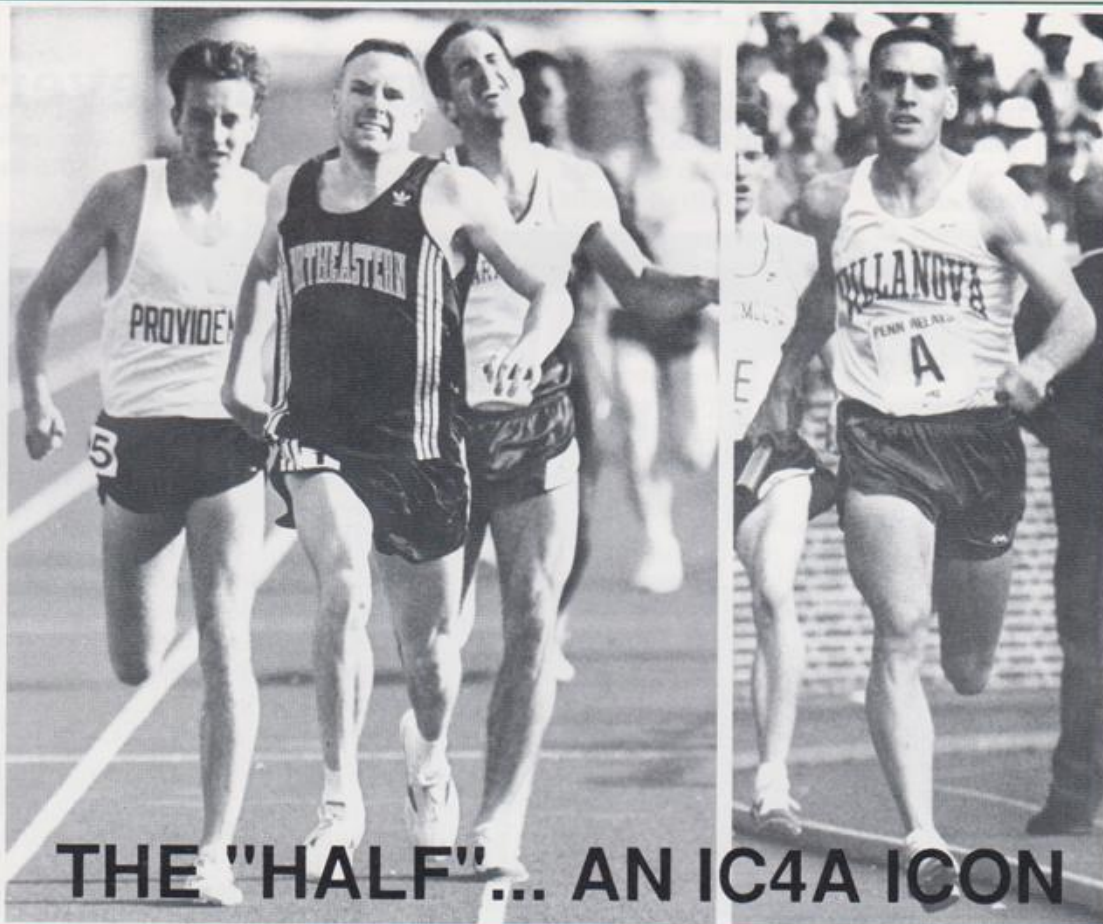

The ECAC

The Nation's Largest
Athletic Conference

Over 50 Years of Tradition,
Pride, Diversity & Service

Founded in 1938, the Eastern College Athletic Conference is the nation's largest collegiate conference with 268 member colleges and universities ranging from Maine to North Carolina in divisions I, II and III. ECAC member institutions sponsor over 2,500 varsity teams involving 125,000 male and female student athletes.

The ECAC manages over 90 championships in 19 men's and women's sports for its membership and is responsible for over 20,000 officiating assignments, a public relations/news bureau and a legislative services department.

The ECAC headquarters, the Asa S. Bushnell Center, is located in Centerville, Mass., on Cape Cod. The business of the this non-profit organization is conducted at its annual ECAC Fall and Spring Conventions. Over 300 athletic administrators annually attend the fall convention, which includes tournament and membership committee meetings, professional seminars, a schedule-making session and an awards luncheon.

