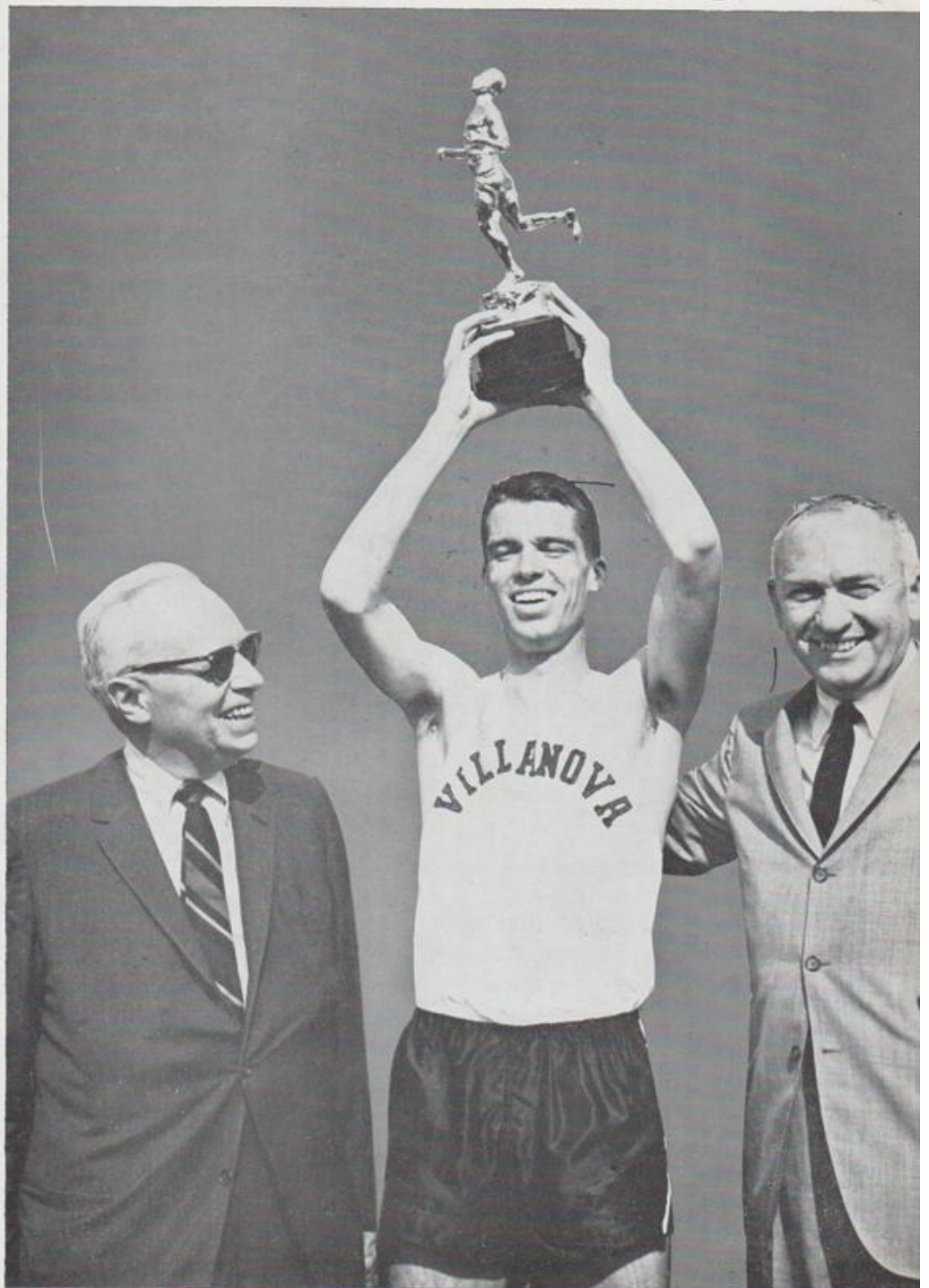

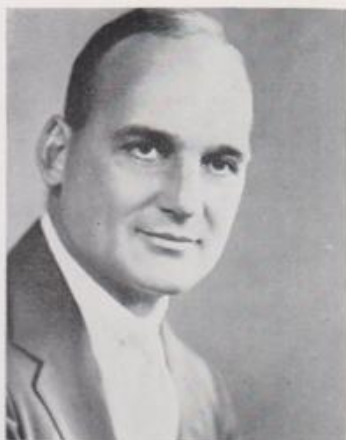

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General Information

N.C.A.A. RULES OF COMPETITION
WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED BY
REFEREE AND OTHER OFFICIALS.

Track measures four laps to mile.

