Similar equipment was employed at the 1960 Olympic Games and at the 1962 British Empire Games and European Championships. It is now being made available on loan to the ICAAAA through the courtesy and cooperation of Sports Beconta, Inc., of New York City.

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General Information

Track measures four laps to mile.

All events are scratch, i.e., none is handicap.

Firing of revolver denotes beginning of final lap in all races.

In all races there is no penalty for first false start, but competitor is disqualified for second false start. However, a starter's recall no longer nullifies a false start by any competitor.

In hurdle races competitor is not disqualified for knocking down hurdles.

In all relay races baton must be carried in runner's hand and must be passed to next succeeding teammate within clearly marked 20-yard zone, extending 10 yards in both directions from leg finish line.

Governing rules provide that, in races around turns, no runner shall cross in front of another unless and until he is 2 yards in front of his nearest competitor. Interference resulting from breach of this rule subjects offender to disqualification.

Each member college is limited to the following numbers of actual participants in various events in Outdoor Championships.

One Mile Run 2*

Three Mile Run 2*

One Mile Relay . . One Team

All other events 5

A nominee or qualifier who fails to compete in any running or hurdling event for which he has been nominated or has qualified will be ineligible for any further participation in the meet.

Competitors must be on time for their events. They will be permitted on field ten minutes before their events are scheduled, but will be asked to leave immediately after their competition is finished.

In each event 15 points are scored: 5 for first place, 4 for second, 3 for third, 2 for fourth, 1 for fifth.

N.C.A.A. RULES OF COMPETITION WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED BY REFEREE AND OTHER OFFICIALS.

TRAYNOR, CARROLL & OTHER 'CATS

AT HOME ON THE Main Line or at Downing Stadium on Randalls Island, indoors or out, Villanova remains the team to beat as the ICAAAA returns to New York for its 87th annual championships.

Championship Cup No. 7 goes into competition with this meet, Jumbo Jim Elliott's Wildcats having retired No. 6 by achieving the required fifth leg on their own campus a year ago.

A late starter in pursuit of that trophy, Villanova wrapped it up with five victories in six years.

Cup No. 6 had a life of thirty years, but the way things are going Cup No. 7 may not last through this decade.

Having won the cross-country team and individual titles last November at Van Cortlandt Park and indoor track last March in Madison Square Garden, Villanova now is in position for its first sweep of all the ICAAAA championships in one academic year.

Its position would seem to be impregnable, considering the quality of Elliott's first-line talent and their condition-confirming performances this spring.

Of the 49½ points that made a runaway of the 86th Intercollegiate, Villanova retains 20½. Senior Pat Traynor, who picked up nine points on a steeplechase first and second in the mile, Senior Doug Kerr, first in the javelin, Junior Rolando Cruz, who shared the pole vault title with Maryland's John Belitza, and Junior Vic Zwolak, fourth in the three-mile, provide a formidable nucleus for a successful defense by the Wildcats.

If that was all Elliott had, Villanova would be in jeopardy. The loss, through graduation, completion of varsity eligibility or academic failure, of Frank Budd, double sprint winner, Paul Drayton, double sprint runnerup, Leon Pras, high hurdles winner, Billy Joe and Gerald Dominini, second and fourth in the shotput, would have been drastic. But more than ample replacements are provided by sophomores Noel Carroll, Don Webster, Tommy Sullivan, Larry Livers and quarter-milers to round out a 3:11.2 mile relay.

Their performances this spring solidify Villanova in the now perennial role of team favorite.

Traynor, whose iron-man double last year consisted of a 4:06.9 mile and 9:19.1 steeplechase, is ready to repeat. Though he hasn't come up with a fast mile this season, his steeplechasing puts him in a class by himself. He sliced his

Penn Relays mark to 8:57.1, then brought his NCAA record down to 8:45.6, a glittering effort. His ICAAAA mark is 9:19.1.

Carroll is an Irishman who runs only fast enough to win in the Ron Delany manner. His mettle was tested in the Los Angeles Coliseum when he came through in a 1:47.5 half, only three-tenths back of the NCAA record. Compare that to Arnie Sowell's ICAAAA standard of 1:49.1. Carroll's time is the fastest in the world this year.

