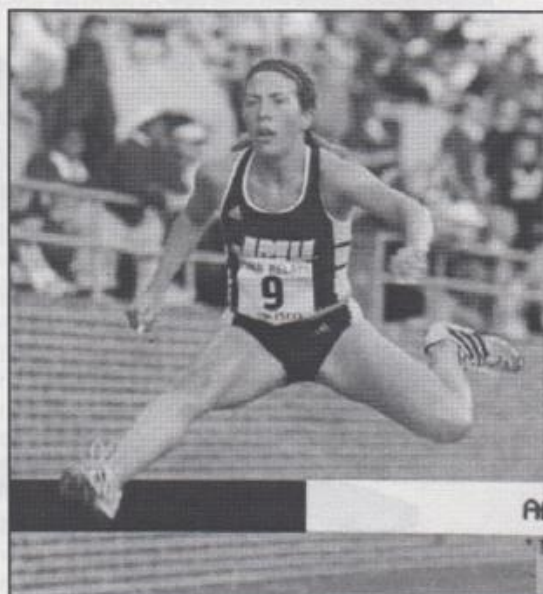

"In a word—wow!"

"In a word—wow!"

That's the way assistant coach Mike Brady described Tora Harris' feat at the 2002 NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships minutes after he heard the news. Harris, a senior out of Atlanta, Georgia, was crowned the 2002 NCAA National Champion in the indoor high jump on March 8 in Fayetteville. Harris soared 7' 5" above the Arkansas pavement, a height that was not only the best on this day, but the best of any collegian all year.

"When I won, I was more relieved than anything else," says Harris. "I could finally relax. I had a lot of pressure on myself. Sometimes when I come to a competition, I have to admit that some guys are better than I, but then I think that on this day it is possible that I will be better than those guys. At this competition, I felt that I was better. I felt that I was supposed to win."

There was good reason for Harris' confidence and lofty goals. Upon his arrival at the NCAA Championships, Harris was one of only two athletes in the United States to clear 2.25 m or 7' 4.5" this year. The other was his truest competition for the title, Adam Shunk of North Carolina.

Harris knew what he was capable of and he knew his opposition well. Self-confidence was a product of both his past successes and his intense preparation. Winning a national title would involve more than just habitual practice on the track.

Harris cleared 7' 5" at the 2001 World University Games in Beijing, China and he knew that equaling that performance would all but guarantee him the crown.

Harris had jumped well all season and this particular Friday was no exception. His indoor average this season equaled last season's personal best and it was time to show everyone what he could do.

"I really wanted to win this competition," says Harris. "I did everything I could to prepare myself with a lot of help from coach (Fred) Samara. I was basically out there to do one thing and that was to win."

As advertised, the competition came down to Harris and Shunk. Both athletes cleared 7' 4.5", the best mark in the nation this season. Harris knew, however, if he could equal his 7' 5" from Beijing, he would be in the driver's seat. Shunk's personal best was the 7' 4.5" he jumped earlier in the year.

"Competing on the international scene helped me calm down," says Harris. "The championships didn't seem as huge to me as they did when I was a freshman. I didn't stand around and watch everyone compete, I just came in and did my own thing."

After passing on a few heights, the bar was finally at 7' 5". Harris cleared and put the pressure squarely on Shunk.

"When I cleared 7' 5" I knew that in order for Shunk to beat me, he would have to jump the first attempt and he had already taken more jumps than I did," says Harris. "I felt that if he did clear it, I would clear the next height. I had more left in the tank."

Shunk did not clear 7' 5" and Harris was crowned Princeton's first NCAA Champion since David Pellegrini won the 35-pound weight throw in 1980. Harris' height broke a Princeton indoor

record, replacing the one he set earlier this season.

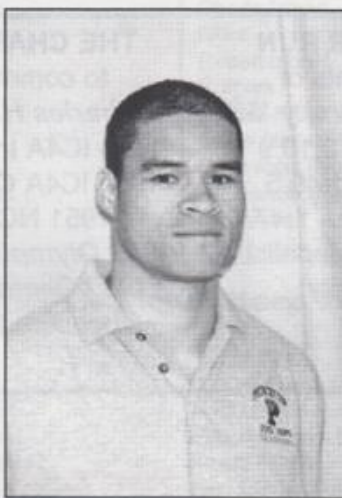
"Tora is a great NCAA champion, an unbelievable athlete and a wonderful representative of Princeton," says head coach Fred Samara. "He has worked so hard for four years and now he has achieved this."