All events are scratch, i.e., none is handicap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty for first false start, but competitor is disqualified for second false start. However, a starter's recall no longer nullifies a false start by any competitor.

In hurdle races competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In all relay races baton must be carried in runner's hand and must be passed to next succeeding teammate within clearly marked 20-yard zone, extending 10 yards in both directions from leg finish line.

Governing rules provide that, in races around turns, any competitor willfully jostling, running across or obstructing another competitor so as to impede his progress, shall be disqualified. If in any race a competitor is disqualified for any of these reasons, the Referee shall have power to order the race to be re-run excluding the disqualified competitor or, in the case of a heat, to permit any competitors affected by the act resulting in disqualification, other than the disqualified competitor, to compete in a subsequent round of the race.

Any competitor may be disqualified if, in the opinion of the Referee, he has in any way been aided by a coach, teammate, or anyone connected directly or indirectly with the team concerned, such as, running along-side of a teammate, being stationed at various points near the track, or located nearby any of the field events for the purpose of aiding or coaching a competitor after the race or field event has officially been started.

Each member college is limited to the following numbers of actual participants in various events in Outdoor Championships.

One Mile Run.....	2*
Three Mile Run.....	2*
One Mile Relay..	One Team
All other events.....	5

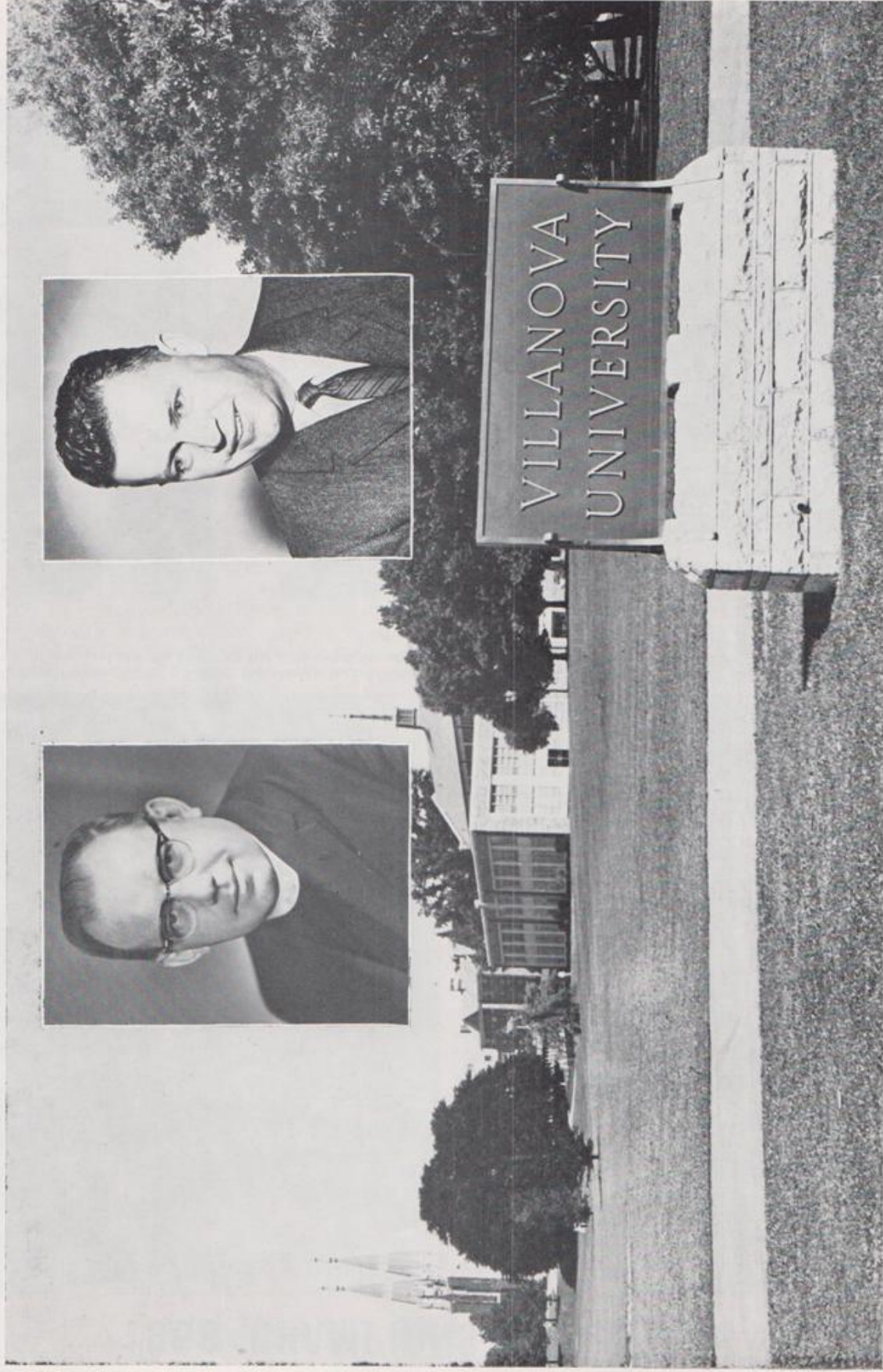
A nominee or qualifier who fails to compete in any running or hurdling event for which he has been nominated or has qualified will be ineligible for any further participation in the meet.

