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George Mason Grows Up Quickly In More Ways Than One

When the name, George Mason University, is mentioned in track and field circles it is no longer, George who?

The emergence of the men's track and field program at George Mason has come a long way in a short time and in some ways mirrors the immense growth felt by the entire university.

Since George Mason was granted university status in 1972 enrollment has grown by more than 12,000 to just over 17,000. Located on 571 wooded acres in the historic area of Fairfax, the university offers undergraduate, graduate and professional degrees in almost 90 fields and boasts being the high-tech center for Washington, D.C.'s business community. New on-campus buildings, such as the \$6 million Humanities Center, are being constructed all over the beautiful grounds.

Since John Cook was appointed head coach in 1978 the track program at George Mason has grown rapidly and in similar leaps and bounds.

Taking over a young aspiring program entering its first year of Division I competition was quite a humbling experience for a coach who had tasted success at the high school level. Due to a lack of facilities the Patriots often had to share space with local high schools. "It was a tough beginning considering we were basically just starting from scratch," said Cook. Like any new venture George Mason had to experience some growing pains first.

Using his keen insight into the world of track and field Cook realized the importance of establishing George Mason with a reputable association. One condition that Cook insisted upon when he was hired was joining the prestigious IC4A. "I wanted us to become a member of the IC4A's because having spent 20 years in the Washington, D.C. area I knew that the IC4A's symbolized the pinnacle of Eastern track success and I wanted George Mason to be a part of that rich tradition," said Cook.

In the beginning stages of the program Cook's original goal was just to qualify some athletes for IC4A competition. Ironically, it was a Mason basketball player, Kevin Jackson, who became the first Patriot performer to qualify in the high jump.

To get his program going in the right direction coach Cook instituted what he calls "a total track philosophy." Included in this philosophy was the need for upgraded facilities. The blossoming university matched Cook's enthusiasm and vigor with brand new indoor and outdoor facilities which rival the finest in the East, if not the country. "Our in-

door fieldhouse is a great building which is hard for anybody to beat," Cook stated.

"The track and field facilities at George Mason, as a whole, underscore the commitment the university made to our program and its impact has been phenomenal."

With a hard working coach, top flight facilities and the commitment of the university community; the only missing link for success was the athletes. And the athletes soon found their way to scenic Northern Virginia.

The first breakthrough for George Mason came in 1982 when the Patriots' Mike Scudieri won the triple jump and the mile relay team ran away with the victory at the IC4A's. In 1983, more individual titles were won at the IC4A level as Reggie Henderson captured the 500 meters, Skeeter Jackson the long jump, Scudieri repeated in the triple jump and both the mile and the 400 meter relay teams were

crowned champions. "We thought it was a great breakthrough just to score at the IC4A's but it started to whet my appetite to want even more," Cook recalled.

Satisfying coach Cook's penchant for more and on the heels of the superb individual efforts at that 1983 IC4A competition, George Mason put itself on the track map by coming home with the prestigious team title during the outdoor season. "Our ultimate goal was to someday win the thing (IC4A's) but we didn't think it would happen so soon," said an amicable Cook. The blossoming young school with an equally expanding track program had arrived.

The year 1983 also marked a major breakthrough for the George Mason track team on another level. That was the year decathlete Rob Muzzio decided to spurn lavish football and track offers from all over the country to attend George Mason University. The foundation began to take root.

Muzzio has made his mark not only at the IC4A's but at the Penn Relays and on the national level. Muzzio, a burly 6-2, 195 pounder who consumes a steady diet of a tireless work ethic, is the only athlete in the history of the NCAA to win the decathlon title two straight times (he's going for an untouchable three straight this spring). The senior from Fairfax, Va. also is the two time defending decathlon champion and 1984 pentathlon title holder at the IC4A's and has captured the decathlon crown at the Penn Relays.

Another Mason performer who has brought national and international recognition to the university is Abdi Bile Abdi. Abdi is the defending NCAA 1500 meters champion and last year claimed a rare double victory in both the 1500 and 800 meters at the IC4A's to lead the Patriots to the team title. The smooth, litheful runner is the current collegian record holder in the mile both indoor (3:55.77) and outdoor (3:53.08). This current indoor season Abdi ran the fastest 1000 meters in the nation (2:21.85)

and cruised to the fastest time in the world in the 1500 meters (3:38.50).

Since the groundwork was laid at the 1983 IC4A's George Mason has worked diligently to maintain the consistency it strived so arduously to obtain. The results have been impressive.

The Patriots finished second indoors at the IC4A's in 1984 and followed that by claiming the outdoor title in 1985. In all, Mason has crowned 15 individual IC4A champions and three team relays trophies in its brief stint on the Division I track circuit. Three NCAA champions have been crowned in Fairfax with nine members of their squad being honored as All-Americans. Besides winning the outdoor IC4A title last year George Mason ended up an exceptional 13th in the nation which was tops among East Coast schools.

At this year's indoor IC4A competition the Patriots will be looking to improve on their 12th place showing of a year ago. "Last season we were riddled with injuries and we wound up not doing so well and I think this year we'd like to break the top 10," commented coach Cook.

Overall, the IC4A's are a tangible goal for George Mason to use as a measuring stick for the success of its season both indoor and outdoor. "I ask our guys to go to the line during the IC4A's because...let's face it...the IC4A's are synonymous with Eastern track supremacy...it is Eastern track," said last year's Division I District II coach-of-the-year.

