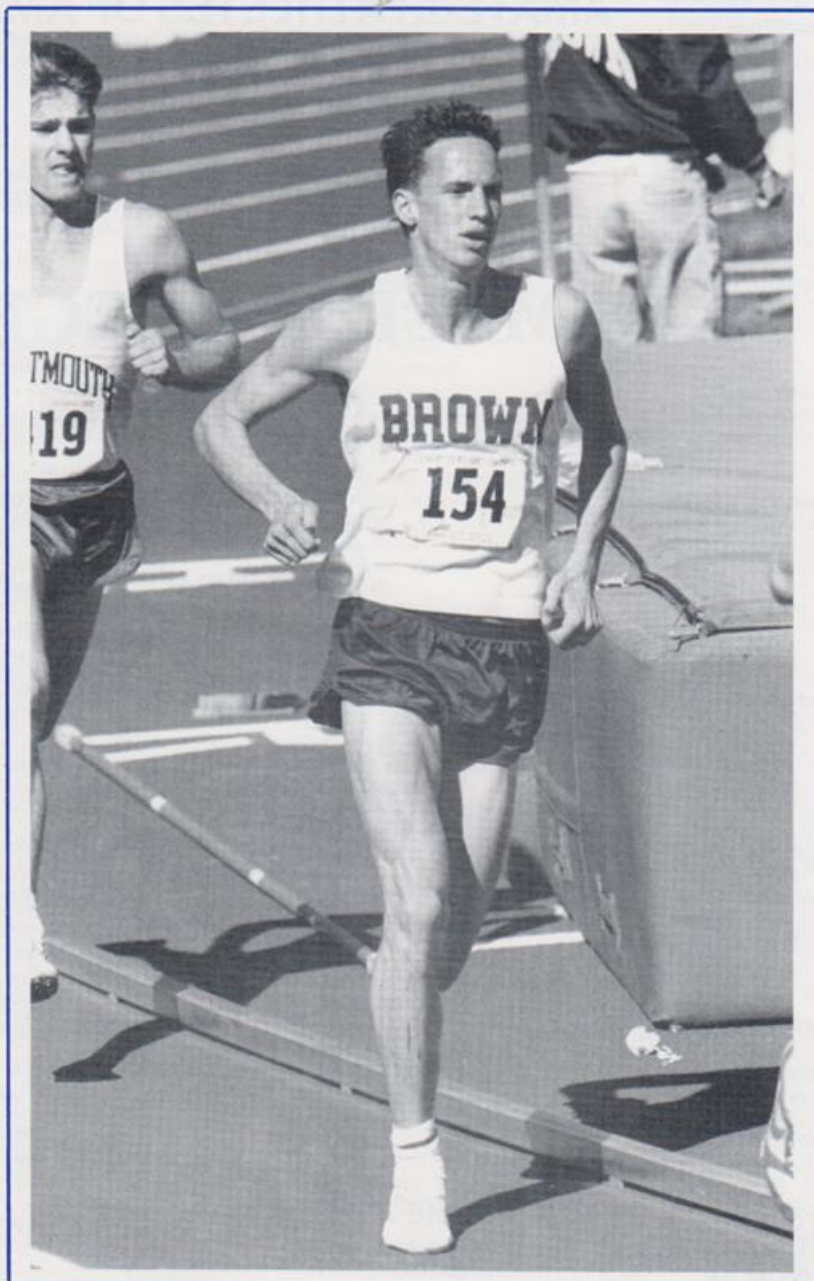

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Greg Whiteley Races to Success at Brown

When Greg Whiteley was nine years old, his father suggested he enter a half-mile race for kids at the park across the street.

He won the race.

Whiteley followed that performance by winning the Encino, California, city championship, and the Orange County championship soon after.

Thirteen years later, Whiteley became the first runner in Brown University history to win a national championship as he captured the 3,000 meter race at the NCAA Division I Championship at the Indianapolis Hoosier Dome in March.

Whiteley, a business major, will graduate from Brown this May having etched his name in the annals of Brown track and field history. He earned twelve varsity letters at Brown, one in each of the three seasons for all four of his years at the school. He holds the Brown indoor records at 1,500 and 3,000 meters, the indoor mile, and the outdoor 1,500 and 5,000 meters. His 5,000 outdoor time of 13:37.53, set on June 11, 1988, was the fastest 5,000 meters run by any collegian in the United States last year.