Competitors must be on time, field contestants entering enclosure five minutes before scheduled start of their event, and track contestants entering enclosure upon completion of race next preceding theirs. As soon as their event is over, competitors will kindly leave track and infield at once.

In each event 15 points are scored: 5 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth, 1 for fifth.

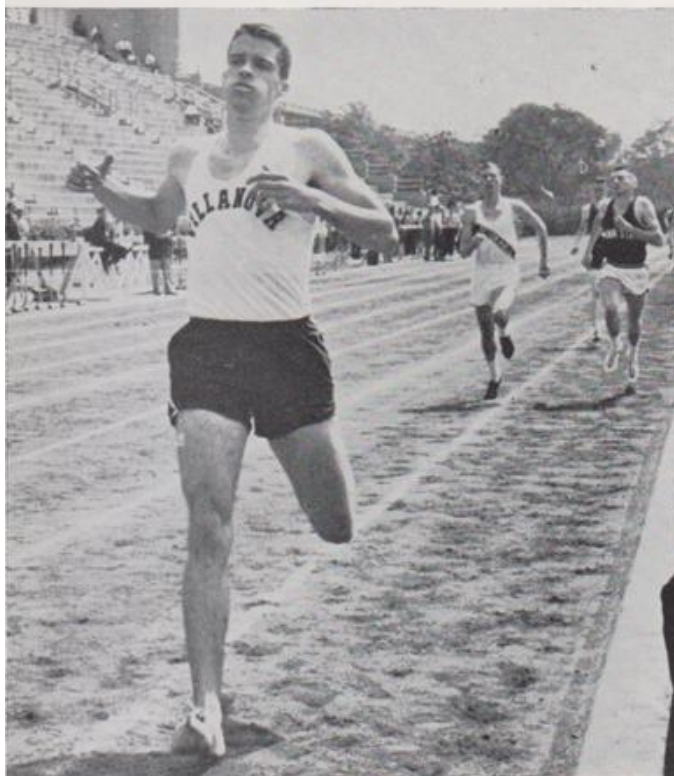

1963 CHAMPIONS AND STARS

ICAAAA and THE OLYMPICS

THE Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America, organized in 1875 and holding its first championship track meet at Saratoga, N. Y., in 1876, had come of age when the Olympic Games were inaugurated in 1896 at Athens.

As the oldest college track group in the U.S., the ICAAAA itself, its members, its athletes, its alumni and administrators have played a significant role in the quadrennial international festival from its birth to the present day.

Prof. William Milligan Sloane, the historian and a professor at Princeton, and ICAAAA charter member, was the closest U.S. friend and colleague of Baron Pierre de Coubertin in selling the French nobleman's Olympic idea in this country.

It was no happenstance, therefore, that a Princeton undergraduate, Robert Garrett, Jr., was a member of the original American group that participated in the first Olympics along with James B. Connolly, of Harvard and the Boston A.A. contingent. Garrett was a double winner in the shotput and discus; Connolly, later an author of sea stories, won the first gold medal in 1896—in the triple jump.

Of the Boston A.A. entry, T. E. Burke won the 100 and 400 meters became a Harvard winner of the ICAAAA 440; W. W. Hoyt topped the pole vault and later won the ICAAAA title for Yale, while Ellery H. Clark of Harvard took the high and broad jumps.

The American team, or rather, the separate American colleges which participated in the second Olympics at Paris comprised a roster of ICAAAA champions. The gold medalists formed an all-star ICAAAA delegation: Alva C. Kraenzlein, of Penn (60 meters, high and low hurdles and broad jump), F. W. Jarvis of Princeton (100), J. W. B. Tewksbury of Penn (200 meters and 400 meter hurdles); Maxey Long of Columbia (400 meters); George W. Orton of Penn (2500 meter steeplechase); Myer Prinstein of Syracuse (triple jump), and Robert Sheldon of Yale (shot put).

Considering the missionary work of ICAAAA college coaches in spreading the gospel and techniques of track, it was too much to expect that the ICAAAA athletes would continue to dominate the Olympics as they did in 1896 and 1900.