A Conference of conferences, the ECAC includes within its organizational structure dozens of leagues and other associations, colleges and universities from the Atlantic 10, Big East, Colonial Athletic Association, Ivy League, MAAC, North Atlantic, Northeast and Patriot League, along with schools from the Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania State conferences, all holding dual membership in the ECAC.

The ECAC was founded 52 years ago as the Central Office for Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics with a charter membership of 53 colleges. Under the leadership of Commissioner Asa Bushnell, the conference addressed the concerns of its members in much the same fashion as today.

One of the most significant events in ECAC history occurred in 1983 with the consolidation of the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (EAIW) into the

ECAC structure. With the addition of women's sports, the ECAC doubled the number of its championships.

Some of the more recognizable ECAC championships include the ECAC Holiday Festival at Madison Square Garden in New York City, IC4A Track, Rowing Championships of the EARC and IRA and the ECAC Men's Golf Tournament. Also included is the ECAC Division I Baseball, Women's Cross-Country and Men's Ice Hockey Championships, each of whose champions receive automatic NCAA tournament bids.

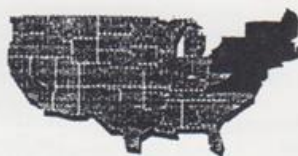
The ECAC also offers men's and women's championships for its members in Divisions I, II and III in baseball, basketball, golf, gymnastics, ice hockey, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field and women's volleyball.

The ECAC assigns over 4,000 officials in baseball, men's and women's basketball, fencing, football, gymnastics, ice hockey, men's and women's and wrestling, as well as the affiliate championships in crew, cross-country, swimming and track.

The Conference office maintains a legislative services department for its membership, responding to questions on eligibility, interpretations of NCAA and ECAC regulations and letter of intent. The office also sponsors legislative workshops and seminars.

Through its public relations and service bureau department, the ECAC assists in the promotion of its members' athletic programs and student-athletes through weekly and seasonal player and team awards, selection of all-star teams, compilation of statistics and championship publicity. The Conference also publishes a Directory and Record Book and media guides in football and ice hockey.

A UNIVERSITY COLLEGE AT 300

The College of William and Mary, the nation's second-oldest institution of higher learning, will mark its 300th anniversary with a year-long series of celebratory events in 1993. Several major conferences and an array of special programs in the arts, sciences and humanities are included in the plans for the celebration. Events celebrating William and Mary's anniversary will be held throughout 1993.

The college was chartered Feb. 8, 1693, by King William III and Queen Mary II to bring education to a growing number of British colonists and Christianity to the Native Americans. Today, William and Mary is a public, four-year, co-educational residential university, with a nationally-recognized liberal arts program. Although it has retained the college name in its title, William and Mary is now a moderate-sized university.

Many of America's early leaders were educated at William and Mary, including U.S. presidents Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and John Tyler, and renowned U.S. chief justice John Marshall. George Washington served as the College's first American chancellor from 1788 until his death in 1799. The College was the first to offer elective courses and to use the honor code system of conduct. The first chair of law in America was established at William and Mary in 1779.

The College's historic campus includes the Sir Christopher Wren Building (1695), the oldest academic building in the nation, where classes are still conducted. This and other early structures of William and Mary have been restored to their original appearance through grants from the American philanthropist John D. Rockefeller.