Webster, after a rather quiet freshman year, is running in the style expected of a 46.6 schoolboy whiz, though his 47.4 has been bettered this spring by Wendell Mottley's 46.7 for Yale and Chris Stauffer's 47.1 for Maryland.

Because of academic pressures as a dean's list candidate, Sullivan has not been the 4:03.5 miler he was as a schoolboy, but his dual-meet 4:09 indicates he will contribute points to Villanova as he did indoors behind the ICAAAA victory of Brown's Dave Farley. Zwolak is a seasoned veteran who can be counted on for points in the three-mile or mile.

Cruz can expect a challenge only from his fellow 16-footer, Belitza, as they ride their fiberglass catapults toward the 15-6 record they shared last year. Kerr hasn't matched the 224-10½ javelin toss that won the ICAAAA title last year, but the spearmen, as a lot, are the most inconsistent performers on the ICAAAA 18-event program. Another sophomore, Livers, could be a point getter in either the 120 or 440 hurdles on his best times of 14.2 and 53.6, and if he fails in both he could run a lap on the mile relay, which has a score to settle with Morgan State's 3:08.8 foursome.

Yale's Heptagonal champions, Maryland's Atlantic Coast Conference rulers, Manhattan's Metropolitan champions, Harvard's sophomore-dominated team have their work cut out if they harbor hopes of upsetting Villanova, or making a strong run at the team title.

No one will be busier than Aggrey Awori, Harvard sophomore from Kampala, Uganda, a favorite or top contender in the two sprints, the 120 hurdles and the broad jump, though once more, as in the Heptagonals, the time schedule will cut him out of one event. In the Heps, Awori won the 100 and 220 and placed third in the jump, but found it impossible to finish the high hurdles final minutes after he won the 220. In the ICAAAA, he probably will concede the

EASTMENT RETIRES...RELUCTANTLY

A TRIP TO A police station to pick up a report on an accident case . . . a quick stop into the 13th Regiment Armory, Brooklyn, to watch Bishop Loughlin High school's track team practice . . . a phone call from a Brother Dennis, F.S.C., that night asking him to come down and help out two or three days a week . . . resignation from the law firm a few weeks later to join the faculty at Loughlin.



George Eastment was strolling down memory lane earlier this month at Leone's as he told the gathering at the Metropolitan Track Writers' luncheon that he was retiring as head coach at Manhattan College after 17 years.

Tears almost came to his eyes—and no one would really have blamed him if he pulled out his handkerchief . . . as he announced that Jim McHugh was his successor.

It comes down simply to this—after the 87th annual ICAAAA championships taking place this weekend—Eastment will be a spectator. And he doesn't like the idea one bit.

"I retire somewhat reluctantly," said George as he recalled his start as a high school coach a little over 35 years ago. "I know I will miss it but I don't want to be half baked. I was never like that. You can't do justice to two jobs.

"The decision wasn't mine. The president of the college (the Rev. Brother Gregory, F.S.C.) made it."

The coach's reference to two jobs meant his other assignment as dean of men at the Riverdale school. He has held that post—in addition to his coaching chores—since July, 1961, and now he will devote full time to it.

Going back to his start as a coach, Eastment, fresh out of Georgetown University's law school—he was a runner for the Hoyas as an undergraduate—was working for a law firm when he had received the assignment to go to the Gates Avenue police station to get "blotter" on an accident.

"I was two or three blocks from the armory," he recalled, "so I stopped by to see my old high school coach, Jim Warburton. He asked me to

start a few practice races, which I did, and that night I received the call from Brother Dennis asking if I would like to help out.

"This was in March and the following September I resigned from the law firm to teach at Loughlin. I was on my way as a coach and I wouldn't trade the memorable experiences for anything in the world.

"I have met some wonderful people throughout the entire world and I am proud and happy of the association. I am humbly grateful to all who have helped me."

In his 17 years as head man of the Kelly Greens, Eastment has produced eight cross country, 13 indoor and the same number of outdoor championship clubs in the Metropolitan Intercollegiate Track and Field Association.

He also has accounted for two cross country, five indoor and four outdoor titles in the ICAAAA. No coach has ever had as many winners in Penn Relays competition as has Eastment.

He has coached the U. S. track team which beat Russia in the first of their now celebrated dual meets in Moscow in 1958. He also was a coach of the 1960 Olympic track team at Rome.