But ICAAAA athletes as students and alumni, right up to the 1960 Games at Rome, continued their affinity with the Olympics, though gold medals do not fall to their prowess in the same quantity as in the early years.

Who among the athletes competing in these 88th ICAAAA championships will maintain the tradition?

It's easier to name the ICAAAA men who are foreigners, for they obviously do not have the competition for places on their teams which their American brethren face in the final tryouts at Downing Stadium on Randalls Island in July.

Wendell Mottley, Yale captain, defending his 440 yard title here, seems a cinch for the Trinidad team on his tremendous year of accomplishment including his 46.1 Heptagonal record on top of his world indoor 440 and 600 yd. records.

Aggrey Awori, of Harvard, represented Uganda in sprints and hurdles at Rome and likely will represent his country at Tokyo. Sam Amukun, of Colgate, also represented Uganda in the Rome sprints. He has been plagued by muscle pulls since his freshman days.

For Nigeria, Chris Ohiri, Harvard's defender in the triple jump, is an almost certain repeater as an Olympian, in soccer as well as track.

For Ireland, Noel Carroll, Villanova's defender in the 880, is a certain choice on his 1:47.5 European record 880 last year and his consistent running this year.

For the U.S., potential Olympians are Gary Gubner, of NYU, provided, of course, the 275-pound Violet senior regains his 64-11 $\frac{3}{4}$ form of his sophomore year. Vic Zwolak, of Villanova, in the 5,000 meters or steeplechase; John Uelses, of La Salle, in the pole vault; Vin McArdle, of Manhattan, in the 400 meter hurdles.

Though Gubner's main goal is reaching top form in the Olympic tryouts, he has the task this weekend of defending shotput and discus titles here. If he could win both—and as a great competitor he can't be counted out despite his elbow troubles this spring—he would be the first since the late Al Blozis of Georgetown (1940-41-42) to win both titles three straight years. He will have a job to win the shotput title; his chances in the discus are not good in the face of the 177-foot throwing of Harvard's John Bakkensen.

The fiberglass vaulters are too closely bunched to pick a sure-thing now. Uelses, making his ICAAAA outdoor debut here, is as consistent as any of the topnotchers, and may be the best bet in the ICAAAA set to make the Olympic team.

Among alumni, the ICAAAA list of Olympic candidates includes Hal Connolly, of Boston College, and Cornell's Al Hall in the hammer throw, Pat Traynor, Villanova, in the steeplechase; Paul Drayton, Villanova, in the 200 meters; Gerald Ashworth, Dartmouth, in the 100; Ira Davis, La Salle, in the triple jump; John Thomas, Boston U., high jump; Ron Zinn, Army, in the walks.

Stellar Performances Highlight 1963 Sprints & Hurdles

120 yard hurdle luminaries vie at last hurdle with Maryland's Chris Stauffer, eventual winner, shown on pole. This was one of meet's closest finishes as the Terrapins' ace in a late charge edged John Bethea of Morgan State and Yale's Bill Flippin by inches in a near triple dead heat. Larry Livers, Villanova, placed fourth and Charles Hammack, Wildcat teammate (behind Stauffer in photo), was fifth.