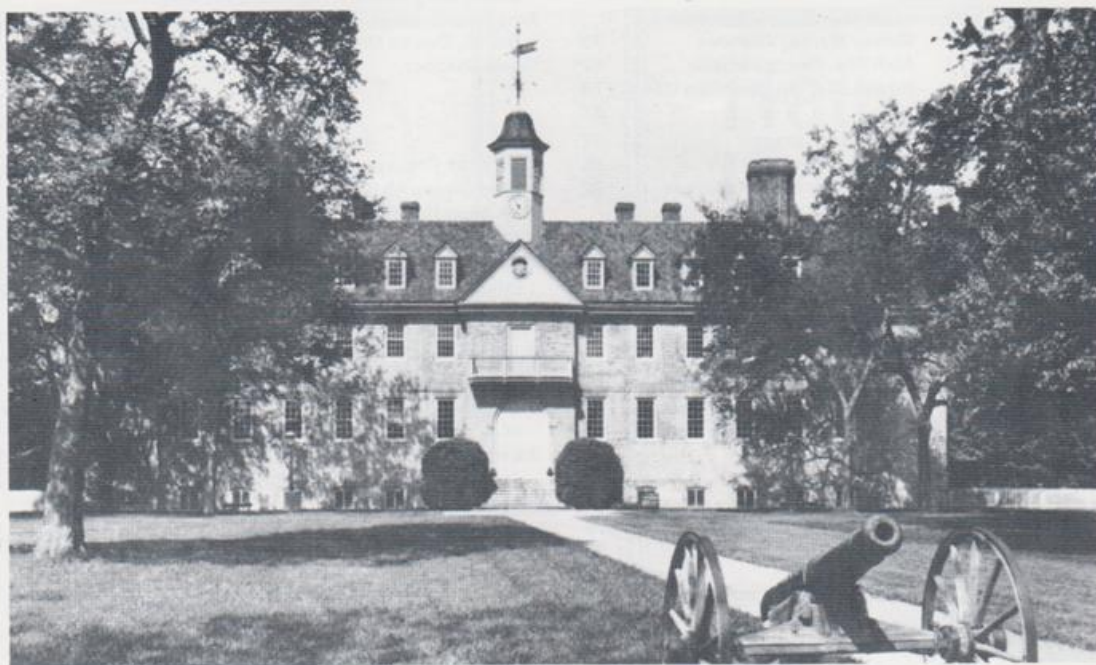
William and Mary is organized as a Faculty of Arts and Sciences and a School of Business Administration, School of Education, the Marshall-Wythe School of Law and the School of Marine Science/Virginia Institute of Marine Science at Gloucester Point, Va.

William and Mary's reputation for educational excellence has been tied to its identity as a selective residential undergraduate college of national stature. The College has also established a solid reputation in graduate education, offering the juris doctor degree in law and doctoral degrees in American studies, applied science, computer science, education, history, marine science, psychology and physics.

The College became state-supported in 1906 and coeducational in 1918. William and Mary attained modern university status in 1967.

William and Mary At A Glance

- A state-supported, coeducational, residential university in Williamsburg, Virginia.
- A "university college" that emphasizes a well-rounded liberal education. All undergraduates meet area and sequence requirements in the arts and sciences in addition to degree and concentration requirements. Graduate study is offered in 16 disciplines, doctoral degrees in eight fields.
- Approximately 5,400 undergraduates and 2,300 graduate students from 47 states and 36 foreign countries.
- Approximately 600 faculty members in arts and sciences, education, business, marine science and law.
- Tuition, fees, room and board (annual): For the 1992-93 school year, undergraduates from Virginia will pay \$7,948 for one year. Out-of-state students will pay \$15,328.
- 1,200-acre campus including Lake Matoaka and College Woods. Forty major buildings, including 870,000-volume Earl Gregg Swem Library; 760-seat theatre in Phi Beta Kappa Memorial Hall; 10,000-seat William & Mary Hall; 15,000-seat Walter J. Zable Stadium; Student Recreation Center; residence halls for more than 4,000 students; and Sir Christopher Wren Building, nation's oldest academic structure.
- Adjacent to Colonial Williamsburg and within walking distance of town center. Williamsburg is 150 miles south of Washington, D.C., 50 miles from Richmond and Norfolk and 25 miles from Newport News. Accessible by air, ground and rail transportation.
- Academic Divisions: Arts and Sciences, Business Administration, Education, Law Marine Science.
- Degrees: A.B., B.S., B.B.A., M.A., M.S., M.Ed., M.B.A., M.A.Ed., Ph.D., J.D., Ed.D., Psy.D., L.L.M.

THE "HALF"...ICON of THE IC4A ...