"I just wanted to go in there and take care of business," says Harris. "In that competition, I happened to come out on top. The next time around, I hope the same thing happens."

Next time refers to the outdoor NCAA championships in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Harris is well on his way to meeting his goal at the championships. This season, Harris set the all-time heptagonal record and tied the all-time Penn Relay record, clearing 7' 6-1/2".

With seven heptagonal championships, four All-America selections and a national championship to his credit, Harris' resume is pretty full; however, he may be able to squeeze in another national championship.

After all, he is the favorite.

Break Out Year for DeFrancesco

It's been a breakout year for James Madison distance runner Mollie DeFrancesco.

Last June, she finished 10th in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the USA Track and Field National Championships in Eugene, Oregon, where she posted a school-record time of 10 minutes, 12.24 seconds.

She followed that by winning the Colonial Athletic Association cross country race in October, leading the Dukes to their third straight conference championship. DeFrancesco then finished ninth in the NCAA regional cross country race, earning All-NCAA Southeast Region honors and qualifying for the NCAA National Championships. She placed 59th in the NCAA meet and was named the CAA cross country runner of the year.

At the 2002 ECAC Indoor Track and Field Championships in Boston in March, DeFrancesco improved her personal-best in the 5,000 by nearly 45 seconds as she won the ECAC title in a school-record 16:27.45. Six days later she was shaving nearly five more seconds off her PR with a time of 16:22.64 at the NCAA Indoor Championships, where she placed sixth and earned All-America honors.

Last month, DeFrancesco was honored as JMU's Female Athlete of the Year and then won her second consecutive CAA steeplechase title.

In early May, she shattered the school outdoor record in the 5,000 meters with a clocking of 16:03.97, surpassing the previous record by more than 13 seconds and meeting the NCAA automatic qualifying standard in the event.

All this for an athlete who nearly quit competitive running as a college sophomore, but found she missed the sport and returned. The secret to her success? A determined attitude and a strong work ethic.

"Mollie is an example that excellence can be achieved through hard work and persistence," says JMU cross country coach Dave Rinker.

And now the senior from East Greenbush, New York takes aim at another ECAC title, this time in an especially challenging event, the steeplechase. In the 3,000-meter race, competitors face five jumps per lap over 30-inch hurdles placed 80 meters apart. Competitors take seven water jumps and go over barriers 28 times during the 7 1/2-lap race.

Success in the steeplechase at the prestigious ECAC meet could serve as a springboard to a

possible NCAA championship for DeFrancesco. When she ran a school-record steeplechase time of 10:02.85 at the April 6 Duke Invitational, it ranked as the best in the world this year. Her time currently ranks second in NCAA Division I behind North Carolina State's Katie Sabino's 10:01.00 and she has the third-best overall time among American steeplechasers this year.

The Nation's Largest Athletic Conference

64 Years of Tradition, Diversity and Service

In the 64 years since its inception, the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) has emerged as the nation's largest conference. The ECAC has grown considerably from its charter membership of 58, currently boasting 315 member schools in Divisions I, II and III, ranging in location from Maine to North Carolina. In the 2001-02 academic year, the ECAC will host 111 championships in 35 men's and women's sports as the sponsors of over 5,811 varsity teams and 128,553 male and female athletes.

HISTORY - The ECAC was founded in 1938 as the Central Office for Eastern Intercollegiate Athletics. One of the most significant events in ECAC history occurred in 1983 with the consolidation of the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (EAIW) into the ECAC infrastructure. With the addition of women's sports, the ECAC doubled its number of championships and greatly increased its member base.

Through the years the ECAC has exerted leadership not only at the regional level, but at the national level as well. Comprising more than 32 percent of the NCAA membership, the conference plays an integral role in national collegiate athletics policy and legislation. The conference, led by Commissioner Philip Buttafuoco, continues today to address many of the same issues affecting college athletics in the past while striving to lead this industry in the 21st century.

LEADERSHIP - Inaugural commissioner Asa S. Bushnell molded the organization from its formation in the 1938 to his retirement in 1970. George Schiebler succeeded Bushnell as commissioner from 1970-72, followed by Robert M. "Scotty" Whitelaw (1972-1989) and Clayton Chapman (1989-98). Current commissioner Phil Buttafuoco assumed chief administrator responsibilities on July 1, 1998. Buttafuoco brings extensive knowledge and leadership into the mix based on his experiences as senior assistant director of championships for the NCAA.