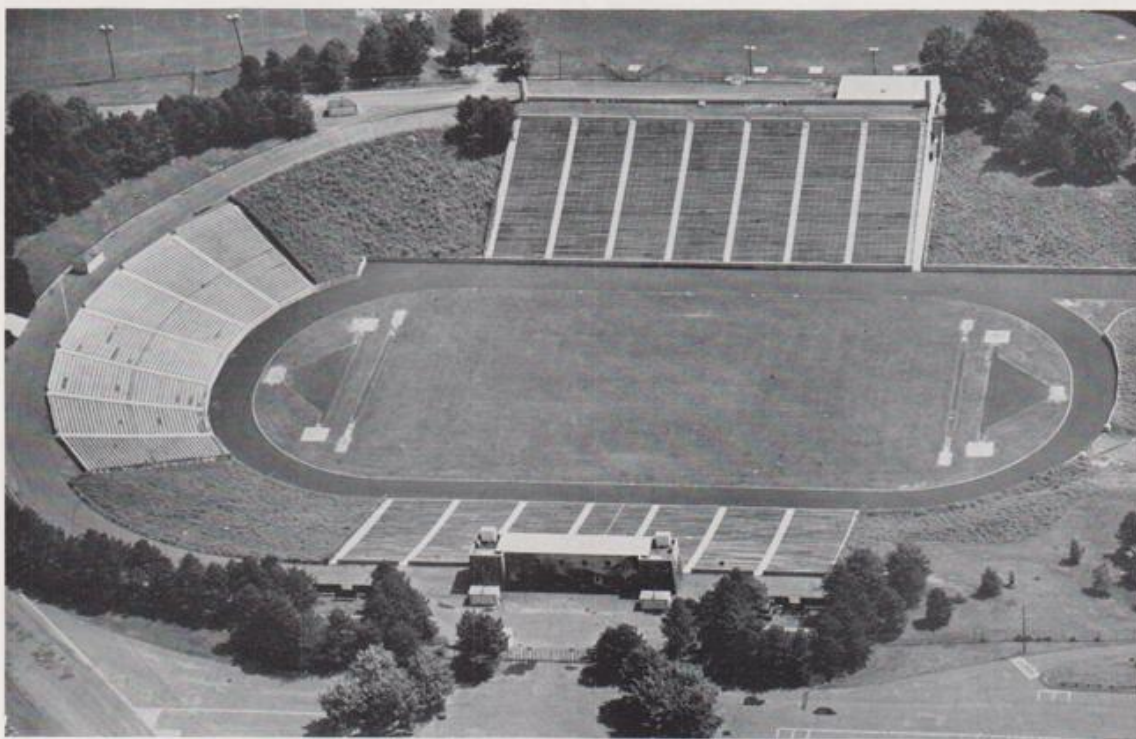
WELCOME TO NEW JERSEY

THE GARDEN STATE, long proud of the prowess of its youth in the sport of track and field, also is very proud of the Intercollegiate Amateur Athletic Association of America selecting Rutgers University, on the

Rutgers is an appropriate host as one of the ICAAAA's oldest members. The New Brunswick school, Princeton's opponent in the first game of intercollegiate football ever played, joined the ICAAAA back in 1878. Only City College of New York, Columbia, Cornell, Harvard, Princeton, Yale and Pennsylvania pre-date Rutgers as members.

New Jersey now has four of the current membership of sixty-eight. Seton Hall University of South Orange and Fairleigh Dickinson Univer-

sity of Teaneck have joined Rutgers and Princeton as members of this country's first and oldest intercollegiate athletic body. All four are considered on the upgrade in track and field this year and have hopes of giving the home

state worthy representation against the visiting squads. But first let us wipe out any possible false beliefs that a trip to Rutgers to those of you here today from this locale is a long and tiresome one. 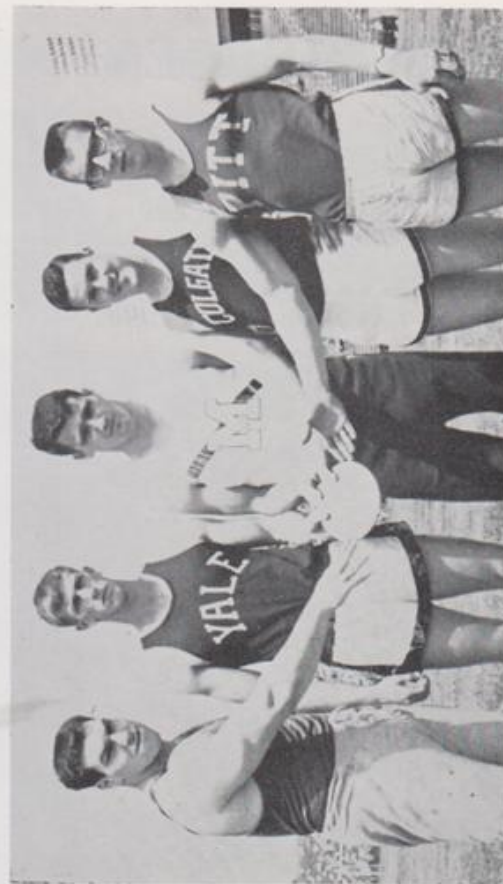

THE ICAAAA MONOPOLY

VILLANOVA COACH Jim "Jumbo" Elliott has long established the ICAAAA track championship as the chief goal of his team. Within the last decade his boys have begun to take the hint.

The Wildcats made a rumble in 1956 and started a monopoly in '57. Since then Manhattan, Penn State, Harvard and Yale threatened to shatter Villanova's hold on the outdoor title. Only a powerful Penn State team could do it . . . in 1959.

With the 88th annual meet at Villanova this weekend, Elliott's Mainliners are shooting for their seventh title in the last eight years. They are odds on favorites to win it because 1) performers who won 30 of last year's 49 points are back; 2) the Cats seldom do poorly at home. They've packed away three IC4-A titles at Villanova Stadium and lost none.