Not only was it a great competitive event, both in the semis as well as the final, but five of the top six return in 1993, four of them previous IC4A Gold Medalists. Only graduated Omar Simmons of Princeton is missing this year. That this event was the "showcase" last year, with Nedeau winning on his home track, is not surprising, since the 800 meters, or its predecessor the 880 yard run has been an IC4A "marquee" event for many, many years.

For those of us who hark back to days of "yard" events, this race was known as the half-mile, or to those who ran it... "THE HALF". And from the roster of IC4A "half-mile" [or former indoor 1,000y] champions, are nine who earned Olympic Medals: John Gregan, Princeton (2/800, Athens '96); Ted Meredith, Pennsylvania (1/800, Stockholm, '12); Earl Eby, Pennsylvania (2/800, Antwerp, '20); Schuyler Enck, Penn State (3/800, Paris '24); Phil Edwards, NYU (3/800, Los Angeles, '32); John Woodruff, Pittsburgh (1/800, Berlin, '36); Tom Courtney, Fordham (1/800, Melbourne, '56); Ron Delany, Villanova (1/1,500, Melbourne, '56) and Tom Farrell, St. John's (3/800, Mexico City, '68).

Our listing could include many other IC4A champion "half-milers" [who, due to the old 600 and 1,000 yard indoors, may never have won an actual 880y crown] that went on to win numerous

National titles, or became members...but not medalists...of USA and other national Olympic Teams.

Names such as Bill Bonthron, Princeton; Leslie MacMitchell, NYU; Arnie Sowell, Pittsburgh; Tom Murphy, Manhattan; Tom Carroll, Yale; Ricardo Urbina, Georgetown; Rick Wohlhuter, Notre Dame; Tom McLean, Bucknell (who still holds the Outdoor Championship Record - 1:45.34, in '76); Mark Belger and John Marshall, Villanova are familiar to old and young alike.

But two of our champions deserve special mention for their achievements beyond the Eastern Collegiate scene. Don Paige, Villanova, truly a "many time" IC4A Champion (nine...count 'em...nine gold medals), who went on to win the 1980 USA Olympic Trials [on the team that didn't go] for which he earned the #1 ranking in the World at 800m that year.

And Abdi Bile, George Mason, who won the 1987 World 1,500m Championship. He was disappointingly ranked only #2 in the World that year, however, he earned the coveted #1 World Ranking at 1,500 in 1989!

Are we comparing the current crop of IC4A undergrad "half-milers"

with the aforementioned array of "All-Stars"? Not necessarily at this time. But track history is on their side as IC4A champions to date. And coaching decisions to run them in other events may not see these long-time protagonists go head-to-head in the 800 final this weekend. But let's meet our "cover boys", up-close-and-personal anyway.

ERIK NEDEAU, Northeastern...Senior...
IC4A Champion - 800m Outdoor '92

Erik's claim to fame out of Kennebunk (Maine) HS, was that of National Junior Olympic 400m Hurdles Champion. Hardly any indicator of the dynamic two-lapper he has become in the past year. Whether it's a leg on the 4x400m Relay or the 800m, or 1,000m (indoors), or 1,500m, or mile, this two-time All-American represents the University's version of instant offense. A dedicated athlete, as focused on improvement and team success as any in Northeastern's long and rich track history.

A Criminal Justice major, Erik emerged among the USA's 800m List Leaders with his 1:46.19 [PR and school record] in finishing 7th in the Final Olympic Trials at New Orleans on June 24th. His time was just .01 off the New England Collegiate mark, by Keith Francis of Boston College in 1975.

An occasional foray into the mile arena, such as at the New England Champs in February, resulted in a 3:59.68...the only US collegian to dip under the once magic "sub-four" this past indoor season. In this race Erik bested the 4:00.07 by Andy Keith (see below).

Earlier this Spring, Coach Mark Lech, himself a former New England 800m Champ during his days at Northeastern, has had Nedeau competing at 1,500m, with mixed success. A 3:46.43 earned only 6th at the Hot Springs (AR) Invitational, followed by another 6th, but at 3:43.50 in the Jumbo Elliott Race at the recent Penn Relays.

Now it's back to the 800m, and Eric seems ready to defend his IC4A title, as a recent 1:49.68 tune-up race would indicate.