Bob Rothenberg, Brown's director of track, said of Whiteley, "In the modern era, there's been no one like Greg at Brown." Not since Norman S. Taber, who finished third in the 1,500 meters at the 1912 Olympics has Brown had such a runner.

"He is a great competitor," says Rothenberg of Whiteley. "He has a good sense of what the sport is all about and a good sense of racing tactics."

Whiteley has used this competitiveness to qualify for seven NCAA Championship events in his four years at Brown. More impressive, perhaps, is that he earned all-American honors in five of those trips. In 1987, he earned the award in the outdoor 5,000. In 1988, he finished third in the outdoor 5,000, fourth in the indoor mile, and earned all-American honors for cross-country. He was also named all-American for winning the indoor 3,000 in March.

Whiteley also has five Heptagonal Championships to his credit: the indoor 3,000; cross-country; indoor 1,500; outdoor 1,500; and outdoor 5,000.

In his freshman spring, Whiteley made the U.S. Junior National Team in Cross Country and competed in the World Championship in Switzerland. Whiteley plans to return to Europe after graduation to run on the European circuit there this summer. He will then study at the University of Copenhagen this fall.

In the Spring of 1988, Whiteley won the 5,000 meters at the Penn Relays. In the Fall of 1988 he became the first Brown runner since 1959 to win the ICAAAA cross-country championship. Just recently, Whiteley was named

the New England Track Athlete of the Year for 1988.

"When he runs, he runs to win," said Rothenberg of Whiteley. "When the gun goes off, he thrives to win."

This was perhaps no more apparent than in the 1988 U.S. Olympic Trials. Whiteley reached the final round, and while some other runners seemed content to simply finish in the middle of the pack, Whiteley went out with the leading pack. Though eventually falling back to twelfth, Whiteley stayed with the leaders until the two-mile mark. Rothenberg feels this performance will serve as a valuable experience for Whiteley, who should attempt to compete in 1992 at Barcelona.

Whiteley credits his success to his coach, Dan Challener. "He's the best coach I've ever seen," says the Brown senior. "He knows exactly what to do. I run my best races at the right part of the season, and that's due to his coaching. We're a team. I don't say 'I won a race' — I say 'we won a race'."

Whiteley and Challener have become close friends. They take in the sights of the cities they race in, and "have a lot of fun," according to Whiteley.

Whiteley also credits much of his success to his father.

"My dad goes to almost all of my races and he's one of the reasons that I'm still in racing. He's always been supportive of whatever I was doing."

Whiteley fondly tells the story of his dad flying all-night from California to see him race in the Heptagonal Championships. John Whiteley watched his son's races at 12 and 2:30, then took a 3:30 flight back to California.

Whiteley has been a winner since his youth. With the support of his father and his coach, Whiteley may not reach the finish line of his career for a long while.

Kodak Man of The Year Scotty Whitelaw

During his 29 years with the Eastern College Athletic Conference, including the past 17 as Commissioner, Robert M. (Scotty) Whitelaw has become synonymous with the ECAC, which has flourished under his leadership.

Whitelaw has announced his retirement effective June 30, 1989, when he will step aside as ECAC Commissioner. He first joined the ECAC in 1960 as Assistant Commissioner, a post he held until 1970, when he was named Associate Commissioner. After George L. Shiebler retired in 1972, Scotty became the Conference's third commissioner.

Since he took over the reins of the nation's largest athletic conference, Scotty has been instrumental in helping the ECAC grow and prosper. During his term as Commissioner, the ECAC membership has swelled to 256 colleges and universities and now offers over 90 men's and women's championships in 19 different sports in all three divisions.

Currently Whitelaw serves as a consultant to the Metropolitan Intercollegiate Basketball Association (MIBA), the sponsor of the National Invitation Tournament (NIT), after serving as its Executive Director from 1972-78. In addition, he is chairman of the Kickoff Classic Games Committee, is a former executive committee member of the National Association of College Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and has served on numerous NCAA committees. For the past 17 years, Scotty has served as secretary-treasurer of the IC4A, the oldest amateur track association in the country.

Before coming to the ECAC, Whitelaw served as varsity basketball and baseball coach and director of physical education at MIT. In his last five years at the Cambridge, Massachusetts college, he was also assistant athletic director while also working as a college football and basketball official.