Their surge to power began in 1956, but a couple of Pennsylvania boys prevented them from winning their first championship. One was Johnny Haines, the brilliant Penn sprinter, who upset Charley Jenkins by three yards in a 47.3 440, then won the 220 in a wind-aided 20.5. The other was Pitt's Arnie Sowell. He licked a young Ronnie Delany in a 1:51.1 880 and Manhattan edged the Cats by 2½ points for the trophy.

Here is a resumé of the years that followed:

1957

Presenting what was to prove to be their best team ever, the Wildcats ran off with seven gold medals, highest since Penn won nine in 1895 . . . beat Manhattan, 48-41 . . . Delany set meet record of 4:08.4 in mile, 90 minutes later won 880 in 1:49.5 . . . Ed Collymore, subbing for George Sydnor who pulled muscle in heats, won 100 in 9.7, 220 in 21.0 . . . Alex Breckenridge volunteered to double in mile and two-mile despite less than hour rest between events. He scored five points . . . Don Bragg won pole vault at 14-4 . . . Jenkins won 47.4 440 . . . Phil Reavis took 6-8 high jump.

1958

Coach Elliott was successful in bringing the first title meet to Villanova . . . All other meets had been held at either Randalls Island, Harvard or Franklin Field . . . Capacity 16,000 turned out to watch Delany in swan song . . . Olympic champion obliged, cracked own mile record with 4:07.8, won 880 in 1:50 . . . Penn State's Ed Moran chased famed Irishman across line both times and Nittanies followed Cats in race for title, too, 33⅓ to 27⅓ . . . Reavis upped his high jump record to 6-10 . . . John Buckley won broad jump . . . LaSalle's Ira Davis upset Collymore in 9.6 100.

1959

Penn State, with 46½ points, ran away with meet before 4,500 at Randalls Island . . . Villanova was fourth . . . Moran, without a Delany to bedevil him, won mile in 4:09.3 and 880 in 1:50 . . . Tufts quarter-miler Basil Ince cracked oldest record in IC4-A book, running 440 in 46.9.

1960

The Wildcats snapped back fast and threw a 99 and 44/100 percent all-sophomore team into the battle and emerged a controversial 38 to 37½ victor over Penn State before 6,500 at Villanova . . . Scorer had given Penn State two points in 120 highs instead of Penn's Dick Cuthbert and it appeared Nittanies had won the meet before error was detected . . . Meet hinged on outcome of final event, mile relay . . . Cats won it . . . Bobby Raemore anchored 10 yard victory in 3:12 . . . Debut of Cats' Frank Budd saw him finish second to State's Bobby Brown in 100, third in 220.

1961

Rain washed out first day at Randalls Island first time in meet's history . . . all events shrunk into Saturday . . . Cats had little trouble in the heavy going . . . beat Harvard 46-29½ . . . Soph Pat Traynor won steeplechase . . . Budd pulverized Brown in a 9.6 100 and 21.4 220 . . . Soph Billy Joe took the shot . . . Jon Dante won the 880 practically by forfeit as Yale's Jim Stack and Tommy Carroll failed to qualify, Fordham's Frank Tomeo was spiked, and Manhattan's Bill Brennan was disqualified for spiking him.

1962

Villanova ran up record 49½ points to 25½ for runnerup Yale . . . 6,500 saw rout at Villanova Stadium . . . Budd (9.6 and 20.6) shared spotlight with teammates Leon Pras, who plunged into the cinders to win 120 highs; Traynor, who broke steeplechase record 80 minutes after running 4:06.9 second place mile; Vic Zwolak, who ran fourth in steeplechase on hair-line fracture of foot . . . Probably finest IC4-A meet ever held . . . Records also fell to Morgan State's Hubie Brown (46.7 440), Villanova's Rolando Cruz and Maryland's John Belitza (15-6 pole vault); NYU's Gary Gubner (62-1¾ shot put); Yale's Jay Luck (51.7 440 hurdles); Morgan's mile relay (3:10.6).

1963

Wildcats got off slowly but won sixth title . . . Zwolak and Cruz accounted for two of the four meet records in 49-35 victory over Yale . . . Zwolak ran three-mile in 14:05.9 . . . Cruz pole vaulted 15-7¾ . . . Soph Noel Carroll won 880 . . . Traynor won mile in 4:07.4 and steeplechase in 9:19.7 for toughest double since Brown's Bobby Lowe brought off three-mile and steeplechase four years ago.