BRAD SUMNER, Villanova...Senior...
IC4A Champion - 800m Indoor '93

Brad arrived on the Main Line campus with a heady array of scholastic marks to his credit... National HS recordholder at 600m (1:19.56)...victor in the National Scholastic Indoor 800m (1:55.29)...and a 1:50.76 win at the Keebler/IPI Meet, which earned him the #3 USA HS ranking at 800m.

Since then the Penfield, NY native has not disappointed anyone associated with Villanova. As a frosh, he became an impact player by running third leg on the winning 4x800m Relay at the Indoor NCAA's.

More relay glory followed as a sophomore, when he anchored the Wildcats to victory in the Penn Relays 4x800m. Later, that Spring of '91, Brad was third in the Big East 800, and 8th in the NCAA 800m, which earned him "All-American" honors for the second time in as many years.

But it was as a Junior that Brad blossomed into a national-ranking collegian in the 800m. Indoors at the

Big East he was 3rd in the 800 and 6th in the 500m and on all three 'Nova relay teams, followed by 8th in the Indoor IC4A 800m. When the track scene moved outdoors, he again anchored the victorious Penn Relays 4x800m Relay, won the Big East 800m title, and took third in that great IC4A 800 race. Then at the NCAA Championships, Brad ran his PR to date, 1:46.77 in fourth, ahead of Nedeau's 1:47.05 in sixth. His 1:46.77 might be a school record at most colleges, but not so at 'Nova. That honor goes to a 1:43.92 by current assistant coach John Marshall, in '84, with Sumner's time currently ranked 9th on the Wildcat "All-Time" List.

Now in his final year in a Villanova singlet, Brad shows no signs of slowing down, as evidenced by a very rewarding indoor season. At the Big East he won the 800m and anchored the victorious 4x800m Relay...a feat he duplicated at the IC4A at Harvard...followed by a disappointing seventh in the NCAA at 1:51.20.

This Spring, at the urging of Coach "Uncle Marty" Stern, he has diversified his range to include the 1,500m. At Hot Springs (AR), Brad ran an Eastern leading 1:48.20, before moving "up" to run the 3rd leg (3:43.8) on a victorious 4x1500m team at Penn, earning his third coveted Relays watch in the process. However, two hours later, his anchor leg of 1:48.7 would garner only third in the 4x800m Relay.

At the recent Big East championships, Brad's last meet as a Villanovan at home, he won his "new" event, the 1,500m in yet another PR of 3:42.88, besting Andy Keith (3rd at 3:44.25) in the process.

With Sumner now suddenly a "miler", along with Nedeau and Keith, does that leave the 1993 Outdoor IC4A 800m solely the possession of:

DENNIS WEBSTER, Dartmouth...Senior...
IC4A Champion - 4x800m Relay Indoor '90

A much sought after schoolboy phenom out of Clarence (NY) Central HS, who still holds such youth records as: New York State 8th Grade (1:57.89); Freshman (1:55.6) and Sophomore (1:53.00)...and the US HS Indoor Junior Class 1,000m (2:29.15).

Although heavily recruited by numerous "scholarship" schools, Dennis opted for the academic goals offered by an Ivy League institution. But, not without giving consideration to one, such as Dartmouth, that had a major middle-distance program where he could maximize his abilities, while pursuing a 5-year Engineering Degree.

As a Frosh in the 1989 Heps 800m, he was 3rd Indoors (1:51.68) and 2nd Outdoors (1:51.20).

In '90 Dennis earned his IC4A gold medal, on the victorious Indoor 4x800m Relay. He ran the 2nd leg, and had the Big Green's fastest split (1:49.4) on their 7:27.24 team. A week later, at the NCAA Champs, this team ran 5 seconds faster (7:22.27), but it only took 5th.

At the '91 Indoor Heps, Dennis, now a junior, won the 800m title in 1:52.20, but took the Spring off from collegiate competition to concentrate on academia. Returning to the team Indoors in '92, he led the Heps 800m until the last few meters, when he lost out to Dartmouth teammate, Steve Hunt, 1:51.28 to 1:51.60, in a 1-2-3 sweep of the event by the Big Green. At the Indoor IC4A, Dennis won the first of a two-section 800m final in 1:50.84, but was 6th overall on time. Then it was on to the Indoor NCAA, where he ran 3rd leg (1:49.2) on Dartmouth's 4x800m Relay that took 4th in 7:20.82, a school record.

