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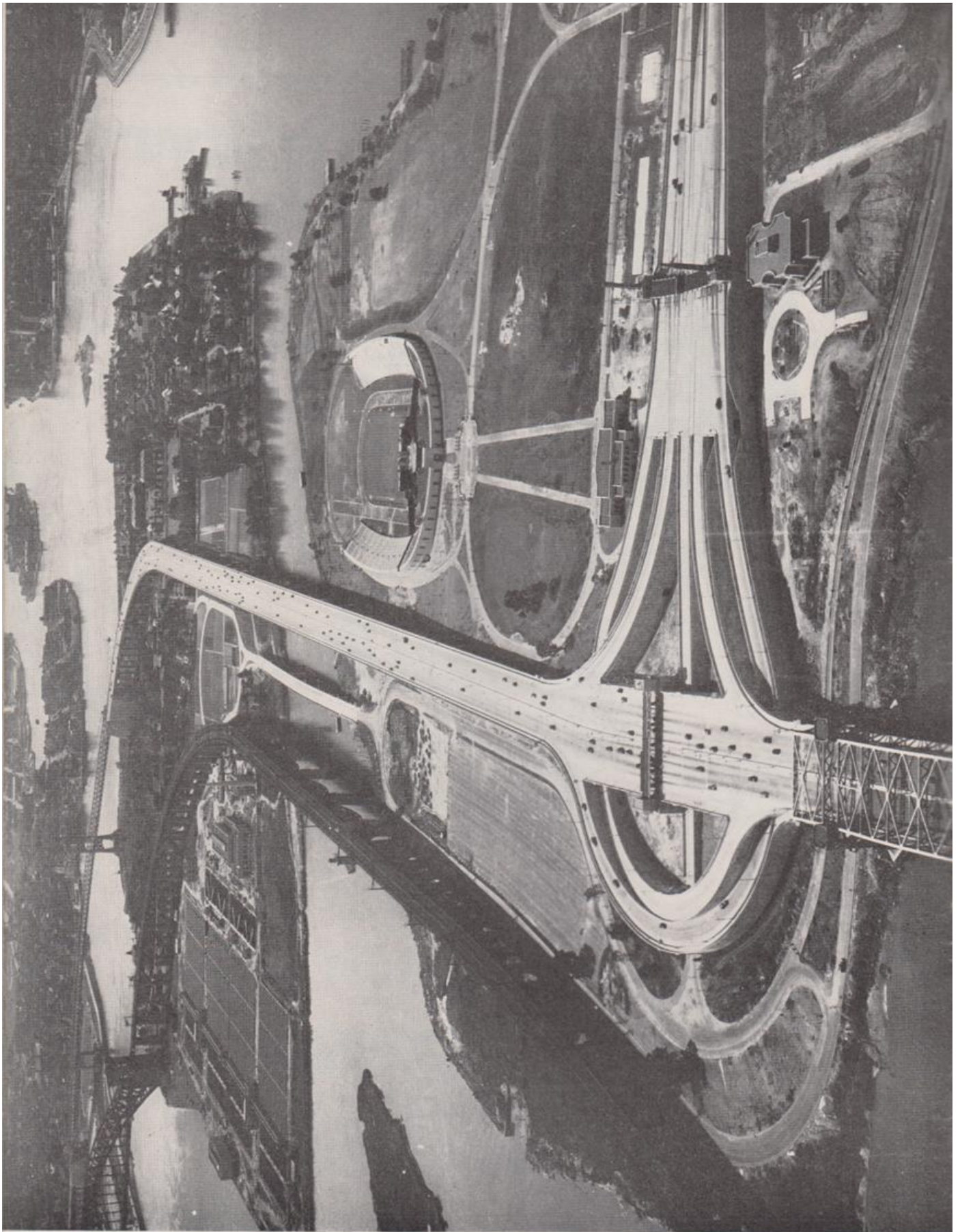

I. C. 4-A. Records Are Made Here

TRIBOROUGH Stadium hails the return today of the outdoor I.C.4-A Championships last held here in 1943. In this stadium a dozen years ago America's track and field men ran for places on the last U. S. Olympic team.

Over a span of ten years the outdoor collegiates have been held here six times. During that period seven of the present I.C.4-A records have been created in this stadium and two of the oldest track records in the books have been tied.

Frank Wykoff's record of 9.6 seconds for 100 yards, set by the U.S.C. speedster in 1931, was tied by Barney Ewell here at Randalls Island in 1941 and again in 1942. The flying Wykoff had erased the old record of 9.7 seconds which he shared with J. A. LeConey of Lafayette (1922) and Henry Russell of Cornell (1926). Before that J. C. Patterson of Penn., Ralph Craig of Michigan and Bernie Wefers of Georgetown were co-holders of the record at 9.8 seconds. Wefers' mark made in 1896 was a world's record.