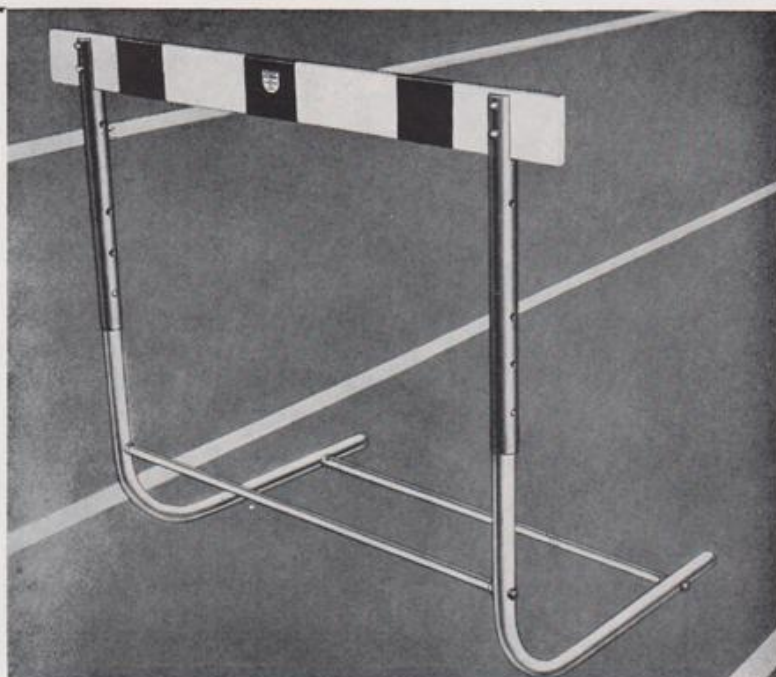

There are ICAAAA men who have already made the 1960 Olympic squad—administratively. Among them are Asa Bushnell, Princeton, secretary of the U.S. Olympic Committee; H. Jamison Swarts, Pennsylvania, assistant treasurer; Robert J. Kane, Cornell, chief of administration of the Olympic team at Tokyo, and his aid, Pinky Sober, CCNY; George T. Eastment, of Manhattan, U.S. Olympic track chairman; Bob Giegengack, of Yale, coach of the U.S. Olympic track team, aided by Ed Hurt, of Morgan State.

Also Drs. Harry R. McPhee, Princeton and Daniel F. Hanley, Bowdoin, who will bind up wounds, and trainers William Dayton, Yale, and Charles (Chuck) Medlar, Penn State. Add, too, Payton Jordan, Stanford, no longer an ICAAAA member, but Payton was a third-place scorer for USC in 1939, the last time the Trojans competed in—and mopped up the opposition—in these games.

The ties that have bound the ICAAAA to the Olympic Games show no sign of weakening.

Top facilities for true competition that the ICAAAA level is worthy of will be available at Rutgers Stadium. The top attraction will be an "en tout cas" imported quarter-mile track that is in its final stage of installation at this time. It will be groomed to perfection for the combined U. S. Olympic team trials semi-finals and National AAU championships to be held there June 27 and 28. And it will be in better shape as it nears its first birthday by the time the 1965 championships roll around.

New Jersey is best remembered by the more mature Eastern track fans for the famed Princeton Invitation Meets of the 1930s, which were conceived and directed by Commissioner Asa Bushnell, the same man who is serving as the meet director of the great competition you are witnessing here at Villanova.

And New Jersey interest will be high for the ICAAAA because there is at least one New Jersey boy competing on practically every college team here for this meet. For example, in the 1964 edition of the Penn Relays there was at least one Garden State resident on the winning team in each of the eight championship college relay events. Twelve of the thirty-two legs on the title foursomes were run by New Jerseyans.

Again we repeat—Welcome to New Jersey for the 1965 Outdoor Track and Field Championships at Rutgers Stadium in New Brunswick on the last weekend in May.

About Villanova

Villanova University is a Roman Catholic institution founded by the Fathers of the Order of St. Augustine in 1842. Its growth in the past 18 years alone has more than doubled in both the number of buildings and the enrollment of the period prior to the Second World War.

In October of 1841, the Augustinian residents at St. Augustine's Church in Philadelphia purchased the land which is the present site of the University. The property, located in Radnor Township, was known as "Belle Air," the country estate of the Revolutionary officer and merchant, John Rudolph. Legal title to the property, comprising approximately two hundred acres with the mansion house and out-buildings, was conveyed in January 1842.

Villanova derives its name from an old Catholic custom. The University was placed under the patronage of a saintly hero of the past, St. Thomas of Villanova, a distinguished Augustinian writer, educator, and Bishop of sixteenth century Spain. Villanova refers to that part of Spain where St. Thomas received his early education as a seminarian. The community of Villanova, Pa., has taken its name from the University.