George Mason has enjoyed constant growth on both the university level and on the athletic level as well. The men's track and field team is a vivid example. A frontpage article on the September issue of the Wall Street Journal summed it up best when it said..."a giant has been growing just outside Washington in Virginia's thriving Fairfax County...it's going places."

They weren't just talking about the university either!

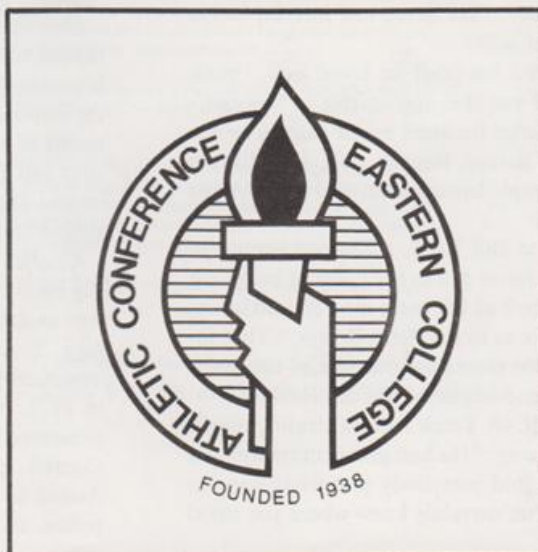

An IC4A Tribute

Those who knew them will remember them for their dedication to track and field and their never-ending concern for its athletes. Whether at an Olympic trial or a CYO meet, Frank Bailey and Charles "Doc" Blanford always had the athletes at heart.

They were respected by their fellow officials because of their knowledge of track and field and their dedication and loyalty to its ideals. To the athletes, they were teachers: helping them with form, and, more importantly, helping them calm the nerves that have cost more than one runner the race at the start.

Frank Bailey served as the chief starter for the IC4A's for over 20 years. The patience and friendship he so generously offered athletes is well-documented.

"In his starting, he was a teacher," commented Yale coach Steve Bartold. "He'd always take the time to help a kid -- correct his form or at least make sure he was steady in the blocks. He was great at giving the kids the confidence they need. I've seen him call up the field if he sees a kid moving in the blocks, ready to jump the gun. Sure, he was concerned that the meet was efficiently run, but he always had the feeling of the athletes at heart. That's what really set him apart."

Through his association with Bill Gaffney, a former IC4A administrator, Frank began his track officiating in the New York area as a clerk. Frank's career as a starter began in 1958 in the New Jersey Catholic Track Conference. He first officiated an IC4A meet in 1961 and began starting IC4A meets in 1970.

"As long as I knew him, he wanted to be a starter," remembers long-time friend and fellow official John Courtney. "He never lost interest in his craft, starting that is."

And he practiced the craft he loved well. Frank became one of, if not the, top starter in the east -- serving as chief starter for every major eastern event -- the IC4A's, Penn Relays, Heptagonals, the Millrose Games, U.S. Olympic Invitational, and the Olympic Trials.

But according to Bill Reed, a 25-year veteran of IC4A meets, "He never got to the point of being big time. He showed he had the same interest and intensity in a CYO meet as in the Penn Relays." That interest extended past the actual conduct of the meet; it most certainly encompassed the athletes.

Art Farnham, IC4A Track Administrator, recalls Frank Bailey this way: "He had great command at a meet. He always told everybody just what was expected of them. You certainly knew where you stood

with Frank. His control of the tempo and overall timing of a meet was probably the best in the east."

Charles "Doc" Blanford's participation in track and field ranged from coaching high school track in Cherrydale, Kansas to heading field events for the 1984 U.S. Olympic Trials. A 1935 graduate of Cornell University, Blanford was awarded the first George L. Shiebler Award by the E.C.A.C. in 1977. The Shiebler Award is presented annually to an eastern official who demonstrates the type of dedication to his avocational activities that former ECAC Commissioner George Shiebler gave leadership to over the many years he was associated with the administration of eastern intercollegiate athletics.

"He was not only an excellent official, but he was really dedicated to track and field at all levels," said Farnham. "His concern for athletes is well-known. He took a great interest in high school athletes. High school coaches, particularly in the Westchester area, would seek advice from him as to where their kids would be best suited to run in college."

But his concern went past their running. Charles would make sure the athlete would be well-suited academically for where he would be happy where he would compete.

"I remember college athletes coming up to him at the IC4A's and thanking him or reporting to him on how they were doing. His interest in these kids never faded," recalls Farnham.

One other way Doc served the IC4A's was as its Games Committee Chair. His tenure in this position is marked by his thorough knowledge of all IC4A regulations, his authoritative yet respected command of the Committee members, and the friendship and fairness he showed to all. His chief concern in any Games Committee decision was that all involved be treated honestly and fairly.

Charles received many honors and awards marking his contributions to track and field. In 1969, he was awarded the Meritorious Service Award of the New York Track Writers Association. The AAU bestowed its Gold Medal on Blanford in 1963, and in 1972, the U.S. Olympic Invitational Track Meet presented Blanford with its Special Award of Honor. Cornell University awards the Charles Blanford Award to the senior who compiles the most career points. Incidentally, the Francis M. Blanford Award

named after his wife Monty, is given to the senior woman who amasses the most career points.

The contributions that these two fine men left to eastern track, and particularly the IC4A's, is immeasurable and in many ways intangible. Perhaps their most important mark, the one they would both like to be remembered for, their genuine concern for athletes and their respect and concern for the ideals of athletics. They will be remembered, and missed.