In 1933 Leslie Ball of U.S.C. ran 100 meters in 10.6 seconds at this meet. Bob Kiesel of California tied this record in 1934 at Franklin Field. Ben Johnson of Columbia and George Anderson of California set the present metric mark of 10.5 seconds in winning their semi-final heats at Cambridge in 1935. Anderson went on to win the finals as Johnson, who was leading with 10 meters to go, suffered a pulled muscle and plunged headlong into the rain-soaked cinders.

Barney Ewell, of Penn State, only athlete to win three individual I.C.4-A titles in three successive years, burned up the cinders here at Randalls Island in 1941, running 220 yards in 20.7 seconds. This mark, which still stands as the meet record, wiped out the 20.9 standard which Ewell shared with Charles Borah of U.S.C. (1927), and also beat the best time, 20.8, ever made by an I.C.4-A sprinter. The 20.8's belonged to Wykoff, Kiesel, Foy Draper and Clyde Jeffrey, all Californians. Before Borah ran his 20.9, the I.C.4-A 220 record was 21.2 seconds and was shared by Craig, Lippincott and Wefers. The latter's 220 mark was also a world's record in 1896.

Ted Meredith's clocking of 47.4 seconds for 440 yards at Cambridge in 1916 was a world and I.C.4-A record that lasted 15 years. At Franklin Field in 1931, Vic Williams of U.S.C. tied this mark, beating Stanford's Ben Eastman and a great field which saw the first six men come home under 48 seconds.

No race in I.C.4-A history had a more dramatic background nor a more spectacular finish than the 440-yard run at Berkeley, California, in 1932. Practically everyone expected to see Ben Eastman, the popular coast favorite who had already broken the world's record in dual meets, win the event. Easterners were pinning their hopes on a smooth-striding quarter miler from Pennsylvania, William A. Carr. Hundreds of people flocked to the stadium

primarily to see this race. And what a race it was!

The start was made in a stillness that was almost painful. Both men, evidently highly-keyed, came down the straightaway with a terrific sprint. Eastman used a long, smooth stride to stay just ahead of Carr, who was running like a machine with shorter bounding steps. As they hit the turn Carr was two feet behind but gaining all the time. They went into the home stretch practically even and then began the long struggle to the tape. Carr, apparently never changing his stride, began to edge ahead and crossed the finish line 7 feet to the good, in 47 seconds flat—a world's record!

This mark has been equaled as an I.C.4-A record but never broken. John Woodruff, of Pittsburgh, who had won the Olympic 800 Meter Championship at Berlin in 1936, ran 47 seconds here in 1937, 1938 and 1939 . . . tying the record three times—a rare feat in itself and a great tribute to Carr's time.

Woodruff also holds the I.C.4-A half-mile record of 1:51.2 set here at Randalls Island in 1939. This mark eclipsed the 1:51.9 standard posted by Eastman in 1932. Before that, Phil Edwards of N.Y.U. was the record holder, running 1:52.2 in 1929. Edwards broke Ted Meredith's 1:53.0 set in 1916 the same year that Ted ran his great record-wrecking 440.

During the four-year period (1933-1936) the championships were contested at metric distances. James LuValle of U.C.L.A. set the 400 meter record at 46.9 seconds; Bill Bonthron, the brilliant Princeton miler, posted the 800 meter mark at 1:53.5 and the 1500 meter standard at 3:54.

John Paul Jones of Cornell ran his great world record breaking mile of 4:15.4 in this meet at Cambridge in 1911. The following year Jones finished in the now famous unprecedented dead heat with his great rival, Norman Tabor of Brown. Jones again broke the world's record in 1913, running 4:14.4, a record which endured for a quarter-century. Manhattan's Howard Borck cast this record into the discard in 1938 here at Randall's Island with a 4:13.9 performance. One year later Louis Zamperini sped over this track in 4:11.2—the present record.

Last year, at Franklin Field, Curtis Stone of Penn State not only set a new 2 miles record of 9:11.8, but also ran the fastest 2 mile ever run by an I.C.4-A athlete. Stone's great figures sliced 6.6 seconds from the former championship mark held by Andy Neidnig of Manhattan.

Both of the existing hurdle records were made here at Randalls Island. Eddie Dugger, classy timber-topper from Tufts, notched the high hurdles record of 14.1 seconds in 1941. This shattered the mark of 14.3 seconds which Dugger had set the year before at Cambridge. Before this, the mark was shared at 14.4 seconds by Harvey Woodstra of Michigan State, Jim Humphrey of U.S.C. and Earl Thomson of Dartmouth. Thomson, who ran the

GENERAL INFORMATION

Track measures four laps to mile.

All events are scratch, i.e., none is handicap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty for first false start, but competitor is disqualified for second false start.