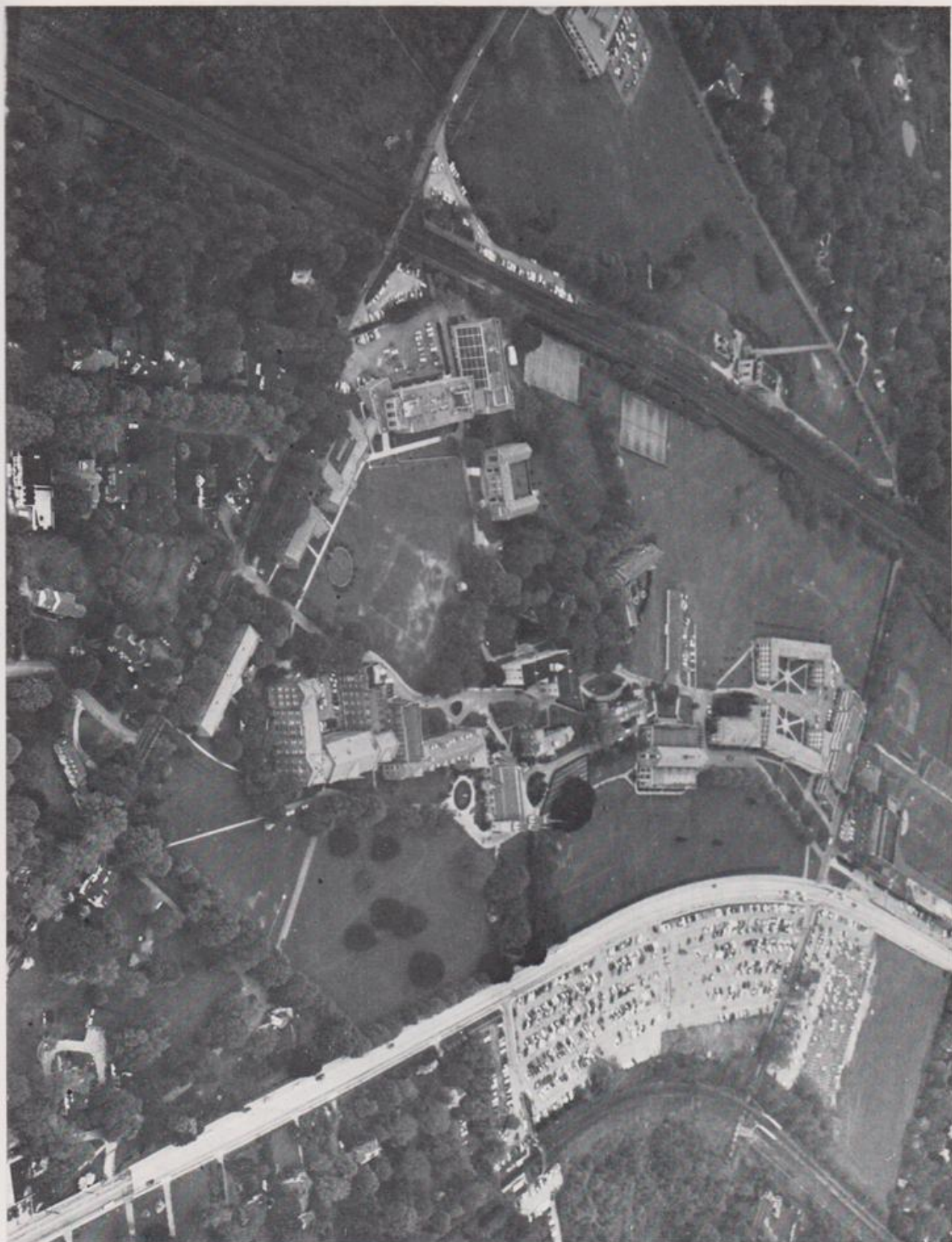
Villanova attained University status in 1953 after being known as Villanova College for more than 100 years. Governor John Fine of Pennsylvania signed a bill which permitted a petition to the courts of the Commonwealth to change the name to Villanova University.

During the past 16 years, eleven new buildings, including chemical engineering, law school, naval science, library, commerce and finance school, student union and two dormitories have been erected. The most recent addition to the university is Mendel Hall, the magnificent science building, dedicated in 1962. In this same space of time the enrollment has rocketed from a modest 800 to 4,500 undergraduate students. Including evening and summer sessions, the total student enrollment numbers 10,600.

Villanova grants a total of seventeen different degrees in its liberal arts and science school; four in engineering; five in commerce and finance, and one in nursing. Graduate courses are also offered in religion, arts and science, education, engineering, law, library science, statistical quality control, theatre, and philosophy-political science. The two latest degrees offered are in medical technology and astronomy.

For many years, Villanova was strictly a school for men. In 1953 it expanded its nursing division and opened its doors to undergraduate women in this course only. Undergraduate women number 215 with the first class receiving its degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing in 1957.