Four of his boys—Lindy Remigino, who captured the 100-meters at Helsinki in 1952; Lou Jones, who set a world record for 400-meters at 0:45.2 in Mexico City; Ken Bantum, a shot putter, and distance runner E. O'Toole—became Olympians.

Remigino's triumph was quite unexpected, and that is one of the highlight's of George's career, but there is one other accomplishment that the 56-year-old youngster always points to when talking about the past.

Remigino, Joe Shatzle, Bob Carty and Jack O'Connell won a 440-880 relay double in the Los Angeles Coliseum Relays in 1952.

"We were the first Eastern team to win in that meet," he recalled. The night before a radio broadcaster asked me who I thought I was bringing out on an Eastern team that had little chance.

"My pride was hurt but I felt much better the next night beating the likes of UCLA, Texas, Southern Cal and Cal."

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ICAAAA OFFICIALS GROUP INCLUDES CHAMPIONS AND NEAR CHAMPIONS

ONE OF THE many nice things about the annual spring rally of the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America is that it affords an opportunity for a lot of old—and not so-old—ICAAAA athletes to get together and talk over old times, heights and distances.

If you ramble around Randalls Island today, you'll see Old Blues (Light and Dark)—Old Reds, Old Greens and on through the whole spectrum—gathered in tight little clusters, trading recollections of their elbow-to-elbow days on the track.

The biggest cluster of all will be the field, too busy while the competition is under way to make much conversation but joining wholeheartedly in the reunion before and after.

We're talking about the officials, those dedicated men in blue blazers and grey flannels who don't get any pay and not nearly enough credit for doing a difficult job extremely well.

The ICAAAA prides itself on the quality of the officiating at its meet, with justice. If there is a finer group of track and field officials anywhere than these men who call the shots at the ICAAAA meet, we have yet to meet them.

However, when you study the list of ICAAAA officials (on pages 14 and 15) it's not hard to understand that they do a superior job of performing their assigned tasks.

These good men and true can't help to be knowing about track and field, because more of them than not were topflight competitors themselves.

Just running down the lists of names calls up vivid memories of past derring-do on cinder strip, runway, take-off apron and throwing circle.

Today's chief judge is Eddie Swinburne (what a great half-miler Old Elbows was at George-

town). On Eddie's judging crew is Bill Carr (Pennsylvania), who looks just as trim and fit as he did when he swept all the quarter-mile honors, up to and including the Olympic 400 in 1932. Also helping to sort out the finishes are smiling Jim Rafferty (Fordham's fastest miler until Tom Kenney ran that big race at the Penn Relays) and Wes Wallace, another Fordhamite who was Mr. 600 of his racing day.

On the timing crew, reading Greg Rice's name conjures up fond recollections of that barrel-chested gamester's weekly two-mile wrangle with the watch he now holds. Chief clerk George Barker of N.Y.U., a former ICAAAA cross-country champion, has three-fourths of a crack mile relay team as aides. Hal Bogrow, John and Joe Trachy all were great stick-carriers for N.Y.U.

Chief inspector Frank Hussey (Boston College) won Olympic sprinting fame as a Stuyvesant High schoolboy. He really has a gilt-edged crew. It includes Olympic champions Ray Barbuti of Syracuse (400 meters in 1928) and John Woodruff of Pittsburgh (800 meters in 1946); N.Y.U.'s silky-striding Jim Herbert, who had no peer at 600 yards on the indoor boards, and Manhattan's Eddie O'Toole, a 1948 Olympian at 10,000 meters.

Today's chief press steward is Abel Kiviat, who won more national titles than he can count at a wide variety of distances.

There's a full crew of champions among the field event officials, too. Working the broad jump and triple jump are Eulace Peacock of Temple, who beat Jesse Owens, sprinting and jumping, in Jesse's prime, and Paul Courtois of N.Y.U., another great leaper. Big Hank Dreyer of Rhode Island, who just about gained permanent possession of the national 35-pound weight throw title, is in charge of the hammer throw.

We could go on and on, but this, we think puts across the idea: ICAAAA officials are the most.

LET'S PLAY COACH

"I'D EAT MY HAT to win the ICAAAA team championship," has been said by many a coach through the years. And many have come close to digesting their sombreros even before the meet starts as they give up sleeping time trying to figure out how they can spread their stars through the various events to bring the highest point score possible.