After graduating from local schools in his hometown of North Quincy, Mass., Scotty enrolled at Springfield College after completing an 18-month tour of duty with the Naval reserve. While at Springfield, Scotty distinguished himself as an all-around athlete, earning letters in football, baseball and track. He was a defensive safety on the football team, a center-fielder in baseball and was New England's AAU 600 yard champion. He is a 1950 graduate of Springfield College and taught at both Springfield and Andover Academy.

Last spring, Whitelaw received the Shaeffer Pen Award for outstanding contributions to college ice hockey and has recently been honored for his college football contributions by being the recipient of the George Carens Award and having the Metropolitan Football Writers Division I-AA Coach of the Year Award named "The Scotty Whitelaw Trophy."

NOTE: The ECAC Office wishes to clarify certain statements that were contained in an article carried in our 1988 ICAAAA Outdoor Program. The article, "Yale and its 112 Years..." by two members of the Yale Sports Information Department, referred, in part, to the development of the first "non-sawdust" pole vault pit by members of the Yale athletic staff.

It has been brought to our attention that a long-time "volunteer" field event coach for the Elfs, Mr. J. "Moose" Miller was, in large part, the party responsible for the development and introduction of early versions of the rubber, portable, and subsequently inflatable pits during the late 50s and early 60s. 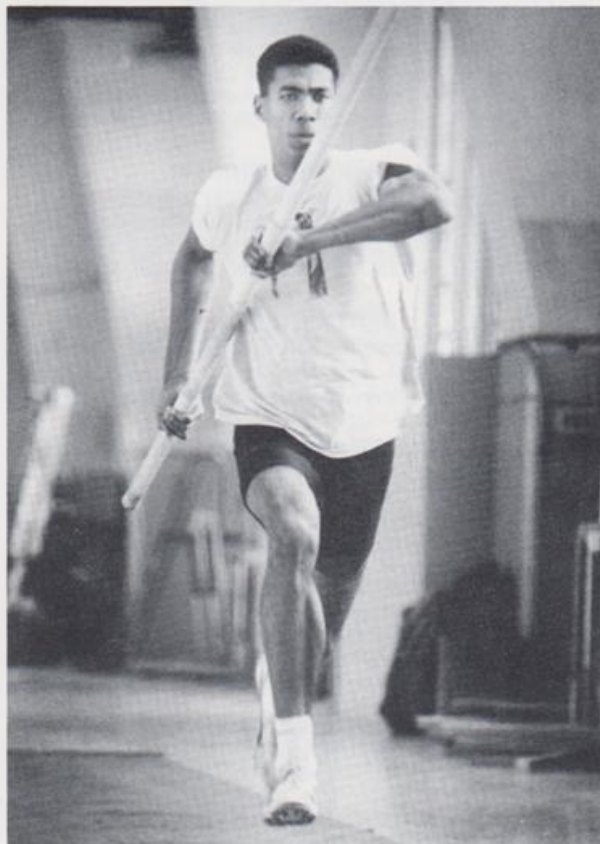
Profile of an IC4A Champion:

Unknown Finney Seeks Sixth IC4A Vault Title

Outside of the world of track and field, the talents of University of Maryland pole vaulter John Finney are virtually unknown. With the exception of his family and some friends, very few non-track people are aware that Finney has won five indoor and outdoor IC4A vault titles, five Atlantic Coast Conference championships, and is the reigning titlist at the prestigious Penn Relays. In addition, he qualified for the indoor and outdoor NCAA championship meets as a junior and made the cut for the indoor nationals in 1989.

Finney, a senior captain of the Terrapin men's track and field team, is "the best collegiate vaulter in the East," according to his coach, Bill Goodman. "John has achieved what many athletes dream of, winning major championships and qualifying as one of the nation's best vaulters. I don't know how many people know about John, but in the track and field world he gets his due."

So far, Finney's best meet was the IC4A outdoor championships at Yale in 1988, where he cleared a personal record of 17' 6-1/4" and won his fourth IC4A title. This season, the Mamaroneck, New York native has a best of 17' 4-1/4" and he needs to add 1-1/2 inches to that height in his remaining meets to qualify for the outdoor nationals.

"I'm a little disappointed with my performance this (outdoor) season, but I'm hoping to start peaking now," says Finney, who recently acquired a new pole that he believes will help. Despite his disappointment, Finney has set lofty goals for himself. "I obviously want to qualify for nationals, but I also want to go 18' this year. I've had several attempts where I've had the height, so I think I have a good chance at it."