With the Spring of '92, came the outdoor Heps, and a 1:49.52 for 3rd place. But two weeks later, at the IC4As, Dennis finally began to realize his true potential. In the

third Semi, Simon Bowen, of Morgan State, set a blistering pace, with Nedeau, Keith and Webster in hot pursuit.

With 150 meters to go, thesethree, running as one, blew past Bowen, and headed down the final straight, the results... we'll let the cover photo on this program tell the story. Nedeau-1:47.20, Keith 1:47.56 (school record), Webster-1:47.67 (school and Ivy League record).

And so, the mantle passes onto another oft-mentioned "key" player...

ANDY KEITH, Providence, Junior... IC4A Champion
1,000m Indoor '93

Andy follows in the PC tradition of top-level distance and middle-distance recruits from the British Isles, in his case Birmingham, England, where he was 4th in the '89 English School Cross Country Championship and then runner-up in the English schoolboy 1,500m championships at 3:49.0 in 1990.

As a Frosh, Andy had mixed success, with a 4:01.7 mile at B.U. in January, 2nd in both the Big East and IC4A Indoor 1,000m, and 10th in the Indoor NCAA Mile. Outdoors he was 6th in the Big East 1,500m (3:52.97).

Last year, parlaying his talent with the experience gained as a yearling, Andy became a force on the collegiate scene, with a 3:58.79 mile victory at the New England Invitational. One week later at the Terrier Classic, Andy moved to #2 on the "All-East" college list in the 1,000m with his 2:20.27, which was followed by victories in the Big East 1,000m; New England Champs 1,500 (3:40.02-#3 All-Time East) and NCAA Indoor Mile (4:02.39). He "passed" on the Indoor IC4A, in order to "train-through" to the NCAA Championships.

Moving outdoors, he finished 2nd in the Big East 1,500m (3:49.94), and 5th in that IC4A 800 (1:50.47), after racing to a PC school record-1:47.56-in the Semi-Final (see cover photo). Andy finished his American season with a good time-3:41.17...poor place-9th...in the NCAA 1,500m.

This year, the PC junior won the Big East 1,000m; was 2nd in the New England mile (4:00.07) to old rival Nedeau; and in the IC4A 1,000m Andy came on with a late rush to overtake Simon Bowen (George Mason) at the tape, for an IC4A Meet Record time of 2:21.58. But lost by the same scant margin in the NCAA mile to Niall Bruton, Arkansas, clocking 4:00.27 in second.

And so the scene is set. Will these four IC4A Gold Medalists go "Head-to-Head" in the 800m or do their plans call for another event...say the 1,500m. And, are there other

top "half-milers" waiting in the IC4A wings. Perhaps the "sleeper" among these is Simon Bowen (now at George Mason) who finished 6th in that classic 800m last year (while representing Morgan State), after setting a blistering pace, that saw him some 20m in the lead at 500m...and who almost won this year's IC4A Indoor 1,000m.

Simon was "hot" at the recent Penn Relays, splitting 1:47.1 on the anchor of the winning Sprint Medley Relay, then two hours later...leading off the GMU 4x800m team in 1:48.5. Coach John Cook may well have the potential winner... only one minute and 45 seconds "plus" will tell at Zable Stadium on Sunday.

NEAR THE FINISH LINE

Fred Dwyer was the Outdoor IC4A mile champ in 1951. Fred also won Indoor mile titles in '51, '52 and in '53 the year he was king of America's indoor milers. He coached Marty Liquori to a 3:59.8 high school mile in '67 and Manhattan College to the NCAA indoor team championship in '73.

The milestone of his life in track and field are in the record books for all to peruse and cheer. But don't ever get caught up in the fiction that he dwells in another era.

He's 62, still at the top of his game, and brings another potent Manhattan College team to the storied Penn Relays at Franklin Field, Phila., this weekend.