In hurdle race competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In each event 15 points are scored: 5 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth, 1 for fifth (for score sheet, turn to page 44).

Each college is limited in actual competitors to one team in One-Mile Relay, two representatives in One-Mile and Two-Mile Runs, and five representatives in all other events.

Competitors must be on time for their events. They will be permitted on field ten minutes before their events are scheduled, but will be asked to leave immediately after their competition is finished.

All rules of competitions as set forth in I.C.A.A.A. Official 1947 Handbook will be strictly enforced by Referee and other officials of the meet.

"We know it won't go through for a world record, but we'll accept it as a college record," was the official verdict—another instance of the curious attitude that they love records, regardless of their validity, in the hinterlands.

When Dillard put up his 13.6 bid for a world record in the high hurdles at the Kansas Relays in April in his first outdoor start, it was said that the wind was not strong enough to invalidate the mark. But Wilfrid Smith, the old piano player and sports writer of Chicago, was the only one, insofar as we saw in a wide perusal of reports, who mentioned that the wind gauge was **ON THE OPPOSITE SIDE OF THE FIELD** from the straightaway where Dillard did his hurdling.

One doesn't necessarily challenge the greatness of a Dillard or a Patton by being skeptical. A proper note of skepticism belongs in every official who has to do with a new record.

In the I.C.4-A.—and you can accept this as a boost for the house—a reporter is never left in doubt, on the spot, about whether a record is acceptable. Decisions on records should be made at the moment a record is made. If there is a favoring wind, it is immediately announced that the record is not accepted. All through the I.C.4-A. roster of champions there are asterisks denoting that the records made were not accepted. You find no such marks in the N.C.A.A. book. The I.C.4-A. officials operate on the principle that a record-holder deserves some protection. There is no unseemly rush to give away cheap records for the sake of headlines the next morning.

Uniformity in regard to records would be helpful. And if you see any records made in the 72d Annual Championships of the I.C.4-A. today you'll know they bear the stamp of authenticity. No world record made in an I.C.4-A. meet ever failed to get A.A.U. and I.A.A.F. recognition.

I.C.4-A. Records Are Made Here

(Continued from Page 7)

1920 Olympic high hurdle title under Canada's colors, set his mark as a world record in 1920. Earl Vickrey, a red-headed flash from Southern California, holds the low hurdles record of 22.8 seconds made here in 1939.

Among the field events, the pole vault and shot put records have been fractured more than any other. Yale, spawner of great pole vaulters, has had 22 men who have won or tied for 33 I.C.4-A Championships in this event. Nine of them posted meet records and along the way three established world marks. Perhaps the most famous Eli vaulter was Keith Brown whose vault of 14 feet 5 $\frac{1}{8}$ inches made at Cambridge in 1935 was a world record which also wiped out Bill Graber's meet record of 14 feet $\frac{1}{2}$ inch and returned to Yale a record they had held since 1907. Sabin Carr of Yale, the first man in history to clear 14 feet, set his great world record at the 1927 championships. Before him, Bob Gardner, another Yale man, held the I.C.4-A and world record at 13 feet 1 inch in 1912.

The late Al Blozis of Georgetown, World War II casualty, holds the present I.C.4-A shot put and discus records. Big Al, who was never beaten in I.C.4-A competition, threw the shot 55' 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " and tossed the discus 167 feet 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ inches.

Bob Peoples of U.S.C. is the present javelin record holder, tossing the spear 223 feet 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches here in 1939. Ken Weisner of Marquette holds the

high jump record made in 1946 at Annapolis with a leap of 6 feet 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches. Oldest record on the book is Fred Tootell's hammer throw mark of 181 feet 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches made at Franklin Field in 1923. Dick Barber, another great U.S.C. star, is the broad jump standard bearer with a leap of 25 feet 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in 1931.

The relays keep 'em roaring, and as in the indoor I.C.4-A meet, the great one mile relay races have always been the climax of these championships. Four cadets from the U. S. Military Academy put on a show in this event last year at Franklin Field that will never be forgotten by those who saw it.

Anchored by Jack Hammack, who ran a 46.5 seconds anchor leg, Army's crack 1947 mile relay team broke all I.C.4-A records for this event when they thundered home in 3:14.3—the fastest mile relay ever run at Franklin Field, scene of the famed Penn Relay Carnival. Army's team, which was not figured to win, broke N.Y.U.'s stellar 3:16 record with a 3:15.5 in the qualifying trials and then went on to their final record-wrecking win. N.Y.U. had set their record in 1940 with Sanford Braun, George Hagans, Hal Bogrow and Jim Herbert.

With today's I.C.4-A athletes primed for an Olympic bid later this year, many of the above records may be smashed in this the stadium that has been the scene of so much I.C.4-A record breaking. Here's hoping!