Goodman is confident that Finney will qualify for nationals and also will place better than his previous NCAA best, a 13th-place showing at the indoor nationals in 1988. "John is a very competitive guy and he has all the qualities of a good pole vaulter. If he makes the outdoor nationals again, he should do well, because he's been there before and knows what to expect now."

Finney has been more than just a point-scorer for the Terps, says Goodman. "John has outstanding leadership qualities on and off the track. He's a good student and takes a thorough approach to everything, from practice to his studies." Finney, an advertising design major at Maryland, is planning to pursue a career as a graphic artist or illustrator.

Finney began pole vaulting in the seventh grade, and says he got serious about it in ninth grade, serious enough to rank sixth in the all-time high school record books in New York State. Aside from an occasional hurdles race in high school, Finney always has concentrated on the vault. "I did the decathlon once," he recalls painfully. "As soon as it was over I told my coach I'd never do it again, and I haven't."

But for all the years of practice and his many achievements, even the East's best pole vaulter is not immune to superstition. "Whenever my parents come to a meet, I seem to set a personal record, and they were there all three times I qualified for nationals," points out Finney. "They'll be at the IC4A meet, so I'm hoping they'll be a good influence again."

Timpson's Athletic Prowess Was Simply Super

The comic book hero Superman can leap tall buildings with a single bound. He's faster than a speeding bullet and more powerful than a locomotive.

Michael Timpson's amazing talents do not permit him to match those astounding feats, but they have allowed him to capture three IC4A titles, set six Penn State track records, qualify for the semifinals of the 200 meters at the United States Olympic Trials and earn a starting spot at flanker on the Nittany Lion football team.

Renowned for his versatility, Timpson ran on relay teams and competed in the long jump, hurdles and sprints for head coach Harry Groves during the spring. In the fall, the Miami, Florida native strapped on the pads and turned his attention to catching footballs under the watchful eye of Joe Paterno. Asked to reflect on his Penn State amateur athletic career, Timpson admitted that he might have attained greater personal success if he had concentrated his efforts solely on one sport.

At the Olympic Trials at Indianapolis, Indiana last summer, Timpson posted a time of 20.91 in winning his first heat at 200 meters. He ran a 20.71 and placed third in the quarterfinals. His aspirations of representing the United States at the Games of the XXIV Olympiad in Seoul, South Korea were dashed in the next race, however.

"I ran a disappointing heat in the semifinals," Timpson related. "It was one of those situations where I felt pretty good warming up. When I got out on the track, I was in the last lane. I may as well have run in the stands. But that's no excuse. I got beat. Plain and simple, I got beat. I was outclassed."

Outclassed by the likes of Joe DeLoach and Carl Lewis, the eventual gold and silver medalists, respectively.

Timpson, a fourth-round draft choice of the New England Patriots in the 1989 NFL draft, concedes that his development as a sprinter was hampered by his desire to compete in more than one event.

"In retrospect, that bouncing around was a disadvantage," noted Timpson, one of only two collegians in the 200 field. "Everyone else at the trials had been honing in on the 200 for the past couple of years. But I've had fun. If I had it to do all over again, I'd probably focus on one event, that's for sure. I think that would make things a lot easier."

Even though his commitment to track was only ever part-time, Timpson possessed enough natural ability to claim IC4A titles in the 400 (indoor) in 1987, 200 (outdoor) in 1988 and 200 (indoor) in 1989.

"Michael's level of enthusiasm always rose as the IC4A Championships approached," Groves said. "He liked major competition. As a coach, that's what you hope for in

your top athletes. If a kid is excited about a meet, he will do well in it. And Michael always did well at IC4As."

An All-American in the 200, Timpson said he always made a conscious effort not to let the storied tradition of the IC4A Championships interfere with his ability to focus on the task at hand.

"Although tradition helps to motivate you, it can't make you run any faster," he observed. "As long as I did my best, I was happy, win or lose."

Timpson and his teammates have experienced a significant degree of success at the IC4As. Penn State, the 1984 and '87 indoor team champion, has captured the last three outdoor titles.

"The IC4A Championships is the last great track meet on the face of the earth," Groves stated. "It's an exciting event for spectators, participants and coaches alike. No other collegiate championship can match it. The last couple of events always decide the winner. It's a meet of changing rhythms. What you think will happen doesn't. The unexpected always does. It's puzzling."