It's different for you fans and us reporters. We can sit high up in the stands and second guess the perspiring coaches as they send their charges out for the events. And no matter how many points any one team does manage to score, on the way home we can figure out how a much higher total could have been garnered.

Harvard's Aggrey Awori being in this year's championships recalls the 1950 meet when Seton Hall coach Johnny Gibson calmly announced that Andy Stanfield would go for a quadruple in the 100, 220, low hurdles and broad jump. Andy had to settle for the 100 which he won in spite of pulling a muscle some 15 yards from the tape. But the pros and cons of shooting for four titles still are echoing.

It will be the same this time no matter how Cantab coach Bill McCurdy uses his 22-year-old athletic marvel from Uganda today. Regardless of how many points Awori does score, one of us in the stands will be sure we could have increased the total.

Any double in this meet outside of the two dashes is a very difficult task. The order of events is the No. 1 detriment to trying to win more than one track event and the class of competition in a meet of this kind runs a close second. Awori won three events and ran on a winning relay team in the indoor Heptagonals, but settled for two firsts and a third against the same competition in the outdoor Heps.

But McCurdy with Awori isn't the only coach with a problem or problems in this meet.

What will Maryland's Jim Kehoe do with Chris Stauffer, a potential high point scorer in both hurdles and the 440?

Should Yale's Bob Geigengack go point crazy with Wendell Mottley and Bobby Mack to try to hold off favored Villanova in the team battle?

What about Villanova coach Jumbo Elliott? How would you enter such stars as Pat Traynor, Noel Carroll, Tom Sullivan, Vic Zwolak, Don Webster, et al?

Distance doubles in this meet are practically impossible. The mile going at 2:40, the three-mile and 3:10 and the steeplechase at 4:00 makes running in any two of those races a real ironman stunt.

Army's Bill Straub won the mile and two-mile Heptagonal double with close to two hours between the races. But Cadet coach Carl Crowell will have no worries on where to run Straub today since Army and Navy are busy competing in their own private tea party.

What would you do with Mack if you were Geigengack?

Would you send Bobby out for the three-mile and call it a day for the ambitious Eli senior or would you choose the earlier mile and then send him back in the steeplechase?

How about a 220-440 double for Mottley if you were Geigengack?

The 440 final goes at 2:50, the 220 semi-finals at 3:40 and the finals at 4:20. That double attempt would put the Trinidad speedster out of the mile relay, but Yale would probably need two or three Mottleys to win over the class of mile baton foursomes that will be running here.

Sure, we'll take a guess on what the Yale mentor will do. Mack in the three-mile and let Bobby tag along with the steeplechasers if he so chooses. Mottley in the 220 and 440.

And why be stingy with the coaching assists.

Playing McCurdy, let's use Awori in the sprints and the broad jump.

In case Kehoe is interested, we'd send Stauffer in the long hurdles and only the long hurdles.

As far as we're concerned, Elliott could fool around with the 220 and 440 for Webster, but just the half for Carroll, the mile for Sullivan, the three-mile for Zwolak and the steeplechase for Traynor.

Come on join the fun. This is a great meet for second guessing. Only the coaches are playing for keeps.

impossibility of running the 220 final five minutes after the hurdles final. The schedule in the qualifying trials bars him from the attempt, for the 100-yard semi-finals, the high hurdles heats and the 220 heats follow one after the other within a half hour.

Mottley from Trinidad, who shattered the Heptagonal and ICAAAA indoor 600-yard records and tied the Heptagonal outdoor 440 mark, has a special interest in the ICAAAA 440. He was shut out in the heats last year and comes back this time to find his path to the title a difficult one against the likes of defending champion Hubert Brown, of Morgan State, Webster, Stauffer, LaSalle's Bill Duryee, Manhattan's Vinnie McArdle, Colgate's Sam Amukun, Temple's Don Council—as swift a field as ever eyed the ICAAAA 440 crown. All of them have been under or around 47 seconds in relay chores or solo laps.

No group of sophomores in the meet will surpass the potential of the Harvard class of '65, to wit, Awori, 9.7 hundred, 20.6 furlong, 14 flat high hurdles and 24-6½ broad jump; John Bakensen, 169-4½ discus throw, Peeter Lamp, 218-1 javelin throw, Art Croasdale, 55-2½ shot-put, and John Ogden, 1:51.1 half.

