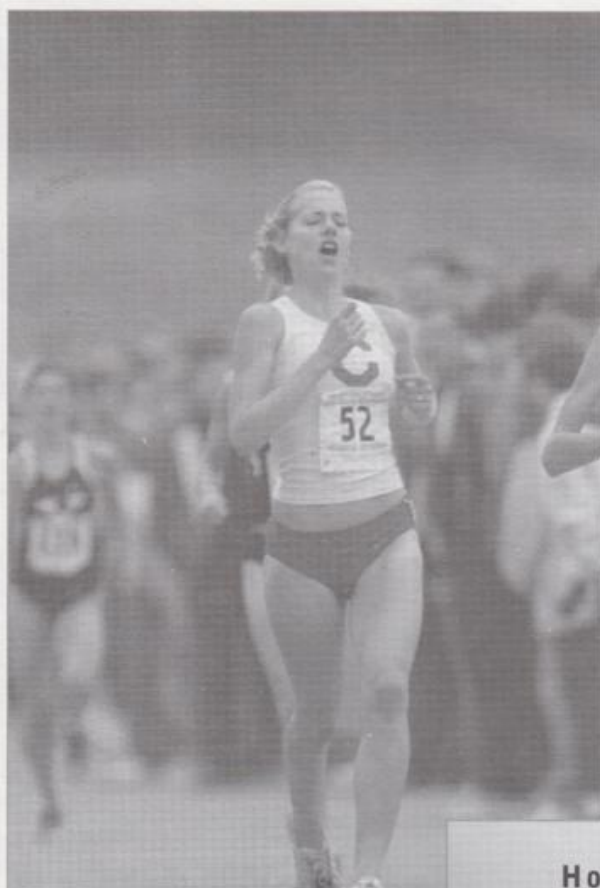
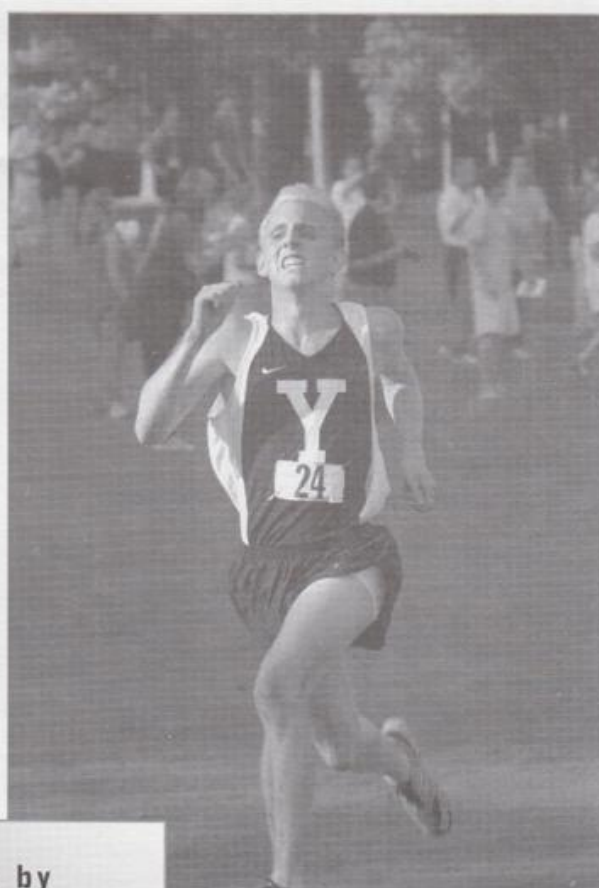

Championships

The ECAC administers 110 preseason and postseason events for 35 men's and women's sports, nine affiliate organizations and seven playing leagues.

Officiating

The ECAC assigns officials in 15 sports in Divisions I, II and III, including baseball, men's and women's basketball, fencing, field hockey, football, men's gymnastics, men's and women's ice hockey, men's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball and wrestling. In addition, the ECAC officiating bureaus provide clinics and workshops, improving the level of officiating and attracting the most qualified collegiate officials.

Communications

The ECAC publicizes the achievements of its member institution's student-athletes through weekly and postseason awards. Annually, the publicity bureau recognizes more than 4,000 student-athletes in 20 different sports from Division I, II and III member institutions.