This is the 117th IC4A and the 24th for Dwyer as director of track operations at Manhattan. It is also his 24th and last as main man of the Jaspers.

So why is this man, the pepper pot known to get as much out of an athlete as any coach in the land, the inspirational leader whose teams reigned as IC4A indoor champions just a year ago, saying his hail-and-farewell to college track?

Well, there are a few things on his list.

One, he's grown semi-weary of the recruiting process, of the business of enticing a 17-year-old to his college when its virtues should have been perfectly clear in the first place.

Two, he's tired of waging uphill warfare against NCAA restrictions, on scholarship limits, number of competitions, coaching staff size and more, which he strongly believes are eviscerating noble Olympic sport that once was central to the campus experience.

And third, he figures it's about time he gave up the 33-mile daily round-trip commute from his Caldwell, New Jersey home to Manhattan College in the Bronx, and stay home to get the grass cut, play some tennis, read good books and "hold hands with my wife, Jane."

At last, after every weekend routine Fred has followed, first at Essex Catholic High School in Newark and then at Manhattan, Jane Dwyer will get to see a little more of her husband of 35 years.

Dan Mecca, Manhattan assistant coach for the past six years, has been appointed Dwyer's successor. "Dan has a work ethic second to none," lauds Dwyer, "I've got every confidence in him."

Those words sound familiar. It was coach "Jumbo" Elliott who had every confidence in Dwyer at Villanova University over 40 years ago.

Dwyer's own track career would be short and lustrous - just seven years all told, from his debut in the sport as a senior at Seton Hall Prep in South Orange to a short stay at Notre Dame to his glory years at Villanova, to three post-graduate campaigns to retirement at just 25, with a calcium deposit problem at the base of his left Achilles' tendon, solved now by routine surgery, but then posed a surgical risk he did not wish to take.

In the early '50's, indoor track was a serious competitor to basketball for the winter season crowds with five well-attended, fan-stirring meets in the

"old" Madison Square Garden. They ran in order - the Millrose Games, NYAC Meet, National AAU Championships, IC4A Championships and Knights of Columbus - and in 1953 Fred Dwyer did what no man had done since, and certainly cannot do now, given that the Garden track season has shrunk to two meets, he won the mile at all five Garden meets. Of course, only a collegian could have done that, since the IC4A meet is for undergrads only.

With the athletic world at that time bubbling over at the prospect of a human being actually running one mile in less than four minutes, once considered an impossible feat, Fred Dwyer was thrust into the spotlight.

Then, a world wide race was on to "break through" and demolish Swedish star Gunder Hagg's 1945 world record of 4:01.4, hopefully with a time that began with a "3." Now, such runners as John Landy and Merv Lincoln in Australia, Wes Santee in Kansas and a young British doctor named Roger Bannister stood on the brink.

The honor would go to Bannister, with his epic 3:59.4 at Oxford University, May 6, 1954. Yet Dwyer's career best would stay at 4:00.8.

What were Dwyer's feelings when he heard the news of Bannister's breakthrough?

"I was in (Army) boot training at Fort Meade, Md. at the time," Dwyer remembers. "A guy there had just heard the news flash and told me. I was ecstatic, I was exhilarated, I felt just great for the sport."

By then, Dwyer was being coached by mail by Franz Stampfl, the famed Austrian-born coach who was coaching Bannister and several other middle-distance greats of the day.

Dwyer's career was then at an early crossroads. "I was getting closer to it (a sub-four) all the time, but it still was a long way away. I still didn't have that focus," he said.

His 4:00.8 wouldn't come until the Compton (Calif.) Invitational of 1956. Now it was an Olympic year and another major target loomed, the Games of Melbourne, Bannister had retired. Santee was by then out of the sport ("over a lousy \$350 or something, imagine that in today's context," says Dwyer). There was no clear-cut American candidate, and the Olympic 1,500-meter final seemed anyone's race to win.

But it wouldn't be Dwyer's either. In the greatest disappointment of his track career, he was edged out by a young California runner named Don Bowden for the third and final spot on the U.S. team at the Final Trials. Dwyer settled for fourth place, so close to Melbourne and yet so far.