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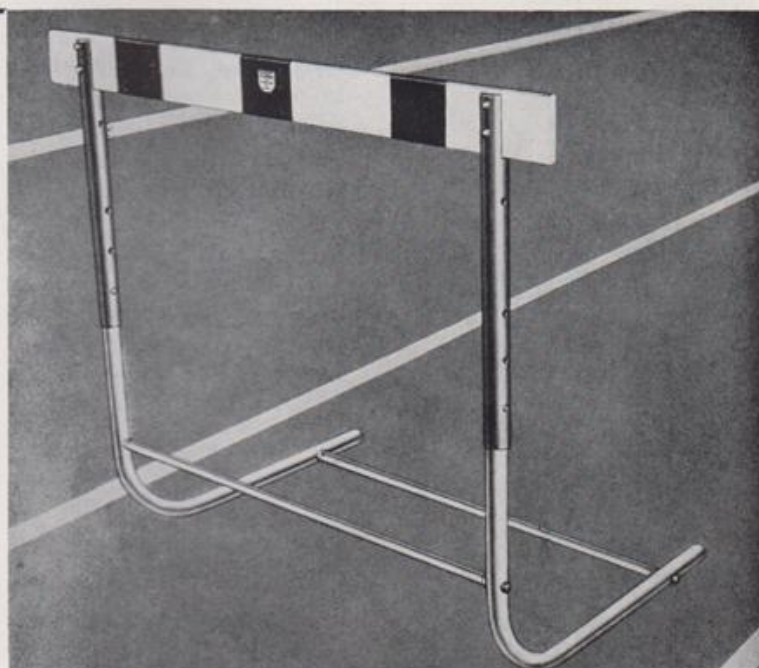

TRACK AND FIELD NEEDS A HOME

TRACK AND FIELD needs a home!

Baseball has Cooperstown, N. Y., where Babe Ruth's bat and other mementoes of the Big Bambino's career are safely enshrined. In a building there, members of Baseball's Hall of Fame are honored for all time. Bronze plaques, recording their greatest deeds, are viewed by thousands of visitors who come to this shrine of balldom every year. College football has Rutgers University at New Brunswick, N. J.; Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore is the site for the Lacrosse Hall of Fame; the Trotter's Hall of Fame is in Goshen, N. Y.; and on April 21 of this year, leaders of dog racing dedicated a national Greyhound Hall of Fame at Abilene, Kansas. Last month, Dutch Clark, presented his old jersey bearing the famed No. 7 and other mementoes of his brilliant career to the Pro-football Hall of Fame being built in Canton, Ohio.

A similar shrine is needed for track and field. Track fans could name hundreds of honored objects such as: Jesse Owens' shoes; Glen Cunningham's medals; Dutch Warmerdam's vaulting pole and Parry O'Brien's shot, to name a few, that might be enshrined in a track and field home.

Then there are the collections. Oscar Hedlund of Boston has one of the largest collections of track records (in scrap books) in the East. He might be willing to donate his collection some day. I venture to say there must be many other fans who have voluminous material on track and field they have painstakingly gathered over the years. What happens to these collections?

That's why track needs a home. A place where books, collections, medals, cups, uniforms, and many other items could be stored. A place that track and field athletes, fans, coaches, officials, writers and all who love the sport could call their own.

Which brings up another point. What about a Hall of Fame for track? Hundreds of stars de-

serve recognition. The Hall of Fame could include track officials, track writers and coaches as well as the honored stars of the cinder paths and the boards.

A library of books on track and field might also be an important part of track's new home. Here the writer, the fan and the researcher could study the records and the deeds of track and field's great stars.

Where should such a shrine be situated? New York City might be the most logical place. The first track meet ever held in the United States was held indoors in New York City. Or, maybe a college campus like Princeton, Yale or Southern California would be a popular choice?

The building would not necessarily have to be built right now. There may be a building someplace which would be suitable. If not, a piece of land would be a start and the building could come later.

Like any project of this kind there are many problems. One of them, of course, is money. Another is the selection of the site. But nothing ever got started without an idea.

Many dinners and ceremonies honoring the great of track and field might be held in track's new home. Returning Olympic teams, for instance, and all the world record breakers each year, could be invited to attend a banquet honoring their deeds.