Marketing and Sponsorships

The ECAC Corporate Partner Program is dedicated to developing relationships with commercial entities that are committed to the mission of the ECAC, support the ideals of intercollegiate athletics and value the pursuit of excellence on and off the field of play. Offering a wide range of opportunities, the ECAC partners with international, national and regional brands to create added-value for its membership and to provide quality championship experiences for its student-athletes.

The ECAC® is the nation's largest athletic conference with 322 Divisions I, II, and III colleges and universities from Maine to North Carolina. Since its foundation 67 years ago, the ECAC has emerged as the nationwide leader in service. The headquarters, the Asa S. Bushnell Center, is located in Centerville, Massachusetts on Cape Cod. A non-profit service organization since 1938, the ECAC was founded as the Central Office for Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics with 58 charter members. In 1983, one of the most significant events in ECAC history occurred as the Eastern Association of Interecollegiate Athletics for Women (EAIW) was consolidated into the ECAC. Through the years the ECAC has

been a leader both regionally, and nationally.

with the focus on increasing the number of women and minority sports officials. This initiative is partially being funded through a grant from the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

The ECAC owns the nation's

leading online officiating system which is a password-protected extranet that allows real-time access to its membership and officials as changes occur to their schedules. The ECAC is also on the forefront of other Web-based technology including the officiating payment service (OPS). This enables the ECAC to pay the game officials on behalf of a member institution. Launched in 2002 in response to the expressed needs of the membership, the ECAC successfully processed more than 6,000 officiating payments last academic year.

The prestigious Asa S. Bushnell internship offers students from ECAC institutions hands-on experience in all areas of operation of the only multi-divisional conference in the country. 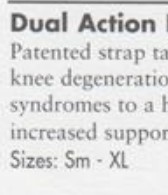
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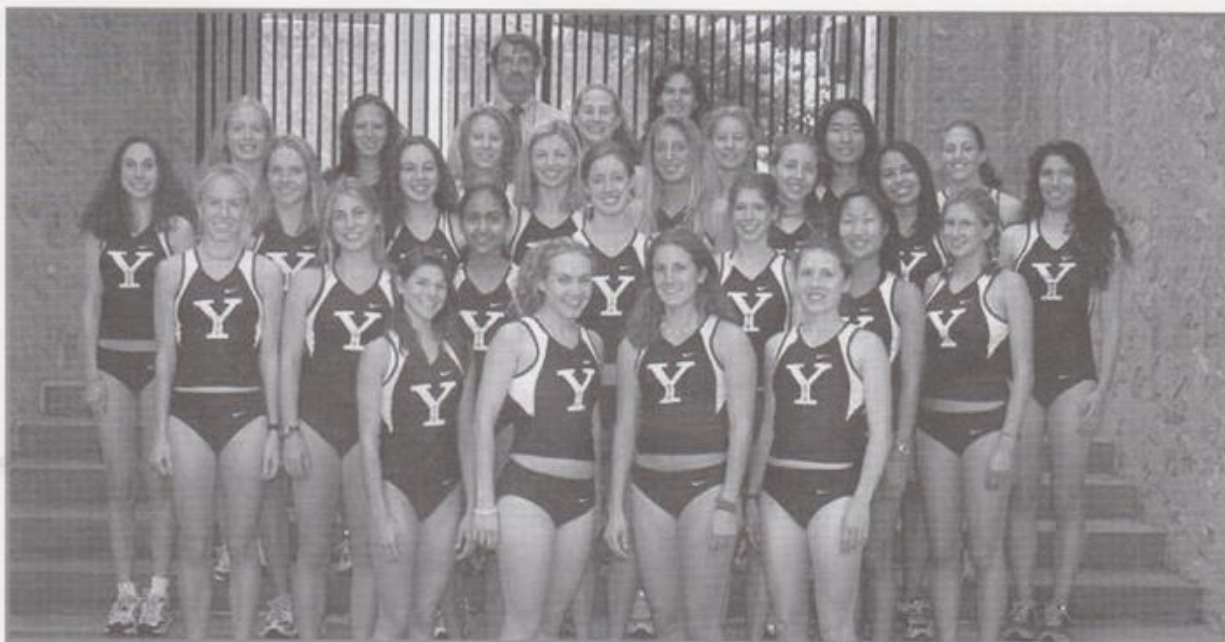