The ironies would continue. The Olympic 1,500-meter final would go to a Villanovan all right, but it was Wildcats' Ron Delany, running for Ireland. And, in the spring of '57, it would be Bowden who became the first American to break four minutes for the mile.

While he never "broke four" himself, Fred Dwyer certainly knew what it took. So when a young prospect named Marty Liquori came under his wing at Essex Catholic High, he immediately saw that Liquori had the necessary ingredients.

"Marty had the focus, he listened," said Dwyer. "Marty was a keen young man. He had a little more maturity than the average youngster. In his mind, he might challenge a workout I'd give him but he'd do it anyway because he knew he had a coach of 24 years experience, and he had only two."

"Very few people, who were as (physically) endowed as Marty would pay the price he would. He would sacrifice. He was very goal-oriented, and that's why he reached the top of the heap."

"There are so many distractions and detours in life, but he wouldn't take any. Everything had to wait until he finished a workout."

They just don't make them like Liquori these days

and to Dwyer anyway, it's no wonder the U.S. hasn't produced a high school miler to break four minutes for the mile in 26 years.

Liquori went on to Villanova and the '68 Olympic team and Dwyer went on to Manhattan College and, sure enough, they were pitted on opposite sides of the fence at many a major meet.

Fred's Jaspers never did beat Jumbo's (and Marty's) Wildcats, but they certainly gave it their best shot.

Could Dwyer in any small way cheer for Liquori and Villanova?

"Are you kidding," said Dwyer, "When you get into the ring you give it your best shot."

His allegiances, of course, now came dressed in the Kelly green and white of Manhattan College.

The 1973 NCAA Indoor Nationals in Detroit proved a high point in Dwyer's coaching career.

To this day, Dwyer insists "It was a dream performance" Mike Keogh started it off by winning the two-mile run, Ken McBryde took third in the triple jump and Cliff Bruce third in the 1,000 yards. But the big one was a world-record victory by the John Lovett-Ray Johnson-Joe Savage-Tony Colon team in the distance medley. The Jaspers' 9:43.8 cracked the world mark by Kansas, anchored by Jim Ryun in 1967.

Manhattan with a current enrollment of 3,680, may have been the smallest school ever to win an NCAA Division I team championship in any sport.

"It wasn't the coach," said Dwyer. They (the athletes) went out and did everything they were supposed to do and didn't fold."

Under Dwyer (twice an NCAA coach of the year), Manhattan has taken a total of two relay and two individual NCAA titles, four IC4A team crowns (two cross-country, two indoor track) and produced 36 individual gold medalists.

On the Metropolitan level, the Jaspers have claimed 19 team crowns and over 100 gold individual medalists.

Track is a numbers game but numbers tell only a fraction of the Fred Dwyer story.

To Dwyer, track success is a product of the heart, mind and body... too few these days have the elements.

It's the NCAA and it's stranglehold on the sport, that keeps driving Dwyer up the nearest wall.

"I'm just irate with the NCAA," says Dwyer. "They're just killing the sport. How can you intelligently cover 20 events, plus cross-country, with 12.67 scholarships? It's absolutely disgraceful but, in the NCAA, the voting basically, is done by the athletic directors and most of them are former football coaches."

"This thing (the trend to cutback in track) started in the 1960's and it's been getting worse every year. If we ever took the NCAA to court, I'm sure they'd lose. There has to be a lawyer, with a track background, who has made his megabucks, who'd do something for the aid of the sport."

The 1992 IC4A Indoor Championships at Princeton showcased a Dwyer-coached team at its best.

"Every kid that day ran to his ultimate," said Dwyer. We couldn't have won if they didn't. Every kid did exactly what he had to. I was so proud of them all."

At this year's Indoor IC4A's at Harvard, Manhattan placed fifth with just nine kids. "I couldn't have gotten more out of them. They competed incredibly," Dwyer said.

That's true to form. That's Fred Dwyer, still downplaying his own achievements and building fires under his "kids." He was a superb miler and super coach who will finally find a great deal to do around the house. Chances are that while he's out of practice, he will do a super job of it.