How about it track fans, coaches, athletes, officials and writers? Does track need a home? Are you interested in helping such a project get started?

"He was a 22-foot broad jumper, a 12-foot pole vaulter, which was good 20 years ago, 180 feet in the javelin and a low and high hurdler."

While Eastment is unhappy about assuming the role of a spectator at all future meets, he is proud that McHugh is his successor.

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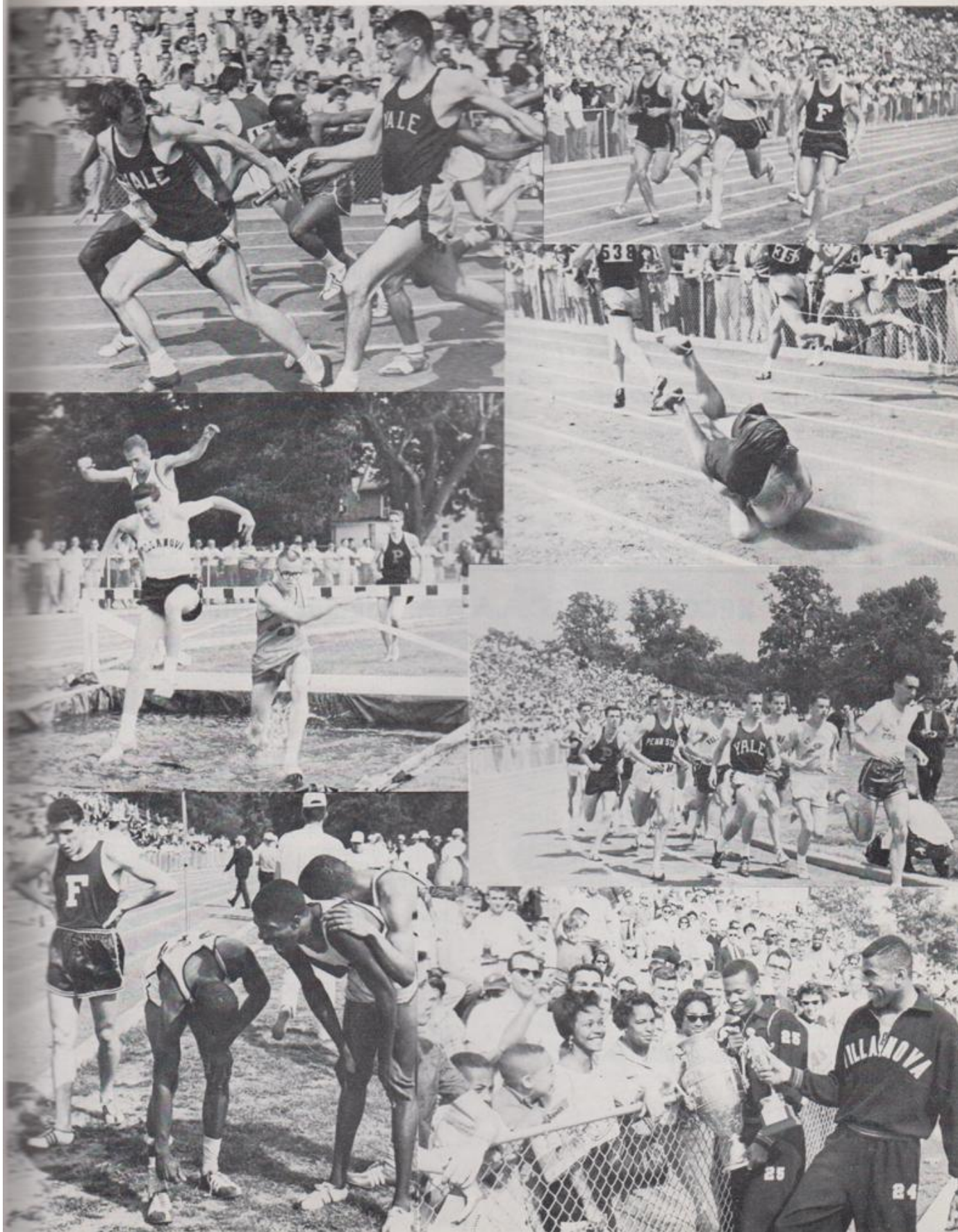