LOCATION - The Asa S. Bushnell Center, the ECAC's current headquarters, is located in Centerville, Massachusetts on Cape Cod. It is on the picturesque Cape that the conference hosts its fall convention and honors dinner. More than 300 athletic administrators attend the convention to partake in the membership committee meetings, professional seminars, tournament, and affiliate meetings. The remainder of the year that center remains the hub of activities for the ECAC with daily tasks focused on championships, officiating, public relations and recognition awards, legislative services, sponsorship, special events and television venues.

CHAMPIONSHIPS - The ECAC administers 111 preseason and post-season events for its member institutions, including the EARC, EAWRC, CCCR and IRA rowing, men's IC4A cross-country and track & field, IFA fencing, EIWA wrestling and men's EIGL gymnastics championships. In 1997, the ECAC was awarded USOC grant money to fund conference championships in Olympic sports considered "endangered" (men's gymnastics, men's water polo) or "emerging" (women's synchronized swimming, women's water polo). Additional grants were awarded to the ECAC in wrestling and men's and women's fencing in 1998. The grant program funded these championships through 2001.

OFFICIATING - The ECAC assigns officials in 15 sports in Divisions I, II and III, including baseball, men's and women's basketball, fencing, field hockey, football, men's gymnastics, men's and women's ice hockey, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer, softball, and wrestling. Furthermore, ECAC official coordinators provide clinics and workshops to improve the level of officiating and attract the most qualified collegiate officials. The officiating bureaus assign officials for

both conference and NCAA championships, totaling over 39,241 assignments for over 4,458 officials each year.

PUBLIC RELATIONS/RECOGNITION AWARDS - The ECAC publicizes the achievements of its member institutions and student-athletes via weekly and postseason awards. The ECAC honors weekly 731 student-athletes in the fall, 1334 in the winter and 434 during the spring season.

CONVENTION and MEETINGS - The business of the ECAC publicizes the achievements of its member institutions and athletes via weekly and postseason awards. These selections stem from nominations submitted by the college's sports information director and the conference's public relations director.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM - The ECAC has two internship programs. The prestigious Asa S. Bushnell internship, named after the first commissioner of the ECAC and established in 1976, offers students from ECAC institutions the opportunity to gain hands-on experience in the operations of the nation's largest athletic conference. The Sherwood Drolet internship, made possible by the generous support of the Sherwood Drolet Corporation, provides recent graduates real-world opportunities in marketing, promotions, licensing and hockey league management. Former interns proudly represent the ECAC in all fields of the sports industry, including directors of athletics, commissioners, broadcasting executives, front-office positions in professional franchises, sports information directors, and coaches.

LEGISLATIVE SERVICES - The conference maintains a legislative and compliance service to assist its membership with the application of NCAA and ECAC regulations. The conference sponsors workshops and seminars, processes hardship waivers and facilitates the Collegiate Commissioners Association National Letter of Intent program for its members.

SPONSORSHIPS - The ECAC actively pursues the development of partnerships that garner the financial support of corporate and individual entities. Through these sponsorships, the ECAC enhances championship events for participants, while supplementing associated event-operation expenditures. Elements conference sponsors may receive include, but are not limited to: official access to the membership, television exposure, event signage, event entitlements, tickets and hospitality, and the opportunity to promote volume incentive buying programs.

TELEVISION - ECAC Productions coordinates with institutions, television vendors and broadcast partners to produce and obtain clearances of quality sports programming promoting the conference and its members. ECAC Productions televised sports events include football, men's gymnastics, men's and women's ice hockey, and wrestling. These events are aired through partnerships with the following regional sports networks: Empire Sports, the New England Sports Network (NESN), Home Team Sports, Sunshine Network and Comcast Broadcasts.

SPECIAL EVENTS - The conference hosts events such as the Eastern College Football Awards Banquet at the Meadowlands, the ECAC Division I Women's Soccer Classic on Cape Cod and three conventions and a trade show.

The ECAC hosted four NCAA championships in 2001 including the Frozen Four, the Division III Baseball Northeast Regional, the Division I Swimming and Diving Championships, and the Division II Indoor Track and Field Championships.