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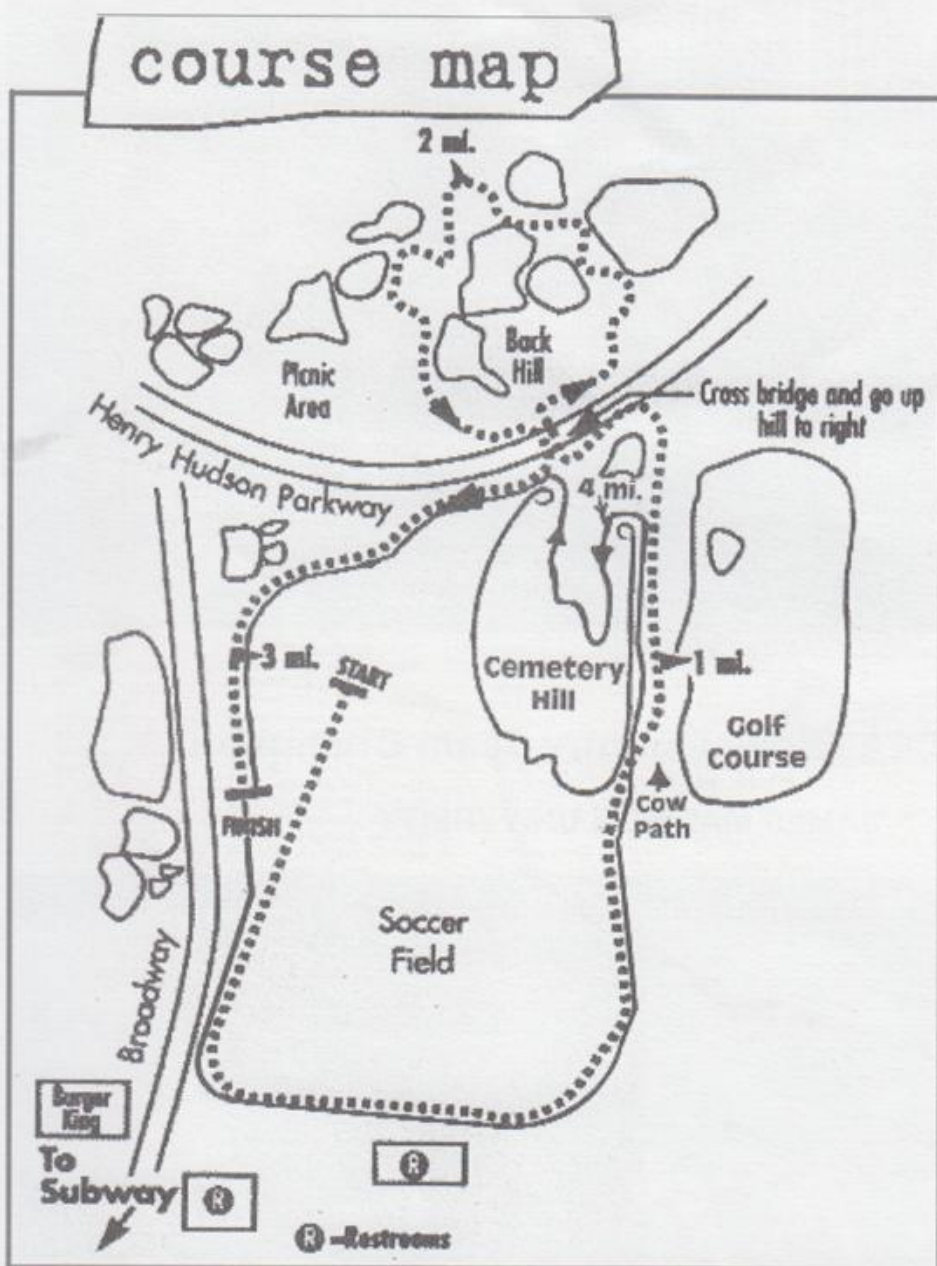
